1.0 Overview of Canada Council funding to Manitoba in 2006-07

- In 2006-07, the Canada Council for the Arts provided grants totalling over \$6.5 million to the arts in Manitoba.
- In addition to grants, \$177,016 in payments was provided to 395 authors through the Public Lending Right Program in 2006-07.¹ This brings the total amount of Canada Council funding to Manitoba close to \$6.7 million.
- In 2006-07, the Canada Council awarded \$705,025 in grants to 59 Manitoba artists and \$5.8 million to 66 Manitoba arts organizations.
- Grants were awarded to artists and arts organizations in Manitoba in each artistic discipline – dance, interdisciplinary and performance art, media arts, music, theatre, visual arts and writing and publishing. In 2006-07, the largest amount of funding went to dance (\$1.4 million). Music received the second largest amount of funding (\$1.4 million), followed by theatre (\$879,450).
- 443 applications from Manitoba artists and arts organizations were submitted to the Canada Council in 2006-07, representing 2.8% of the total number of applications received.
- Funding to artists and arts organizations in Winnipeg totaled \$6.2 million, comprising 96% of the total funding going to the province. Onanole received over \$98,500 in funds, while Saint-Boniface received \$79,500 and Brandon received \$66,961. Three other communities in Manitoba (Selkirk, Dauphin, and Swan Lake) were awarded funds in 2006-07.
- In 2006-07, Manitoba artists received 3.3% of Canada Council funding to artists, and Manitoba arts organizations received 4.8% of the funding to arts organizations. In total, Manitoba artists and arts organizations received 4.6% of Canada Council funding. In comparison, the province makes up 3.0% of Canadian artists,² and 3.6% of the Canadian population.³
- As a result of the increase to the Canada Council's parliamentary appropriation (for the fiscal years 2006-07 and 2007-08) announced in the federal budget of May 2006, 27 arts organizations in Manitoba received \$1.5 million over a two year period as part of the Supplementary Operating Funds Initiative.
- 35 artists and arts professionals from Manitoba served as peer assessors in 2006-07, comprising 4.5% of all peer assessors.

2.0 Statistical highlights about the arts in Manitoba⁴

- In Manitoba, three-quarters of the province's 4,000 artists reside in Winnipeg (2,965).
- Winnipeg has the second-highest artistic concentration among large Prairie cities (0.9%).
- In Winnipeg, the growth in the arts labour force between 1991 and 2001 was almost eight times the growth in the overall local labour force.
- In Winnipeg, the gap between artists' average earnings (\$19,700) and local labour force earnings is 33%, which is the smallest gap among large Prairie cities. Across Canada, artists' average earnings (\$23,500) are 26% less than other workers.
- Manitobans spent "\$850 million on cultural goods and services in 2005, which equals 3.3% of total consumer spending in the province. The \$850 million in consumer spending on culture is over three times larger than the \$260 million spent on culture in Manitoba by all levels of government in 2003/04. On a per capita basis, Manitobans' cultural spending ranks fifth in the country at \$809 per resident."⁵

Examples of Canada Council funding in Manitoba⁶

The Canada Council supports the endeavours of professional artists and arts organizations through its programs. The following selection illustrates the scope of the activities supported by the Canada Council in Manitoba.

The Council's **Spoken Word and Storytelling Program** awarded Winnipeg's **Magic of One Productions** a grant of **\$6,300** to organize **The Magic of One Concert Series** from October 21, 2006 to March 23, 2007. The collaborative series, now in its fourth season, is an innovative program of oral stories supported by music and comprised of four major presentations. Storytellers and co-directors **Mary Louise Chown, Laura Cowie** and **Kay Stone** created the series for adults to "focus on the power of the spoken word and to remind us of the 'Magic of One,' one voice being raised, one story being told, and one common human experience being explored and honoured through storytelling."

First-time grant applicant and recipient **Melanie Brouzes** of Winnipeg received **\$2,550** from the **Travel Grants to Theatre Artists** program to attend the Women Playwrights International Conference in Jakarta and Bali, Indonesia, from November 19 to 24, 2006. At the conference **Brouzes** presented a paper entitled **Theatre as Community**, which was published in the conference program guide, and spoke in the panel discussion *Identity, Community and the Role of Diversity*. Of the experience **Brouzes** wrote: "Theatre artists from around the globe took interest in my presentation, and my work as an Aboriginal [Métis] Canadian theatre artist."

In 2006-07 **Stephanie Ballard** received **\$9,000** through the **Grants to Established Dance Professionals** program to research and develop her skills as an archivist through establishing the **Winnipeg Dance Preservation Initiative (WDPI)**. Based in Winnipeg, **Ballard** and her collaborator Margaret Piasecki intend to expedite the archiving of all professional and semi-professional dance companies in the province of Manitoba. One of the **WDPI's** first projects will be the creation of the **Arnold Spohr Collection**, an archive of Canadian ballet dancer, choreographer, and artistic director Arnold Theodore Spohr's artifacts and materials.

