


Offer your students stimulating and educational experiences by participating in the Biosphere's activities!

This program for official-language minority communities offers free educational activities adapted to the needs and interests of high school students and teachers across Canada. These activities link the worlds of science and technology, and explore environmental themes such as water, climate change, responsible consumption, energy and biodiversity.

The Government of Canada is committed to encouraging linguistic duality among all Canadians. Its goal is to support the cultural vitality of communities by emphasizing the value of increased knowledge of both the English and French languages. In line with this approach, the Biosphere environment museum subscribes to government objectives of improving access to services for official-language minority communities, notably young people.

ABOUT THE BIOSPHERE

Architectural symbol of Expo 67, the Biosphere is a unique structure, located in the heart of Montréal in Parc Jean-Drapeau. As the only environment museum in North America, the Biosphere's mandate is to encourage citizens to take action and get involved in environmental issues. In addition to its general public programming and special events, the Biosphere is a recognized clearinghouse for environmental information.



THE BIOSPHERE AT YOUR SCHOOL

The Biosphere offers, all across Canada, four free thematic presentations by videoconference. Conferences at school are also offered to schools in some regions of Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Ontario.

Videoconferences

Offered to high school students from coast to coast, these activities link the worlds of science and technology. It is possible to connect several schools across Canada at the same time to encourage discussion among young people from various cities, provinces or territories. These 60-minute presentations are intended for students aged 12 and up in groups of 10 or more.

- · High-speed Internet.






This year, conferences at school are being offered to schools in some regions of Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Ontario.

A CHANGE IN THE AIR fosters discussion with an expert facilitator about the very latest scientific information on climate change, its impacts on the environment and what we can do about it.

Theme: Climate change



ONE WORLD ONE PLANET! sheds light on our consumption and its impacts, examining the life cycle of products and our ecological footprint. With an expert facilitator, students develop a critical mindset with respect to consumption and learn to reduce its effects on our planetary ecosystem.

Theme: Responsible consumption



DROP BY DROP helps students understand water's cycles and the importance of protecting it. Students discuss with an expert facilitator the impacts of human activities on water and the actions they can take to limit those impacts.

VARIETY IS THE SPICE OF LIFE! helps students understand the importance of biodiversity and the pressures we exert on the natural environment. With an expert facilitator, students discuss biodiversity and how to preserve it.
