Civil Aviation, Annual Operating and Financial Statistics, Canadian Air Carriers, Levels I to III



2011

Highlights

- In 2011, Canadian Level I to III air carriers reported 63.0 million enplaned passengers, up 6.8% from 2010. The domestic sector rose 4.1% in 2011 to 34.5 million passengers, while the international sector (including Canada-United States) increased 10.3% to 28.5 million passengers. The scheduled passenger counts reached 57.2 million and the charter passenger counts, 5.8 million. In terms of passenger-kilometres flown, these carriers recorded 147.5 billion passenger-kilometres in their scheduled and charter operations in 2011, up 8.2% from the previous year. The international sector (+10.9%) advanced at a much faster pace than the domestic sector (+2.5%).
- After reporting a net income of \$477.4 million in 2010, Canadian Level I to III air carriers reported a net income
 of \$144.8 million in 2011. In 2011, total operating revenues generated by the Canadian Level I to III air carriers
 amounted to \$19.1 billion, up 9.9% (or +\$1.7 billion) from 2010. Total operating expenses increased to \$18.5 billion
 in 2011, up 12.1% (or +\$2.0 billion) from the previous year.
- In 2011, 96.9 cents of each operating revenue dollar were used to cover operating expenses. Aircraft operations absorbed the largest portion of each operating revenue dollar, at 52.2 cents, followed by general services and administration (28.6 cents) and maintenance (10.3 cents).
- Total assets of the Canadian Level I to III air carriers reached \$17.0 billion in 2011, up 0.4% compared to 2010.
- The aviation industry's earning power is reflected in the profitability ratios of profit margin, return on investment and return on assets. In 2011, the profit margin was 0.8% compared to 2.8% in 2010. This shows that every dollar of service sold, in 2011, earned 0.8 cents of profit for the Canadian Level I to III air carriers. The decrease in profit in 2011 compared to 2010 reflected the decrease in operating income and the increase in net non-operating expenses. Operating income fell as the rise in operating expenses (aircraft operations—fuel cost and wages and salaries—and general services and administration) offset the gain in operating revenues. Both return on assets and return on investment also showed declining profitability within the aviation industry in 2011. The rate of return on assets went from 2.8% in 2010 to 0.9% in 2011, while the rate of return on investment declined from 5.5% in 2010 to 3.2% in 2011.
- Total employment in the aviation industry grew 0.8% to 53,123, while total wages and salaries went up 8.7% to \$3.4 billion. In 2011, wages and salaries accounted for 18.4% of the operating expenses, down from 19.0% in 2010.
- Canadian Level I to III air carriers consumed 6.3 billion litres of fuel (turbine fuel and gasoline) in 2011 and spent \$5.6 billion acquiring the fuel. In 2011, fuel costs accounted for 30.2% of the operating expenses, up from 25.8% in 2010.
