Highlights

Domestic travel, 2003

- Travel in Canada by Canadian residents fell 8.3% to 172.2 million trips in 2003 after reaching 187.9 million trips in 2002, the highest level over the last six years.
- The year 2003, which was a difficult year for tourism in Canada, had a series of adverse events such as the war in Iraq, the outbreak of SARS, the power outage in Ontario and the forest fires in British Columbia.
- Overall, domestic trips accounted for 81.6% of the 211.1 trips made in Canada in 2003 compared to 80.7% in 2002.
- Trips made by Canadians within their own province in 2003 reached 151.2 million, or 87.8% of all trips made by Canadians in Canada. They were down 8.1% compared to 2002.
- During the year, Canadian travellers in Canada were away from home 278.5 million nights or an average of 3.2 nights per trip.
- Spending on domestic travel, which reached \$28.5 billion in 2003, dropped 8.0% compared to 2002. However, when taking inflation into account, spending actually decreased by 9.0% to \$25.4 billion (in 1997 dollars).
- Annual declines were recorded in all expenditure categories, with expenditures on food and beverages showing the smallest decrease (-6.8%) and recreation and entertainment, the largest (-9.1%).
- In 2003, average spending (\$166) and average distance travelled (287 km) for all trips were relatively unchanged from the previous year. In comparison, average spending per overnight trip was \$261, while the average distance travelled for all overnight trips was 424 km.



Chapter 1

Introduction

Background

In 2003, tourism in Canada was worth \$52.1 billion¹, of which tourism domestic demand accounted for \$36.2 billion or 69.5% of the total. Tourism in Canada was also responsible for generating close to 600,000 direct person-years of employment in 2003. Tourism trends are constantly changing in response to social and economic conditions and consumer preferences.

Throughout 2003, Statistics Canada interviewed about 170,000 Canadian residents about their trips in Canada, about themselves and about their households. This publication presents a summary of the responses to the 2003 Canadian Travel Survey (CTS). The CTS provides a yardstick for identifying who is travelling, the types of trips they are taking and how much they are spending. These findings may prove useful to decision makers in the tourism industry and government concerning how to market Canada to Canadians, which tourism products to develop, and so forth. The CTS results are also used in putting together Canada's Tourism Satellite Account, in calculating the National Tourism Indicators and for producing tourism economic impact models.

Organization and content of this publication

Chapter 1 provides background information on the Canadian Travel Survey, including the history of the survey and the products available. Chapter 2 presents an overview of economic conditions at the national level from 1998 to 2003 and a brief description of the main characteristics of domestic trips taken in 2003. Several historical statistical tables (1998-2003) highlighting domestic travel and trip spending by province and census metropolitan area are included in Chapter 3. Chapter 4 provides a statistical measure of the sampling variability for each estimate included in the historical tables of Chapter 3. Finally, information on concepts, definitions and survey methodology as well as main changes introduced to the survey throughout the years is available in the Appendix.

Brief history of the Canadian Travel Survey

The Canadian Travel Survey, which is conducted as a supplement to Statistics Canada's monthly Labour Force Survey (LFS), was first conducted in 1979 and, beginning in 1980, has been conducted every two years up to 1996. Since 1997, the survey has become annual. The CTS was developed to measure the volume, characteristics and spending of domestic travel, which is defined as same-day or overnight travel by Canadian residents to Canadian destinations with a one-way distance of 80 km or more from home.

From 1980 to the first quarter of 1992, the survey had been conducted on a quarterly basis, that is, the respondents were contacted at the end of the three-month period and were asked to recall all trips ending in that period. Because it was hard to remember all the trips that ended during such a long period, starting with the second quarter of 1992, the reference period was shortened to a month as the same respondent was contacted for each month in the quarter. This method led to trips being under-reported for the second and third months of the quarter. To further improve the data quality in 1994, the collection method was changed again to have a new sample of respondents for every month. This method has been used since. However, the improvement in the collection method caused a break in the series. The data from 1980 to 1992 are not comparable to data collected since 1994. In 1996, no major methodological changes were made to the survey but a number of smaller changes, however, occurred. For example, 1996 was the first year the CTS was conducted using Computer-Assisted Interviewing (CAI) technology. Also, the sample included two LFS rotation groups in 1996, compared to one group in 1994 (some provinces purchased additional rotation groups for the summer months in 1994). Because of these small changes, 1996 data are not comparable to those of 1994 and earlier years.

