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Preface

A co-operative is an enterprise that is jointly owned by the members who use its services. All members of a co-op are equal decision makers in the enterprise, using a democratic system of one-member, one-vote. In turn, all members share the benefits of co-operation, based on how much they use the co-operative's services.

Co-operatives serve both economic and social purposes. While a co-op exists to meet the common needs of its members, it also promotes the development of those members through their involvement in the democratic governance of the enterprise. At the same time, the co-operative usually undertakes local social development or economic development activities, such as creating jobs or providing goods and services that would otherwise be unavailable to the community.

Co-ops take different forms and operate in all sectors of the economy, but a co-op is generally set up by a group of people who share a common need. By pooling their resources and working together, the members can satisfy that need through the co-operative.

Canada's co-operatives play a vital role in the Canadian economy by providing essential goods and services to a significant portion of the population in areas such as retail, agriculture, manufacturing, housing and health care. This publication presents a statistical overview of the co-operative system in Canada to a wide and diverse audience.

Methodology

The statistics used in this publication are based on various sources:

- Reporting by non-financial co-operatives to the "Canadian Annual Survey of Co-operatives" undertaken by the Co-operatives Secretariat.
- Data on non-financial co-operatives collected by provincial/territorial governments and Industry Canada, including information such as incorporations, dissolutions, name changes and amalgamations.
- Data on financial co-operatives is extracted from the Credit Union Central of Canada (CUCC) website and from Statistics Canada.
- In cases of non-reporting to the Canadian Annual Survey of Co-operatives, the data is estimated once it is confirmed that the co-operative is still operating actively.

Data is presented as follows:

- Data on non-financial co-operatives are presented by activity and by area of incorporation (provincial/territorial/federal).
- Data on credit unions and *caisses populaires* are presented by province.

Note: In the tables, itemized sums may not equal totals because of rounding off of figures.

CO-OPERATIVES IN CANADA

2005 STATUS

The 2005 statistics are based on survey results received from 5,714 non-financial co-operatives representing 5.9 million members, \$27.7 billion in total revenues and \$17.7 billion in assets. These co-operatives employed 87,716 people, of which over 77% were full-time employees, including wholesale co-operatives and federations. Of these co-operatives, 896 were agricultural, representing over 346,000 active memberships and employing close to 33,000 individuals with total revenues of \$13 billion and assets of \$5.3 billion.

The number of non-financial co-operatives participating in the survey decreased by 1.1% from 2004, however membership increased by 5.1%. The volume of business and number of employees for these co-ops rose by 0.6% and 0.3% respectively. Total assets increased by 1.1%.

The number of agricultural co-operatives participating in the survey decreased slightly by 4.1%, and active memberships were down 4.6%. Agricultural volume of business and assets were down 7.7% and 5.7% respectively. The total number of employees of agricultural co-operatives was also lower by 1.0%.

PRODUCER CO-OPERATIVES

Co-operatives play a crucial role in the agricultural sector of the Canadian economy, particularly in farm supply and in the processing and marketing of grains and oilseeds, dairy products, poultry, fruits, vegetables, livestock, as well as honey and maple products.

Agricultural marketing co-operatives are, for the most part, modern enterprises that use the latest technology to process and add value to farm products. A few large co-operatives account for the largest part of total revenues, including Agropur and Gay Lea Foods for dairy, La Coop fédérée for meat and poultry processing and Exceldor for poultry slaughtering and processing. The 151 marketing co-operatives that reported represent a major economic force with a combined business volume of over \$8.2 billion and assets of \$3.0 billion. In 2005, these co-ops marketed over \$6.8 billion in agricultural products in Canada and abroad (see Table 4).

2005 marks the first year in which sales in grains and oilseeds from the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool and poultry sales from Lilydale ceased, as both co-operatives demutualized during the course of the year.

The market share of agricultural marketing co-operatives is accentuated in the following areas: poultry and eggs (38%); dairy (40%); honey and maple (25%); grains and oilseeds (8%); and livestock (18%) (see Appendix E).