Through the **Visual Arts - Supplementary Operating Funds Initiative**, the **Winnipeg Art Gallery** received a **\$175,000** grant in 2006-07 to undertake a two-year project aimed at engaging a younger audience through their contemporary art programming. The project consists of integrating new interpretive strategies via new technologies including blogs, digital audio programs and podcasting delivered by iPods and MP3 players. The initiative is inspired by the evolution of new media by contemporary artists who have embraced new technologies and methods including “self-publishing, graphic novels, websites, t-shirts and buttons, making them part of the creative process to extend their work outside of the gallery walls.”

Manitoba Printmakers' Association Inc (MPA) in Winnipeg received a **\$12,000** grant through the **Artists and the Community Collaboration Program** to create a **Youth Outreach Program** in 2006-07. The 12-week program, which will take place in the Martha Street Studio, will allow youth who are interested in visual arts to come together in a safe and creative environment. Participants will learn a broad range of skills from all areas of printmaking, participate in class critiques/discussions and visit various galleries and art events with the class. **MPA** designed the program to aid in the participants' development of creativity and language for talking about art as well as their personal development.

An **Assistance to Visual Artists - Project** grant of **\$11,000** was awarded to **Douglas Smith** of Winnipeg to produce a drawing series investigating the global nature of the world by combining maps and diagrammatic imagery. **Smith**, a first-time grant recipient, wrote that the series entitled **Systems** will examine the “gulf that appears to be increasing between our individual sense of self in the world and the potential loss of it within the scope of massive population shifts and societal demands.” The large-scale drawings will be executed primarily in graphite on archival paper with additions of acrylic paints, a medium that allows **Smith** to show all aspects of the drawing process including eraser marks and torn/stressed edges.

Winnipeg's **Ruth Cansfield Dance Company** was awarded **\$5,000** by the **Audience and Market Development Travel Grants** program to present three full-evening performances at the Merce Cunningham Studio in New York in January 2007. The performances took place during the Association of Performing Arts Presenters Conference, allowing **Ruth Cansfield Dance** to engage the interest of dance professionals. The four dancers who performed are **Michael Blais, Alexandra Elliott, Marisa Rempel** and **Treasure Waddell**. Artistic Director **Ruth Cansfield** wrote that her choreography was praised and that interest in potential collaborative projects and bookings was expressed.

A grant of **\$40,800** was awarded to Winnipeg's Aboriginal artist-run centre **Urban Shaman Gallery** by the **Media Arts Commissioning Program** to commission a work by Cree artist **Kent Monkman** in 2006-07. The work, entitled **Dance to the Berdashe**, will consist of a series of single channel film vignettes based on themes of historical or mythological origin. Of the project **Monkman** wrote: “The mises en scène that I will be creating will subvert the commonly held, yet misguided, perceptions and representations of Aboriginal peoples that emerged in the nineteenth century.” An exhibition of the works and a catalogue featuring essays by Steve Loft and a guest writer will also be developed.

Self-taught musician **Desmond Lagace** from Swan River received **\$1,800** from the **Grants for Specialized Music Sound Recording** program to record his third album entitled *New & Used* in 2006-07. The album will primarily consist of fiddle music accompanied by the guitar, banjo and mandolin. Of the album, **Lagace** wrote; "This CD project is mainly intended to re-enforce my presence in the world of fiddle music. By continuing to produce new material, I hope to introduce more people to my brand of music and also generate new compositions for this particular genre of music." **Lagace** will promote *New & Used* by performing songs from the album at various festivals, concerts and functions.

The Canada Council supported **Noam Gonick** of Winnipeg with a **\$750** grant through the **Travel Grants to Media Artists** program in 2006-07. With the funds **Gonick** will attend the premiere of his work entitled *Wildflowers of Manitoba* at the Biennale de Montréal in May 2007. Created by **Gonick** and **Luis Jacob** in 2006, *Wildflowers of Manitoba* is a 360-degree multi-screen 35mm film installation projected within a 14-foot geodesic dome. Of the film, **Gonick** wrote, "the non-narrative film installation references an imagined scenario echoing late sixties counter-culture, with its widespread experimental communitarianism, environmentalism, and sexual liberation."

Kerry DuWors of Brandon was a winner of the Council's **Musical Instrument Bank Competition** in 2006. The Musical Instrument Bank acquires and loans exceptional instruments to gifted young musicians embarking on an international solo or chamber music career. **DuWors**, a Professor of Violin and Chamber Music at Brandon University, chose the **1747 Palmason Januarius Gagliano violin** made in Naples in 1747. In her application **DuWors** wrote: "Having an exceptional instrument at my fingertips would continue to propel me to further my development as an artist at an unimaginably fast rate, as well as enable me to achieve even higher standards of violin playing."