In 1997, the implementation of the Project to Improve Provincial Economic Statistics (PIPES) resulted in new requirements for the CTS, namely the collection of more reliable annual data on interprovincial trips. In order to comply, the CTS sample was increased to three rotation groups. Members of one group were asked about all trips, while respondents in the other two groups were only asked about out-of-province trips. Except for the sample size, no changes were made to the survey.

In 1998, a few changes were implemented to the CTS concerning the sample size and the questionnaire. The sample size went back to what it was in 1996. In all provinces except Newfoundland and Labrador, the sample was drawn from just two rotation groups. Following an agreement reached with the province of Newfoundland and Labrador, the sample from that province was drawn from three rotation groups. Changes to the questionnaire were related to activity participation and accommodation type.

In the summer of 2000, there was a change in the way the CTS data were collected. Rather than being gathered by interviewers working out of their homes (a decentralized method), the majority of the collection was done in all regional offices (centralized method).

In the following months, the trip levels remained somewhat higher than those previously obtained in a decentralized environment. It was concluded that some under-estimation had occurred due to the decentralized collection and, consequently, an adjustment to previously released data was required.

Furthermore, it had been acknowledged that the second time a person or household is interviewed in the CTS, the respondent may have learned they can shorten the interview by reporting fewer trips. It was decided the adjustment to previously released data and the production of current data should take into account this concept of "respondent conditioning".

Provincial logistic regression models were used to adjust the data for 1996 and 1998 to 2001 as part of the project "Historical adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2001". The data prior to the centralization were adjusted to indicate what the level of travel would have been if the data had been collected from a centralized environment. Prior data were also adjusted for the respondent conditioning phenomenon. However, the data that were collected from a centralized environment were only adjusted for the respondent conditioning. For more information on the project "Historical adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2001", consult the 2001 edition of this publication.

At the beginning of 2002, a more systematic interviewer monitoring system was put in place in the regional offices. However, since the start of the year, substantial increases in the estimates of 2002 over 2001 were observed. Although there is some volatility in the CTS estimates, the changes were too important to be considered acceptable.

As a result of a comprehensive analysis of the data, Statistics Canada concluded the new monitoring system was in a large part responsible for the increases registered in 2002 and the 2002 estimates could not be compared to those from previous years. Consequently, the project “Historical adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2003” was put in place to adjust once again the 1998 to 2001 data.

Using a methodology similar to the one used for the project “Historical adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2001”, the data from 1998 to 2001 were adjusted to take into account not only the effects of centralized collection and respondent conditioning, but also the effect of an enhanced monitoring system for the interviewers.

Consequently, the revised 1998 to 2001 estimates released in this publication were produced using the adjusted data that came out from the project “Historical adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2003”. These revised estimates are comparable with those of 2002 and 2003.

Chapter 2

Domestic tourism in 2003

Introduction

The following analysis summarizes the main statistics on domestic tourism activity in 2003. It contains information on the characteristics of travellers and trips and the associated expenditures.

Overview of the economic situation in Canada from 1998 to 2003

The level of confidence of Canadian consumers remained high in 2003, prompting them to spend more

In 2003, the economy experienced moderate growth, as the gross domestic product (GDP) at market prices advanced 5.3% compared to 2002, reaching \$1,218.8 billion. This was the third largest increase in the past six years, with the largest (9.4%) recorded in 2000.

