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Canada's Health Care Providers— 2007 Provincial Profiles

Canada's Health Care Providers—2007 Provincial Profiles provides comparable information on health care provider population trends for 10 provinces and nationwide for 24 health occupations in Canada. It includes information on per capita population and gender breakdowns for the all-new 2007 reporting year, as well as regulatory information and counts for 1999, 2003 and 2007.

CIHI attempts to collect data from each province and territory in Canada. In many cases, however, data providers have combined Nunavut and Northwest Territories data, or data for all three northern territories including the Yukon. *Canada's Health Care Providers—2007 Provincial Profiles* focuses on the 10 provinces, while data on the northern territories are included in the nationwide totals.
