Highlights

Aircraft take-offs and landings at Canadian airports with NAV CANADA air traffic control towers and flight service stations decreased 5.5% in October 2014 from the same month a year earlier. The 91 airports included in October 2014 reported 460,016 movements compared to 486,958 movements at 93 airports the previous year.

Both itinerant movements (flights from one airport to another) and local movements (flights that remain in the vicinity of the airport) contributed to the decline. Itinerant movements (329,355) fell by 13,732 (-4.0%) while local movements (130,661) dropped 13,210 (-9.2%).

The Edmonton City Centre Airport closed on November 30, 2013 and the Prince Rupert Airport, while still open, lost its status as a flight service station effective July 24, 2014. These two airports accounted for a total of 4.516 movements in October 2013.

Note to readers

This release of the Aircraft Movements Statistics data includes the months of March 2014 to October 2014, along with revisions to January and February 2014.

This will also be the last edition of the Aircraft Movement Statistics: NAV CANADA Towers and Flight Service Stations (TP 141) (51-007-X) publication. However, all of the information and data included in this publication will continue to be available, either in The Daily, on CANSIM, in the repository for survey definitions, data sources and methods, or in the service bulletin Aviation (51-004-X). Hyperlinks to all of this information will be included in *The Daily*.

Analysis

The reduction in itinerant movements was led by the drop (-3,514 movements) resulting from the closure of Edmonton City Centre Airport. Large decreases were also reported at Toronto/Buttonville (-2,290), Montreal/St. Hubert (-1,287) and Langley, British Columbia (-1,189). Together, these airports accounted for 60% of the overall decline. In contrast, year-over-year itinerant activity at Vancouver International rose by 2,391 movements to reach its highest level for the month of October since 2008.

Similarly, 75% of the decline observed in local movements was concentrated in just four airports – Montréal/St-Hubert (-3,432 movements), Toronto/Buttonville (-2,712), Fredericton International (-2,018) and Ottawa/Macdonald-Cartier (-1,794). These decreases were more than sufficient to offset the largest increase (+2,016 movements) which was reported at Victoria International.

The drop in total movements for Toronto/Buttonville may be explained by the upcoming closure of the airport and the relocation of some activities, a flight school, for example, to nearby airports.

Itinerant movements: domestic, transborder and international

Itinerant movements within Canada fell to 276,367 movements in October 2014, a drop of 5.0% from the previous year. Since the economic downturn in 2009, domestic itinerant movements during the month of October have fluctuated from a high of 296,065 in 2011 to a low of 270,983 in 2012. Year-over-year variations for October 2014 ranged from an increase of 1,771 movements (+10.1%) at Vancouver International to a drop of 2,271 movements (-45.3%) at Toronto/Buttonville. Of those reporting in October 2014, fifty-nine airports reported year-over-year decreases in domestic movements.

Eighty-two airports recorded 42,684 transborder itinerant movements (between Canada and the United States) in October 2014, little changed from the 42,906 movements that were reported the previous year. Slight decreases in transborder movements at Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International (-518 movements), Montreal/ Pierre Elliot Trudeau International (-235) and Quebec/Jean Lesage International (-203) were sufficient to offset small gains at Vancouver International (513) and Edmonton International (107).

In October 2014, forty-five airports reported a total of 10,304 other international itinerant movements, up 10.2% from October 2013. The gain resulted from growth of 9.5% at Canada's busiest airport, Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International, which reported 5,062 other international itinerant movements during the month.

Methodology

Survey universe

Coverage

The survey covers all aircraft movements at Canadian airports with NAV CANADA air traffic control towers and flight service stations.

Methodology survey

The Itinerant movement record is designed to capture:

- · Aircraft identification
- Aircraft type
- · The last station before landing at the reporting airport or the next station after take-off
- Arrival or departure
- Time of movement
- Runway used
- · Flight rules (Instrument flight rules or Visual flight rules).

