Introduction

The National Homelessness Information System (NHIS) is a data development initiative of the Homelessness Partnering Strategy (HPS) that focuses on the collection and analysis of data related to emergency homeless shelter usage in Canada. Such data is necessary for measuring the progress communities are making towards the reduction of homelessness.

The Homelessness Partnering (HP) Secretariat has compiled the National Shelter List, the most comprehensive list of emergency homeless shelters in Canada, since 2001. The National Shelter List does *not* contain a comprehensive list of transitional and Violence Against Women (VAW) shelters.

Below are definitions for the terms used in the following tables.

Emergency Shelters are defined as facilities providing temporary and short-term accommodation for homeless individuals and families, which may include essential services such as food, clothing and counselling.

Regular Beds refers to permanent emergency shelter beds. Overflow beds are not counted in this report.

There are five **Emergency Shelter Types** reported for each community. These classifications are based on self-reports from service providers.

- **General:** may provide shelter services to any combination of men, women, youth or families.
- **Men's:** provide shelter services to adult men.
- **Women's:** provide shelter services to adult women.
- **Youth:** provide shelter services to youth. As this is self-reported, the definition of youth at various shelters may range anywhere between 12 and 29 years of age.
- **Family:** provide shelter services to families and adults with dependants; however, some may also accept single adult women.

This document provides shelter capacity statistics from the National Shelter List as of November 30, 2010. Emergency shelter statistics are organized by province or territory. Within each province or territory, HPS designated communities¹ are listed first, followed by other communities. Communities are listed alphabetically within these categories.

¹ There are 61 HPS designated communities in Canada. A designated community is one that has been identified as having a significant challenge with homelessness. As such, it is able to access multi-year funding under the HPS, with matching funds from other sources.

In Canada, half of emergency shelters and nearly 70% of emergency shelter beds fall into either the general or men's category. Despite there being a larger proportion of youth shelters in Canada (24%) than women's (17%) or family shelters (9%), each accounts for approximately 10% of the shelter beds.

Men's and women's emergency shelters are not unlike general shelters, the difference being that they cater to a specific population based on gender. Many of the provinces and territories with a small number of general shelters have a large number of gender-specific emergency shelters, and vice versa. Nationally, there are more emergency shelters and beds available for single men than for single women. For the purpose of this report, Violence Against Women shelters (VAW) are not included.

Family shelters account for 9% of all emergency shelters. Shelters that accept single women as well as women with children are not included in the family shelter category but have been defined as women's shelters in this report. While youth shelters account for 24% of all emergency shelters, they have, on average, the smallest number of beds per shelter (approximately 15). The other types of shelters have average bed capacities ranging from 25 to 68.
