Highlights

- On July 1, 2011, Canada's population was estimated 34,482,800, up 356,600 from the same date in 2010. This represents a 1.0% increase, slightly down from the 1.2% growth observed during the previous year.
- Prince Edward Island's population grew up by 2,500 (1.7%) during 2010/2011. This is the strongest demographic growth among the provinces.
- As of July 1, 2011, the median age of Canada's population was estimated at 39.9 years, up 0.2 years over the previous year.
- The number of people aged 65 years and up was estimated at 4,973,400 on July 1, 2011, or 14.4% of Canada's population, up 0.3 percentage points over the previous year (14.1%). There were also 1,378,100 persons 80 years of age and up (4.0%) in Canada, and 5,644,800 children under the age of 15 (16.4%).
- As of July 1, 2011, Newfoundland and Labrador had the highest median age in the country (43.8 years). The youngest population was in Nunavut, where the median age was 24.8 years.
- Nova Scotia (16.5%) and New Brunswick (16.2%) had the highest proportion of the 65 and over population.

Section 1

Total

This section presents the population estimates for Canada, the provinces and the territories as of July 1, 2011 and an analysis of the components of growth estimated between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011.

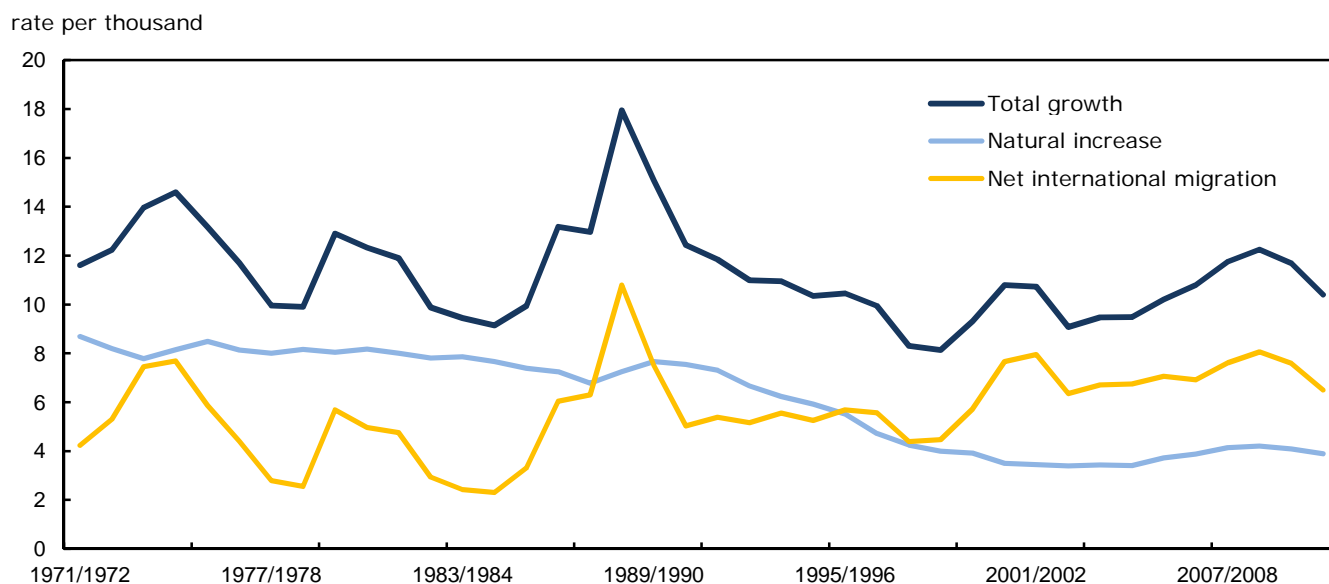
On July 1, 2011, Canada's population was estimated at 34,482,800, up 356,600 from the same date a year earlier. This represents growth of 10.4 per thousand between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011 (2010/2011), down from the growth of 11.7 per thousand observed in the previous year. Population growth has not been seen at this level in Canada since 2005/2006. Canada's average annual growth rate during the period from July 2006 to June 2011 was 11.4 per thousand, higher than that of other G8 countries,

including the United States (8.4), Italy (5.3) and France (4.7). Several countries posted negative demographic growth, including Japan (-0.6), Russia (-1.4) and Germany (-1.4).¹

At the national level, demographic growth is the result of two components, growth in net international migration and natural increase. The first component, also referred to international migration, is essentially movement of people between Canada and other countries and which involves a change in usual place of residence. Since 1999, international migration has been the primary source of demographic growth in Canada (see Chart 1.1), with almost two-thirds of the increase in 2010/2011. For 2010/2011, net international migration is estimated at 223,100 people, down from 257,600 people in the previous year and also in terms of the net average for the past decade (233,600). Canada's international migration rate for 2010/2011 was 6.5 per thousand, its lowest level since 2002/2003.

Over 258,900 immigrants settled in Canada in 2010/2011, 11,700 less than in 2009/2010 (-4.3%). This decrease in the number of immigrants in 2010/2011 was combined with a sharp decline in the net flow of non-permanent residents.² In 2010/2011, the net flow of non-permanent residents represented slightly fewer than 11,500 people, compared to 34,200 in 2009/2010 and 71,800 in 2008/2009. Two-thirds of the decline in this number can be explained by a drop in net non permanent residents, while the rest can be attributed primarily to the smaller number of immigrants admitted to Canada during this period.

The second component of demographic growth, natural increase, refers to the change in the size of a population during a given period as a result of the difference between the number of births and deaths. In 2010/2011, there were an estimated 386,000 births and 252,600 deaths, resulting in slightly fewer than 133,500 people being added to the population through natural increase. The rate of natural increase was 3.9 per thousand in 2010/2011, its lowest level

since 2006/2007. As with net international migration, but to a lesser degree, the number of people added in 2010/2011 by natural increase was less than in 2009/2010 by about 5,500 people. This is explained by the fact that the number of deaths increased faster than the number births over that period.

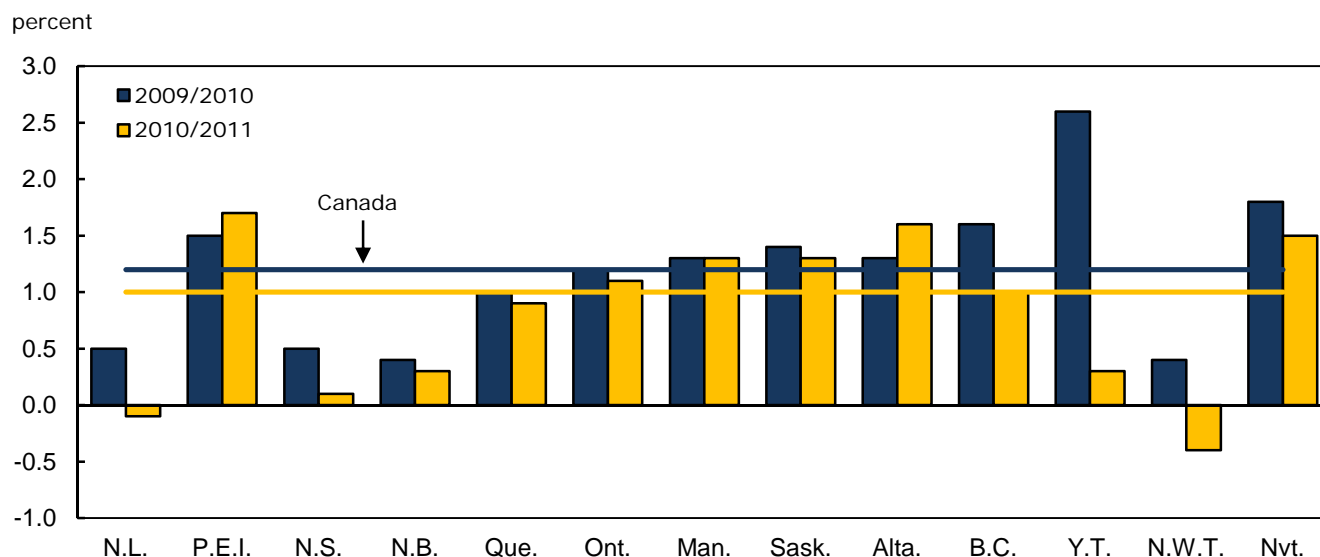
Provincial and territorial population growth

At the provincial and territorial levels, population growth is the result not only of natural increase and net international migration, but also of net interprovincial migration. Net interprovincial migration refers to the difference in the size of the population over a given period that is attributable to population movements between Canada's provinces and territories, which are accompanied by a change in usual place of residence.