Despite a decline of 5.0 percentage points from the peak (124.2) registered in 2002, the consumer confidence index of the Conference Board of Canada remained relatively high in 2003 compared to the levels registered from 1998 to 2001. The average personal disposable income stood at \$22,538, up 1.2% from 2002. The personal saving rate was 1.4%, its lowest level since 1981, while average personal expenditures on consumer goods and services climbed 3.8% compared to 2002 to \$21,753. Also in 2003, the value of the Canadian dollar appreciated against its U.S. counterpart to a six-year high of 71.4 cents U.S.

In 2003, the accommodation industry registered the steepest drop in economic activity of any major component of the tourism sector. Its GDP (at basic prices) fell 6.8% from 2002 to \$6.9 billion. The GDP of the transportation industry declined more modestly (-1.0%) reaching \$17.4 billion in 2003. The other components of the tourism sector, namely the food and beverage services industry (+1.1%) and the arts, entertainment and recreation industry (+4.1%), both saw their economic activity increase to \$15.8 billion and \$10.1 billion in 2003 respectively.

Travel in Canada and by Canadians to all destinations in 2003

Canadians travelled less in Canada and the United States in favour of trips to overseas countries

Canadian residents made 211.5 million trips in 2003. Of this number, 172.2 million were made in Canada, accounting for 81.4% of all trips, compared to 82.7% in 2002. The number of trips in Canada by Canadian residents fell 8.3% from the peak of 187.9 million trips registered in 2002. By contrast, the number of trips made outside Canada, at 39.2 million, remained stable in relation to 2002, mainly owing to an increase in the number of trips to overseas countries (+8.4%). The United States was again the outbound destination that received the largest proportion of international trips made by Canadians, namely 87.2%, despite a drop of 1.2% compared to 2002.

Canada registered 211.1 million trips on its territory in 2003, down 9.3% from 2002. The number of trips made by foreigners stood at 38.9 million, down 13.4% from 2002. Trips made by Americans accounted for 91.3% of trips by international visitors in Canada. These trips, numbering 35.5 million, dropped 13.1% compared to 2002, while those made by overseas residents fell 15.6% to 3.4 million.

Several factors contributed to the decline in the number of trips in Canada by Canadian residents and foreigners in 2003. These include the SARS crisis, the appreciation of the value of the Canadian dollar against its U.S. counterpart, the war in Iraq and the forest fires in British Columbia.

Foreign travellers spent 107.7 million nights in Canada in 2003, down 11.8% from 2002. Of these nights, 47.4% were attributable to travellers from overseas.

Trip expenditures in Canada stood at \$41.5 billion in 2003, down 10.0% from 2002. All major markets recorded decreases in trip expenditures in Canada: 8.0% for Canadian residents, 12.9% for U.S. residents and 16.7% for overseas residents. Two-thirds of the expenditures by international travellers in Canada in 2003, or \$8.7 billion, were made by U.S. residents. On the other hand, Canadian residents increased their spending outside Canada (+1.4%) to \$16.8 billion in 2003. These expenditures accounted for 37.1% of all their travel spending in 2003, compared to 34.9% in 2002.

Trips by Canadians in Canada in 2003

Quebec was the only province to host more travellers in 2003

Canadian residents made 172.2 million domestic trips in 2003, down 8.3% from 2002. This year-over-year decrease, the first since 1998, brought the number of trips to its lowest level since 1999.

As to the duration of domestic trips, the number of overnight trips was slightly higher than the number of same-day trips, at 86.3 million compared to 85.9 million. The number of overnight trips declined 9.4% compared to 2002, while the number of same-day trips fell 7.3%.

With 62.2 million trips made on its territory in 2003, Ontario remained the most popular province of destination with Canadian travellers, followed by Quebec with 47.2 million trips. These two provinces were the destination of 63.5% of all trips made by Canadian residents in Canada, compared to 61.8% in 2002.

Quebec is the only province of destination to have experienced an increased number of trips (+2.8%) in 2003. The rise is almost entirely due to an increase in pleasure trips and trips to visit friends and relatives. These two types of trips, which together accounted for nearly 80% of all trips made in Quebec by Canadian residents, rose 6.0% in 2003 whereas Canada-wide, their number declined 7.9% compared to the previous year.

