# **Highlights:**

- In September 1999, the freight (excluding intermodal traffic) loaded by railways in Canada totalled 20.9 million metric tonnes.
- The intermodal tonnage, represented by "containers-on-flat-cars" (C.O.F.C.) and "trailers-on-flat-cars" (T.O.F.C.), was 2.0 million metric tonnes.
- The five top leading commodities, were: coal (3.6 million metric tonnes), iron ores and concentrates (3.3 million metric tonnes), wheat (1.3 million metric tonnes), potash (1.0 million metric tonnes) and lumber (0.9 million metric tonnes).
- The cumulative freight loaded (excluding intermodal traffic) for the first nine months of 1999 reached 174.2
   million metric tonnes
