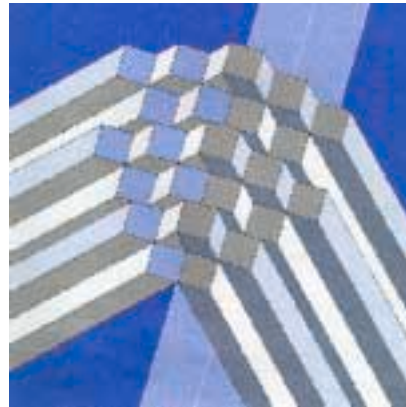

This issue of 15-001-XIE contains revised estimates of Gross Domestic Product by industry back to January 2001.

Note to users:

The July 2001 release of monthly gross domestic product (GDP) by industry introduced major classification and conceptual changes. The most important of these are: replacement of the 1980 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) with the 1997 North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS); rebasing from 1992 to 1997 prices, i.e., updating the price structure used to derive constant dollar GDP; a change in valuation from factor cost to basic prices; the capitalization of computer software. For more information, consult Appendix IIa of this publication.

The GDP of an industry is the value added by labour and capital in transforming inputs purchased from other industries into outputs. The estimates presented here are seasonally adjusted at annual rates and are valued at 1997 prices.

The System of National Accounts

In Canada, the National Accounts have been developed since the close of the Second World War in a series of publications relating to their constituent parts. These have now reached a stage of evolution where they can be termed a "System of National Accounts". For purposes of identification, all publications (containing tables of statistics, descriptions of conceptual frameworks and descriptions of sources and methods) which make up this System carry the term "System of National Accounts" as a general title.

The System of National Accounts in Canada consists of several parts. The annual and quarterly Income and Expenditure Accounts (included with Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 13) were, historically speaking, the first set of statistics to be referred to with the title "National Accounts" (National Accounts, Income and Expenditure). The Balance of International Payments data (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 67), are also part of the System of National Accounts and they, in fact, pre-date the Income and Expenditure Accounts.

Greatly expanded structural detail on industries and on goods and services is portrayed in the Input-Output Tables of the System (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 15). The Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 15 also provide measures of the contribution of each industry to total Gross Domestic Product at factor cost as well as Productivity Measures.

Both the Input-Output tables and the estimates of Gross Domestic Product by Industry use the establishment as the primary unit of industrial production. Measures of financial transactions are provided by the Financial Flow Accounts (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 13). Types of lenders and financial instruments are the primary detail in these statistics and the legal entity is the main unit of classification of transactors. Balance sheets of outstanding assets and liabilities are published annually.

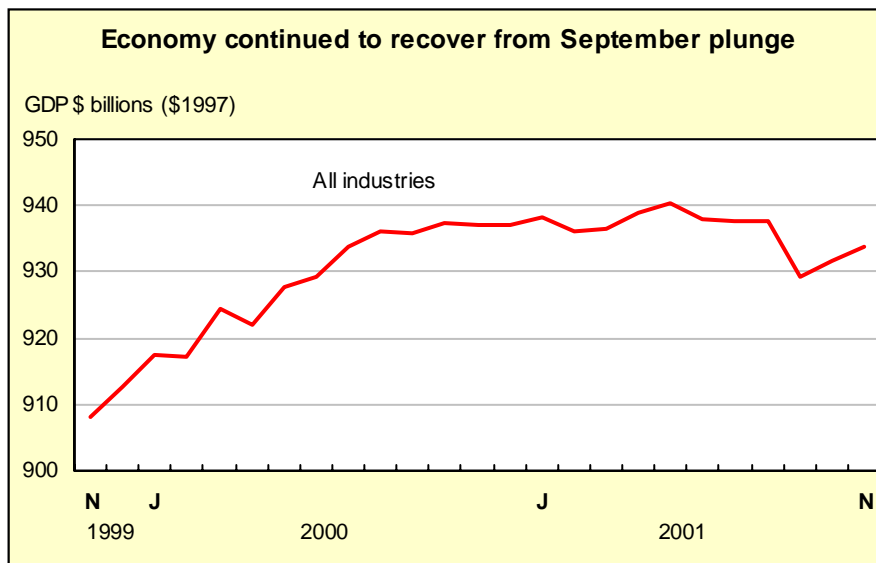
The System of National Accounts provides an overall conceptually integrated framework in which the various parts can be considered as interrelated sub-systems. At present, direct comparisons amongst those parts which use the establishment as the basic unit and those which use the legal entity can be carried out only at highly aggregated levels of data. However, Statistics Canada is continuing research on enterprise company establishment relationships; it may eventually be feasible to reclassify the data which are on one basis (say the establishment basis) to correspond to the units employed on another (the company or the enterprise basis).

In its broad outline, the Canadian System of National Accounts bears a close relationship to the international standard as described in System of National Accounts, 1993, a joint publication of the Commission of the Euro-pean Communities, International Monetary Fund, Organization for Economic Co-operation and development, United Nations and World Bank.

Highlights

November 2001

Gross domestic product (GDP) advanced 0.2% in November, after rising 0.3% in October. With these two increases, the economy has regained slightly more than half the ground it lost in September.