The Local aircraft movement record provides for reports of local movements by:

- Hour
- · Single engine aircraft
- Multi-engine aircraft
- Jet aircraft
- · Military aircraft
- · Date of movement

Processing of aircraft movement statistics involves several stages. Monthly data by class of operation are released in Aircraft movement statistics - Monthly report, catalogue nos. 51-007-X and 51-008-X (TP-141). Annual tables, which may reflect revisions, are released in the two annual publications, catalogue 51-209-X Aircraft movement statistics – NAV CANADA Towers and Flight Service Stations: Annual report (TP-577) and catalogue 51-210-X Aircraft movement statistics – Airports Without Air Traffic Control Towers: Annual report (TP-577). In particular, data on itinerant movements by type of operation may reflect revisions as various sources of comparative information (data collected from commercial air carriers by the Aviation Statistics Centre, Statistics Canada) become available during the processing cycle. Finally, when revisions are required after the release of 51-209-X and 51-210-X, they are contained in the five year historical summary of subsequent editions of these reports. These revisions are also reflected in the CANSIM tables, both monthly and annual.

The records are completed daily, based on a twenty-four hour clock running from zero hour to 23:59. The times recorded are Coordinated Universal Time (UTC); however, published statistics are shown in local times. The records are transmitted to the Aviation Statistics Centre.

The Aviation Statistics Centre maintains a data base of parameter files of current information on all registered aircraft. The storage of this information reduces the reporting burden of the survey respondents and limits the element of human error associated with the preparation of source documents.

Other parameter files information includes registered aircraft identifications and their corresponding aircraft types, maximum take-off weights, types of power plant (piston, jet or turboprop); whether the aircraft are fixed wing, helicopters or gliders. This information also provides a basis for identifying type of flights (commercial, private and government) and the geographical area in which the flights take place.

The parameter files also include airport environment information against which the airport category is checked; the reported runway is validated and the time difference between UTC and Local is assigned.

Data quality and limitations

Aircraft movement statistics are accumulated from data originating with air traffic control tower units or flight service station personnel. Because staff in these positions are highly trained in factual observation and reporting, the entries in the data bank are of a high quality.

The procedures for reporting aircraft movements on the Daily air traffic records by tower units are described in the NAV CANADA Air traffic control manual of operations (TP 703) Volume 1, Para. 1023 to 1023.5. Definitions for terms used in these paragraphs can be found in the appendix II "Glossary of terms" of this report.

To maintain uniformity in the reporting of source data, ASC issues to air traffic control units an "Air traffic designators" handbook (TP 143) listing the official Transport Canada aircraft type designators and the designators of various domestic and international air carriers. This handbook and another titled "Canada flight supplement" listing various airport codes serve as references to help ensure the reporting of the proper aircraft identity and the point of origin and destination of flights.

The processing system contains editing procedures designed to identify data errors occurring during transcription or during data capture of forms. Identified errors are manually corrected by Aviation Statistics Centre editing staff.

Errors may occur if an aircraft type code which exists is reported or data captured in error for a flight. For example, the reporting or keying of B727 for a flight actually performed by a B737 may not be detected during the system editing. That the aircraft type information is recorded by highly trained air traffic control tower staff using a common handbook of official aircraft codes will minimize this problem.

Similarly, the breakdown of the data on a geographic basis by use of location codes can be subject to error. For smaller locations, alphanumeric location codes are often used and the sequence of numbers and letters determines the geographic area to which the data are assigned. In some cases, where a sequence error has been introduced into the system either at the reporting unit or at data capture, a domestic movement may be classified as transborder or vice versa. The use of common manuals of location identifiers works to minimize this occurrence.

Appendix I

Factors influencing the data

A simulated air crash took place in October 2014, on one of the runways at the Montréal/Saint-Hubert Airport. The exercise was designed to test the effectiveness of the emergency measures plan, in accordance with Transport Canada requirements.

Effective July 24th, 2014, NAV CANADA terminated the services provided by the Flight Service Station located at Prince Rupert Airport. The airport remains operational.

On July 23rd and 24th, 2014, Air Canada halted flights to Tel Aviv, Israel due to a rocket strike near its main airport.