By province of destination, the largest decreases in the number of trips in 2003 compared to 2002 were in Prince Edward Island and Alberta, with drops of 20.3% and 17.8% respectively.

Prince Edward Island and British Columbia are the provinces of destination that recorded the largest proportions of overnight trips; these accounted for 61.9% and 59.5% respectively of all trips on their territory. Conversely, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick posted the highest proportions of same-day trips, at 55.9% and 58.8% respectively.

The number of nights that Canadian residents spent travelling in Canada in 2003 stood at 277.3 million, down 9.7% from 2002. The only increase in nights spent in a province was in Manitoba (+3.3%).

Canadian residents spent \$28.5 billion during their trips in Canada in 2003. Two-thirds of the expenses were incurred during overnight trips, for a total of \$22.4 billion. For all trips combined, the average expenditure was \$165 per trip, while the averages for same-day trips and overnight trips were \$70 and \$260 respectively.

Nearly nine trips in ten were made in travellers' province of residence

Most trips made by Canadian residents in Canada in 2003 were made in the province of residence. The number of intraprovincial trips, which stood at 151.2 million, accounted for 87.8% of all trips made by Canadians in Canada. These trips declined 8.1% compared to 2002.

Ontario is the province with the highest proportion of intraprovincial trips in relation to all trips made on its territory, at 91.9%, followed by Quebec with 90.2%. By contrast, Prince Edward Island recorded the lowest proportion at only 38.0%.

The number of domestic trips made outside the traveller's province of residence fell more sharply than the number of trips made within the province of residence. Interprovincial trips dropped 10.0% between 2002 and 2003 to 21.0 million. These trips accounted for 12.2% of all domestic trips in 2003. Nearly eight interprovincial trips in ten included at least one night outside the home, compared to fewer than five trips in ten for intraprovincial trips.

Only two provinces saw increases in the number of trips by non-residents on their territory compared to 2002. Newfoundland and Labrador posted the largest increase in trips by non-residents, namely 17.3%, whereas intraprovincial trips in that province fell substantially (-17.4%). The other increase in the number of trips by non-residents was registered in Manitoba, with a gain of 5.3%, whereas intraprovincial trips made in that province fell 6.9% compared to 2002. Quebec, which was the only province to record an increase in the total number of trips on its territory, owed this performance to its own residents. They made 4.5% more trips in Quebec than in 2002, while the number of trips in Quebec by non-residents dropped 10.4%.

Trip purpose

Number of business trips plummets

The main reason motivating Canadian residents to travel within Canada 2003 was pleasure. Indeed, 39.1% of all domestic trips, or 67.4 million, were undertaken for this purpose. Second came visits to friends or relatives, with 61.4 million trips in Canada. Together, pleasure trips and trips to visit friends or relatives accounted for three-fourths of all domestic trips in 2003.

The number of trips made in Canada by Canadian residents fell in 2003, without regard to the category of trip purpose cited by the traveller. Business (and convention) trips are those that declined the most compared to 2002, falling 17.0% to 19.6 million. These trips, which had been declining since 2001, were down 23.9% compared to that year, reaching their lowest level since 1998. Business trips accounted for 11.4% of all domestic trips in 2003. Pleasure trips declined 9.5%, while trips to visit friends or relatives were down 6.0% from 2002. The number of trips made for personal reasons, such as medical appointments and family responsibilities, were down a modest 2.5% at 23.8 million. Travelling for personal reasons is the only trip purpose category not to have registered another year-over-year decline in the number of trips since 1998.

Pleasure is the trip purpose category that generated the largest share of travel expenditures by Canadians in Canada in 2003, at 38.5%. Expenditures made during pleasure trips stood at \$11.0 billion, down 10.0% from 2002. The expenditures generated by business travel stood at \$7.6 billion or 26.6% of all travel expenditures in Canada in 2003. Business was the only trip purpose category to generate expenditures at basically the same level as that in 1998. Although the number of business trips in 2003 fell 17.0% compared to 2002, the amounts spent on those trips declined less steeply at 11.0%. Expenditures for trips made for personal reasons remained practically unchanged from 2002 (-0.6%). However, this relative stability had little impact on the decline in overall travel expenditures in 2003, since expenditures on trips for personal reasons accounted for only 11.5% of the total.

