Monthly Railway Carloadings



February 2013

Highlights

- Freight carried by Canadian railways reached 25.7 million tonnes in February, a 1.0% rise over the same month
 last year. The gain was entirely due to increased rail traffic within Canada as shipments from the United States
 fell during the month.
- Within Canada, combined loadings of non-intermodal freight (i.e., cargo moved via box cars or loaded in bulk) and intermodal freight (i.e., cargo moved via containers and trailers on flat cars) rose 1.5% to 22.7 million tonnes.
- Non-intermodal loadings rose 1.3% to 20.4 million tonnes in February. Strong freight volumes related to potash; fuel oils and crude petroleum; and fresh, chilled or dried vegetables were key factors behind this growth as less than half of the 64 commodity classifications loaded by the railways rose during the month.
- The increase in fuel oils and crude petroleum loadings represents both the highest volume of shipments and the rate of growth the commodity has seen for the month of February since 1999.
- On the other side of the spectrum, the largest declines in loadings were observed for shipments of wheat, colza seeds (canola) and iron ores and concentrates. The decline in these commodities alone was greater than the drop in tonnage from the remaining commodities that fell during the month.
- Intermodal loadings advanced 3.1% to 2.3 million tonnes in February. The gain reflected increased loadings of both containerized cargo shipments and trailers loaded on flat cars.
- The Western Division accounted for 60.6% of the domestic freight loadings, up 1.3% from the same month in 2012 to 13.7 million tonnes. The remainder was loaded in the Eastern Division, which saw a slightly stronger rate of growth than its counterpart, increasing 1.8% to 8.9 million tonnes. For statistical purposes, cargo loadings from Thunder Bay, Ontario, to the Pacific Coast are classified to the Western Division while loadings from Armstrong, Ontario, to the Atlantic Coast are classified to the Eastern Division.
- Rail shipments from the United States fell during the month of February, declining 2.9% to 3.0 million tonnes. The
 drop was solely attributable to non-intermodal loadings, which decreased 4.0% to 2.8 million tonnes.

Methodology and concepts

The **Railway Carloadings (Monthly)** publication presents essential data for timely analysis of the Rail Transport Industry and its contribution to the Canadian economy. Approximately 40 rail carriers report each month on their total intermodal 1 and non-intermodal2 traffic. For non-intermodal traffic, the carriers report the number of cars and tonnes by commodity of revenue-generating freight that they have loaded in Canada. For intermodal freight, the carriers report the number of units and tonnes for containers-on-flat-cars (C.O.F.C.) and trailers-on-flat-cars (T.O.F.C.), with no commodity detail. The carriers also report the total tonnage of revenue freight received from United States connections.

The total quantity of freight carried in Canada is the sum of the non-intermodal and intermodal freight loaded and the traffic received from U.S. connections. Additional information provided includes the number of units and tonnes of C.O.F.C. and T.O.F.C received from U.S. connections and the total tonnes of cargo that the carriers received from other Canadian connections. This freight that is exchanged among Canadian based carriers is counted only once in the total quantity of freight moved as it is counted only when loaded. For intermodal freight, twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) are derived from the dimensions of the freight-laden containers. Empty containers are not included in these statistics.

The data are collected via questionnaires and electronic reports that are filed with Statistics Canada eight working days after the reference month. These questionnaires are captured and edited and the data are then aggregated to produce tables for all of Canada and the Eastern and Western divisions of Canada.³ Tables show the data for the reference month and the year-to-date. These year-to-date figures include revisions of data from previous months.

Users of Railway Carloadings (Monthly) current and historical data should be aware of a break in the continuity of these data. Starting with the January 1999 reference period, the commodities presented in the Railway Carloadings (Monthly) publication were modified to conform to the Standard Classification of Transported Goods (SCTG) and the number of carriers surveyed more than doubled from the eighteen carriers surveyed prior to 1999.

The additional carriers were primarily shortline carriers whose data were previously included with the data of mainline carriers. The change in commodity classes has had negligible impact on the reporting of bulk commodities (e.g., wheat, potash and coal) which represent the majority of the total number of cars and tonnes. However, the reporting of manufactured and miscellaneous goods has changed significantly.