In **farm supply**, co-operatives play an indispensable role in the provision of farm inputs. They provide member co-operatives and producers with a broad range of farm inputs, including fertilizers and chemicals, animal feed, seed, building materials and petroleum products. The 216 supply co-operatives that reported have a total revenue of \$4.8 billion, an increase of 9.5% from 2004. In farm supply market share, the strongest areas are farm petroleum (52%), fertilizers and chemicals (13%), and animal feed (14%) (see Appendix E).

2005 also marks the first year in which fertilizer and chemical sales from the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool ceased due to the demutualization mentioned previously.

Eight of the top ten agricultural co-operatives in Canada are marketing organizations and two supply co-operatives round out the Top 10 (see Appendix H).

A total of 55 **fishery co-operatives** responded to the survey, one less than in 2004. They reported \$251.7 million in revenues, a 5.8% increase over 2004. Assets increased by 11.6% to reach \$95.5 million (see Tables 10 and 11).

Production co-operatives include **feeder, grazing, agricultural machinery, animal reproduction, forestry and handicraft** co-operatives. The 603 production co-operatives responding to the survey reported a combined volume of business of \$605.6 million. Those in Québec accounted for over 65% of the total volume of business. Québec revenues were derived primarily from the sale of forest products. Québec has the largest number of production co-operatives with 204 organizations reporting. There are two main activities of production co-operatives: management of feeder finance operations and management of grazing operations, with 141 and 134 enterprises respectively, accounting for 45% of all production co-operatives (see Tables 12 and 13 and Appendix B).

CONSUMER CO-OPERATIVES

At the local level, **consumer co-operatives** vary in size and sophistication, from small buying clubs to large supermarket organizations and wholesalers. These “conventional stores” obtain sales in the usual manner with any “surplus” being returned at year’s end based on patronage (purchases of each member at their co-operative). Revenues from the consumer group totalled \$11.8 billion, with food products accounting for 37% of the total and petroleum products, dry goods and home hardware being the other main items sold (see Table 6).

The 288 member co-operatives of Federated Co-operatives Limited had total revenues of \$4.8 billion, placing them first in revenues of all non-financial co-operatives. The 109 member co-operatives of Co-op Atlantic had revenues of \$564 million.

Calgary Co-op Association Ltd. is one of the largest retail co-operatives in North America. Their sales include food products, hardware, clothing, home furnishings, pharmaceuticals, petroleum products and building materials, as well as providing travel services.

Mountain Equipment Co-op (MEC), headquartered in Vancouver, British Columbia, specializes in the sale of equipment for outdoor activities. With 2.2 million members across Canada, it provides a catalogue sales service and operates eight stores outside British Columbia in Toronto, Ottawa, Calgary, Winnipeg, Edmonton, Québec, Montréal and Halifax.

Although Québec and Ontario consumer co-operatives are smaller and less influential, they are well-established organizations, however, the vast majority are located outside large urban areas.

A decreasing number of consumer co-operatives operate as “**direct charge**” co-operatives. In 2005, 16 of these co-ops reported to the survey, most of them located in Québec. They reported revenues of \$117.7 million, assets of \$28.5 million and 20,626 members. The concept of the “direct charge” system is that goods are provided to members at cost and a weekly service fee is charged to cover operating costs.

Student supply co-operatives have gained a strong foothold, particularly in Québec, where 89 co-operatives are active. These co-operatives reported a volume of business of nearly \$154.8 million with over 521,113 members. They provide students with various school supplies, from stationery to textbooks. Several student supply co-operatives operate cafeterias and offer driver education courses (see Appendix A).

Service co-operatives make up the largest number of co-operatives in Canada. 4,167 of these co-operatives responded to the survey, accounting for 73% of all non-financial co-operatives. They reported a volume of business of \$1.9 billion, a 1.1% decrease from 2004.

The largest single area of co-operative activity in the service sector is **housing**, where 2,202 co-operatives responded to the survey reporting assets of \$5.5 billion and memberships totalling 115,197. In addition to housing co-operatives, which focus on providing housing to their members, there are other types of co-operatives that provide services related to housing; 68 of those co-operatives participated in the survey. Most of them are co-operative housing resource groups involved with the development of emerging housing co-operatives. The concept of equity

housing co-operatives, which are involved with the management of common assets, exists only in British Columbia and Alberta as of 2005; only six of these responded to the survey (see Appendix C).