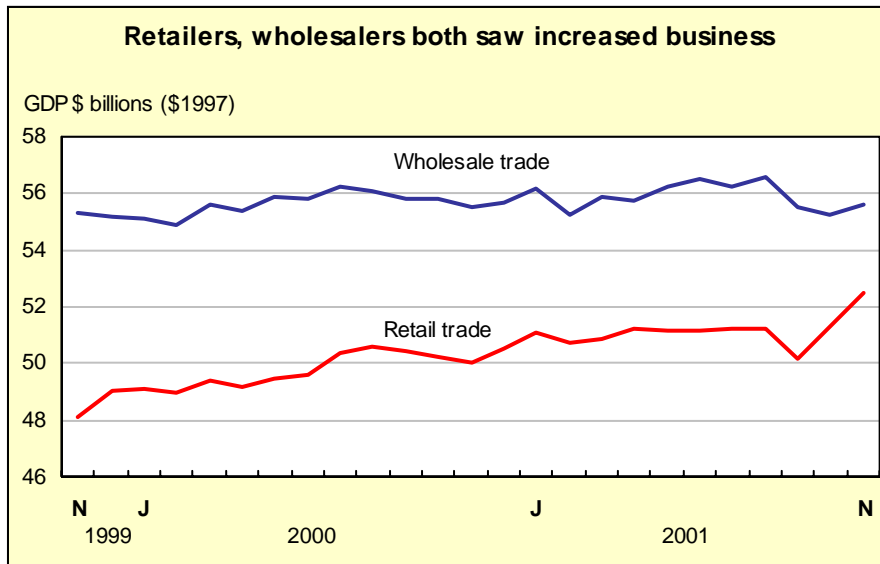


Sharply higher auto sales lifted the retail industry and provided the single largest push to the economy in November. Strong sales of computer equipment boosted wholesaling activity. Travel-related industries expanded for the second month in a row. Residential construction activity continued its upward trend as mortgage rates continued to fall. However, lower energy prices reduced oil and gas exploration activity. Manufacturing output declined slightly as the recent upswing in transportation equipment was negated by the continuing erosion in demand for telecommunications and electronic equipment investment.

Record car sales boost retailing activity

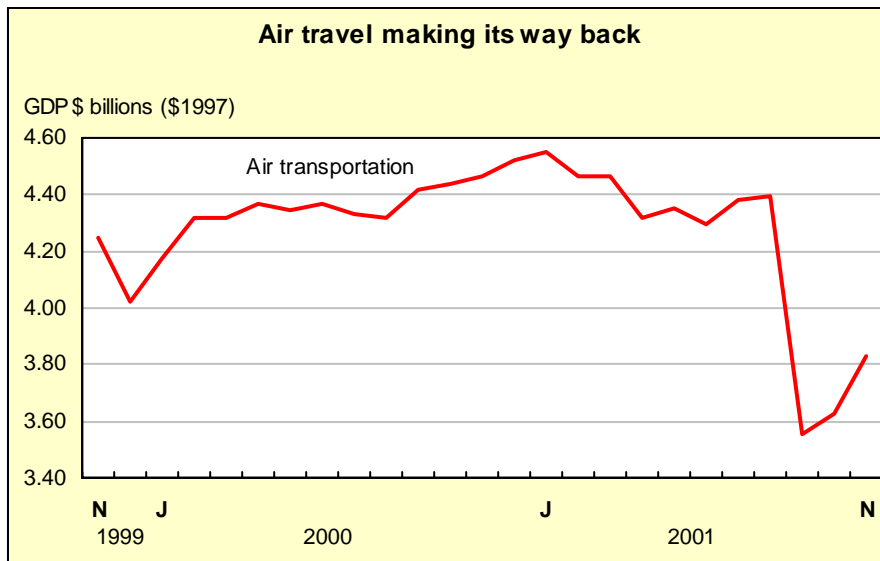
Retail sales surged for the second consecutive month increasing 2.1% in November. Sharply higher new motor vehicles sales were the impetus behind this strength as interest free financing helped put consumers into new car showrooms. Sales at automotive dealers surged 7.3% in November, the single largest monthly increase since December 1997. Excluding autos, retailers had a lacklustre gain of 0.1%. Higher sales at furniture stores were offset by lower sales at food and department stores.

Wholesaling activity advanced 0.5% in November, after falling significantly in the previous two months. Distributors of computers and software were largely responsible for November's increase. Computer sales rose 5.5% in November; but, this was only the second time in ten months that computer have risen. Increased wholesaling in the consumer products category also contributed to November's strength.



Travel-related industries advanced again

Industries associated with the travel sector made some gains in November, although the effects of September 11th continued to hamper demand for their outputs. Air transportation, which was hit particularly hard in September, was up 2.6% in November. Although demand for air travel improved, air transportation activity remained 10.9% below August levels. The passenger rail transportation industry gained at the expense of air travel. Partial rebounds were also reported for car rental, taxi and limousine services and the scenic and sightseeing industry.



The accommodations industry advanced for a second straight month, although output in this industry remains 3.4% below August levels. The restaurant industry, which suffered only a minor setback in September, advanced 0.7% in November. The travel and tour agency industry gained 1.1%; output in this industry was still 8.1% short of August levels. The output of the gambling industry rose 1.5% as the number of tourists from the US increased slightly from lower September and October levels.

Low mortgage rates spur home construction

The build-up in construction activity continued; output grew 0.3% in November. Residential building construction advanced 0.9%; the fifth increase in as many months for residential builders. Increases were reported for both single-family homes and multiple residential units. Forty-year lows in interest rates helped push up demand for both new and existing housing. Real estate brokers also saw more business, a result of lower mortgage rates. Real estate brokerage activity advanced 4.5% in November after a substantial 5.2% increase in October. Engineering and repair construction rose for the third consecutive month; however, these gains largely offset a slump during the summer months. However, work on non-residential building projects declined for the third straight month.

Mining sector hurt by reduced exploration

In November, mining sector output declined for the third straight month, now 9.2% short of its April peak. Lower prices for oil and gas continued to discourage exploration activities. Drilling and rigging services output declined 9.6% in November, the sixth decline in seven months. Oil production edged up slightly, but natural gas output fell.

Production at metal mines advanced 5.6%, reflecting gains in almost all types of metals. Output of the iron ore industry shot up 15.7% after declining 35.9% in October; however, output levels are still 30% below those of 2000. Non-metallic mineral mining declined 2.2% as increased diamond production was offset by lower salt, potash and asbestos output.