On June 28th, 2014, Calgary International Airport opened a new runway. The new runway will be the longest in Canada, capable of landing the largest aircraft in the world with fewer payload restrictions.

Effective June 27th, 2014, WestJet Encore began service between Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport and Thunder Bay Airport, as well as service between Thunder Bay Airport and Winnipeg/James Armstrong Richardson International Airport.

As of June 25th, 2014, China Eastern Airlines commenced flights from Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport to Shanghai, China to supplement increasing demand for flights to and from Chinese destinations. And Cathay Pacific Airline, which has been flying out of Vancouver for 31 years, flies twice-daily non-stop from Vancouver International Airport to Hong Kong. The airline also offers flights 10 times a week between Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport and Hong Kong.

Starting June 24th, 2014, WestJet commenced non-stop service twice per week between Las Vegas, Nevada and Fort McMurray Airport.

Effective June 20th, 2014, Canadian North Airlines began a seasonal non-stop flight service between Iqaluit Airport and Halifax/Robert L. Stanfield International Airport, with same plane service to St John's International.

On June 15th, 2014, WestJet launched its first transatlantic flight between Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport and Dublin, Ireland. The inaugural flight stopped at St John's International Airport for refueling.

On June 1st, 2014, British Airways began to operate 19 flights per week between Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport and London, England, with the introduction of additional flights on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays.

Beginning May 12th, 2014, WestJet Encore added new daily non-stop service between Fort McMurray Airport and Kelowna Airport and between Fort McMurray and Vancouver International Airport.

Starting May 5th, 2014, KLM Royal Dutch Airlines launched non-stop service between Edmonton International Airport and Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport.

As of May 1st, 2014, Air Canada rouge began flying year-round service between Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport and Dublin, Ireland.

Air Canada rouge will operate five new routes from Vancouver International Airport by the end of 2014, beginning with a daily service to Las Vegas, Nevada on April 28th. The airline will also offer daily services to Los Angeles, California (beginning May 1st), Anchorage, Alaska (beginning May 16th), San Francisco, California (beginning July 1st) and Phoenix, Arizona (beginning December 17th).

Effective April 1st, 2014, Bearskin Airlines cancelled its service from Kitchener-Waterloo Airport to Ottawa/ Macdonald-Cartier International Airport.

On March 12th, 2014 a significant winter storm struck Eastern Canada forcing dozens of flight cancellations and delays at Eastern Canadian airports.

On February 24th, 2014, a major winter storm with freezing temperatures struck the south-west coast of British Columbia forcing flight cancellations and delays at Vancouver International Airport and Victoria International Airport.

On January 7th, 2014, Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport experienced a ground stop caused by extreme cold which prevented North American flights from landing for approximately eight hours.

Significant winter storms struck much of Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime provinces forcing flight cancellations and delays across Canada in December 2013.

On November 30th, 2013 (4:49pm), Edmonton City Centre Airport officially closed.

On November 25th, 2013, Air Canada rouge began year round flying between Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport and Orlando, Florida with 3 daily departures and two more starting on December 14th, 2013.

On October 28th, 2013, Westjet launched a new non-stop seasonal service between Calgary International Airport and Miami International Airport. The airline will start service four times a week until December 14th. Effective December 16th the service increases to six times weekly.

On October 27th, 2013, Air Canada rouge launched service between Toronto/Lester B. Pearson International Airport and Las Vegas. The airline will offer ten flights per week for the winter 2013-2014 season.

Appendix II

Glossary of terms

Air carrier

Aircraft operators, licensed by the Canadian Transportation Agency to transport persons, mail and/or goods by air.

Level I: Effective 2010, this includes every Canadian air carrier that, in the calendar year immediately preceding the reporting year, transported at least 2 million revenue passengers or at least 400 thousand tonnes of cargo.

Level II: Effective 2010, this includes every Canadian air carrier that, in the calendar year immediately preceding the reporting year, transported at least 100 thousand, but fewer than 2 million revenue passengers, or at least 50 thousand but less than 400 thousand tonnes of cargo.

