# What is the Canada Day Challenge?

The Department of Canadian Heritage is proud to introduce the new Canada Day Challenge (formerly the Canada Day Poster Challenge). It's an opportunity for youth across Canada to share their stories and experiences of Canada and win some really great prizes!

## What do you have to do?

If you're between 8 and 18 years old and live in Canada, you're invited to express what Canada means to you by submitting an original poster design, a digital photograph, or a piece of creative writing inspired by the theme **Canada: Strong and Free**. Nine finalists of the Canada Day Challenge will be chosen, including three national winners. We challenge you to get creative, have fun, and let our great country inspire you!

## How you can enter:

You can enter in one, two, or all three of the following categories:

#### DRAW IT!

Draw, paint, and sketch—you decide! If you love to create art, then this is the category for you. Draw inspiration from Canada's past and present to create a colourful poster design that highlights the theme **Canada: Strong and Free**. Posters should be a minimum of  $8.5 \times 11$  inches and maximum of  $18 \times 24$  inches.

- Before submitting your entry, make sure to visit the Canada Day Challenge website for full Challenge rules and regulations.
- Writing and digital photography entries must be submitted by email no later than March 22, 2013.
- If you are submitting an original poster design, please download the DRAW IT! entry form, which can be found on our website, and submit it along with your entry to your Department of Canadian Heritage Regional Office. Your entry must be postmarked no later than March 22, 2013.
- Once submitted, all entries—including any intellectual property relating to your entry—will become the sole property of the Department of Canadian Heritage. The Department will be free to use any or all such entries in any form without compensation or remuneration.