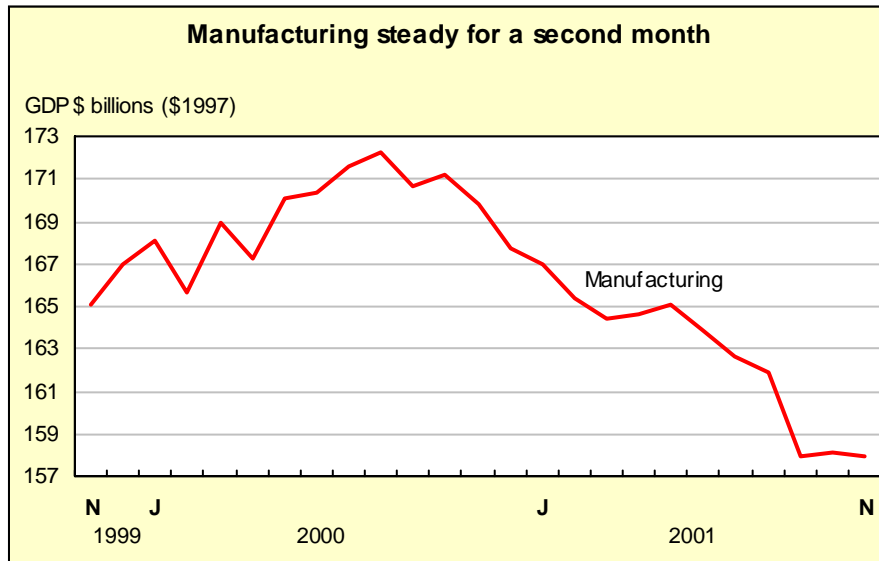
Manufacturing relatively stable

Manufacturing output remained relatively steady, edging down 0.1% in November. Sharply weaker demand for electronic and electrical equipment was again a major cause in manufacturing weakness, although producers of machinery, chemicals, paper and wood products saw declines as well. Strength in manufacturing came from makers of transportation equipment, food, beverages, tobacco and primary metals products. Ten of the 21 major manufacturing groups, representing 41% of total manufacturing output, declined in November.

Production of computers and electronic products continued its downward spiral, falling 2.2% in November. Production levels were less than half of their August 2000 peak. November's weakness was led by makers of telecommunications gear (-8.9%) and computer equipment (-3.2%). Fabricators of semi-conductors bucked the trend, raising output 3.5%; November was only the third month since August 2000 that this industry boosted production.

Output of electrical equipment manufacturers receded a further 4.3% in November, the tenth decline in eleven months. Makers of wire and cable (-14.9%), household appliances (-3.7%), electrical equipment (-2.9%) and lighting equipment (-0.2%) all reported declines. Manufacturers of most types of machinery also reduced production – output fell 1.7%.

Chemical manufacturers scaled back production 0.9% in November after raising output 2.9% in October. Petrochemical refiners suffered in light of low prices and flagging demand. However, a buoyant pharmaceutical industry continued to expand. Pharmaceutical production levels are up 28.6% from November 2000.



Production of paper products dropped 0.8% in November as manufacturers continued to take downtime due to weak demand and high inventories. Pulp production declined 2.2%, following an 11.6% increase in October, mirroring export flows. Manufacturing of newsprint remained little changed, edging up 0.2% in November. The imposition of new US anti-dumping penalties on softwood lumber continued to take its toll on the Canadian wood industry as output fell a further 0.9% in November.

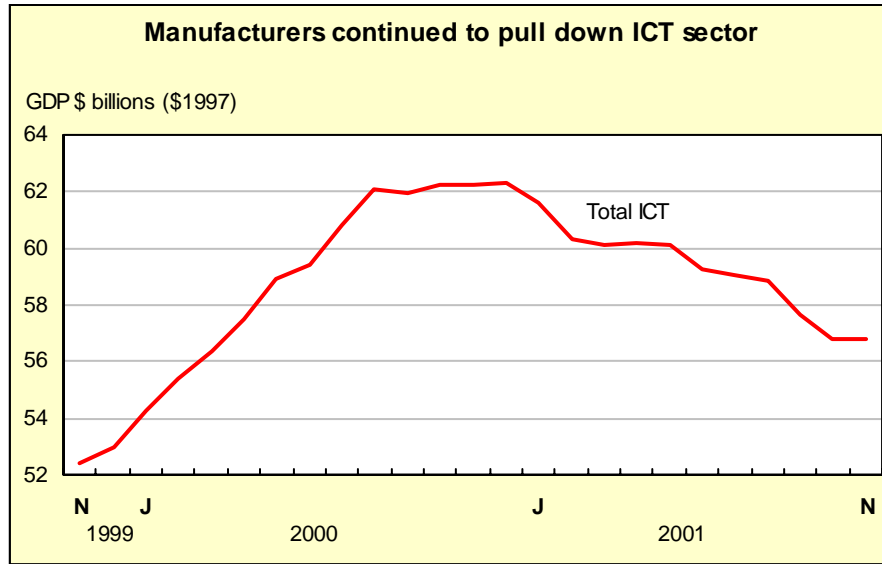
Motor vehicle assembly advanced 1.8% in November, the second consecutive monthly increase. Meanwhile, automotive parts production remained relatively flat. The North American auto industry's attempts to reduce inventory levels using generous sales incentives seemed to work, as stocks on dealers' lots declined to more manageable levels. This bodes well for future North American auto production. Makers of other transportation equipment also boosted output in November. The ship and boat building industry ramped up production 10.9%, the third consecutive monthly increase.

Other industries

Output of utilities fell 0.6% in November, as unseasonably warmer temperatures reduced residential and industry heating needs. Business services activity fell 0.3%, as most types of professional services (except advertising services) recorded declines in November. Demand for business services cooled considerably in 2001 – output levels are now back to August 2000 levels.

Information and communications technologies sector

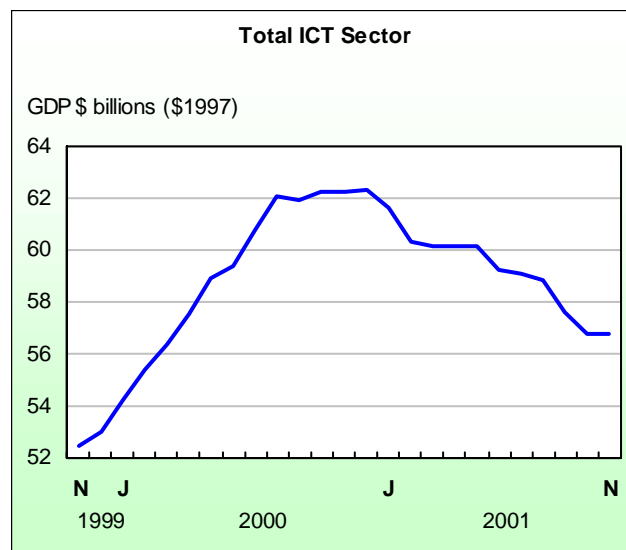
Starting with this November 2001 release, the monthly GDP statistics will include an aggregation for the Information and communications technologies (ICT) sector and its manufacturing and services components.



