Vacancy rate drops again

According to figures released today from the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation Rental Market Survey, the vacancy rate in the Kingston Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) dropped for the third year in a row to 0.9 per cent, down from the 1.5 per cent recorded last year. As a result, the tight rental market made it more difficult for residents to find an apartment in Kingston in 2002. Kingston's vacancy rate is well below the National Average of 1.7 per cent.

With few rental housing starts recorded in the past year, the supply of available private rental dwellings has not grown in face of growing demand from a strong student population residing within the city. While only 125 rental housing starts were recorded in Kingston for 2001, none have been recorded to date for 2002.

Faced with rising demand but relatively low new supply, the average monthly rent for a two-bedroom apartment increased 2.5 per cent this year to \$727 per month, surpassing the rate of inflation. The average monthly rent for a one-bedroom unit increased less than one per cent, while bachelor suites jumped by 5.6 pr cent over last October. Private rental apartments with 3 or more units actually decrease by 2.5 per cent in average rent.

Kingston has recorded the lowest vacancy rate for a CMA in Ontario this year, well below the 1.6 per cent recorded for Hamilton and 1.9 per cent for the CMA of Ottawa.
