THE FRUIT AND VEGETABLE PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY, 1950

The development of the canned foods industry has effected a great change in the relation of foods to seasons. Fruits and vegetables of many kinds are to be had at all times of the year, not always with all the flavour of the freshly gathered products, but with much of their original tenderness and food value. The producers in the country are provided with an enormously extended market for their products and the consumers in both city and country with cheap and wholesome food in great variety.

There was an increase in this industry during 1950, although the number of plants in operation decreased from 473 in 1949 to 444 in 1950. The average number of employees decreased from 14,992 to 14,893 with an increase in the salary and wage payments from \$23,863,821 to \$24,561,151. The value of production rose from \$148,762,324 to \$161,091,734, while the cost of materials used increased from \$89,502,037 to \$94,443,794. During the decade preceding the war the volume of fruit and vegetable preparations produced increased over 54 per cent. After the war production continued to increase and reached an all-time high in 1948. This growth represents a marked increase in the domestic demand for these products. The industry, besides supplying the home market, also has an exportable surplus.

The statistics published in the present report include only the statistics of establishments engaged in canning, evaporating, preserving and freezing of fruits and vegetables and the manufacture of vinegar, cider, pickles, catsups, etc. Statistics relating to specific products are not to be regarded as the total production for Canada, since many products, such as peanut butter, jelly powders, etc., are also found as secondary products of other industries. For the total production, reference should be made to the alphabetical list of products appearing in the report "The Manufacturing Industries of Canada" published annually.

The most important branch of this industry is the canning of fruits and vegetables which is carried on most extensively in Ontario, British Columbia and Quebec where climatic conditions for the growing of fruits and vegetables are favourable. The canning season begins in June and continues throughout the summer and autumn until October, being at its height in September. In September of 1950 there were 26,065 wage-earners employed in this industry, while in March, the month of lowest employment, there were only 6,022 employed.

The industry in 1950 increased 8 per cent in gross value of production while the volume of production increased only about 4 per cent. There was an increase of 30 per cent in the volume of canned soups, 25 per cent in pickles, 15 per cent in jams and jellies and 4 per cent in catsup, while canned vegetables decreased by 10 per cent, and fruits by 13 per cent.

The tables following give detailed statistics of products made, materials used, employment and salaries and wages paid, imports and exports, etc.
