Azoxystrobin

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Under the authority of the *Pest Control Products Act*, Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has added the domestic use of bulb vegetable (Crop Group 3-07) treated seeds to the product label of Dynasty 100FS Fungicide, containing technical grade azoxystrobin. The specific use approved in Canada is detailed on the label of Dynasty 100FS Fungicide, *Pest Control Products Act* Registration Number 28394.

Corresponding maximum residue limits (MRLs) were proposed in the consultation document published on 27 June 2011, Proposed Maximum Residue Limit PMRL2011-23, *Azoxystrobin*. The PMRA received no comments in response to this consultation.

To comply with Canada's international trade obligations, consultation on the proposed MRLs was also conducted internationally by notifying the World Trade Organization, as coordinated by the Standards Council of Canada. No comments were received as a result of the World Trade Organization consultation.

The following MRLs take legal effect in Canada as of the publication date of this document and are in addition to the MRLs already established for azoxystrobin.