In 2006-07 Winnipeg author **Sally Ito** received **\$20,000** from the **Intersectional Initiatives** program to write a memoir entitled *The Emperor's Orphans* based on her family history. Besides traveling to Japan with her family to conduct research, **Ito** will use her mother's oral testimony, the Japanese manuscript of her grandfather's memoir and interviews of family members as primary sources of information. *The Emperor's Orphans* will be **Ito's** first long work of non-fiction which she says, "will cover the history of my family before, during and after the Pacific War [1937-1945], I envision this book as a mediation on my own cultural identity as it has shifted over the years."

A grant of **\$4,900** was awarded by the **Assistance to Aboriginal Traditional Visual Arts Forms** program to the **Dauphin Friendship Centre (DFC)** to organize and host the **Artistic Expressions** workshops series featuring instruction in bone, wood, and stone carving. Located in Dauphin, the **DFC** has appointed **Irvin Head**, a talented Métis Master Carver, to facilitate three workshops that will take place in 2006-07. **Irvin Head** will teach carving as well as outline the different types of stone, carving safety, tool use, maintenance and display of works and marketing techniques. Through the workshops the **DFC** hopes to revitalize and promote the continuation of bone sculpting within the community.

The **Book Publishing Support - Grants for Art Books** program supported **Éditions du Blé** with a **\$15,000** grant to publish the book entitled *Pauline Boutal, l'artiste à l'oeuvre* (Pauline Boutal: The Artist at Work) by **Louise Duguay**. The book recounts the life and work of Boutal during her 60-year career as an artist in Manitoba and will include black and white photographs, illustrations and images of her works. This book will be one of few that document and highlight the contribution of women artists in Western Canada during the mid-19th century. Located in Saint-Boniface, **Éditions du Blé** is a non-profit French-language publishing house founded in 1974.

Winnipeg artist **Diana Thorneycroft** received a **Visual Arts** grant of **\$80,000** to produce a series of twelve 40x50" chromira digital photographs that will be promoted internationally by Canadian commercial galleries in 2006-07 and 2007-08. The works in ***A Group of Seven (or More) Canadian Landscapes*** (working title) will be a satirical commentary on Canada's national identity and its connection to geography. Of the images, **Thorneycroft** wrote: "The content in each piece will reflect tragedies caused by bad weather and stupid decisions, intentionally subverting the upstanding idealism the Group of Seven paintings have come to embody."

4.0 Overall arts and culture funding in Manitoba from all three levels of government⁷

- Arts and culture funding to Manitoba from all three levels of government stood at \$262.4 million in 2003-04 (the latest year of overall data from Statistics Canada).
- Provincial funding made up the largest share at about 43% (\$111.8 million) with another 32% (\$85.1 million) coming from federal sources. 25% (\$65.5 million) of total government expenditures to Manitoba came from municipal sources.
- Federal government cultural funding to Manitoba totalling \$85.1 million is primarily concentrated (92%) in four areas – heritage resources (historic parks/sites and nature/provincial parks), broadcasting, performing arts and film and video. The remaining 8% is allocated to areas including multidisciplinary arts (\$2.0 million), literary arts (\$1.7 million) and visual arts and craft (\$1.6 million). In the comparable year (2003-04), Canada Council funding accounted for 7% of all federal culture spending in Manitoba.
- Between 1999-00 and 2003-04, federal cultural spending in Manitoba decreased from \$95 million in 1999-00 to \$85.1 million in 2003-04 (a decrease of 10%). During the same period, Canada Council funding to Manitoba increased from \$5.4 million to \$6.1 million.
- The largest part of provincial government funding is concentrated in four areas – libraries, heritage resources, multidisciplinary arts and performing arts (92% or \$102.6 million). However, funding is also allocated by the provincial government to film and video (\$3.2 million), visual arts and crafts (\$1.3 million) and arts education (\$1.2 million).

Canada Council for the Arts funding to Manitoba

- Since 1999-00, Canada Council funding to Manitoba has increased, rising from \$5.4 million in 1999-00 to \$6.5 million in 2006-07 (an increase of 21.12%).
- Grants to Manitoba as a percentage of total Canada Council funding has dropped somewhat from 5.21% in 1999-00 to 4.62% in 2006-07.

Grant applications from Manitoba

- Since 1999-00, the total number of grant applications from Manitoba artists and arts organizations has decreased from 495 applications in 1999-00 to 443 applications in 2006-07. There has been a 10.51% decrease in the number of grant applications from Manitoba since 1999-00 while Canada Council as a whole has seen an increase of 4.85%. The average percentage of grant applications from Manitoba between 1999-00 and 2006-07 is 3.15%.

Manitoba – Various comparisons with other provinces⁸

- Manitoba ranks third in terms of its level of Canada Council funding on a per capita basis per province at \$5.67. In terms of its share of funding, Manitoba is in fifth place at 4.62%. The province's share of funding is significantly higher than its percentage share of applications, population and artists.