Population growth can vary widely among provinces and territories (Chart 1.2). The western provinces (Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta) and Prince Edward Island and Nunavut all recorded higher growth in 2010/2011 than the national level. In contrast, growth rates in the other Atlantic provinces and in the Northwest Territories and Yukon were lower than that of the country as a whole.

During 2010/2011, the population of Newfoundland and Labrador fell by close to 700 people. As of July 1, 2011, the population of that province was estimated at 510,600. It is the only province to have recorded a drop in its population during this period. With virtually no natural increase in 2010/2011, the gains made in international migration (600) were completely erased by losses in its migration exchanges with the other provinces and territories. The province's net interprovincial migration was -1,300 people in 2010–2011, compared to the gain of 1,600 people in the previous year.

The population of Prince Edward Island grew by close to 2,500 people (17.0 per thousand) in 2010/2011. On July 1, 2011, the province's population was estimated at 145,900, the only province east of Ontario to have recorded growth higher than the national average. The increase in net international migration was the main factor in this growth. Indeed, 2010/2011 saw the province's highest net international migration since 1971/1972³ with 2,800. The province welcomed more than 2,600 immigrants in 2010/2011, some 800 more than a year earlier. This demographic jump was partially offset by negative net interprovincial migration (-500).

Nova Scotia experienced a slight increase in its population during 2010/2011, up 600 (0.7 per thousand). On July 1, 2011, its population was estimated at 945,400. The province's net international migration (3,000) was almost completely offset by negative net interprovincial migration (-2,900). In 2010/2011, almost 2,300 immigrants moved to Nova Scotia, 5.3% fewer than during the same period in 2009/2010. However, the province welcomed over 2,000 immigrants for the sixth straight year.

As of July 1, 2011, the population of New Brunswick was estimated at 755,500, an increase of slightly more than 2,600 (3.5 per thousand) in 2010/2011. Three-quarters of the population growth in this province is attributable to strong net international migration. The province received almost 2,000 immigrants, a record number for New Brunswick since 1975/1976. New Brunswick was not affected significantly by its exchanges with the other provinces and territories, obtaining a slight positive balance. For the second straight year, the province gained in its interprovincial

exchanges, something that has not happened since the early 1990s.

In 2010/2011, the population of Quebec grew by about 74,000 (9.3 per thousand), reaching 7,979,700 on July 1, 2011, reflecting a growth rate slightly below that of 2009/2010 (10.0 per thousand). Two-thirds of this province's population growth in 2010/2011 is due to net international migration. Quebec welcomed close to 54,000 immigrants between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011, the highest level since 1971/1972. In comparison, the province welcomed 400 more immigrants in 2010/2011 than in 2009/2010 and 7,500 more than in 2008/2009. It also recorded a net flow of non-permanent residents of nearly 3,000, significantly below the levels recorded in 2009/2010 (7,400) and in 2008/2009 (13,200). In addition, the province lost in its migration exchanges with all other provinces and territories, with negative net interprovincial migration of -3,300, a level comparable to that of 2009/2010.

In 2010/2011, Ontario's population grew by 145,200 (10.9 per thousand), a rate similar to the national average (10.4 per thousand). As of July 1, 2011, the population of Ontario was estimated at 13,373,000. The main factor in Ontario's population growth was net international migration, which was 98,600 in 2010/2011, down from 109,400 in 2009/2010. The province welcomed close to 104,900 immigrants between July 1, 2010 and June 30, 2011, its smallest contingent since 1998/1999. In 2010/2011, 40.5% of all immigrants arriving in Canada settled in Ontario, compared to 59.6% a decade ago. The net flow of permanent residents was slightly higher, climbing from 12,600 in 2009/2010 to 13,600 in 2010/2011. In contrast, Ontario experienced a deficit in its exchanges with the other provinces and territories (-2,300). This does, however, represent the smallest loss since 2003/2004. Most of the province's loss in this component occurred in its exchanges with Alberta (-3,900) and Saskatchewan (-1,500). These migration losses were partially offset by gains from Quebec (3,400). Lastly, in 2010/2011, Ontario recorded its lowest natural increase since 1971/1972, with 3.7 per thousand. In comparison, the national natural increase was estimated at 3.9 per thousand.

Manitoba's population grew by slightly more than 16,000 (12.9 per thousand) in 2010/2011. This was the province's largest increase since 1982/1983.

As of July 1, 2011, Manitoba's population was estimated at 1,250,600. During the year, net international migration (13,700) was the main factor driving the province's growth. Manitoba welcomed 15,900 immigrants in 2010/2011, the highest level estimated for the province since 1971/1972. For the second straight year, the province posted a slightly negative net flow of non-permanent residents (-300) in 2010/2011. Manitoba also lost in its exchanges with the other provinces and territories, posting net interprovincial migration of close to -3,400, lower than the level experienced in 2009/2010 (-2,400). The majority of this interprovincial migration losses resulted from exchanges with Alberta (-1,500) and British Columbia (-1,200).

Saskatchewan recorded an increase in its population of 13,900 in 2010/2011, up 13.2 per thousand, but slightly down from the previous year's rate of 14.2 per thousand. Saskatchewan's population was estimated at 1,057,900 on July 1, 2011. Net international migration (7,700) was the primary factor in the province's population growth, accounting for 55.7% of the increase in 2010/2011. During the year, the province received 7,500 immigrants, its highest level since 1971/1972. The province also experienced a natural increase of 5,100 people in 2010/2011, the highest level estimated since 1994/1995, and net interprovincial migration of 1,000 people. This is the fifth straight year that Saskatchewan has experienced gains in its migration exchanges with the other provinces and territories after 22 years of losses.

The population of Alberta was estimated at 3,779,400 on July 1, 2011. Alberta's population growth was estimated at 58,400 (15.6 per thousand) in 2010/2011, a rate higher than that for Canada as a whole (10.4 per thousand) but one of the province's smallest increases since 1995/1996. Unlike the other provinces, natural increase (30,700) was the primary factor in the growth of Alberta's population in 2010/2011. Since 1980/1981, Alberta has had the strongest natural increase among all Canadian provinces. It also recorded net interprovincial migration of 13,700 people in 2010/2011. This represents a return to positive balances after a loss of 3,300 people in 2009/2010. However, the gains made in its migration

flow with the other provinces in 2010/2011 still remain over 32,100 people below the peak level achieved in 2005/2006. Alberta's net international migration rose to 14,100. The arrival of 30,200 immigrants, the highest level recorded since 1971/1972, was offset in part by a negative net flow of non-permanent residents (-8,000). Although several provinces posted net flows of non-permanent residents in 2010/2011 that were lower than in 2009/2010, only Manitoba and Alberta experienced negative net flows.

As of July 1, 2011, the population of British Columbia was estimated at 4,573,300. This province experienced a population growth of 43,600 (9.6 per thousand) in 2010/2011, a level slightly lower than the national average (10.4 per thousand) and the province's smallest increase since 2003/2004. Net international migration (31,200) was the primary factor in the province's population growth. Natural increase accounted for the remainder of British Columbia's demographic growth, with 12,200 more births than deaths. Net interprovincial migration was estimated at fewer than 200 people in 2010/2011, the smallest gain recorded since 2003/2004 (7,900).

Due to the small number of inhabitants in the territories, even modest population fluctuations can greatly impact their growth rate. According to the most recent estimates, the population of Yukon grew at a rate of 3.1 per thousand in 2010/2011 and was estimated at 34,700 on July 1, 2011. For the first time since 2005/2006, Yukon posted a loss in its migration exchanges with the provinces and other territories (-300). As for the population of the Northwest Territories, it declined slightly in 2010/2011, at a rate of -3.5 per thousand. This loss was due mainly to negative interprovincial migration. On July 1, 2011, the population of this territory was estimated at 43,700. Lastly, the population of Nunavut rose by slightly fewer than 500 people (14.8 per thousand) in 2010/2011. As of July 1, 2011, Nunavut's population was estimated at 33,300. Demographic growth in Nunavut is attributable mainly to a natural increase of close to 700 people. Indeed, this territory has had the strongest natural increase in the country for several years.

