
Message from the Director





Atlantic Military Affairs Symposium: Islanders at War and Peace







In partnership with the University of PEI and Maritime Canadian Forces Reserve units, the Gregg Centre will host the second annual two-day public conference entitled "Atlantic Military Affairs Symposium: Islanders at War and Peace" in Charlottetown at HMCS Queen Charlotte on 25-26 March.

Historians from the Maritimes and across Canada along with local soldiers, sailors and aircrew will discuss the role of Atlantic Canada in the defence of the nation. Presentations will be on subjects including the 19th Century militia, the region's contribution to the two world wars and the role of today's Atlantic Canadian reservists serving around the world.




