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Under the authority of the *Pest Control Products Act*, Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has added new uses on sugar beets to the product label of Proline 480 SC Foliar Fungicide, containing technical grade prothioconazole. The specific uses approved in Canada are detailed on the label of Proline 480 SC Foliar Fungicide, *Pest Control Products Act* Registration Number 28359.

A corresponding maximum residue limit (MRL) was proposed in the consultation document published on 20 July 2010, Proposed Maximum Residue Limit PMRL2010-34, *Prothioconazole*. The PMRA received no comments in response to this consultation.

To comply with Canada's international trade obligations, consultation on the proposed MRL was also conducted internationally by notifying the World Trade Organization, as coordinated by the Standards Council of Canada. No comments were received as a result of the World Trade Organization consultation.

The following MRL takes legal effect as of the publication date of this document and is in addition to the MRLs already established for prothioconazole.