Section 2

Age and sex

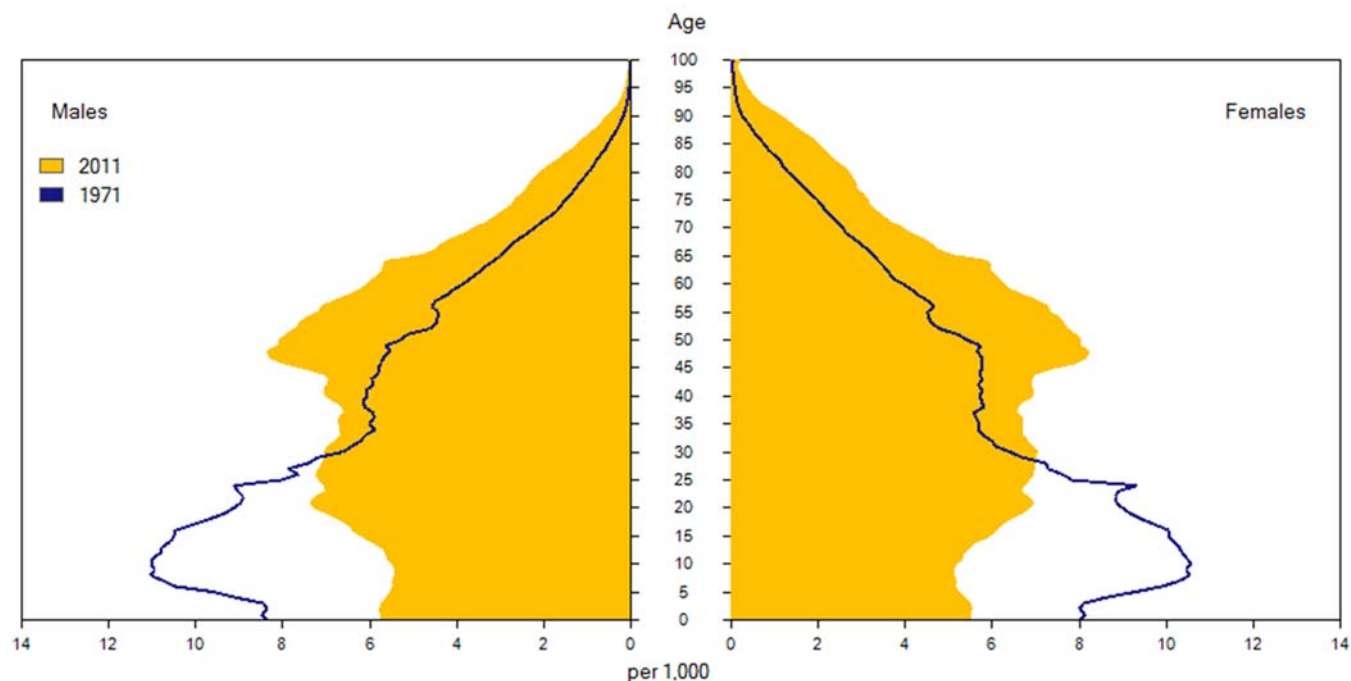
One of the major changes related to Canada's age and sex structure in the last several decades is population aging. This phenomenon is directly or indirectly linked to a number of significant social and economic issues such as renewal of the working age population, financing of public health care and retirement programs and intergenerational relations.

The age pyramid below (Figure 2.1) clearly shows the aging of Canada's population by comparing the structure of the Canadian population by age and sex on July 1, 1971 and on July 1, 2011. A population pyramid provides an immediate snapshot of the

age and sex structure of a population as well as a visual comparison of several populations or a single population at different times. The population pyramid shows, in particular, the impact of the large cohort of baby boomers, born between 1946 and 1965, on Canada's age structure. The progression of baby boomers through the age structure is particularly evident when comparing the July 1, 2011 pyramid to that of July 1, 1971. Forty years ago, baby boomers were children and young adults aged 6 to 25 years, whereas now they are in the 46-to-65 range. This large cohort will continue to shift upward and will eventually age out of the population pyramid, resulting in a more rectangular-shaped age structure at the end.

The pyramid also clearly shows the impact of low fertility rate at the base of the pyramid and increasing life expectancy at the oldest ages. Also apparent in the pyramid of July 1, 2011 is the recent increase in the population aged 3 years and under. This increase is due to the growing population of women in their prime childbearing years of the 20s to early 30s, and the rise in the total fertility rate in the majority of provinces and territories. As a result, the number of births has risen recently, making the base of the pyramid slightly broader.

Population aging is a complex phenomenon that can be measured by several statistical indicators. Median age and the proportion of the population aged 65 years and over are the two most widely used indicators of aging and serve to make international comparisons. Median age is the age that divides the population into two equal groups, one composed of individuals older than the median age and the other of individuals younger than the median age. The third indicator, the proportion of children aged 15 years and under in the population, can also provide an indication of the aging of the population to the extent that this proportion is dependent on the increase in the proportion of the older population.

On July 1, 2011, the estimated median age of the Canadian population was 39.9 years, up 0.2 years from the previous year. In 1971, the beginning of the period covered by the current system of demographic accounts, the median age was 26.2 years. The rise in the median age is the result of below replacement fertility rates for the last several decades, combined with an increasing life expectancy and the aging of the large baby boom cohort. According to the medium growth scenario of the most recent demographic projections, the median age could reach 44.0 years by 2040.

Senior population continues to grow

As of July 1, 2011, 4,973,400 persons aged 65 and over accounted for 14.4% of the Canadian population, up 0.3 percentage point from one year earlier (14.1%).

In 1971, 8.0% of the population were seniors and there has been a steady increase over the last 40 years. Population aging in Canada is expected to accelerate between 2011 and 2031 as all people in the large cohort of baby boomers reach their senior years. The first baby boomers reached 65 years in 2011. The most recent projections show that seniors could account for more than one-fifth of the population as soon as 2026 and could exceed one-quarter of the population by 2056.

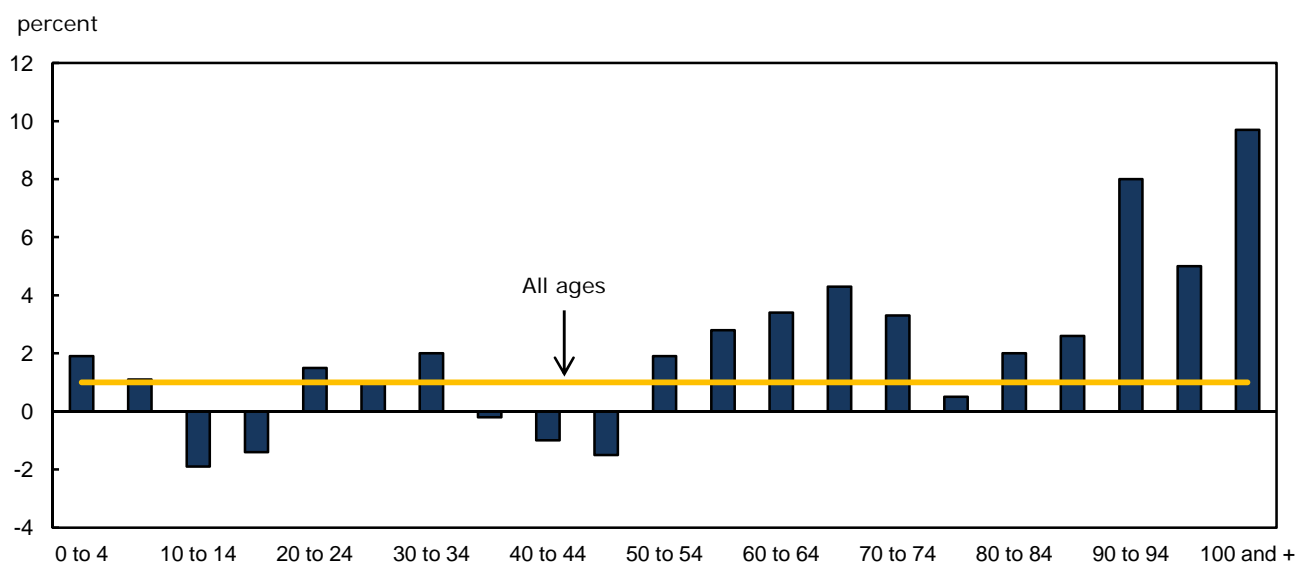
Recent international data¹ from several other countries of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) show that the proportion of Canadian seniors remains below levels in Japan (23%), Germany (21%), France (17%) and the United Kingdom (16%), but slightly higher than in the United States (13%). Given the sizeable demographic weight of the baby boom cohort in Canada, the share of the senior population in this country could surpass that of other nations in the coming years.

As of July 1, 2011, there were 1,378,100 people aged 80 years and over in Canada, representing 4.0% of the total population. The number of people aged 80 years and over could double by the year 2031 and, by 2061—the end of the period of the most recent projections—there could be 5.1 million people in this age range, more than the actual number of people aged 65 years and over. The nation also had an estimated 7,600 people aged 100 years and over on July 1, 2011. This was the fastest growing age group in 2010/2011 (Chart 2.1). In 2001, they numbered 3,400. It is projected that there could be 17,600 centenarians in 2031 and 78,300 by 2061.

