

Sir,

Herewith, for submission to the Honourable Commissioner for Public Health and Welfare, an Interim Report on the Census of 1935.

This Census was taken under the Census Act, No. 23, Section 1 of which provides that "the Commissioner for Public Health and Welfare shall divide the Colony into as many divisions as he may think proper, and may appoint persons to take, within the said Divisions, the Census and other statistical information required by the Act."

Preparation for the work of the Census was commenced early in 1935, when forms were obtained from the United Kingdom and the Dominion of Canada, showing the information called for under the Census taken in those countries. From these forms were selected those items which would be of value in respect to this Colony.

The Forms were then typed and copies of same were submitted to the Commissioners in charge of the various Government Departments for their approval. The total items calling for particulars in the Forms being 211, in 1921 they numbered 311. Other necessary Forms were drawn up and the Book of Instructions to Enumerators was prepared.

The Colony was divided into 20 Districts, and the boundaries of the Districts, with the exception of the Districts of St. George and Humber, were the same as in 1921. These Districts were divided into 184 Sections; in 1921 there were 19 Districts and 192 Sections.

A total of 260 Enumerators were appointed; in 1921 the number was 252.

Forms and Instructions were mailed the Enumerators on the 15th July, 1935 and the month of August was selected for the enumeration. In 1921 the enumeration was spread over a period of six months, from July to December. With the exception of a few sections, enumeration was completed by the end of August. Enumerators' Returns were then sent the Revising Magistrates. The Revising Magistrates completed their work the latter part of November, the revised Returns then being forwarded this Office.

The Compilers, five being appointed in December, 1935, immediately began the work of checking over the Returns. The figures furnished herewith are as accurate as checking can make them, and any alterations made will not appreciably affect the Returns here given.

1. Total Population

The numerical increase of the population over that of 1921 is 26,483 or 10%.

The excess of 42,144 would be the natural growth of the population which by these figures, should now total 305,177, being an

Vital Statistics records show a total of 94,009 births, and 51,865 deaths in Newfoundland and Labrador for the period from 1922 to 31st July, 1935, inclusive.

increase of 16 per cent for the fourteen years. From the records of Emigration and Immigration during the same period of years it is found that the loss to the population of the Colony is 8,796, or 3.4 per cent of the 1921 population. This is .3 per cent less than that of the ten years 1911-1921.

Subtracting this loss from the population with the natural increase added, we find that, according to the records of Vital Statistics and Migration, the present population should be 296,381.

By the present Census Returns, it is found that the population is 289.516, thus showing a difference of 6,865 between the two methods of computation.

The natural growth for the period from 1922 to 31st July, 1935 inclusive, was 16 per cent and for the ten years 1911-1921 12.9 per cent; for 1901-1911, 13.5 per cent. The loss by emigration is 3.3 per cent; for 1911-1921 the loss was 3.7 per cent which was an increase of .2 per cent for the ten years between 1901-1911.

In Table 4 we have the population shown for the twenty-five districts, including Labrador, instead of 19 as in former Census Years. These Districts were set up under the Act, Chapter 7, 1932.

The largest numerical increase is to be found in the District of Humber, where there is an increase of 10,421 or 219.6 per cent. This is due to the establishment there of the town of Corner Brook with its paper-making industry.

Other Districts showing increases are, Grand Falls 55.8 per cent; White Bay 33.3; Labrador 24.9; St. John's West 21.7; St. Barbe 18.2; St. George's-Port au Port 10.5; Harbour Main-Bell Island 10.3; Fortune Bay and Hermitage 7.5; Burgeo and LaPoile 7.5; St. John's East 7.4; Fogo 4.0; Trinity South 3.7; Burin 3.6; Twillingate 2; Trinity North .5. The increase for Newfoundland is 9.7 per cent; Labrador 24.9.

Nine Districts show a decrease in population, namely: Carbonear-Bay de Verde 12.4; Port de Grave 12.4; Ferryland 9.3; Harbour Grace 7.7; Bonavista South 3.3; Bonavista North 2.6; Green Bay 1.7; Placentia West 1.0; Placentia and St. Mary's .8.

The natural growth of the various Districts is not shown here, because Vital Statistics records are made up of the nineteen Districts instead of twenty-five.

The increase per cent for the District of St. John's West is 21.7, and the increase per cent of the West portion of the City is 10.0; this shows an increase of 1.7 in the Outports, which, combined with the City, forms the District.

In the District of St. John's East the increase per cent is 7.4, but in the East portion of the City the increase per cent is 8.7, which shows a slightly greater increase than the Outports which form the part of that District.

During the past twenty-four years, or from 1911, the Roman Catholics have increased by 12,831 or 15.8 per cent; the Church of England by 13,902 or 17.7 per cent; the United Church by 8,102 or 11.9 per cent; the Presbyterians have decreased by 416 or 22 per cent; the Congregationalists have decreased by 89 or 8.8 per cent; the Salvation Army have increased by 7,908 or 78 per cent; and the Other Sects have increased by 908, or 51.8 per cent.

Previous Censuses did not show any adherents for the Pentecostal Assemblies, but the present Census returns give 3,721 persons as being members of that Denomination.

The gain to the Sexes in the Colony by natural increase has been as follows:—

Period from 1922 to 31st July, 1935, inclusive;

Male Births 48,255; Female Births 45,754; Deaths Deaths 26,923 24,942 Gain to Males 21,332 Gain to Females 20,812

The loss to the sexes by emigration has been as follows:-

Males who have left the country 102,158; less those who returned 96,333; loss to males 5,825.

Females who have left the country 61,866; less those who returned 58,895; loss to females 2,971.

That is by emigration and immigration there is a greater loss to the male sex than to the female sex by 2,854 persons.

This system of computation gives a larger number of both males and females in the Colony to-day than the figures shown by the actual returns of the Census. The difference being 940 males and 5,925 females.

In Labrador, out of the population of 4,716, shown by the Census figures, there are 2,522 males and 2,194 females; that is, there are only 870 females to every 1,000 males; in 1921 out of a population of 3,774 there were 2,025 males and 1,749 females, giving 864 females to every 1,000 males and in 1911 out of a population of 3,949 there were 2,054 males and 1,895 females giving 923 females to every 1,000 males.

8. Birthplace

From the Census Returns we find that out of a total population of 289,516, in 1935, 281,664 persons were born in Newfoundland; 3,743 in Labrador, 1,044 in the British Isles; 1,447 in the various British Possessions; 17 were born At Sea and 1,601 in Foreign Countries.

9. Nationality

Out of the total population of 289,516 we find there are 288,863 persons either born or naturalized British subjects in the Colony and only 653 persons of other nationality.