Of all trip purpose categories, it was business that generated the most expenditures per trip in 2003 at \$387 on average, with pleasure a distant second at an average of \$163 per trip. In 2003, the average distance travelled one-way for a business trip was 401 km, compared to 287 km for trips in general.

Transportation modes**Air travel declines less than automobile travel**

Travel by automobile, the mode of transportation most often used by Canadian residents travelling in Canada, accounted for 91.9% of all domestic trips in 2003. Compared to 2002, these trips declined 8.7% to 158.3 million. This was the first drop since 1998. The automobile was the chosen mode of transportation for 87.6% of overnight trips, while for same-day trips, the proportion was 96.2%. More than three-fourths of same-day trips made by automobile were for pleasure or to visit friends or relatives.

Air travel accounted for 3.9% of all domestic trips in 2003, making air the second most frequently used mode of transportation. Air is also the transportation mode that registered the second smallest decline in the number of trips (-2.4%) compared to 2002. However, in 2003, the number of trips by air reached its lowest level since 1998.

In 2003, 9.6% of trips by air were same-day trips, whereas in 2002, the proportion was only 7.6%. Among same-day trips, air is the only transportation mode to have registered an increase in its use compared to 2002 with a gain of 24.1%. This increase may be partly attributable to competition among airlines, which would seem to have resulted in advantageous prices for short flights. From 2002 to 2003, the average expenditure for air transportation on same-day trips declined 13.4% to \$464.

Among Canadians who made same-day trips by air in 2003, a majority, namely 87.3%, were business travellers, while for overnight trips by air the corresponding proportion was 39.7%.

Accommodation

Resorts gained in popularity in 2003 while the other types of accommodation had a more difficult year

Canadian travellers spent 277.3 million nights outside their home in 2003, down 9.7% from 2002. The number of nights spent in commercial establishments accounted for 34.5% of all nights spent travelling in Canada, for a total of 95.6 million. The number of nights spent in commercial accommodation fell 10.6% compared to 2002, while the corresponding decrease for nights spent in private accommodation was 8.9%.

With one exception, all types of commercial accommodation experienced a decline in the number of nights. With a total of 2.8 million nights, resorts were the only commercial establishments to register an increase in 2003 (+17.5%) compared to 2002. The province mainly responsible for this increase was Quebec, which accounted for nearly one-third of the nights spent in this type of accommodation in Canada. Fishing and hunting lodges recorded the largest drop in nights compared to 2002, namely 27.3%.

In 2003, hotels continued to be the most popular type of commercial accommodation, with more than one overnight trip in five including at least one night in such establishments. The 41.9 million nights in hotels accounted for 43.8% of all nights spent in commercial accommodation.

Of the various types of commercial accommodation, hotels were the one in which Canadian residents spent the least time during their domestic trips in 2003, with an average of 2.7 nights per stay, followed by motels with an average of 3 nights per stay. By contrast, Canadian travellers remained the longest in commercial cabins or cottages, averaging nearly 5 nights per stay.

On a provincial basis, Nova Scotia (+8.0%), Newfoundland and Labrador (+7.8%) and Quebec (+3.2%) were the only provinces of destination to experience an increase in the number of nights spent by Canadian travellers in commercial accommodation in 2003. New Brunswick (-26.8%) and Alberta (-23.6%) registered the steepest declines on this score compared to 2002.

In 2003, a majority of Canadian residents travelling in Canada continued to opt for private accommodation, where they spent 169.9 million nights, down 8.9% from 2002. Nearly half of the nights spent away from home were spent with friends or relatives.

