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INTRODUCTORY NOTES

Volume 2 of the report, *Official Languages in the Canadian Sport System*, is a compilation of the responses received from Canadian athletes. The results are presented directly vis à vis each question as it was worded and put to the athletes in a mailed questionnaire.

This compilation gives the observed frequencies as expressed by the two groups of respondents, Anglophone athletes and Francophone athletes.

Where it was deemed suitable, depending upon the type of responses, the mean and the standard deviation were added to the frequencies.

The mean and the standard deviation are two statistical measures which may make the comparison of the two groups and data interpretation easier:

- The mean, otherwise known as the average, is the sum of the individual responses divided by the number of responses.
- The standard deviation (S.D.) is a statistical measure reflecting the extent to which individual responses diverge from the mean and gauges the dispersion of individual responses around the mean.

A responding athlete is known as an Anglophone if he or she indicated English as the preferred official language in Question 1. Likewise, a Francophone is an athlete who indicated French as his or her preferred official language.

INTRODUCTORY NOTES

Survey Objective

The overall objective of our study was to examine the resources invested in the Canadian sport system and the results obtained, in terms of official languages. In order to determine whether athletes receive essential services in their preferred official language, we conducted a survey of carded athletes to identify which elements of the sport system contribute most to the athlete's development and to determine which elements, if any, are deficient from a linguistic point of view.

Methodology, Scope and Limitations

The Commissioner of Official Languages conducted a survey of athletes who received direct financial support from Sport Canada (carded athletes) as of November 1, 1999. We divided the population into two samples: English-speaking and French-speaking athletes, using the data on preferred official language in Sport Canada's data base. The survey was conducted using a self-administered mail survey.

The population sampled represents only those athletes who have attained the elite level at which they receive federal funding (1235 athletes). Francophones make up a smaller proportion of carded athletes (18.0%) than of the general Canadian population (24.6%). The survey does not deal with any phenomena at developmental levels which may inhibit French-speaking athletes from achieving the elite level in their sport.

In order to achieve the confidence level of 95 percent, we required 99 responses from French-speaking athletes. Taking account of non-responses, we determined it would be necessary to send out 150 questionnaires, which represented 67 percent of the population. We

therefore conducted a census of French-speaking athletes, sending out questionnaires to all 222 athletes. In order to achieve an equivalent confidence level of 95 percent, we required 152 replies from English-speaking athletes; with a suitable increase for non-response, we chose a random sample of 256 athletes out of the 1013 Anglophones.

Questionnaires were mailed to athletes in mid-December 1999, and a reminder was sent in mid-January. We received 107 replies from English-speaking athletes (a response rate of 42%), and 118 replies from French-speakers (a response rate of 53%).

The breakdown of respondents by gender is 44 percent male and 56 percent female among Anglophones, and 44 percent male and 56 percent female among Francophones. The gender breakdown among Francophone respondents is comparable to that of the total Francophone group of carded athletes, whereas male Anglophone respondents are under-represented relative to their presence in the total group.

Anglophone athletes originate mostly from three provinces: Ontario (34%), British Columbia (23%) and Alberta (16%), whereas most Francophone athletes are from Quebec (89%).

In terms of age and carding status, there were no significant differences between the two linguistic groups. The average age of Anglophone respondents is 24.8 years, and for Francophones it is 24.0 years. Anglophone athletes had held a card for an average of 2.8 years, while Francophones had been carded for an average of 3.2 years. In both groups, the "C" level card was the most common.

The sports represented in the survey responses generally parallel those practiced by the population of carded athletes.

In spite of the limitations caused by nonresponse, the survey samples reflect the population. The confidence level for findings related to Francophone athletes is higher than for those related to Anglophones, but in both cases it is over 90 percent. More precisely, the standard deviation from the mean is increased by 0.12 for responses from Anglophones, whereas the standard deviation for Francophone responses is slightly reduced. For example, for a question where the survey result was 4.60, the actual response for the English-speaking athlete population would lie between 4.28 and 4.92, whereas for the population of French-speaking athletes the actual response would lie between 4.30 and 4.90.
