Your SDF: Dr. Alex Wilner



Dr. Wilner, a recipient of the SDF Ronald Baker Doctoral Scholarship, completed his PhD at Dalhousie University in December 2008. His dissertation is entitled *Deterring the Undeterrable: The Theory and Practice of Coercing Terrorists*; it applies deterrence theory to counterterrorism and assessed various coercive tactics being developed in Afghanistan.

In October 2008, Dr. Wilner began a Transatlantic Post-Doctoral Fellowship for International Relations and Security at the Center for Security Studies (CSS) in Zurich, Switzerland. Since then, he has accepted a Senior Research position at the CSS with the intention of further investigating counterterrorism in both theory and practice.

The Can-Am Sicily-Italy Staff Ride

The Gregg Centre for the Study of War and Society will once again run an advanced level battlefield ride to Sicily and Southern Italy from 14-24 May.
