VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA
ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS
NOVEMBER, 1955

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits totalled 91,588 in November, a drop of between 5 and 6 per cent when compared with the same month of 1954. Declines were quite pronounced in the western provinces where weather conditions were not conducive to travelling. Cumulative entries for the first eleven months of 1955 show a gain of 3 per cent or 72,726 vehicles when compared with the previous year.

NOTE: Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks, and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