In addition to the centenarians, the other age groups that experienced the strongest growth in 2010/2011 were those 90-94 years (8.0%), 95-99 years (5.0%) and 65-69 years (4.3%). Growth of the 65-69 age group is due largely to the arrival of the first cohort of baby boomers in this group.

There were roughly equal proportions of men and women in each age group under 65 years. However, these proportions change beyond that age. For the total population 65 years and over, 55.5% were women on July 1, 2011, increasing to 62.5% for those aged 80 years and over and to 79.3% for centenarians. Much of this sex difference is due to a higher life expectancy for women compared to men. In recent years, however, gains in life expectancy have been more rapid for men than for women, resulting in a gradual narrowing of the gap between the sexes.

Older working-age population increases

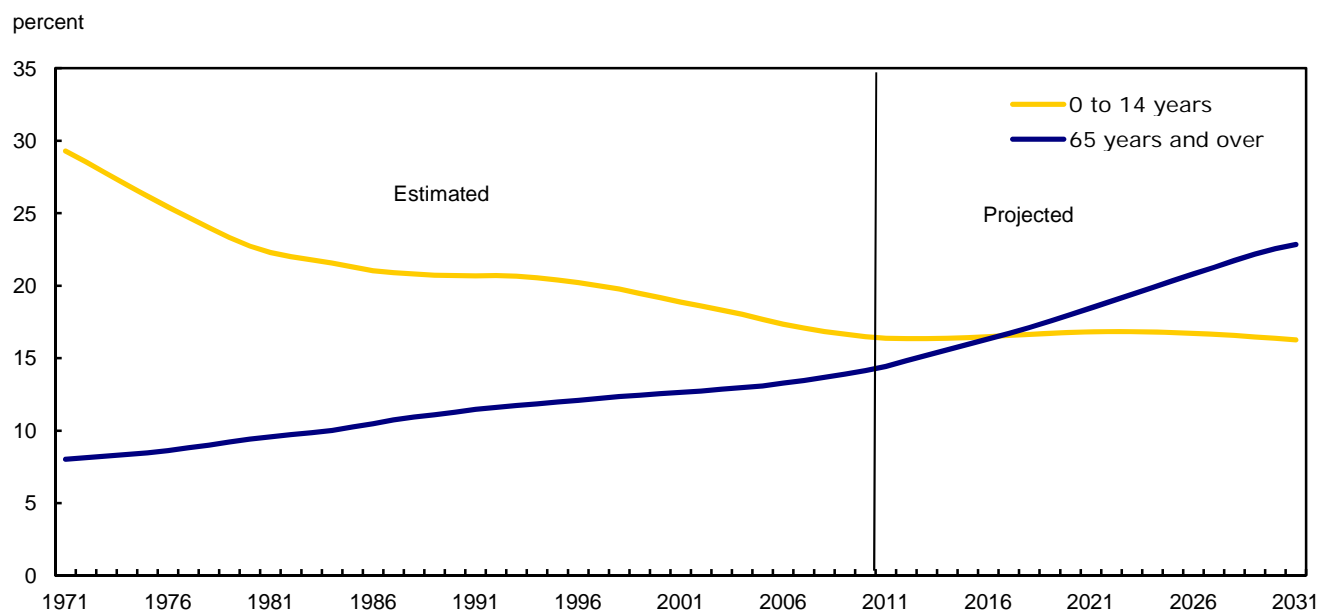
As of July 1, 2011, the working-age population aged 15 to 64 years accounted for 69.2% of the total Canadian population. Although there has been some fluctuation over the years, this proportion is higher than it was in 1971 (62.7%). Despite a larger share of the total population than in past decades, this group has also grown older. Specifically, the proportion of 55 to 64 year olds in the working-age population has increased, particularly in recent years, while the share of 15 to 24 year olds has decreased. On July 1, 2011, 55 to 64 year olds accounted for 18.4% of Canada's working-age population, up from a range of 12.5% to 13.3% throughout the 1970s to 1990s. In contrast, the youngest group of the working-age population, those 15 to 24 years, has decreased fairly steadily from 30.1% in 1971 to 19.3% in 2011.

The ratio of 15 to 24 year olds to 55 to 64 year olds was just over 1.0 on July 1, 2011, meaning that for every person at the age of leaving the labour force, there was just over one person of age to enter the labour force. In 1971, this ratio was 2.4. As a result of the baby boom cohort gradually leaving the labour force, the share of the working-age population in the total population is expected to decrease in the coming years. Most recent projections show that the ratio of the younger working-age population to the older working-age population will be less than one by 2015.

Proportion of children decreases

Since the proportions of adults and seniors have grown over time, the proportion of children under 15 has steadily decreased. On July 1, 2011, there were an estimated 5,644,800 children in this age group, representing 16.4% of the population, down slightly from 16.5% a year earlier. In 1971, close to three in 10 persons in Canada were children in this age group (29.3%). Most recent projections² show that the proportion of people aged 65 years and over will exceed the proportion of children under the age of 15 for the first time between 2015 and 2021 (Chart 2.2). Based on these projections, a little over one in five persons could be aged 65 years and over in 2031.

Provincial and territorial variation

Population aging does not affect all regions of Canada in the same way. Overall, the country's youngest populations are found in the territories and the oldest are in the Atlantic provinces. This trend has remained steady for several years and is the result of regional differences in demographic behaviour.

As of July 1, 2011, Newfoundland and Labrador had the highest median age in the country (43.8 years). This province also recorded the most significant increase in median age in the country over the previous year at 0.5 year. Median age in the other Atlantic provinces was systematically higher than the national average, with 42.2 in Prince Edward Island, 43.1 in Nova Scotia

and 43.0 in New Brunswick. Nova Scotia (16.5%) and New Brunswick (16.2%) also have the highest proportions of their populations aged 65 and over.

Newfoundland and Labrador (14.8%) and Nova Scotia (14.7%) were the two provinces with the lowest proportion of children under the age of 15. With the exception of Prince Edward Island, the proportion of seniors aged 65 years and over continued to exceed the proportion of children under 15, something not projected to happen at the national level for five to ten years. The higher population aging in the Atlantic provinces is mainly due to an evolution in fertility, initially higher and then lower than the national average and, more recently, steady losses through interprovincial migration.

On July 1, 2011, Quebec had a population slightly older than the national average, with a median age of 41.4 years and a proportion of persons aged 65 and over of 15.7%. For the first time since the introduction of the current system of demographic accounts, the population aged 65 and over, numbering 1,253,600, exceeded the under 15 population, estimated at 1,241,700. For the last few decades, Quebec has had a life expectancy higher than the national average, steady interprovincial migration losses since 1971 and, until recently, a fertility rate lower than the national average, all factors contributing to the aging of its population.

Ontario's population was slightly younger than the national average on July 1, 2011. The median age of Ontarians was 39.6 years, while the proportion of the population aged 65 years and over was 14.2%; these figures were 39.9 years and 14.4% respectively for the country as a whole.

On July 1, 2011, Manitoba and Saskatchewan had populations significantly younger than the national average. The median ages for these provinces were 37.6 years for Manitoba and 37.3 years for Saskatchewan. This represents a decrease of 0.1 year for Manitoba and 0.2 year for Saskatchewan compared to the previous year. Both provinces are also the only places in the country where the median age is falling. In addition, with the exception of the territories, these provinces posted the highest proportions of persons under 15 years in the nation (18.8% for Manitoba and 19.0% for Saskatchewan).

This demographic situation is the result of several population components, notably, higher fertility rates in these provinces, a higher number of immigrants than in previous years, positive net interprovincial migration in Saskatchewan, and increasingly smaller losses in Manitoba. Moreover, interprovincial and international migrants with lower median ages than the total population, and the births associated with those migrants, combined to reduce the median age. However, the most recent demographic projections show that the population of these provinces is still expected to age in the coming years.

Alberta had the youngest population of all provinces on July 1, 2011. Its median age was 36.0 years and the proportion of persons aged 65 years and over was 10.8%. In both cases, these are the lowest values among all provinces. Alberta's demographics can be attributed to a higher fertility rate than the national average and constantly positive and often significant net interprovincial migration since 1995/1996, with the exception of 2009/2010.

British Columbia was the only province west of Quebec with a median age above the national average. On July 1, 2011, this province's median age was 41.1 years. The proportion of persons 65 years of age and over was 15.3%. British Columbia was also the only province west of Quebec where the number of people 65 years and over (estimated at 700,500) surpassed the number of children under the age of 15 (684,900). This situation is the result of a lower fertility rate than elsewhere and a higher life expectancy.

