### Survey of Labour and Income Dynamics public-use microdata file

1999 and 2000

The cross-sectional public-use microdata files for the 1999 and 2000 Survey of Labour and Income Dynamics (SLID) are now available. Since 1996, SLID public-use microdata have been a source of detailed cross-sectional household income data. Prior to this, the Survey of Consumer Finances provided public-use microdata files to meet the needs of users of cross-sectional household income.

The *Survey of Labour and Income Dynamics public-use microdata files* on CD-ROM (75M0010XCB, \$2,000) are now available for 1999 and 2000. The files are available separately for each year.

### Apartment Building Construction Price Index

First quarter 2003

The composite price index for apartment building construction (1997=100) was 115.9 in the first quarter, up 0.8% from the fourth quarter and 2.9% from the first quarter of 2002, the same year-to-year increase as that of the previous quarter.

Calgary recorded the highest quarterly change (+1.6%), followed by Ottawa (+1.1%), Edmonton (+1.0%), Toronto (+0.9%), Vancouver (+0.7%), Montréal (+0.3%) and Halifax (+0.2%).

Toronto saw the highest year-to-year gain (+4.1%), followed by Calgary (+3.7%), Ottawa (+3.4%), Edmonton (+3.1%), Halifax and Montréal (+2.4% each), and Vancouver (+1.6%).

**Note:** The apartment building construction price indexes provide an indication of new construction cost changes in seven major urban areas across Canada (Halifax, Montréal, Ottawa, Toronto, Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver). Besides each of the urban areas' indexes and the composite index, there are further breakdowns of cost changes by trade groups within the building (structural, architectural, mechanical and electrical). These price indexes are derived from surveys of general and special trade-group contractors who report on the categories of costs (material, labour, equipment, taxes, overhead and profits) relevant to the detailed construction specifications included in the surveys.

### Restaurants, caterers and taverns

March 2003

Total receipts of restaurants, caterers and taverns in March were an estimated \$2.72 billion, up 1.9% from the March 2002 estimate.

## Production of poultry and eggs

2002

The value of poultry products totalled \$2.5 billion in 2002, down 1.9% from 2001. Sales of poultry meat, at \$1.7 billion, dropped 3.9% as prices declined. Egg sales increased 2.9% to \$754.1 million.

Canadian farmers produced 1.1 million metric tonnes of poultry meat in 2002, virtually unchanged from 2001. Production of chicken, which accounts for over 85% of all poultry meat produced, rose slightly from 2001, continuing a long-term upward trend. Turkey production, which peaked at 152.6 thousand tonnes in 2000, stood at 146.4 thousand tonnes in 2002, down 2.1% from 2001.

In 2002, each Canadian consumed 32.3 kilograms of chicken, up from 32.1 kilograms per person in 2001. The ongoing popularity of easy-to-prepare and ready-to-eat chicken products with time-conscious consumers contributed to the increased intake of chicken.

Egg production increased 1.6% from 2001 to stand at 575.8 million dozen in 2002. Egg consumption, which has been rebounding in recent years, reached 15.4 dozen eggs per person in 2002, down slightly from 15.8 dozen per person in 2001. The general growth can be attributed in part to publicity outlining the nutritional benefits of eggs, increased use of eggs by the food service sector, the growing popularity of value-added products, and the expanded use and availability of processed egg products.

Despite the emphasis on taking urban transit, Canadians are using it less and less. In 1996, each Canadian took an average of about 20 trips on some form of urban transit, the lowest level in the past 25 years.
