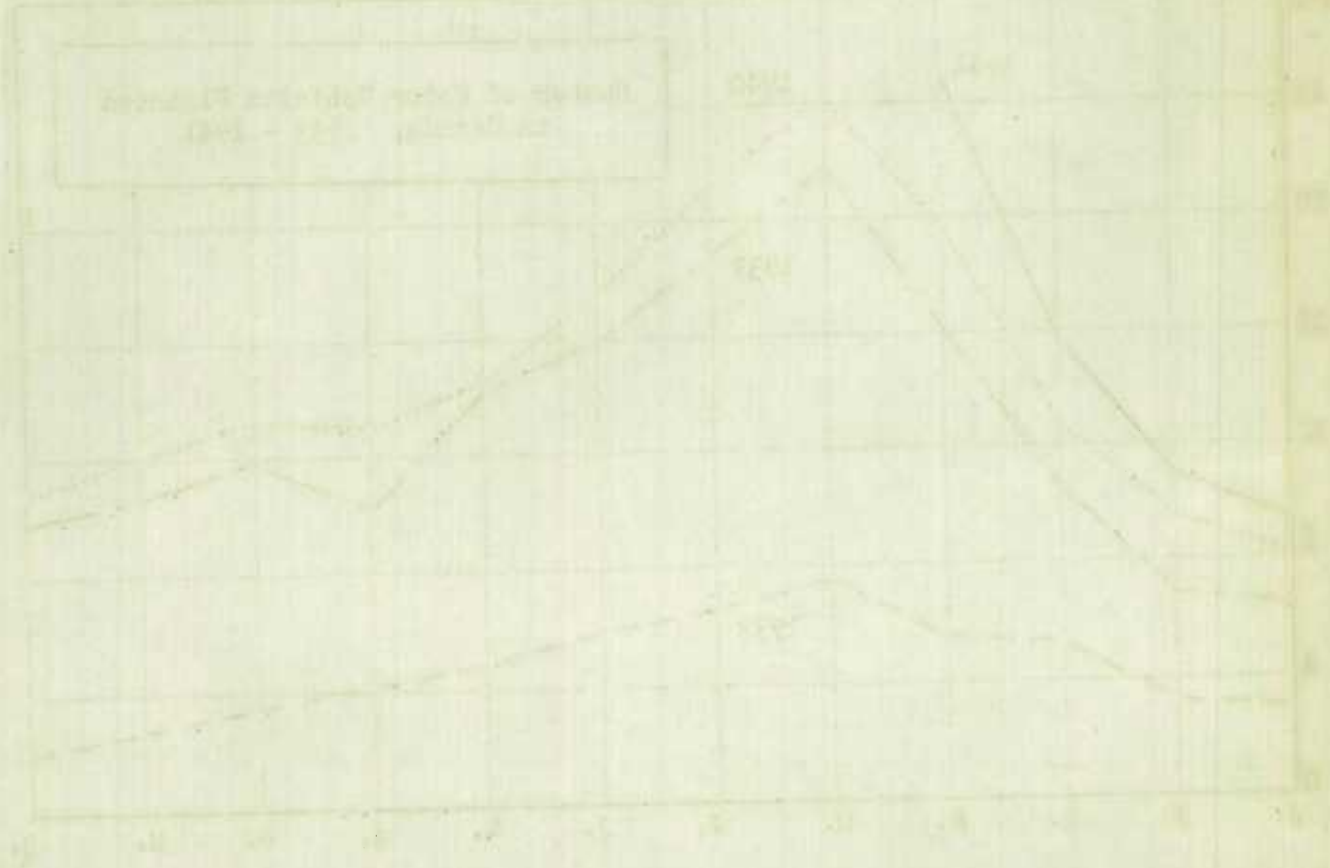

THE TRADE POLICY OF THE UNITED STATES IN WOOL, 1937

The wool trade of the United States in 1937 was characterized by a general decline in volume and value compared with 1936. This was due to a combination of factors, including a decrease in the number of sheep in the United States and a decline in the price of wool. The total value of wool exports from the United States in 1937 was estimated at \$1,000,000, a decrease of approximately 10% from the \$1,100,000 reported for 1936. The quantity of wool exports was also lower, at 1,000,000 pounds, compared with 1,100,000 pounds in 1936. The principal markets for United States wool in 1937 were Great Britain, France, and Italy, which together accounted for over 80% of the total exports. The United States continued to maintain a policy of free trade in wool, with no tariff or quota restrictions in effect. This policy was based on the principle of reciprocity and the desire to promote the welfare of the wool-growing industry in the United States.