Level III. Effective 2010, this includes every Canadian air carrier not classified in reporting level I or II that, in the calendar year immediately preceding the reporting year, realized gross revenues of at least 2 million dollars for the provision of air services for which the air carrier held a licence.

Level IV. Effective 2010, this includes every Canadian air carrier not classified in reporting level I, II or III that, in the calendar year immediately preceding the reporting year, realized gross revenues of less than 2 million dollars for the provision of air services for which the air carrier held a licence.

Aircraft movement

A take off, a landing, or a simulated approach by an aircraft as defined in the NAV CANADA Air Traffic Control Manual of Operations (ATC MANOPS).

Class of operation

Aircraft movements are classified as either "Itinerant" or "Local".

Commercial

Flights by aircraft operators licensed by the Canadian Transportation Agency to perform commercial air services. Commercial operations are divided into two categories: Air carrier and Other commercial.

Domestic itinerant movements

Movements, at a Canadian airport, of aircraft departing to or arriving from another point in Canada.

FSS

Flight service station.

Government-Civil

Aircraft owned by federal, provincial and municipal bodies as well as foreign states, but excluding those owned by crown corporations, boards and commissions. Such aircraft are coded "state" under "Purpose" in the Canadian civil aircraft register.

Government-Military

Aircraft of any branch of the armed forces of any nation.

I.F.R. flight

A flight conducted in accordance with Instrument Flight Rules.

International movements

Movements, at a Canadian airport, of aircraft arriving from or departing to a point outside Canada. International movements are subclassified into "transborder" (to or from a point in the United States including Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico), and "other international" (to or from points in countries other than Canada and the United States). Since aircraft movements are reported on the basis of place "arrived from" or "departed to", an arrival at Halifax airport from London, England would appear under "other international". If the same aircraft moved on to Toronto, both the departure at Halifax and the arrival at Toronto would be shown as "domestic".

Itinerant movements

At airports with control towers and/or flight service stations: for the purpose of completing air traffic records, itinerant movements are considered as movements in which aircraft proceed to or arrive from another location; or where aircraft leave the circuit but return without landing at another airport. At airports without control towers: an aircraft movement in which the aircraft arrives from or departs to a point other than the reporting airport; or a movement by an aircraft that leaves the close proximity of an airport and returns without landing at another airport.

Local movements

At airports with control towers and/or flight service stations: for the purpose of completing air traffic records, local movements are considered as movements in which the aircraft remains in the circuit. At airports without control towers: an aircraft movement in which the aircraft remains in the close proximity of the airport. Local movements are often carried out during training flights (touch-and-go), equipment tests, etc.

Maximum take-off weight

The maximum weight for which the aircraft is licensed to operate. For operational purposes, all weights are rounded upwards to the next 1,000 kilograms. Thus 3,200 kilograms becomes 4,000 kilograms.

Other commercial

Flights performed by Commercial aircraft operators not included in the Air carrier categories. Flying schools, agricultural sprayers, water-bombers, aerial photography and survey, etc.

Power plant

The source of propulsion. For example, piston engines, turbo-propellers and jet engines. "Helicopters", in this report, include both piston and turboshaft-driven engines.

Private aircraft

Aircraft used solely for private purposes, not for hire and compensation, which are classified as "Private" or "Private Restricted" in the Canadian civil aircraft register or similar registries of other countries. Owners include individuals, groups and business firms.

Runway 88

Through control zone flights, i.e. flights which communicate with the tower while transiting the tower control zone to another destination without landing at the reporting airport.

Data for these runways are not included in the grand total.

Simulated approaches

Movements that are either missed instrument or practice instrument approaches without landing.

TC

Transport Canada.

Tower control zone

A controlled airspace within the proximity of an air traffic control tower, usually within a radius of less than 24 kilometres of the tower.

V.F.R. flight

A flight conducted in accordance with Visual flight rules.

Weight group

The classification of weight classes in groups for statistical purposes.