Output of the ICT sector declined 0.2% in November, returning to output levels not seen since March 2000. Production in November 2001 amounted to just under 56.8 billions, which represented 6.1% of GDP. The continuing expansion of ICT services (+0.4%) was more than offset by the ongoing retrenchment of manufacturers of ICT products (-3.2%). The ICT sector is comprised of 84% services and 16% manufacturing.

Information and communications technologies (ICT)

The 'New Economy' is most often associated with information technology and innovations, including the production of computers, cell phones and related goods and services. The information or digital revolution is commonly referred to as *Information and Communications Technologies (ICT)*. Broad access to personal computers in business, government and households has led to rapid expansion of Internet use, changing the way in which Canadians access, share information and do business. Over the past two decades, and particularly the 1990's, ICT has been an engine of growth and a major thrust in long periods of low-inflation and economic expansion. Since the latter part of 2000, however, expansion of the ICT sector came to a halt, as the manufacturing of ICT products crashed in light of slumping global demand. Overall, growth in ICT services slowed significantly, but nonetheless communications services continued to expand at a healthy pace through increased domestic demand for services such as Internet and cell phones.



With the release of the November 2001 monthly Gross Domestic Product by Industry, we are introducing a new industry aggregation for ICT. This measure will now be included as part of our regular monthly GDP release. The estimates, at this stage, have been worked back to January 1997, the point at which we converted to North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS).

The composition of ICT sector

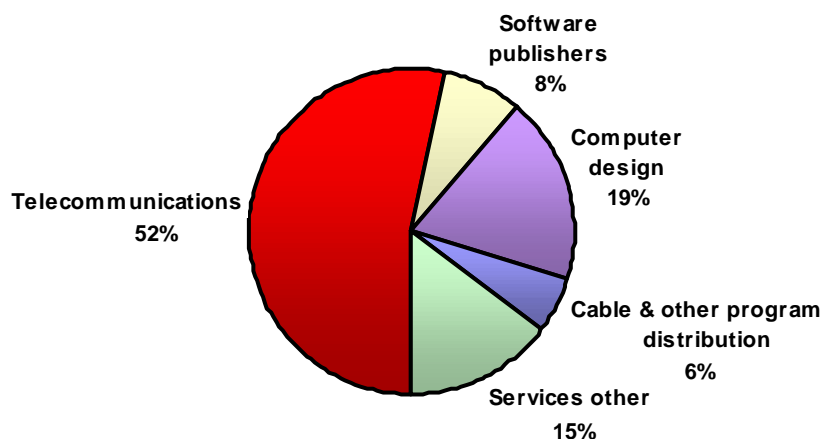
The ICT measure that we compiled here is consistent with the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) definition with a couple of exceptions, in that we include the retailing of ICT equipment and exclude the repair of ICT equipment. The OECD definition only includes the wholesaling of ICT equipment. We felt that the inclusion of retailing is warranted since the lines between wholesaling and retailing are becoming increasingly cloudy. Furthermore, the distributive trade surveys at Statistic Canada will not convert to NAICS 97 until 2003. The conversion from SIC 80 to NAICS97 will lead to significant shifting of establishments between wholesale and retail trade. Hence, including all distributive trade of ICT equipment would be more consistent through time.

The ICT sector consists of seven manufacturing industries and nine service industries. For the most part these ICT industries coincide directly with industries that are already published in our monthly GDP. The exceptions are in wholesale, retail, rental and leasing of computer equipment, pay TV, speciality TV and program distribution where only the part of the industry relating to ICT is included. Also, we were not able to break out the ICT component from the total repair and maintenance aggregate. This is explained in the detailed industry listing that follows the data table.

Output of the ICT sector is mainly services. In November 2001 services made up 84% of total ICT output while manufacturing accounted for the remaining 16% share. Developments since the latter part of 2000, however, have significantly changed these shares. In August of 2000, the split between services and manufacturing stood at 70% and 30% respectively. The precipitous decline in the manufacturing of telecommunications equipment, where its' ICT sector output share fell from 11% to 3% is the main contributor.

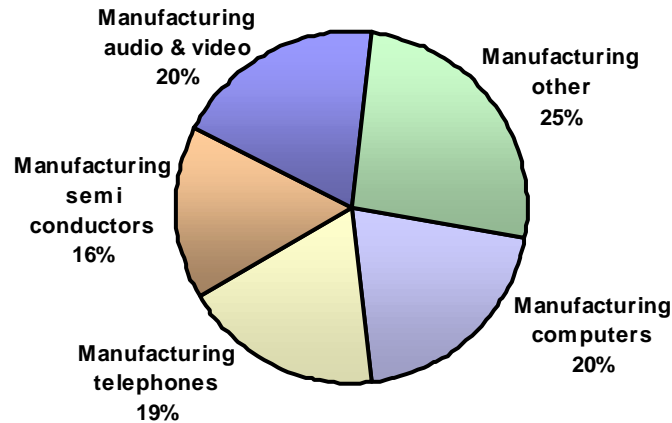
Telecommunications services stand out, by far, as the largest ICT industry, accounting for almost 52% of total services output. Producers of computer design and related services ran a distant second representing about 19% of ICT services sector GDP. These are followed by, software publishers, providers of cable and other program distribution services and wholesalers of computer and communications equipment.

Components of ICT services sector, November 2001 (GDP)



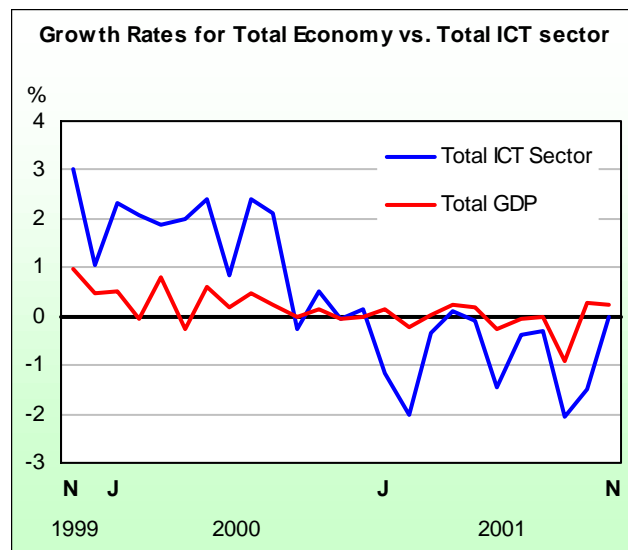
The key industries of the manufacturers of ICT equipment and components are: computers and peripheral equipment, audio and video equipment, telephone apparatus and makers of semi-conductors and other electronic components. As noted earlier, output of the telephone apparatus industry, which produces telecommunications and related equipment, fell dramatically over the past 15 months.

