

Housing markets differ for immigrants in Toronto and Vancouver

Immigrants own 43% of all residential properties in Toronto and 37% of all residential properties in Vancouver. In both census metropolitan areas, the overall mix of residential dwellings owned by immigrants differs from those owned by Canadian-born residents.

Tracking cancer in a growing and aging population

In 2016, over 146,000 new cases of cancer were diagnosed in Canada, excluding Quebec. The incidence rate was approximately 523 cases per 100,000 people. Since the inception of the Canadian Cancer Registry in 1992, the annual number of diagnosed cancer cases has increased from one year to the next as the population ages and grows.

A number of Canadians change labour status each month

From January 2007 to September 2018, 6.2% of people aged 15 years or older changed their labour force status each month, on average. This represents more than 1.5 million people. An average of 289,000 people, or 1.0% of the working-age population, went from looking for work to finding a job each month.

Gross domestic product declines in November

Real gross domestic product edged down 0.1% in November, partly offsetting a rise of 0.3% in October. Decreases in wholesale trade, finance and insurance, manufacturing and construction more than offset gains in 13 of 20 industrial sectors.