There are two types of **child care co-operatives: daycare and nursery school**. Daycare co-operatives are set up by parents to provide daytime care for their children during working hours. Nursery school co-operatives, however, put more emphasis on education and social interaction, which allow parents to have more free time. Child care co-operatives are found predominantly in Ontario, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. There are 387 daycare and nursery school co-operatives reporting revenues of \$70.7 million and a membership totalling 34,089.

Health care co-operatives play an important role in many communities across Canada; 101 health care co-operatives responded to the survey reporting 77,469 members and revenues of \$158.3 million. **Home care co-ops** are found mostly in Québec, where the majority of them were only established in the past few years. A total of 51 reported from across Canada for the 2005 survey. Home care co-ops provide care primarily to elderly people in their homes.

Community development co-operatives foster local leadership skills and grassroots participation in innovation and solving social and economic problems. While these co-operatives are located throughout Canada, most of them are found in Saskatchewan. 300 development co-operatives reported with a total membership of 19,433, assets of \$58 million and revenues of \$56 million, an increase of 13.9% from 2004.

Funeral co-operatives are located mostly in Québec, although they have made some in-roads in the Maritimes, particularly in Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick. Fifty-five funeral co-operatives reported assets of \$127 million.

Water supply co-operatives are found mainly in Alberta, Manitoba and Québec; 160 of these co-operatives responded to the survey.

Natural gas and rural electric co-operatives are found almost exclusively in Alberta, where 62 of

these co-operatives participated in the survey. Canada wide, 66 of them reported memberships of 146,647 with assets of \$479.9 million and revenues of \$272.7 million.

Although **recreational co-operatives** are found in most provinces, they are most prevalent in the West, particularly in Saskatchewan. The 269 recreational co-operatives reporting were engaged in various activities, including the management of community centres, skating and curling rinks, golf courses, campgrounds and swimming pools.

A number of **transportation and communications co-operatives** are found throughout Canada. Of the 62 transportation co-operatives that reported, most of them were freight co-ops and taxi co-ops. They had revenues of \$90 million and assets of \$60.2 million. Over the past few years, car sharing co-operatives have been formed in large urban centres such as Vancouver and Toronto. These co-operatives supply shared vehicles to its members based on their needs, allowing them to save on the high costs of owning an automobile (\$9,000 average per year), which in turn helps reduce traffic congestion and pollution. Most of the 99 communications co-ops reporting were of the radio TV/cable and editing and publishing type. They reported 93,767 members, revenues of \$129.5 million and assets of \$215.3 million (for other service co-operatives see Appendix C).

WORKERS' CO-OPERATIVES

Workers' co-operatives are employee owned enterprises, most being located in the province of Québec. Canada wide, 341 of these co-operatives reported a total of 13,310 members with revenues of \$527 million and assets of \$312 million. They operate in a wide variety of fields, including **forestry co-operatives**, which accounted for 58% of the overall volume of business of workers' co-operatives in Canada, a total of \$307.1 million (see Appendix D).

Included in these numbers is the **worker/shareholder co-operative** in Québec. In this type of co-operative, employees can form a co-operative to buy a block of shares in an existing business, thus enabling them to have a voice at the board of directors level. The increasing interest

in workers' co-operatives reflects the determination of educated and informed people to have more control over their jobs and, consequently, their lives and communities. Worker co-operatives have also been identified as an option for business succession, particularly in rural and remote communities.

Another type of co-operative gaining popularity in Québec is the **multi-stakeholder** or **solidarity co-operative**. Membership is made up of different categories of partners: service users, employees and community organizations. Almost non-existent a few years ago, by 2005 some 147 multi-stakeholder co-operatives were incorporated in Québec. Many provide home care services to seniors and people with minor health problems.

FINANCIAL CO-OPERATIVES

CREDIT UNIONS AND CAISSES POPULAIRES

Credit unions and **caisses populaires** operate in all provinces, reporting assets of \$181.3 billion in 2005, an increase of 7.4% over 2004. Québec accounts for 47% of all credit unions and caisses populaire assets (see appendices F and G).

