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Highlights

June 2003

A negative balance for the first half of 2003

• Non-intermodal traffic dropped 8.8 million metric tonnes (mt) in the first six months of 2003, compared to the first half of 2002. This represents a 7.2% decrease, which is mainly the result of a 3.3 mt decline in wheat and cereal loadings and a 2.4 mt drop in coal loadings. Forestry products such as logs, wood chips and lumber decreased 0.9 mt. Overall, almost two thirds of the commodities posted a drop in tonnage from 2002. Among the goods that increased, potash loadings were up half a million tonnes. Fuel oils and crude petroleum along with gaseous hydrocarbons, including liquid propane gas, posted a gain of a little over 0.7 mt. Metallic waste and scrap were up 0.3 mt. Sulphur was consistently up 6% for the first half of both 2002 and 2003.

Note of Appreciation

Canada owes the success of its statistical system to a long-standing partnership between Statistics Canada, the citizens of Canada, its businesses and governments. Accurate and timely statistical information could not be produced without their continued cooperation and goodwill.

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- The cumulative total for the first half of 2003 (excluding intermodal loadings) reached 112.8 mt compared to 121.6 mt in 2002. The variation was only -0.2% between 2002 and 2001. Traffic from US connections went from 12.9 mt to 15.3 mt, up 18.3%. Intermodal traffic gained just over one million tonnes for a total of 12.9 mt, from 11.9 mt in 2002.
- In June 2003, loadings on Canadian railways (excluding intermodal loadings) totalled 236 thousand cars and 18.5 mt, a drop of 5.4% in tonnage compared to June 2002.
- Non-intermodal tonnage went down from 19.2 mt to 18.5 mt from May to June 2003. Coal, potash and nickel ores were
 the most important contributors to this decrease, making up almost 0.7 mt. A strike caused a 97% drop in nickel ore
 loadings. A rise of 0.6 mt in iron ore, wheat, other non-metallic minerals as well as sand gravel and crushed stone
 helped to offset the drop.

These top five groups of commodities accounted for 46.4% of the June tonnage and for 39.3% of the car loadings.

- Loadings for intermodal traffic, that is "containers-on-flat-cars" (C.O.F.C.) and "trailers-on-flat-cars" (T.O.F.C.) increased 5.8% from the same period of 2002 but dropped 7.2% from May 2003, totalling 2.2mt.
- Loadings originating from the United States reached 2.5 mt, down 2.9% from May.

Methodology and concepts

The *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication presents essential data for timely analysis of the Rail Transport Industry and its contribution to the Canadian economy. Approximately 40 rail carriers report each month on their total intermodal and non-intermodal¹ traffic of the previous month. For non-intermodal traffic, the carriers report the number of cars and tonnes by commodity of revenue-generating freight that they have loaded in Canada. For intermodal freight, the carriers report the number of units and tonnes for containers-on-flat-cars (C.O.F.C.) and trailers-on-flat-cars (T.O.F.C.), with no commodity detail. The carriers also report the total tonnage of revenue freight received from United States connections.

The total quantity of freight carried in Canada is the sum of the non-intermodal and intermodal freight loaded and the traffic received from U.S. connections. Additional information provided includes the number of units and tonnes of C.O.F.C. and T.O.F.C received from U.S. connections and the total tonnes of cargo that the carriers received from other Canadian connections. This freight that is exchanged among Canadian based carriers is counted only once in the total quantity of freight moved as it is counted only when loaded. For intermodal freight, twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) are derived from the dimensions of the freight-laden containers. Empty containers are not included in these statistics.

The data are collected via questionnaires and electronic reports that are filed with Statistics Canada eight working days after the reference month. These questionnaires are captured and edited and the data are then aggregated to produce tables for all of Canada and the Eastern and Western divisions of Canada². Tables show the data for the reference month and the year-to-date. These year-to-date figures include revisions of data from previous months.

Users of *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* current and historical data should be aware of a break in the continuity of these data. Starting with the January 1999 reference period, the commodities presented in the *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication were modified to conform to the Standard Classification of Transported Goods (SCTG) and the number of carriers surveyed more than doubled from the eighteen carriers surveyed prior to 1999.

The additional carriers were primarily shortline carriers whose data were previously included with the data of mainline carriers. The change in commodity classes has had negligible impact on the reporting of bulk commodities (e.g., wheat, potash and coal) which represent the majority of the total number of cars and tonnes. However, the reporting of manufactured and miscellaneous goods has changed significantly.
