# Did you know? Facts and figures

- Seafood is one of the largest single food commodities exported by Canada.
- Canada's exports of wild capture fish and seafood products were worth nearly \$3.6 billion in 2012.
- Canada is the 8th largest exporter of seafood products in the world in terms of value (source: Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, 2009).
- Approximately 80,000 Canadians make their living directly from fishing and fishing-related activities.
- Lobster remains Canada's top export species in terms of value, with 2012 exports totaling close to \$1.09 billion.
- Approximately 56% of Canada's wild capture fish and seafood exports were destined for the United States in 2012, at a value of more than \$2.03 billion.
- The European Union is also a significant market, importing almost \$344 million in 2012, or about 9.5% of Canada's wild capture fish and seafood products.
- China has surpassed the European Union as the second largest trading partner, with \$436 million worth of Canadian wild fish and seafood exports being shipped to China in 2012.




### Wild capture fisheries in Canada – Landed volume and value and export value



Canada's exports of fish and seafood products have remained steady at \$3.6 billion between 2011 and 2012. The value of our exports demonstrates Canada's position as a world leader in the export of fish and seafood products.

### Landings of Shellfish, Groundfish, Pelagic Fish, Freshwater Fish and Anadromous Fish



Over a span of 10 years, between 2002 and 2011, shellfish has been the most harvested category of wild fish, accounting for over 44% of the total amount of fish harvested among the five categories listed. It is followed by pelagics and groundfish, which together account for more than 50% of the harvest among the same five categories.