CO-OPERATIVES AND INSURANCE MUTUALS

This category, which encompasses **sales of insurance by co-operative enterprises and mutual companies applying co-operative principles**, includes some of the largest companies within Canada's insurance sector. Five insurance co-operatives and two insurance mutuals have over \$33.5 billion in assets and provide services to policy holders that represent 11.9 million certificates and policies¹.

It is important to note that data in the 2004 Co-operatives in Canada publication may not reflect data in the 2005 publication. This is due to a reclassification of certain co-operatives for one activity code to another.

¹ Due to availability of data, this edition presents the number of insurance policies and certificates instead of the number of policy holders as in previous editions.

Figure 1: Number and Membership of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

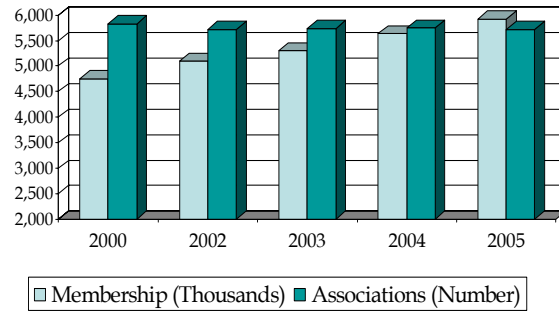


Figure 2: Volume of Business and Assets of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

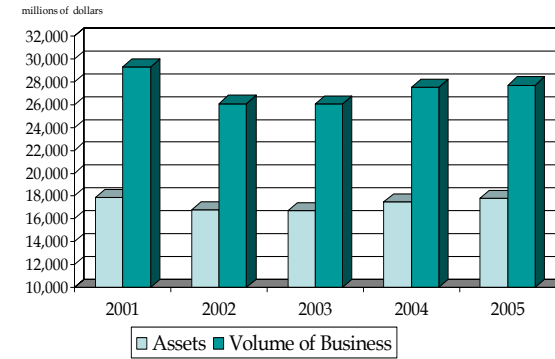
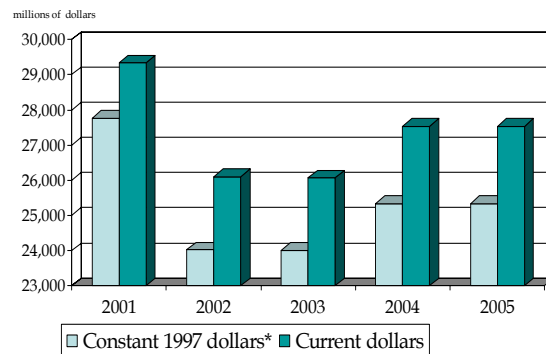


Figure 3: Volume of Business of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

Figure 4: Product Marketings, Consumer and Supply Sales of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

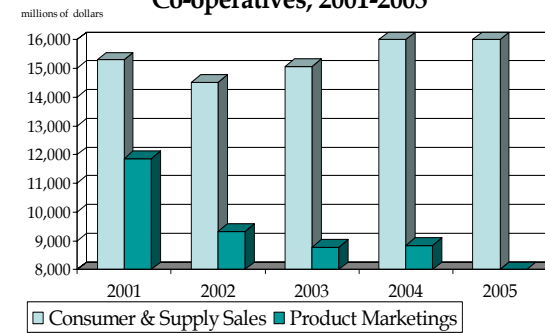


Figure 5: Products Marketed as a Percentage of Total Marketings by Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

