## **Funding Success Story**

#### The Experience and Resolution of Moral Distress in Paediatric **Intensive Care Teams: A Canadian Perspective University of Alberta**

In a healthcare setting, health professionals are likely to face a moral issue at some point in their careers. This moral distress can lead to anger and frustration and have an impact on the level of care they give to their patients. Dr Wendy Austin and her team at the University of Alberta conducted a study looking at moral distress issues in Paediatric Intensive Care Units (PICUs) in Canada. By collecting real stories from healthcare professionals, they were able to identify key ethical issues facing professionals in the PICU. Many strategies to resolve moral distress were identified from these first-hand experiences, which may ultimately help enhance the practice environment in PICUs, and thus the level of care for patients and families