Components of ICT manufacturing sector, November 2001 (GDP)

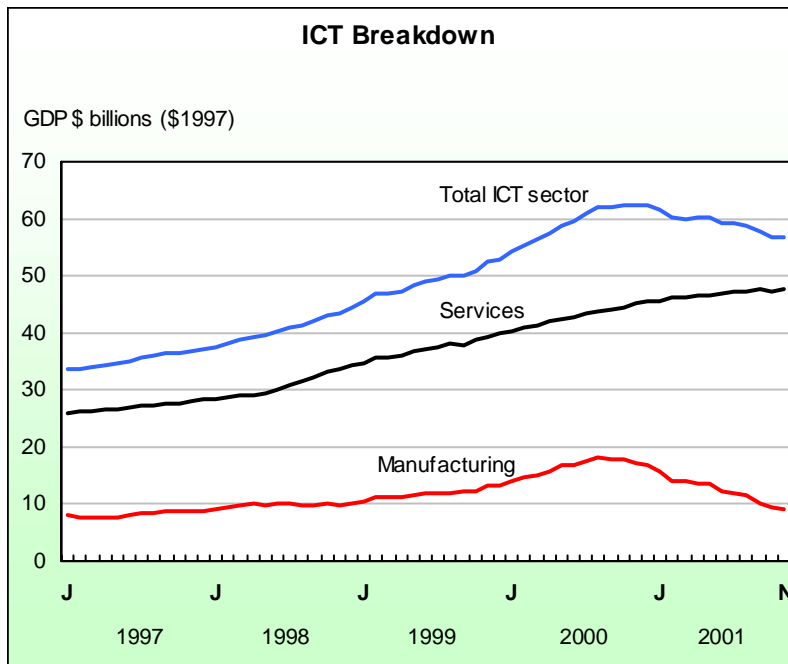


ICT engine of growth began to sputter in late 2000

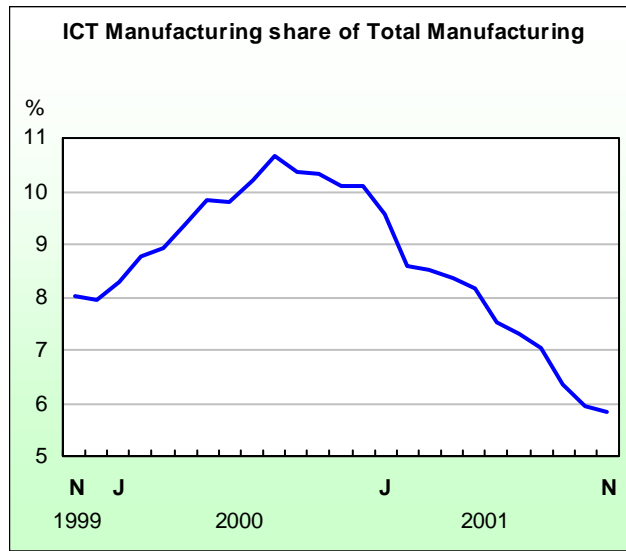
In 2000, growth in the ICT sector was up 21.0% while total GDP increased 4.5%. In fact, ICT contributed one-quarter of all economic growth in that year. So far in 2001, ICT has flattened out while the overall economy has inched up 0.8% (11 months compared to the first 11 months of 2000). The picture is even more dramatic when we look at ICT manufacturing versus services. The manufacturing of ICT equipment and components shot up nearly 40% in 2000 and has declined 25% so far this year. Putting it in a different context, ICT contributed more than 50% to total manufacturing growth in 2000 and three-quarters of the decline in manufacturing output in 2001 to date. Although fabricators of telephone apparatus were the main cause, makers of computers, semi-conductors and communications wire and cable were also main contributors to this pattern. ICT services continued to expand at a heady pace in 2001, albeit slower than in 2000.



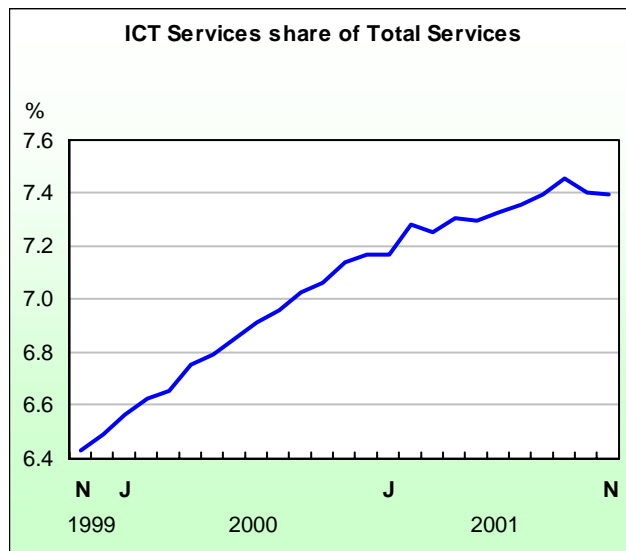
In the final quarter of 2000, output of the ICT sector exceeded \$62 billion in 1997 prices. Production increased nearly 70% from 1997 to 2000 and the ICT share of total GDP rose from 4.3% to 6.4%. In November 2001 this level had dropped to \$56.8 billion (6.1% of GDP). The manufacturing of ICT equipment and components, which had doubled from 1997 to 2000, went into a tailspin in the latter half of 2000 as global investment in information technology infrastructures waned. Since the August 2000 peak, fabrication of these products declined by half, and the ICT share of manufacturing fell from 10.7% to 5.8%. Demand for ICT services, nevertheless, continued to expand in 2001, increasing 5.8% since the fourth quarter of 2000.



