Under the authority of the *Pest Control Products Act*, Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has added new uses on triticale to the product label of Twinline Fungicide, containing technical grade metconazole and pyraclostrobin. The specific uses approved in Canada are detailed on the label of Twinline Fungicide, *Pest Control Products Act* Registration Number 30337.

A corresponding maximum residue limit (MRL) for metconazole was proposed in the consultation document published on 26 June 2012, Proposed Maximum Residue Limit PMRL2012-34, *Metconazole*. The PMRA received no comments in response to this consultation.

To comply with Canada's international trade obligations, consultation on the proposed MRL was also conducted internationally by notifying the World Trade Organization, as coordinated by the Standards Council of Canada. No comments were received as a result of the World Trade Organization consultation.

The following MRL takes legal effect in Canada as of the publication date of this document and is in addition to the MRLs already established for metconazole.