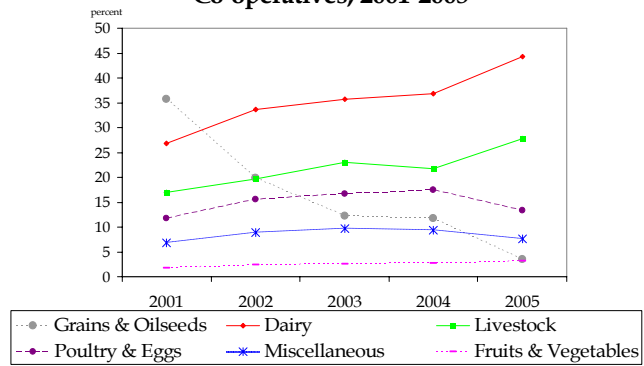
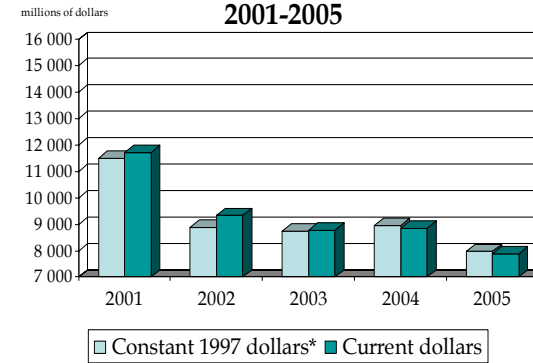
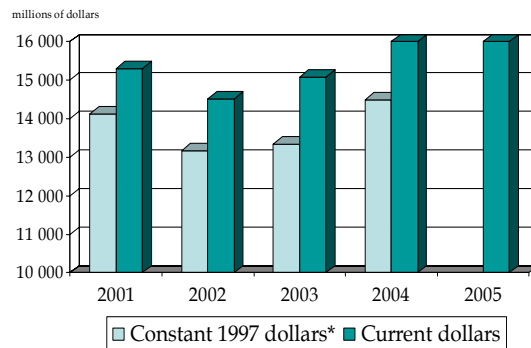


Figure 6: Product Marketings of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

Figure 8: Liabilities and Members' Equity of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

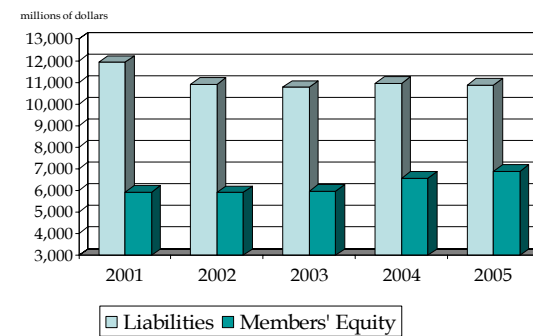


Figure 9: Members' Equity as a Percentage of Total Assets of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 2001-2005

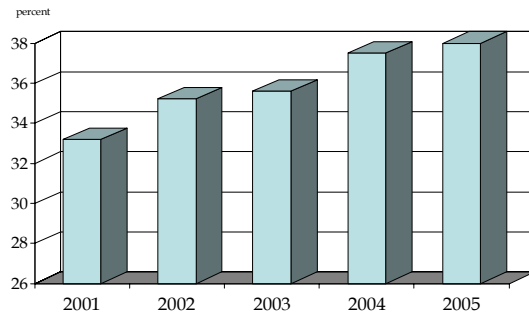


Figure 10: Five Year Moving Average, Number and Memberships of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 1997-2005*

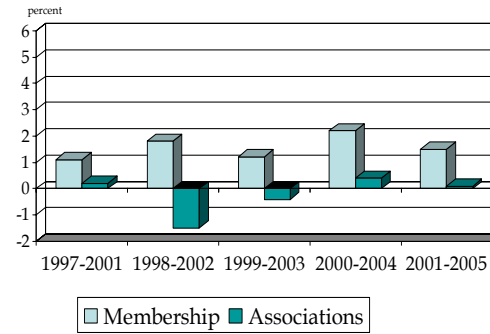
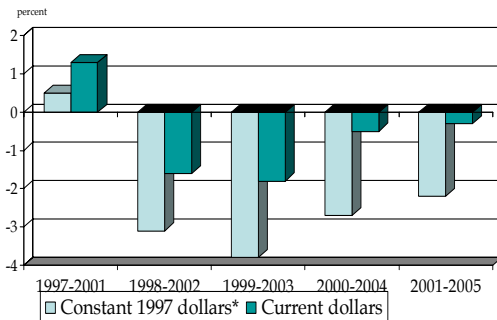
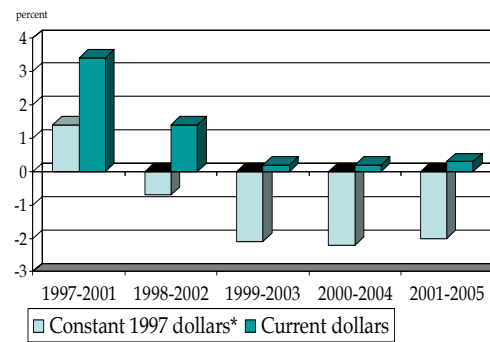


