## Clethodim

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Under the authority of the *Pest Control Products Act*, Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has added new uses on highbush blueberries to the product labels of Centurion and Select Emulsifiable Concentrate Post-Emergence Herbicides, containing technical grade clethodim. The specific uses approved in Canada are detailed on the Centurion and Select labels, *Pest Control Products Act* Registration Numbers 27598 and 22625, respectively.

A corresponding maximum residue limit (MRL) was proposed in the consultation document published on 15 December 2011, Proposed Maximum Residue Limit PMRL2011-52, *Clethodim*. The PMRA received no comments in response to this consultation.

To comply with Canada's international trade obligations, consultation on the proposed MRL was also conducted internationally by notifying the World Trade Organization, as coordinated by the Standards Council of Canada. No comments were received as a result of the World Trade Organization consultation.

The following MRL takes legal effect as of the publication date of this document and is in addition to the MRLs already established for clethodim.