Seasonality of travel

A quieter summer season in 2003 for domestic travel

During the third quarter of 2003, which corresponds to the summer season, 55.8 million domestic trips were made. However, these trips accounted for only 32.4% of all domestic trips made during the year, compared to 34.9% in 2002. A 14.8% drop in the number of trips was registered in the third quarter, compared to more moderate declines in the other quarters. This third-quarter decline followed the record number¹ of 65.5 million trips set for a third quarter in 2002. The largest monthly declines in the number of trips in 2003 were recorded in July (-16.3%) and August (-16.8%), the two most popular months for domestic tourism.

Quebec posted increases in the number of trips within its territory in all quarters except the third quarter, when there was a drop of 12.1% compared to the same quarter in 2002. The only quarterly increases observed in other provinces were in New Brunswick in the first quarter (+1.8%), British Columbia in the second quarter (+8.8%) and Manitoba in the fourth quarter (+15.2%).

Travel expenditures of Canadians in Canada

Canadian residents spent \$28.5 billion during their trips in Canada in 2003, down 8.0% from 2002. These expenditures accounted for 62.9% of all amounts that they spent on travel in 2003. The expenditures generated by domestic trips represented 2.3% of GDP at market prices.

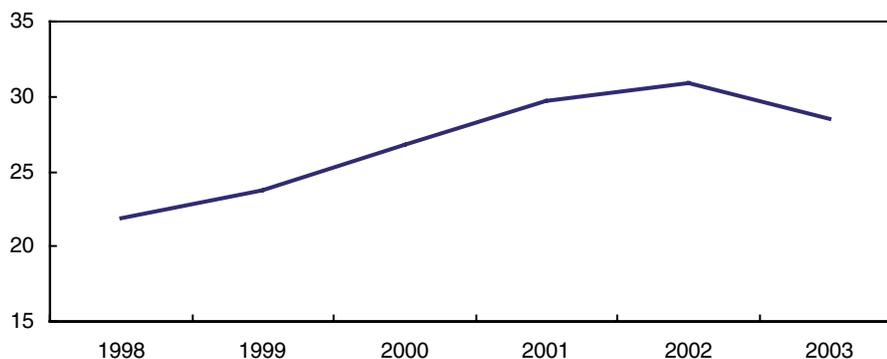

As was the case for the number of trips, travel expenditures in 2003 declined for the first time since 1998. This decrease is strictly due to the decline in the number of domestic trips made during the year, since the prices of domestic trips, as measured by the Travel Price Index, advanced 1.7% in 2003.

Expenditures on pleasure trips and business trips are those that declined the most from 2002 to 2003 with decreases of 10.0% and 11.3% respectively. These expenditures accounted for 65.0% of all domestic travel expenditures in 2003.

More than two-thirds of travel expenditures in 2003, namely \$22.4 billion, were made on overnight trips. However, compared to 2002, these expenditures posted a greater decrease (-8.6%) than those made on same-day trips (-5.5%).

Expenditures made by Canadian residents on trips in their province of residence in 2003 accounted for 62.9% of total expenditures generated by all domestic trips in Canada. The \$17.9 billion spent on these intraprovincial trips represented a decrease of 7.7% compared to 2002. The rest of travel expenditures in Canada, namely \$10.5 billion, were made by Canadians on trips outside their province of residence (interprovincial trips). These expenditures were down 8.4% from the previous year.

On average, Canadian residents spent \$166 per trip in Canada in 2003. Average expenditures per trip were the highest in Prince Edward Island and British Columbia at \$330 and \$270 respectively. Quebec, which posted average expenditures of \$132 per trip on its territory in 2003, was the only province to lose ground in relation to 2002, going from sixth place to last place among provinces on this score.

Average expenditures made on overnight trips were little changed in 2003 compared to 2002, going from \$259 to \$261. A similar pattern was also observed for same-day trips, with average expenditures for these trips going from \$69 to \$70 during the same period.