Figure 11: Five Year Moving Average, Volume of Business of Non-Financial Co-operatives, 1997-2005



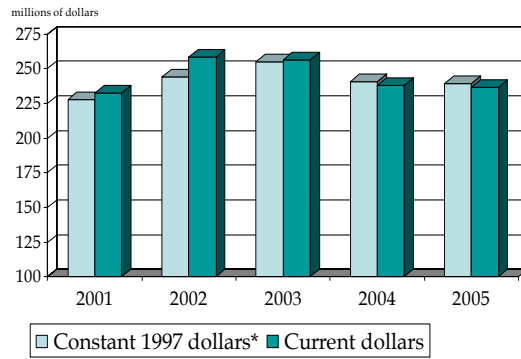

Figure 14: Number and Membership of Fishing Co-operatives, 2001-2005

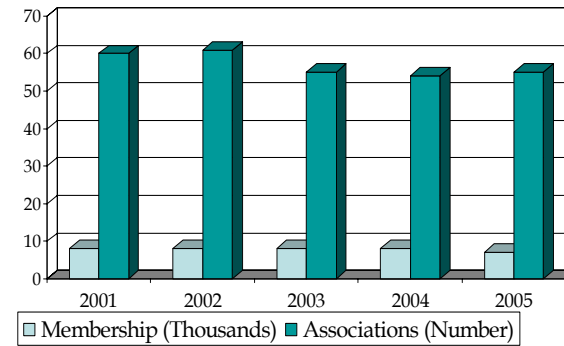


Figure 15: Service Revenues and Sales of Production Co-operatives, 2001-2005

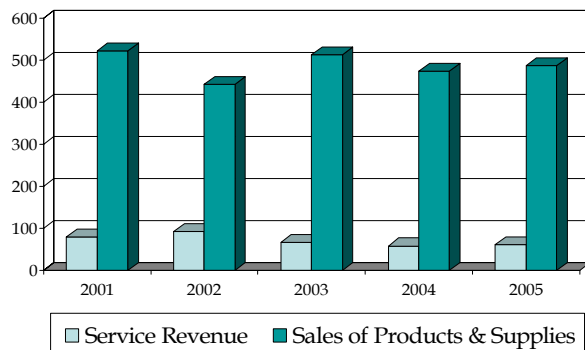


Figure 16: Number and Membership of Production Co-operatives, 2001-2005

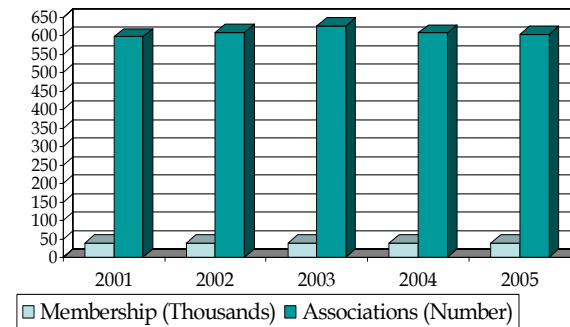
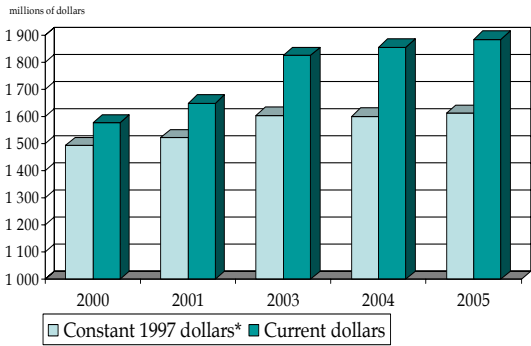


Figure 17: Volume of Business of Service Co-operatives, 2000-2005
