Profile of Funding in the Northwest Territories, 1997-98

Planning and Research The Canada Council for the Arts April, 1999

- In 1997-98, the Canada Council for the Arts provided grants worth \$270,000 to the arts in the Northwest Territories (N.W.T). This includes almost \$58,000 in new funding in 1997-98.
- In addition to grants, \$4,700 in payments was provided to 10 authors through the Public Lending Right Program¹.
- Total Canada Council funding to N.W.T. including grants and Public Lending Right payments was \$275,000 in 1997-98.
- N.W.T. accounts for 0.29% of Canada Council funding. The territory makes up 0.22% of Canada's population.
- The Council awarded \$164,000 to 6 arts organizations² and almost \$106,000 went to 8 artists.
- Grants were awarded in music, theatre, media arts and writing and publishing. The largest amount of funding went to media arts (\$193,00), followed by writing and publishing (\$52,000) and theatre (\$20,000).
- Artists and arts professionals from N.W.T. and Yukon Territory made up 0.2% of all peer assessors in 1997-98 (a total of 1 individual in that year).
- A total of \$164,000 (61% of funding) went to artists and arts organizations in Igloolik, followed by Yellowknife (\$34,000 or 13% of the total) and Iqaluit (\$22,000 or 8% of the total). The remaining communities received almost \$50,000 (18% of the total).
- According to the 1996 Census, there are 1,100 individuals in professional and technical occupations in the arts and culture³ in N.W.T. This represents a 20% increase over 1991.

¹ The Public Lending Right Program provides payments to authors whose books are held in selected Canadian libraries.

² Number of arts organizations excludes host organizations such as libraries, post-secondary institutions, bookstores and other organizations participating in the Literary Readings Program.

³ This represents only a portion of the total cultural sector labour force.
