

# **Deh Cho Process**

#### What's it all about?

The Deh Cho process began in 1998 when ministerial envoy, Dr. Peter Russell was asked to review Deh Cho interests in lands, resources, and governance. Dr. Russell worked with Deh Cho leadership to find areas of common ground that could lead to fruitful land and self-government negotiations.

Dr. Russell prepared a report outlining 21 common ground principles, and proposed a two-step approach to formal negotiations. The first step includes the simultaneous negotiation of an interim measures agreement and a Framework Agreement. The second step will move forward with formal negotiations toward an Agreement-in-Principle and a Final Agreement.

The Deh Cho First Nations agreed to proceed with formal talks, based on the 21 principles developed by Dr. Russell and the Deh Cho negotiating team. In March 1999, in response to the Russell report, the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development also agreed to enter formal discussions with the Deh Cho First Nations on land claims and self government, using the proposed two step approach.

#### Where are we now?

Step one talks began in the fall of 1999, and are proceeding toward an interim measures agreement and a Framework Agreement. Funding has been provided to help the Deh Cho First Nations prepare for formal talks on land, resource, and self-government matters.
