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Under the authority of the *Pest Control Products Act*, Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has established maximum residue limits (MRLs) for foramsulfuron in or on popcorn grain and sweet corn to permit the import and sale of foods containing such residues.

Corresponding MRLs were proposed in the consultation document published on 23 June 2011, Proposed Maximum Residue Limit PMRL2011-20, *Foramsulfuron*. The PMRA received no comments in response to this consultation.

To comply with Canada's international trade obligations, consultation on the proposed MRLs was also conducted internationally by notifying the World Trade Organization, as coordinated by the Standards Council of Canada. No comments were received as a result of the World Trade Organization consultation.

The following MRLs take legal effect in Canada as of the publication date of this document and are in addition to the MRL already established for triadimenol in or on field corn.
