Monthly Railway Carloadings



September 2010

Highlights

- Railway cargo traffic rose in September on the strength of a growth in domestic loadings as well as a rise in traffic received from American railways.
- The culmination of these activities resulted in total rail traffic rising to 24.3 million metric tonnes in September, an
 increase of 9.5% from last September.
- From a domestic perspective, loadings from the rail industry's core transportation systems, non-intermodal and intermodal, rose 7.0% from September 2009 to 21.8 million metric tonnes.
- Non-intermodal loadings, which are typically carried in bulk or loaded in box cars, increased to 19.5 million metric tonnes in September, an increase of 6.8% from the same month last year. The commodity groups that registered the largest gains in tonnage were iron ores and concentrates, potash and iron and steel (primary or semi-finished).
- The increase in non-intermodal loadings occurred despite a fall in loadings of some of the industry's typically largest commodities by tonnage wheat, lumber and coal.
- Intermodal loadings, in which cargo are transported via containers and trailers on flat cars, advanced 8.4% from last September to 2.3 million metric tonnes.
- From a non-domestic perspective, rail freight traffic received from American railways rose to 2.5 million metric tonnes in September, up 38.3% from September 2009.
- On geographic basis, 54.1% of the freight traffic originating in Canada was loaded in the Western Division of Canada, with the remainder loaded in the Eastern Division. The Eastern and Western Divisions, for statistical purposes, are separated by an imaginary line running from Thunder Bay to Armstrong, Ontario. Freight loaded at Thunder Bay is included in the Western Division while loadings at Armstrong are reported in the Eastern Division.

Methodology and concepts

The **Railway Carloadings (Monthly)** publication presents essential data for timely analysis of the Rail Transport Industry and its contribution to the Canadian economy. Approximately 40 rail carriers report each month on their total intermodal 1 and non-intermodal2 traffic. For non-intermodal traffic, the carriers report the number of cars and tonnes by commodity of revenue-generating freight that they have loaded in Canada. For intermodal freight, the carriers report the number of units and tonnes for containers-on-flat-cars (C.O.F.C.) and trailers-on-flat-cars (T.O.F.C.), with no commodity detail. The carriers also report the total tonnage of revenue freight received from United States connections.

The total quantity of freight carried in Canada is the sum of the non-intermodal and intermodal freight loaded and the traffic received from U.S. connections. Additional information provided includes the number of units and tonnes of C.O.F.C. and T.O.F.C received from U.S. connections and the total tonnes of cargo that the carriers received from other Canadian connections. This freight that is exchanged among Canadian based carriers is counted only once in the total quantity of freight moved as it is counted only when loaded. For intermodal freight, twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) are derived from the dimensions of the freight-laden containers. Empty containers are not included in these statistics.

The data are collected via questionnaires and electronic reports that are filed with Statistics Canada eight working days after the reference month. These questionnaires are captured and edited and the data are then aggregated to produce tables for all of Canada and the Eastern and Western divisions of Canada.³ Tables show the data for the reference month and the year-to-date. These year-to-date figures include revisions of data from previous months.

Users of Railway Carloadings (Monthly) current and historical data should be aware of a break in the continuity of these data. Starting with the January 1999 reference period, the commodities presented in the Railway Carloadings (Monthly) publication were modified to conform to the Standard Classification of Transported Goods (SCTG) and the number of carriers surveyed more than doubled from the eighteen carriers surveyed prior to 1999.

The additional carriers were primarily shortline carriers whose data were previously included with the data of mainline carriers. The change in commodity classes has had negligible impact on the reporting of bulk commodities (e.g., wheat, potash and coal) which represent the majority of the total number of cars and tonnes. However, the reporting of manufactured and miscellaneous goods has changed significantly.
