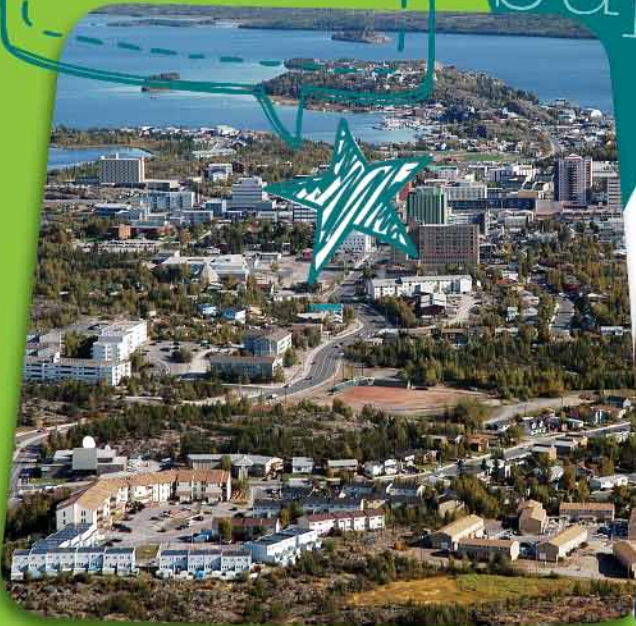

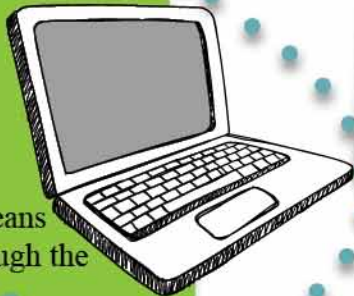

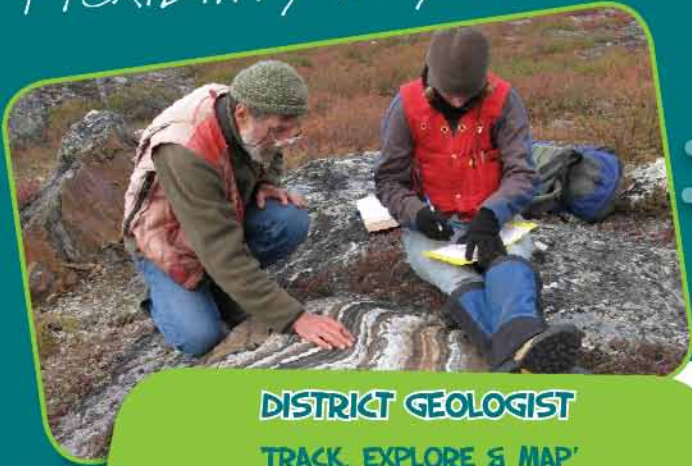

Your research and knowledge is key to NWT's economic development as you track mineral and petroleum exploration activity, deliver geoscience research programs, and map the lay of the land.

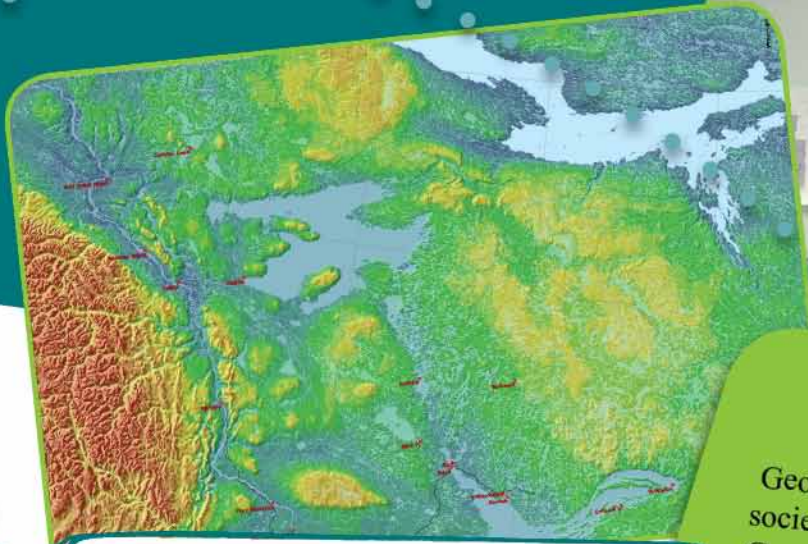

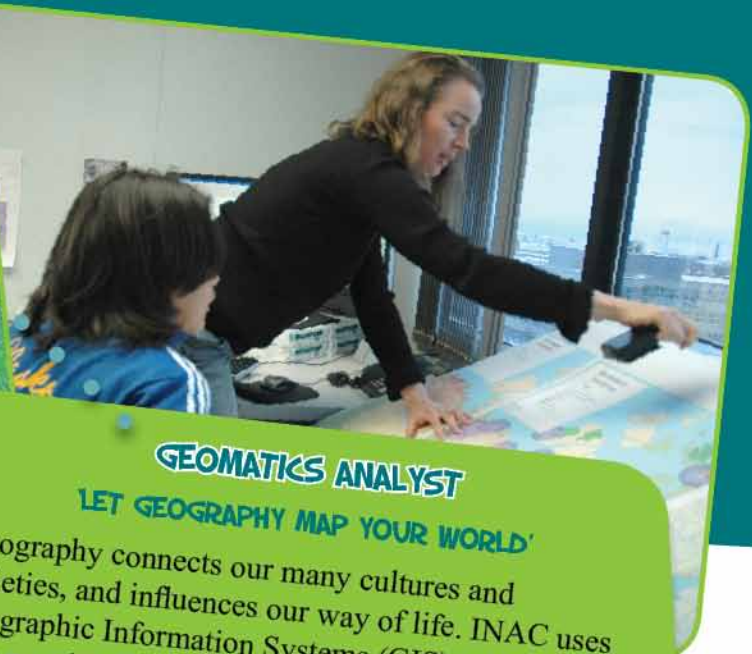
### H<sub>2</sub>O EXPERT

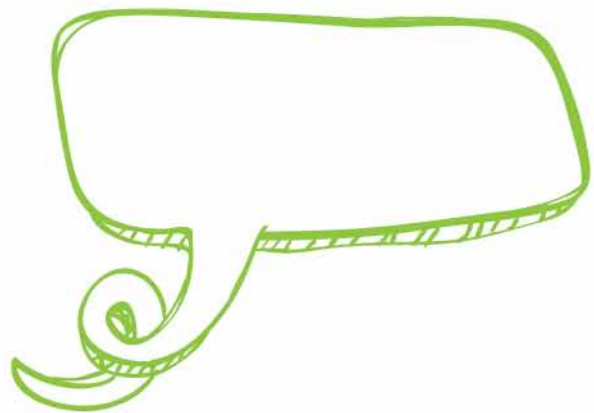