The fabrication of telecommunications and related equipment in the telephone apparatus industry in November 2001 stood at only 25% of the level of output in August 2000. A number of other ICT manufacturing industries also did not fare well since the fourth quarter of 2000. By November 2001, the output of industries producing semiconductors and electronic components, communications wire and cable, and computers and peripheral equipment had fallen 59.8%, 51.2% and 34.2% respectively. The production of computer equipment had nearly tripled between 1997 and 2000, and the industry remained resilient into the first half of this year. Subsequently, two sharp monthly declines left November output of this industry 37.6% below May 2001 levels.



Overall, solid growth was maintained for ICT services, but not at the torrid pace set in the previous two years. Nevertheless, ICT related services contributed one-fifth of all growth in the total services sector of the economy so far in 2001 – about the same proportion as in 2000. Top performers include telecommunications, cable services, data processing and software publishing. The only real weakness in services for 2001 was concentrated in the wholesaling and leasing of computer and communications equipment.



Telecommunications, which account for about half of total ICT services, increased nearly 50% from 1997 to 2000 in response to a growing market for cell phones, long distance services and Internet access. These services continued to expand in 2001 with November output 8.5% higher than December 2000. Over the same period, output of cable services, data processing and software publishing increased 11.3%, 16.8% and 8.5% respectively. Declines in the wholesaling of computer and communications equipment, down 13.9%, and the easing back of rental and leasing of computer equipment (-1.4%) and computer systems and design services (-1.3%) held the reins on the expansion of ICT services.

Appendix IIa - GDP by Industry: Overview

1. Gross Domestic Product by Industry at Basic Prices, in Constant Dollars

Definition

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by industry at basic prices is a measure of the economic production which takes place within the geographical boundaries of Canada. As the name suggests, it is designed to show the industrial distribution of total output. GDP for a single industry is also referred to as net output, or value added. It is equal to the total value of production by the industry (gross output) less the value of inputs purchased from other industries or imported (intermediate inputs). Primary factors of production, such as labour and capital, produce gross output by adding value to the intermediate inputs. Value added can therefore also be derived as the remuneration to the primary factors of production, that is as the sum of labour income, depreciation, and profits. GDP at basic prices for the economy as a whole, is the sum of net output, or value added, for all industries. Summing net rather than gross outputs avoids double counting the output of one industry which is an intermediate input to another.

The term "gross" in Gross Domestic Product means that capital consumption costs, that is the costs associated with the depreciation of capital assets (buildings, machinery and equipment), are included.

"Constant dollars" means that the estimates are valued at the prices that prevailed in some base year rather than those of the current year. As a result, changes in the estimates of value added by industry reflect changes in the physical volume of production, and do not reflect changes that are simply due to price fluctuations. With this publication, the base year for constant price estimates is 1997 (see section 2.2).

"By industry" implies a classification system. The North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS) replaced the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) with the release of July 2001 data (see Section 3).

2. Major Changes and Differences Between Industry-Based and Expenditure-Based GDP

2.1 Differences in Objectives

The Canadian System of National Accounts (CSNA) publishes two constant dollar subannual measures of Gross Domestic Product: (1) the monthly GDP by industry and (2) the quarterly expenditure-based GDP. Both measures are designed to measure total production in Canada, but serve different analytical purposes. GDP by industry provides information about the sources of output, while the expenditure-based GDP shows the disposition of output among the various categories of final demand. The two series yield similar results, but because of conceptual, statistical and methodological differences, they are not identical.

2.2 Rebasing and Deflation Methods: Fixed-Weighted Laspeyres versus Chain-Weighted Fisher

In order to analyse the behaviour of GDP independently of the influence of price changes, GDP is calculated for each industry in constant prices. Constant price measures inform about the volume of goods and services produced, independently of changes in prices. Such series are generally calculated by choosing a reference period in the past, called the base year, and valuing current production of goods and services in the prices of that year.

With the release of the July 2001 data, a new base year was adopted. The year 1997 (previously 1992) became the new base year for the constant dollar estimates.

Currently, real GDP by industry estimates are calculated using a Laspeyres formula chained periodically. The Laspeyres formula is fixed-weighted using weights based on some fixed point in the past. This formula basically adds up the volume changes in GDP by using the price levels of the base year as the weights. It is chained by changing the base year periodically. The base years are 1961, 1971, 1981, 1986, 1992 and 1997. Each time span is added up in its own base year prices and then the spans are linked together by measuring each base year on two price levels (old base and new base) and using the ratio of the two to link them together. One of the effects of linking together series in this manner is the loss of additivity in the period prior to the new base year (i.e., prior to 1997, aggregates will not generally be equal to the sum of their components).

The selection of the base year can have significant consequences, as different base years may yield different growth rates in total GDP and other aggregates. Consider an industry whose output price has declined relative to that of other industries, between two years. The contribution of this industry to total output will be larger when valued in prices of the earlier period since the relative price was larger in that period, and movements in this industry will have more impact on movements in total output. If the industry is growing faster than average, valuing output in prices of the earlier period will result in a total GDP measure that grows faster than it would were output valued in prices of the later period.

Ideally the base year is a typical year, followed by a number of years in which the relative prices of commodities remain stable. In a dynamic economy, however, relative prices constantly shift due to such factors as uneven technological developments in different industries, variations in productivity, shifts in consumer demand, cycles in economic growth and so on. The more remote a base year becomes in time, the more today's relative prices will have changed compared to those of the base year, and the less prices of the base year will be relevant for the current period. The usefulness of constant price estimates therefore diminishes as we move away from the base year. The rate of obsolescence depends on the degree of relative price change.

Recently, with the rapid expansion of the Information and Communication Technology (ICT) industries in Canada, the current Laspeyres volume measure has produced significantly biased results. Growth has been overestimated because prices of equipment and services related to this fast-growing sector of the economy have declined dramatically since the base year 1992 because of rapid technological change. The Laspeyres index measures changes in GDP by adding up the quantities produced of these commodities using 1992 price levels as weights. This is the equivalent of giving these commodities roughly four times the weight they would have at price levels of 2000. This over-weighting of the Laspeyres index, called "substitution bias", is why the Laspeyres formula produces a growth rate of GDP that is at the upper limit of possible measures. It does not compensate for substitution to lower-priced commodities.