Although they continue to age, the youngest populations are found in the territories. On July 1, 2011, the youngest population was in Nunavut, where the median age was 24.8 years and the proportion of children under the age of 15 was 31.5%. The Northwest Territories also reported a population that was significantly younger than the national average, with a median age of 31.8 years and the proportion of children under 15 at 21.2%.

Of the three territories, Yukon was the one with the oldest population (median age of 39.2 years). However, despite a median age quite close to the national average, Yukon had a proportion of persons aged 65 years and over that was substantially lower than the national average (8.8%). This proportion was considerably higher than for the other two territories, where the numbers were 5.6% for the Northwest Territories and 3.2% for Nunavut. The territories, especially Nunavut and the Northwest Territories, have a high fertility rate and the lowest life expectancy in the country, two factors associated with younger populations.

Methodology

This section describes the concepts, data sources and methodology used to produce the population estimates. Population estimates are produced to measure the population counts according to various characteristics and geographies between two censuses. Population estimates are the official figures used for the count of the population at the national, provincial and territorial levels.

Specific information regarding age and sex distributions are provided in boxes.

Population Estimates

Estimates of the total population

Types of estimates

Population estimates can be either intercensal or postcensal. Intercensal estimates are produced using counts from two consecutive censuses adjusted for census net undercoverage (CNU)¹ (including adjustment for incompletely enumerated Indian reserves) and postcensal estimates. The production of intercensal estimates involves updating the postcensal estimates using the counts from a new census adjusted for CNU.¹

Postcensal estimates are produced using data from the most recent census adjusted for CNU¹ and the components of population growth. In terms of timeliness, postcensal estimates are more up-to-date than data from the most recent census adjusted for CNU,¹ but as they get farther from the date of that census, they become more variable.

Levels of estimates

Updating population estimates between censuses entails the use of data from administrative files or surveys. The quality of population estimates therefore depends on the availability of a number of administrative data files that are provided to Statistics Canada by Canadian and foreign government departments. Since some components are not available until several months after the reference date, three kinds of postcensal estimates are produced preliminary postcensal (PP), updated postcensal (PR) and final postcensal (PD). The time lag between the reference date and the release date is three to four months for preliminary estimates and two to three years for final estimates. Though it requires more vigilance on the part of users, the production of three successive series of postcensal estimates is the strategy that best satisfies the need for both timeliness and accuracy of the estimates. All tables in the CD-ROM indicate the level of the estimates they contain.

Calculation of postcensal population estimates

Population estimates – preliminary, updated and final – are produced by the component method. This method consists in taking the population figures from the most recent census, adjusted for census net undercoverage (CNU)¹ (census undercoverage minus census overcoverage), and adding or subtracting the number of births, deaths, and components of international and interprovincial migration.

A. Provincial / territorial estimates of total population

Population estimates are produced for the provinces and territories first; then they are summed to obtain an estimate of the population of Canada.

C. Levels of estimates

The difference between preliminary² and final postcensal population estimates lies in the timeliness of the components. When all the components are preliminary, the estimate is described as preliminary postcensal (PP). When they are all final, the estimate is referred to as final postcensal (PD). Any other combination of levels is referred to as updated postcensal (PR).

Base population and components of population growth

A. Base population

The base populations are derived from the quinquennial censuses between 1971 and 2006. The population universe of the 2006³ Census includes the following groups:

- Canadian citizens (by birth or by naturalization) and landed immigrants with a usual place of residence in Canada;
- Canadian citizens (by birth or by naturalization) and landed immigrants who are abroad, either on a military base or attached to a diplomatic mission;
- Canadian citizens (by birth or by naturalization) and landed immigrants at sea or in port aboard merchant vessels under Canadian registry;
- persons with a usual place of residence in Canada who are claiming refugee status and members of their families living with them;
- persons with a usual place of residence in Canada who hold Study Permits and members of their families living with them;
- persons with a usual place of residence in Canada who hold Work Permits and members of their families living with them.

2. Unless otherwise noted, the term *preliminary* include both preliminary and updated estimates.

3. From 1991 to 2001 Census, "persons with a usual place of residence in Canada who hold Minister's permits (including extensions) and members of their families living with them" were included in the census universe.

For census purposes, the last three groups in this list are referred to as non-permanent residents (NPR).

Foreign residents have not been enumerated since 1991. Foreign residents are persons who belong to the following groups:

- government representatives of another country attached to the embassy, high commission or other diplomatic body of that country in Canada, and members of their families living with them;
- members of the Armed Forces of another country who are stationed in Canada, and members of their families living with them;
- residents of another country visiting Canada temporarily (for example, a foreign visitor on vacation or on business, with or without a visitor's permit).

These populations are adjusted as follows:

- adjustment of the population for census net undercoverage (CNU);
- addition of independent estimates for incompletely enumerated Indian reserves in 1991, 1996, 2001 and 2006;
- adjustment for early enumeration in 1991 and 1996 in parts of northern Quebec, Newfoundland and Labrador, the Yukon and the Northwest Territories;
- addition of estimates of NPRs in 1971, 1976, 1981 and 1986. Since 1991, NPRs are included in the census universe;
- estimation of the July 1 base population by addition or subtraction of the components of growth between Census Day and June 30.

Adjustment for census net undercoverage (CNU)

The adjustment for CNU is important. CNU is the difference between the number of persons who should have been enumerated but were missed (undercoverage) and the number of persons who were enumerated but should not have been or who were counted more than once (overcoverage).

Coverage studies provide undercoverage estimates for the 1991, 1996, 2001 and 2006 Censuses at the provincial and territorial levels, and for the 1971, 1976, 1981 and 1986 Censuses at the provincial level only. Estimates of overcoverage at the provincial and territorial levels are available only for the last four censuses (1991, 1996, 2001 and 2006). Overcoverage for previous censuses was estimated by assuming that the overcoverage-to-undercoverage ratio for each census between 1971 and 1986 was the same as in 1991. The CNU for the Yukon and the Northwest Territories prior to 1991 was estimated by assuming that the ratio between the CNU for each territory and the 10 provinces for each census between 1971 and 1986 was the same as in 1991.

For consistency, 1991 Census undercoverage and overcoverage were revised in 1998 to take into account the methodological improvements made in the 1996 Census coverage studies. This revision altered the CNU in all censuses between 1971 and 1986. Similarly, 1996 Census undercoverage and overcoverage were revised in 2003.

Various methods were used to produce the estimates of CNU by age and sex for 1991, 1996, 2001 and 2006. First, the national estimates of CNU based on the coverage studies by age and sex were smoothed. Then an Empirical Bayes regression model was used to generate provincial and territorial estimates of CNU by broad age groups, and a synthetic model produced estimates by single year of age. Lastly, two-way raking⁴ was used to ensure that the CNU estimates were consistent with the provincial and territorial CNU totals and the national estimates by age and sex.

For the 1971 to 1986 period, the CNU estimates by age and sex were simply prorated to the revised CNU estimates for the total population.

4. Two-way raking is also referred to as the "Deming method", the "method of iterative proportions", and calibration (see Shryock, Siegel *et al.*, 1976: 547-549).

B. Births and deaths

Numbers of births and deaths are derived directly from the vital statistics database of Statistics Canada's Health Statistics Division. Although Statistics Canada manages the National system of vital statistics, the central vital statistics registries of the provinces and territories are responsible for collecting and processing the information from those administrative files. Under provincial / territorial vital statistics statutes (or similar legislation), all live births and all deaths must be registered, and all provinces and territories provide the information to Statistics Canada.

The vital statistics universe closely parallels the census universe. Both universes include births and deaths of all Canadians, immigrants and non-permanent residents (NPR) and exclude foreign residents.

Vital statistics by province or territory of residence are used to produce our final estimates of births and deaths.

When there are no vital statistics, the number of births is estimated using fertility rates by mother's age. The number of deaths is estimated using mortality rates by age and sex. These methods are used to calculate preliminary² estimates.

Special treatment for preliminary² estimates for Quebec and British Columbia.

Quebec and British Columbia provide their most recent estimates of births and deaths. The figures are used to produce preliminary² estimates. For the final estimates, the two provinces' births and deaths are derived from the vital statistics compiled by Health Statistics Division.

If current vital statistics are unavailable for sex, the number of births by sex is derived by applying the latest birth distribution from vital statistics to the preliminary birth estimates.

If current vital statistics are unavailable by age and sex, the number of deaths by age and sex is derived by applying the mortality distribution from the last two years provided by vital statistics to the preliminary death estimates.

