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Under the authority of the *Pest Control Products Act*, Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has granted full registration to Prowl H<sub>2</sub>0 Herbicide, containing technical grade pendimethalin, for use in Canada on apples, apricots, cherries, dry bulb onions, field corn, nectarines and peaches. The specific uses approved in Canada are detailed on the product label of Prowl H<sub>2</sub>0 Herbicide, *Pest Control Products Act* Registration Number 29542.

Corresponding maximum residue limits (MRLs) were proposed in the consultation document published on 16 November 2010, Proposed Maximum Residue Limit PMRL2010-56, *Pendimethalin*. The PMRA received no comments in response to this consultation.

To comply with Canada's international trade obligations, consultation on the proposed MRLs was also conducted internationally by notifying the World Trade Organization, as coordinated by the Standards Council of Canada. No comments were received as a result of the World Trade Organization consultation.

The following MRLs for pendimethalin in Canada take legal effect as of the publication date of this document.