Changing the index formula to a Paasche index, where current prices would always be used as a weight base, is not a solution. This results in a bias opposite to that of the Laspeyres, with a tendency to understate growth in GDP as ICT prices fall monotonically. Growth in the base year would be measured using current prices, which is as faulty as the reverse. So with a Laspeyres index producing an upper bound to measurement of economic growth and a Paasche index producing the lower bound, the Fisher index, which is the geometric average of the two, follows a more stable middle path.

The expenditure-based quarterly GDP adopted a quarterly chained Fisher index as the official measure of economic growth at the time of their annual revision in May 2001. The new Fisher formula, which is the middle ground between the Laspeyres and the Paasche, is rebased each quarter in order to minimize the bias introduced by dispersion.

In order to produce chained Fisher indices for the industry-based GDP measures, extensive development work is required that will take place between now and the Fall of 2003. In the interim, steps will be taken to improve the timeliness of rebasing in an effort to retain reasonable comparability between the expenditure- and industry-based measures. Provincial GDP by industry measures (annual) will also be rebased to 1997 for the 2001 Fall release, and will be converted to an annual chained Fisher in two years, in tandem with the expenditure-based Provincial GDP estimates.

2.3 Market Price and New Basic Prices Valuation

Because expenditure-based GDP is viewed from the perspective of purchasers, the analysis is concerned with final demand categories such as personal expenditure, government expenditure, capital formation, and exports and imports. Output is valued at *market prices*, which reflect what purchasers actually pay for the goods and services. Market price valuation includes indirect taxes such as sales and excise taxes, licences, property taxes, etc., and excludes subsidies.

Since its inception, GDP by industry has been measured at *factor cost*. This measure differed from the *market price* measure by its exclusion of taxes on production (formerly called indirect taxes) and the inclusion of subsidies. While the *market price* measure represents the value of GDP as paid for by final consumers, the *factor cost* measure took the point of view of producers.

With this revision, value added is no longer measured at *factor cost*, but instead at *basic prices*. This new measure adds to the factor cost measure some taxes on production (such as property and payroll taxes, but not federal or provincial sales taxes), and subtracts some subsidies (such as labour-related subsidies, but not product-related subsidies). The end result is that the new basic prices measure of GDP stands somewhere in between the lower and upper bounds defined by the *factor cost* and *market price* measures, respectively.

The difference between the three measures can be illustrated using data from the 1997 Input-Output tables in constant prices for total GDP.

Indirect taxes fall more heavily on some products (for example liquor or tobacco) than on others, and consequently the contribution of specific industries to total GDP is more accurate if such taxes are not taken into consideration. GDP by industry is therefore estimated at basic prices.

2.4 Statistical Differences

The estimates of monthly GDP by industry and the quarterly expenditure-based GDP are built up somewhat independently. The estimates are prepared using various data sources which, in addition to being weighted differently, also result from different estimation methods. For example, the industry-based estimates do not rely on data for exports but are based on manufacturers' shipments data. The expenditure-based estimates of GDP use exports, but not shipments. Since exports by manufacturers must have been shipped, both systems will reflect the same underlying activity. However, since they do so via different statistical vehicles, there will be statistical differences between the two systems.

3. Other Major Changes Introduced with this Revision

3.1 Classification: Adoption of the North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS)

With the September 2001 release, the 1997 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS-1997) replaced the 1980 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC-1980). NAICS is an industry classification system developed by the statistical agencies of Canada, Mexico and the United States. Created against the background of the North American Free Trade Agreement, it was designed to provide common definitions of the industrial structure and a common statistical framework to facilitate the analysis of the three economies. The adoption of a common system ensures that statistical agencies in the three countries can produce information on inputs and outputs, industrial performance, productivity, unit labour costs, employment, and other statistics that reflect structural changes occurring in the three economies.

NAICS is based on a production-oriented or supply-based conceptual framework. This means that producing establishments are grouped into industries according to similarity in the production processes (i.e., the similarity of input structures, labour skills, etc.) used to produce goods and services. This is a marked departure from previous classifications systems, where the guiding principle in delineating industry boundaries was the commodity itself (i.e., establishments were grouped together based on which commodities they produced or, alternately, the end use to which they were put). For example, under the SIC-1980, manufacturing of motor vehicle plastic parts (SIC 3256) was a subdivision of motor vehicle parts production (SIC 325), because of similarity of product/end use. However, under

NAICS-1997, Motor Vehicle Plastic Parts Manufacturing (NAICS 326193) has been classified under Plastic Product Manufacturing (NAICS 3261), reflecting the shared similarity of production process, which involves the extensive use of compression, extrusion and injection moulding techniques.

The numbering system that has been adopted is a six-digit code, of which the first five digits are used to describe the NAICS levels that will be used by the three countries to produce comparable data. The first two digits designate the sector, the third digit designates the subsector, the fourth digit designates the industry group and the fifth digit designates industries. The sixth digit is used to designate national industries. The Canadian version of NAICS consists of 20 sectors, 99 subsectors, 321 industry groups, 734 industries and 921 national industries. The 20 sectors are listed below.

The Canadian System of National Accounts only publishes 19 of these sectors. The twentieth, Sector 55 (Management of Companies and Enterprises) has, for reasons of historical continuity and data quality, been grouped together with Sectors 52 and 53 into an aggregate called Finance, Insurance and Real Estate.

Monthly GDP estimates are compiled back to 1981. At the lowest level of aggregation of the current industrial classification framework, it is not always possible to have an homogeneous series from 1981 to the present. Data gaps as well as changes in the industry classifications of 1980 and 1997 are responsible for this.

With the introduction of the new 1997 NAICS, establishments are sometimes reclassified from one industry to another. Thus a NAICS industry with a name similar to that of the 1980 SIC may have a somewhat different composition in terms of establishments.

In some cases the differences will be small, and in others large. In general there is greater such definitional discontinuity at lower levels of industrial dis-aggregation than at higher levels. For some purposes it is useful to have definitional continuity at as low a level of dis-aggregation as possible. For this reason, special industry groupings that provide relatively good continuity were created back to 1981. These groupings are identified with an asterisk (*) in Appendix I.

Special attention was given in NAICS to developing classifications for new and emerging industries, services industries in general, and industries engaged in the production of advanced technologies. As much as possible, time series continuity was maintained. However, owing to fundamental changes in the economy, to the classification's strong production orientation and to proposals from data users, this has not always been possible. There are such aggregates including goods producing industries, services producing industries, industrial production and others. They are identified in Appendix I with an industry code prefixed by a "T".