Levels of estimates

For information on the differences between preliminary² and final estimates, see sections **B. Births and Deaths**, above.

C. Immigration

Like the numbers of births and deaths, Canadian immigration statistics must be kept by law. In Canada, immigration is regulated by the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (IRPA) of 2002. This statute superseded the Immigration Act, which was passed in 1976 and amended more than 30 times in the years thereafter. Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) collects and processes immigrants' administrative files. It then provides Statistics Canada with information from Field Operational Support System (FOSS) files. The information is used to estimate the number and characteristics of people granted permanent resident status by the federal government on a given date. For Demography Division, the terms immigrant and permanent resident are equivalent.

An immigrant is a person who is not a Canadian citizen by birth, but has been granted the right to live in Canada permanently by Canadian immigration authorities. The number of immigrants does not include persons born abroad to Canadian parents who are only temporarily outside the country.

Immigrants are usually counted on or after the date on which they are granted permanent resident status or the right to live in Canada.

The number of immigrants by age and sex is derived from the Field Operational Support System (FOSS).

Levels of estimates

The difference between preliminary² and final postcensal estimates lies in the timeliness of the source used to estimate this component. Since the FOSS file is continually being updated, new calculations are carried out each year to update the immigration estimates. Immigration estimates are preliminary the first year and final the following year.

D. Net non-permanent residents

Like the numbers of births and deaths, Canadian immigration statistics must be kept by law. In Canada, the non-permanent residents (NPR) are regulated by the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* (IRPA) of 2002. This statute superseded the *Immigration Act*, which was passed in 1976 and amended more than 30 times in the years thereafter. Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) collects and processes the administrative files of immigrants and NPRs in Canada. It then provides Statistics Canada with information from Field Operational Support System (FOSS) files. The information is used to estimate the number and characteristics of people granted non-permanent resident status by the federal government.

Non-permanent residents (NPR) are persons who are lawfully in Canada on a temporary basis under the authority of a temporary resident permit, along with members of their family living with them. Non-permanent residents (NPR) include foreign workers, foreign students, the humanitarian population and other temporary residents. The humanitarian population includes refugee claimants and temporary residents who are allowed to remain in Canada on humanitarian grounds and are not categorized as either foreign workers or foreign students. For Demography Division, the terms non-permanent resident and temporary resident are equivalent.

Estimates of the number of NPR are based on population estimates. The number of people in CIC's system is estimated on a specific date in each year of observation. First, the end-of-period population is estimated, and then the start-of-period population is subtracted from that estimate. That yields the net number of NPR.

Anyone who received non-permanent resident status prior to the observation date is counted. For refugee claimants, the date of their application is used. Permit holders and refugee claimants are excluded from the population if their permit has expired, if they receive permanent resident status, or if they are deported. In addition, refugee claimants are excluded if their file has been inactive for two years.

Since the FOSS file is continually being updated, the figures are recalculated for each new release period to update the estimates of the net number of NPR in Canada.

The net number of non-permanent residents by age and sex is derived from the Field Operational Support System (FOSS).

Levels of estimates

The difference between preliminary² and final estimates lies in the timeliness of the source used to estimate this component. Since the FOSS file is continually being updated, the figures are recalculated for each new release period to update the estimates of the net number of NPRs. Non-permanent resident (NPR) estimates are preliminary the first year and updated the following year. They become final two to three years after the reference year, when all other components are also final.

E. Emigration

The number of emigrants is estimated using data from the Office of Immigration Statistics, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, data collected by the Canada Child Tax Benefit (CCTB) program, and data from the T1 Family File (T1FF).⁵ The first source is used to estimate emigration to the United States. CCTB data are used to estimate emigration to other countries. The estimates of the number of child emigrants have to be adjusted because the CCTB is not universal and does not provide direct information on the number of adult emigrants. As a result, four adjustment factors are used to take into account:

- incomplete coverage due to a delay in the receipt and processing of the files of children eligible for the CCTB. Since it seems to take four years after the reference period for CCTB administrative files to become complete, the adjustment is made if the estimates are finalized after two years. The factor is derived from the two-year ratios of emigrant children based on two versions of the CCTB files;
- the program's partial coverage, that is, people who do not apply for the CCTB or are not eligible. This factor is obtained by comparing the estimated number of children in the population with the number of children in CCTB files;
- the differential propensity to emigrate between children who are eligible for the CCTB and children who are not. This factor is obtained by comparing the emigration rates of CCTB-eligible children with the rates for all children (aged 0 to 17). This factor is calculated for each province and territory and is based on the last three available years of T1FF;⁴
- the differential propensity to emigrate between adults and children. This factor generates the emigration rate for the population aged 18 and over. It is obtained by (1) calculating the average ratio over three years of the adult and child emigration rates based on T1FF⁴ data, (2) calculating the average ratio over three years of the adult and child emigration rates based on data from the Office of Immigration Statistics, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, and (3) taking the average of the two rates. This factor is calculated for Canada only.

The adult emigration rate is applied to the adult population to generate the number of adult emigrants, which is then added to the number of child emigrants to produce the number of emigrants for the entire population.

Emigration is disaggregated by province and territory based on the number of child emigrants adjusted for coverage and differential emigration.

Estimates of the number of emigrants by age and sex are obtained by disaggregating the broad age groups in the T1FF⁵ into five-year age groups based on data from the Office of Immigration Statistics, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, and disaggregating those estimates into single years of age using Sprague coefficients. The same distribution is used for all provinces and territories.

Levels of estimates

The difference between preliminary² and final estimates lies in the timeliness of the sources used to estimate this component. The same estimation method is used.

5. The T1 family file (T1FF) is derived from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) T1 file by Income Statistics Division of Statistics Canada.

F. Net temporary emigration

Some people leave Canada to live temporarily in another country; others who were temporarily outside Canada return. The net result of those departures and returns is the component known as “net temporary emigration”. Estimates of the number of departures are derived from the Reverse Record Check (RRC), the most important census coverage study. The RRC provides an estimate of the number of people who left Canada temporarily during an intercensal period and are still out of the country at the end of the period. Estimates of the number of returns are based on two sources: the Census and Demography Division’s estimates of returning emigrants. The census provides the number of people who were outside Canada at the time of the previous census and returned during the intercensal period. That number includes all returning emigrants. Then Demography Division’s estimate of the returning emigrants’ component is subtracted to produce the number of returning temporary emigrants. The estimated numbers of departures (RRC) and returns (Census and Demography Division) yield an estimate of net temporary emigration.

That estimate is for the whole intercensal period; it is disaggregated into estimates for each of the five years in the period and then into monthly estimates using a seasonal adjustment that is an average between zero seasonality and the seasonality of emigration.

Net temporary emigration is calculated first for the national level. It is then disaggregated by province or group of provinces based on the RRC estimates of temporary emigration. For the Atlantic provinces and the territories, the estimate for the group is disaggregated on the basis of each province / territory’s proportion of the group’s total population.

Net temporary emigration can be estimated only for the intercensal period preceding the most recent census. Net temporary emigration in the current period is assumed to be the same as in the previous period for each province and territory.

The emigration age and sex distribution is applied to obtain the age and sex structure of the net temporary emigration.

Levels of estimates

The difference between preliminary² and final estimates lies in the timeliness of the emigration estimate used to calculate the seasonal adjustment for the net temporary emigration. The same estimation method is used.

G. Returning emigrants

A returning emigrant is a person who returns to Canada after having been classified as an emigrant. In a manner similar to the procedure used to calculate the number of emigrants, data from the Canada Child Tax Benefit (CCTB) file and the Canada Revenue Agency’s (CRA) ‘s T1FF⁴ are used to estimate the number of returning emigrants. Adjustment factors are applied to compensate for the fact that the CCTB program is not universal, and an adult/child ratio is used to estimate the number of adult returning emigrants. As a result, three adjustment factors are used to take into account:

- the program’s partial coverage, that is, people who do not apply for the CCTB or are not eligible. This factor is obtained by comparing the estimated number of children in the population with the number of children in CCTB files;
- the differential propensity to emigrate between children who are eligible for the CCTB and children who are not. This factor is obtained by comparing the emigration rates of CCTB-eligible children with the rates for all children (aged 0 to 17). This factor is calculated for each province and territory and is based on the last three available years of T1FFs;⁴
- the adult / child ratio, which is based on the census used in estimating the base population.

The age and sex distribution of returning emigrants is based on Census of Canada data. Characteristics of returning emigrants are derived from census mobility data 1 year ago, after excluding non-permanent residents and immigrants. From 2006/2007, we are using distribution by age and sex derived from 2006 Census.

