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## Inside China The Seafood Trade





## ► TRADE SUMMARY

From a global perspective, China is the fourth-largest importer of fish and seafood, importing over C\$5.7 billion in 2011, an increase of 24.4% from 2010. The country mainly imports its fish and seafood from Russia, representing 27.6% of total imports, followed by the United States (U.S.) with 19.7%, Norway (7.1%) and Canada (5.4%).

China's primary fish and seafood imports from all countries in 2011 included fish and crustaceans, mollusks and other aquatic invertebrates (C\$5.5 billion), prepared or preserved crustaceans, mollusks and other aquatic invertebrates (C\$147.2 million), and preserved fish, caviar and caviar substitutes (C\$22.7 million).

In 2011, China exported just over C\$16.8 billion in fish and seafood products worldwide, an increase of 23.7% from the previous year. Most of these were fish and crustaceans, mollusks and other invertebrates (C\$10.9 billion), prepared or preserved crustaceans, mollusks and other aquatic invertebrates (C\$3.3 billion), and prepared fish, caviar and caviar substitutes (C\$2.6 billion). Top destinations included Japan (23.1%), the U.S., (16.6%) and South Korea (9.3%).

## ► CANADIAN PERFORMANCE

China is Canada's second-largest market for fish and seafood, and its market share is growing. From 2007 to 2011, the value of China seafood imports from Canada grew by approximately 77%. More recently, growth in 2011 from 2010 equaled 36.5%, up from 23.3% in 2010 over 2009. Much of this expansion can be attributed to an increase in exports of fresh Pacific salmon (+1200%), live, frozen Pacific salmon (+225%), fresh and chilled lobster (+214%) and frozen crab (+40%). In absolute dollars, frozen crab was clearly leading the value growth in 2011.

For Canada, fish and seafood was the third most significant sector of agri-food exports to China in 2011 and the twelfth-largest sector for overall merchandise exports to China.

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In 2011, Chinese imports of fresh Pacific salmon from Canada recorded the highest growth of all Canadian fish and seafood supplies to China with an increase of 1200%.

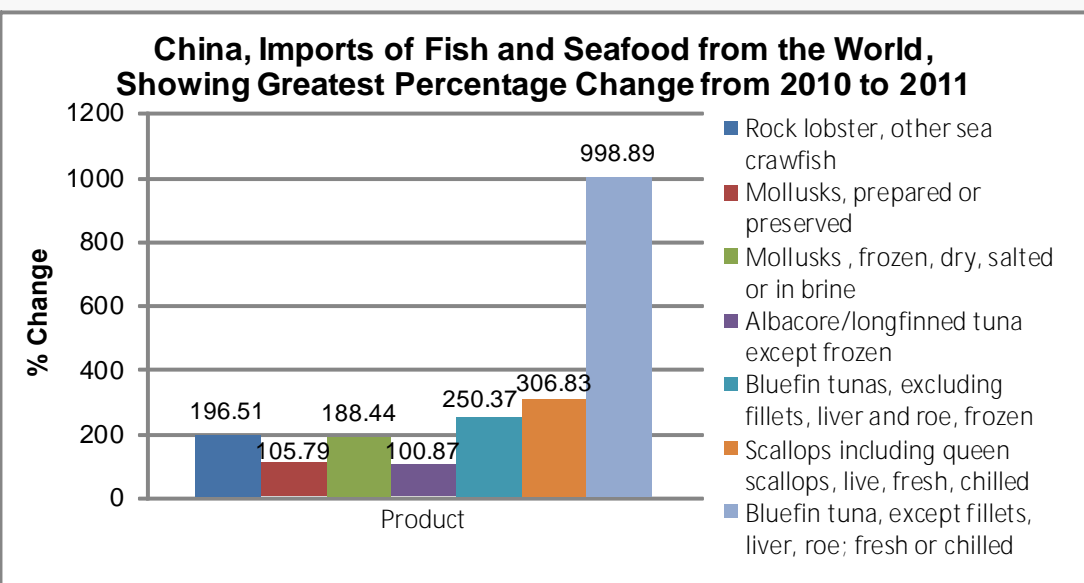