3.2 Capitalization of Software

All spending by businesses and governments on software is now treated as a capital expenditure. Previously, only a small portion, less than 20% of these expenditures, was treated as such. This will be a net addition to GDP, both in level and in growth, in the years in which software expenditures grow faster than other components of final expenditure. Treating software as a capital expenditure has been introduced by most countries, including the United States, within the last couple of years.

3.3 Treatment of Rent Paid by Farmers

Another conceptual change concerns the treatment of *rent* in the Crop Production Industry. Previously, the *rent* paid by farmers was considered as an intermediate input; now it is treated as mixed income, which is a primary input (i.e., part of GDP). This treatment conforms more closely to the international standards as described in [System of National Accounts 1993](#). The end result of this change is to increase GDP in the Crop Production Industry. However, this is offset by a decrease in the GDP of the Lessors of Real Estate Industry, where the aforementioned output of rent was formerly classified. This redistribution of output, which has no net effect at the level of the total economy, brings land use for agriculture in line with the treatment of royalties on natural resources.

4. Methodological Overview: GDP by Industry

4.1 Annual Benchmarks

For all but the most recent two years, the annual estimates of GDP by industry are derived within the framework of the Input-Output accounts by subtracting the intermediate inputs from the gross output of industries. The data sources are typically annual surveys or censuses. For the most recent two full years and part of the current year, GDP is estimated using the monthly methodology described below.

4.2 Monthly Estimates

On a monthly basis information on industry activity, especially the consumption of inputs, is not as complete as it is annually. As a result, the monthly values of GDP by industry are projections, estimated using proxy indicators such as gross output or employment, usually obtained from monthly surveys (see Appendix IIb). The main assumption inherent in the monthly projector system is that the relationship between inputs and outputs changes slowly enough that it can be regarded as constant over short spans of time. This assumption will be true if both technology and the product mix change slowly. It is therefore more useful for projecting GDP over short time spans than over long ones, and at lower levels of industrial disaggregation, where product mix is relatively homogenous and stable. Prices of inputs and outputs do not necessarily evolve at the same pace during a given period. As a result, the relationship between inputs and gross output can be distorted at current prices. For that reason, the assumption above only applies to the calculation of GDP at constant prices.

4.3 Benchmarking

This is the process by which monthly estimates are adjusted to the new benchmark levels. Since the monthly estimates are projections, they are adjusted to sum to the annual benchmark levels once they become available. This adjustment is based on a quadratic minimization technique, which preserves the month-to-month movements in the original series as much as possible, subject to the constraint that the monthly estimates sum to the annual benchmarks.

4.4 Seasonal Adjustment

To aid interpretation of economic developments the estimates of GDP by industry are seasonally adjusted and are published in both seasonally adjusted and unadjusted forms. Seasonal adjustment removes movements caused by repetitive climatic or institutional events, thereby making the underlying activity more apparent.

The seasonal adjustment technique relies heavily on the use of moving averages, that become less reliable towards the end of the series. To minimize this problem, the series are projected one more year so that the last real data point is 12 months from the end point of the extended series. An ARIMA (autoregressive integrated moving average) model is used for this purpose.

4.5 Trading-Day Adjustment

In many monthly economic time series a significant portion of the monthly growth rate is associated with differences in the composition of calendar months. For example, the volume of production usually varies with the different days of the week, and since consecutive months contain different combinations of days, a significant portion of the month-to-month changes may be caused strictly by the calendar. To give a more precise idea of economic developments, the calendar months are put on an equalized basis. This is done by applying a smoothing procedure, known as trading-day adjustment. Trading-day adjustment alters the distribution of monthly output to reflect changes in production that would occur if all months contained the same number and type of days.

5. Dissemination Vehicles

5.1 The *Daily*/CANSIM

As with many Statistics Canada series, the monthly estimates of GDP are officially released to the public simultaneously through the Statistics Canada *Daily* Bulletin and CANSIM II (Statistics Canada's machine-readable database). The CANSIM II database is available on Internet at the following address: www.statcan.ca. The estimates are published approximately 60 days after the end of the reference month. Data can also be obtained directly from the division on diskette, print-out or other.

5.2 Publication

The monthly, quarterly and annual constant price estimates of Gross Domestic Product by industry are published in *Gross Domestic Product by Industry*, Statistics Canada, Catalogue no. 15-001-XIE, available approximately five working days after the data have been released. This publication contains seasonally adjusted data extending back to 1997, the current base year.

Appendix IV - A Note on Data Revisions for the Period 1997 to 2001

Introduction

With the release of the July 2001 data, the monthly detailed estimates of GDP by industry for 235 industries and their aggregates were revised back to January 1997. A more summary level of aggregation, totalling 123 industry aggregations were revised back to January 1981. Revisions for 1997 and 1998 incorporate new annual information compiled by Input-Output Division. The annual data presented in the Input-Output tables reflects a careful synthesis and reconciliation of both survey and census data from many different sources. It is often referred to as 'benchmark' data.

With the incorporation of the new benchmarks, the annual levels for 1999 and 2000 were projected so that the movement of the GDP continues to parallel that of the indicators. The monthly estimates of GDP were step-adjusted so they would sum to these projected annual levels between 1999 and 2000 and to the benchmarks for 1997 to 1998. Subject to the annual adding up constraints, the step-adjustment process also minimised revisions to previously published month-to-month movements in GDP.

Revisions to Gross Domestic Product by Industry

The following tables provide a summary of revisions to a few special aggregates. The reasons for these revisions are the result of major classification and conceptual changes. The most important of these are: replacement of the 1980 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) with the 1997 North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS); rebasing from 1992 to 1997 prices, i.e., updating the price structure used to derive constant dollar GDP; a change in valuation from factor cost to basic prices; the capitalization of computer software. Revisions also resulted from the incorporation of new annual information from both survey and census data from many different sources.

Revisions to the annual growth rates are shown in Text Table 1. The table shows that in the year 2000 the growth rate of the total GDP was unchanged. The growth rate was revised up in 1998 and 1999 by 0.7% and 0.5% respectively. These upward revisions were mainly due to the goods producing industries of the business sector.

The revisions to the quarterly growth rates are presented in Text Table 2. Overall GDP growth rates were revised by 0.4% or less.