Levels of estimates

The difference between preliminary² and final estimates lies in the timeliness of the sources used to estimate this component. The same estimation method is used.

H. Interprovincial migration

Interprovincial migration represents movements from one province or territory to another, involving a change in usual place of residence. As is the case for emigration, there is no provision for recording interprovincial migration in Canada. Consequently, such movements have to be estimated using data from the Canada Child Tax Benefit (CCTB) of Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and the T1FF.⁴

Final estimates of interprovincial migration are obtained by comparing addresses indicated on personal income tax returns over two consecutive tax years. However, the migration status of taxfilers' dependants has to be imputed. An adjustment is also required to take into account migrants who do not file income tax returns. From 2001/2002 to 2005/2006, the adjustment was slightly modified (for further information, see *Wilkinson, 2004*). From 2006/2007, this adjustment has been slightly modified (Cyr, 2008 – Internal document).

Since income tax returns are not available at the time preliminary estimates are produced, the estimation of preliminary² interprovincial migration is based on CCTB administrative files, which provide counts of child migrants (aged 0 to 17) receiving benefits under the program. The estimates have to be adjusted later for children who are not receiving the CCTB. Finally, the number of adult migrants is calculated using the number of child migrants and factors derived from the T1FF.⁴ As a result, three adjustment factors are used to take into account:

- the program's partial coverage, that is, people who do not apply for the CCTB or are not receiving benefits. This factor is obtained by comparing the estimated number of children in the population with the number of children in CCTB files;
- the differential propensity to migrate between children who are receiving the CCTB and children who are not. This factor is obtained by comparing the out-migration rates of children receiving the CCTB with the rates for all children (aged 0 to 17). This factor is calculated for each province and territory and is based on the last available year of T1FFs;⁴
- the differential propensity to migrate between adults and children. This factor generates the out-migration rate of the population aged 18 and over for each province / territory of origin and destination. It is obtained by calculating the ratio of the central migration rate for adults to the rate for children. It is estimated using data from the last three available years of T1FFs.⁴

The adult migration rate is then applied to the estimated adult population. The number of adult migrants is then added to the number of child migrants to produce the number of interprovincial migrants for the entire population.

Interprovincial migration by age and sex is derived from T1FF⁵ data and counts from the last available census (1- year mobility variable). From 2006/2007, the 2006 Census age and sex distribution is used.

Levels of estimates

For information on the differences between preliminary² and final estimates of total interprovincial migration, see section **H. Interprovincial migration** above.

Intercensal population estimates

Intercensal estimates – population estimates for reference dates between two censuses – are produced following each census. They reconcile previous postcensal estimates with the new census counts.

There are two main steps in the production of intercensal estimates:

- calculation of the error of closure;
- linear distribution of the error of closure.

Error of closure is defined as the difference between the postcensal population estimates on Census Day and the population enumerated in that census (after adjustment for census net undercoverage (CNU)).¹

The error of closure is spread uniformly over the intercensal period of days within each month.

Intercensal estimates by age and sex are adjusted in the same way, i.e., by distributing the error of closure uniformly across the age-sex cohorts.

Quality of demographic data

The estimates contain certain inaccuracies stemming from two types of errors:

- errors in the census data;
- imperfections in other data sources and the method used to estimate the components.

Census Data

A. Coverage, response and imputation errors

The errors attributable to census data can be divided into two groups: response and processing errors, and coverage errors. The first group implies non-response error, misinterpretation by respondents, incorrect coding and non-response imputation. Errors in the second group primarily result from undercoverage and, to a lesser extent, overcoverage. It should be noted that both types of errors are intrinsic to any survey data.

The coverage errors occur when dwellings and/or individuals are missed, incorrectly included or counted more than once. Following each census, Statistics Canada undertakes coverage studies to measure these errors. The main studies are the Reverse Record Check Survey (RRC) and the Census Overcoverage Study (COS). Based on these studies, estimates of census net undercoverage (CNU) (which is equal to the difference between undercoverage and overcoverage) are produced. Demography Division adjusts the population enumerated in the census by province and territory using these estimates.

When creating base populations, the Estimates Program corrects the census populations only for coverage errors. This correction, which is based on the findings of coverage studies, is primarily subject to sampling errors, and to a lesser extent, processing errors. Statistical tests indicate that coverage adjustments improve the quality of census data. The Estimates Program uses the estimates from coverage studies for the provinces and territories. However, given the size of the samples in these studies, estimates by age and sex are modelled. Furthermore, it is assumed that the coverage rates estimated for a province or territory apply to the regions within that geographic area. Prior to 1991, the Estimates Program used census data that was unadjusted for coverage errors. Coverage studies had been done to measure undercoverage, but none measured overcoverage. Following the decision to integrate a correction for the coverage to the enumerated population in 1991, the Program had to revise the population estimates for the period from 1971 to 1986. The correction is based on the findings of the coverage studies conducted during this period and on hypotheses regarding the ratio between the overcoverage and undercoverage levels based on the findings of subsequent coverage studies.

Nevertheless, the corrections to the census data due to CNU improved, in general, the quality of the estimates by compensating for the differential undercoverage by age, sex and by province/territory across censuses.

The adjustment also incorporates the results of a study on the estimates of the number of people living on incompletely enumerated Indian reserves to complete the corrections for coverage errors in the census. The results of the coverage studies contain mainly sampling errors.

These adjustments have a direct impact on:

- the error of closure and its distribution by age and sex within a province or a territory as well as by province/territory as the CNU¹ and its distribution vary from one census to another;
- within-cohort consistency of population estimates. If for example, the male cohort in age group 0- to 4 in 1981 was tracked up to the 2001 Census (unadjusted for CNU)¹ the age group 20- to 24 would be noticeably smaller in 2001 than the age group 15- to 19 in 1996. Since Canada receives many immigrants within these age groups, the opposite would be expected. However, only after adjustment for CNU,¹ the cohort size increases from 1996 to 2001.

Components

Errors due to estimation methodologies and data sources other than the census can also be significant.

A. Births and deaths

Since the law requires the recording of vital statistics, the final estimates for births and deaths data meet very high standards. Nevertheless, since preliminary estimates are derived, they can be slightly different from final estimates.

B. Immigration and non-permanent residents

With respect to immigrants and NPRs, Citizenship and Immigration Canada administers special data files on both of these components. Since immigration is controlled by law, data on immigrants and non-permanent residents (NPRs) are compiled upon arrival in Canada. These data represent only "legal" immigration and exclude illegal immigrants. Thus, for the "legal" part of international movement into Canada, the data are considered to be of high quality. However, some biases such as the difference between the stated province of intended residence at the time of arrival and the actual province of residence, may persist. Finally, since information provided by the Visitor Data System (VDS) from Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) is not complete (age and sex of dependents, province of residence for certain groups of permit holders), estimates of NPRs are more prone to error than data on immigrants.

C. Emigration, returning emigration and net temporary emigration

Of all the demographic components that are used in the population estimates program, these components are the most difficult to estimate with precision. Canada does not have a complete border registration system. While immigration and non-permanent residents (NPRs) are well documented by the federal government, Statistics Canada has always used techniques of indirect estimation in the estimation of persons leaving the country. For this reason, available statistics regarding these three components have historically been of a lower quality than other components.

Estimates of the number of emigrants and returning emigrants are both derived using Canada Child Tax Benefit (CCTB) data provided by Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). Data are adjusted to take into account the incomplete coverage of the program and to derive the emigration and returning emigration of adults.

These adjustments and the delay in obtaining the data are the two main sources of errors. As current information on the number of persons living temporarily abroad does not exist, estimates are based on the Reverse Record Check (RRC) and the census. Estimates for the intercensal period, distributed equally among the five years, are maintained constant for the postcensal period. Moreover, assumptions were made to allow for the distribution of annual estimates to a quarterly level. Any geographical or quarterly variation may introduce error in the estimation of these components.

D. Interprovincial migration

Since July 1993, preliminary² interprovincial migration estimates have been based on Canada Child Tax Benefit (CCTB) files. Under this program, only 76% of children aged 0- to 17 at the Canada level were entitled to benefits on July 1, 2001. Consequently, preliminary CCTB based estimates are subject to larger error than final estimates derived from Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) tax files.

E. Level of detail of components

As a more detailed breakdown of the data introduces a greater risk of inaccuracy into the estimates, the possibility of error in the components is augmented by the method used to distribute the estimates by age and sex. It seems that, in general, the initial errors should be minimal where the distribution of annual estimates of births, deaths and immigrants is concerned, and more significant with regard to the distribution of other components (non-permanent residents, emigrants, returning emigrants, net temporary emigrants and interprovincial migrants). Finally, the size of error due to the age and /sex distribution may vary by period and errors in some components may have a greater impact on a given age group or sex.

Quality assessment

In order to assess the quality of our estimates, two evaluation measures are used: precocity errors and errors of closure.

A. Precocity error

Precocity error allows for useful comparisons between components, as well as between provinces and territories or geographical areas of different population size. Note that when compared to the total population for an area, the differences between preliminary and final estimates of the components are quite small. There are, however, differences in the amount of impact on the population estimates between components and between provinces and territories.

The quality of preliminary estimates of components is analyzed using precocity errors. Precocity error is defined as the difference between preliminary and final estimate of a particular component in terms of its relative proportion of the total population for the relevant geographical area. It can be calculated for both population and component estimates.

Generally speaking, net interprovincial migration yields the greatest precocity errors. This is likely the result of the use of different data sources for preliminary and final estimates. In most years and for most provinces/territories, births, deaths and immigration estimates yielded the smallest precocity errors. For immigration estimates, this reflects the completeness of the data source and the availability of data for the more timely preliminary estimates. In the case of births and deaths, small precocity errors are due to the use of a different method (method of ratios) for preliminary estimates.

According to the analysis of the most recent precocity errors and assuming that the quality of the basic data remains constant, the present postcensal estimates should have an acceptable degree of reliability.

Precocity errors by age and sex are not currently available.

B. Error of closure

The error of closure measures the exactness level of the final postcensal estimates. It can be defined as the difference between the enumerated population of the most recent census (after adjustments for census net undercoverage (CNU)¹ and the most current postcensal population estimates as of Census Day.

The error of closure comes from two sources: the relative differences in the amount of CNU¹ and errors in the components of demographic growth over the intercensal period. This can be calculated for total population estimates and for age, sex and marital status. With each 5-year intercensal period, the error of closure can only be calculated with the release of census data and estimates of CNU.¹

The error of closure can be calculated for total population estimates and for age and sex.

By dividing the error of closure by the census population adjusted for CNU,¹ the differences are relatively small at the national level (0.16% for 2001 and 0.32% for 2006). At the provincial and territorial level, differences are understandably larger, since the estimates are also affected by errors in estimating interprovincial migration. Nevertheless, the provincial/territorial final postcensal estimates generally fall within 1% of the adjusted census population, except for the territories that falls within closer adjustments.

Appendix A

Glossary

Age

Age as of July 1.

Ageing (of a population)

An increase in the **number of old persons** as a percentage of the total population.

Average age

The average age of a population is the average age of all its members.

Census coverage

Census net undercoverage: Difference between undercoverage and overcoverage.

Overcoverage: Number of persons who should not have been counted in the census or who were counted more than once.

Undercoverage: Number of persons who were intended to have been enumerated in a census but were not enumerated.

Cohort

Represents a group of persons who have experienced a specific demographic event during a given year. Thus, the married cohort of 2001 consists of the number of persons who got married in 2001. In the case of births, persons born within a specified year are referred to as a generation.

Components of demographic growth

Any of the classes of events generating population movement variations. Births, deaths and migrations are the components responsible for the variation since they alter either the total population or the age and sex of the population.

Dependency ratio

The **ratio of the combined population** aged between **0 to 14 years old** and the population **aged 65 years** and over to the population aged between **15 to 64 years old**.

Emigrants

Canadian citizen or **immigrant** who has left Canada to establish a permanent residence in another country.

Error of closure

Difference between the **postcensal estimate** for the same date as the census and the results of the census adjusted for **census net undercoverage** (including adjustment for incompletely enumerated Indian reserves).

Generation

Unless otherwise specified, refers here to a group of persons born within a given period. The 2001 generation represents people born during the year 2001.

Immigrant

Within the framework of this publication, the term immigrant refers to **landed immigrant**. A landed immigrant is a person who does not have Canadian citizenship but was granted the right by immigration authorities to live in Canada on a permanent basis.

International migration

International migration represents movement of population between Canada and a foreign country which involves a change in the usual place of residence. A distinction is made with regard to **immigrants, emigrants, returning emigrants, net temporary emigrants** and **net non-permanent residents**.

Interprovincial migration

Interprovincial migration represents movement from one province or territory involving a permanent change in residence. A person who takes up residence in another province or territory is an **out-migrant** with reference to the province or territory of origin and an **in-migrant** with reference to the province or territory of destination.

Median age

The median age is an age "x", such that exactly one half of the population is older than "x" and the other half is younger than "x".

Natural increase

Variation in population size over a given period as a result of the difference between the numbers of births and deaths.

Net international migration

Net international migration is obtained according to the following formula: **Immigrants + returning emigrants + net non permanent residents– (emigrants + net temporary emigrants)**

Net interprovincial migration

Net interprovincial migration represents the difference between **in-migrants** and **out-migrants** for a given province or territory.

Net non-permanent residents

Net non-permanent residents represent the variation in the number of non-permanent residents between two dates.

Non-permanent residents

A non permanent resident belongs to one of the five following groups:

- persons residing in Canada claiming refugee status;
- persons residing in Canada who hold a study permit;
- persons residing in Canada who hold a work permit;

- persons residing in Canada who hold a minister's permit;
- all non-Canadian born dependants of persons claiming refugee status, or of persons holding study permits, work permits or minister's permits and living in Canada.

Net temporary emigration

Net temporary emigration represents the variation in the number of temporary emigrants between two dates. Temporary emigration includes Canadian citizens and **immigrants** living temporarily abroad who have not maintained a usual place of residence in Canada.

Population

Estimated population and population according to the census are both defined as being the number of Canadians whose usual place of residence is in that area, regardless of where they happened to be on Census Day. Also included are any Canadians staying in a dwelling in that area on Census Day and having no usual place of residence elsewhere in Canada, as well as those considered **non-permanent residents**.

Population estimate

- postcensal:** Population estimate produced by using data from the most recent available census adjusted for **censusnet undercoverage** (including adjustment for incompletely enumerated Indian reserves) and estimate of the **components of demographic growth** since that last census. This estimate can be preliminary, updated or final.
- intercensal:** Population estimate derived by using **postcensal estimates** and data adjusted for **censusnet undercoverage** (including adjustment for incompletely enumerated Indian reserves) of censuses preceding and following the year in question.

Population growth or total growth

Variation of population size between two dates. It can also be obtained by summing the **natural increase**, **total net migration** and if possible, subtract **residual deviation**. It can be positive or negative.

Precocity error

Difference between preliminary and final estimate of a particular component in terms of its relative proportion of the total population for the relevant geographical area. It can be calculated for both population estimates and component of population growth.

Rate

Refers to the ratio of the number of events estimated in a year ($t, t+1$) to the average populations at the beginning and the end of the period. In this regard, birth, death, immigration rates, etc are calculated. Generally, the rate is expressed in per 1,000.

Demographic growth rate or population growth rate: Ratio of population growth between the year t and $t+1$, to the average **population** of both these years. The rate is generally expressed in per 1,000.

Overcoverage of population rate: The ratio of the number of persons who should not have been counted in the census or who were counted more than once to the total number of persons that should have been enumerated in the census. Generally, the rate is expressed in percentage.

Undercoverage of population rate: The ratio of the estimated number of persons not enumerated in the census (who were intended to have been enumerated) to the total number of persons that should have been enumerated in the census. Generally, the rate is expressed in percentage.

Census net undercoverage of population rate: The difference between the census undercoverage rate and the census overcoverage rate.

Residual deviation

Difference between demographic **population growth** calculated using **intercensal estimates** of population between two dates and that obtained by the sum of the components for the same period. This deviation results from the distribution of the **error of closure** between years within the quinquennial period. This distribution is calculated by taking into account the number of days within each month.

Returning emigrants

Canadian citizen or **immigrant** having previously emigrated from Canada and subsequently returned to the country.

Sex ratio

The ratio of the number of men to the number of women. This is not to be confused with the sex ratio at birth, which is the ratio of the number of live-born boys to the number of live-born girls. This ratio is usually expressed as an index, with the number of females taken to be a base of 100.

Sprague coefficients

Series of factors which, when multiplied to a population distributed by multiples age groups, give a distribution of the same population by single years of age.

Total net migration

Sum of **net international** and **net interprovincial** migration.

Vital events

Includes all the demographic events (that is to say births, deaths, marriages and divorces) for which there exists a legal requirement to inform the Provincial or Territorial Registrar's Office.

Year

Unless otherwise specified, the term "year" refers to the period beginning July 1 of a given year and ending June 30 of the following year.