Distribution of expenditures

In 2003, all categories of overnight travel expenditures showed declines in relation to 2002. The largest share of overnight travel expenditures (23.7%) was for the purchase of food and beverages, with a total of \$5.3 billion. This expenditure category posted the smallest decline in relation to 2002 at 7.4%. Canadian residents spent \$4.7 billion for accommodation in 2003, representing nearly one-quarter of expenditures made on overnight trips. Accommodation expenditures fell 8.6% compared to 2002, thus registering their first decline since 1998. This drop is attributable to the reduced number of nights spent in commercial accommodation and the 10.0% drop in accommodation prices for travellers during the period.

Expenditures associated with vehicle rental and operation were \$4.2 billion, down 7.6% from 2002, while expenditures related to interurban and local transportation decreased by 10.3% to \$4.2 billion. These expenditures accounted for 17.8% and 1.0% respectively of all overnight travel expenditures.

Expenditures on interurban and local transportation were mainly related to travel by air, since this transportation mode was chosen by nearly half of travellers using commercial transportation to make overnight trips. In comparison with 1998, transportation expenditures are those that advanced the least (+10.4%). This result is mainly attributable to air transportation expenditures, which grew by only 4.1% in five years.

With \$1.5 billion in expenditures in 2003, recreation and entertainment was the category that posted the largest decrease compared to 2002 at 10.5%. Lastly, the purchase of clothing and other products during overnight trips fell 9.1% from the 2002 level to \$2.6 billion.

Conclusion

The year 2003 was a difficult one for tourism in Canada, especially for domestic travel, which accounted for 81.4% of all trips in Canada. Various factors, such as increased gasoline prices, lower consumer confidence and a more favourable exchange rate, may have had a negative impact on the propensity of Canadian residents to travel in Canada. At the provincial level, Quebec was the only province to show an increase in the number of domestic trips made on its territory, with such trips advancing 2.8% compared to 2002.

However, Canadians travelled more to overseas destinations; at the same time, they made somewhat fewer trips to the United States, even though the Canadian dollar appreciated against its U.S. counterpart in 2003.

Statistical tables

Notes regarding statistical tables

CANSIM

The majority of estimates included in this chapter are available in the CANSIM data bank (Tables 426-0001 to 426-0006). Only data series with <poor> or <very poor> quality level have not been stored in the CANSIM data bank.

Sampling variability

When an estimate is followed by the letter ^E, it indicates the coefficient of variation of the data is between 16.6% and 25.0% and therefore should be used with caution.

When the coefficient of variation of the data exceeds 25.0%, the letter F appears in place of the estimate due to data publication requirements.

The coefficients of variation for every estimate appearing in the statistical tables are presented in Chapter 4.

Footnotes

1. The total of visits for all census metropolitan areas (CMAs) at the Canada level is greater than the province visit total since more than one CMA may be visited during a provincial visit.

Chapter 4

Coefficient of variation tables

Notes concerning the coefficient of variation tables

Sampling variability

The guidelines for release and publication of the CTS data make use of the concept of sampling variability to determine whether estimates produced from the microdata files are reliable. Sampling variability is the error in the estimates caused by the fact that we survey a sample rather than the entire population. Since differences always exist between sample and census data, statistical measures have been developed which indicate the expected size of the differences. The statistical measure of sampling variability used in this publication is the coefficient of variation (CV). The CV is the standard error of an estimate expressed as a percentage of the estimate.

The application of the CV to the CTS data in this publication has been simplified. In all tables of the publication, the reliability of the data has been identified in the following manner:

Coefficient of variation	Reliability of data	Identified in the tables
0.0 – 16.5	Good	Data released without qualification.
16.6 – 25.0	Fair	Data followed by the letter ^E indicates the data should be used with caution.

Appendix

Methodology

The Canadian Travel Survey (CTS), which is sponsored by Statistics Canada, the Canadian Tourism Commission (CTC) and the provincial governments, is administered to one or more sub-samples of households in the Labour Force Survey (LFS) sample. Except for differences in sample size and weighting, the design features of the LFS sample are maintained in the CTS sample.

LFS population coverage

The LFS is a monthly household survey whose sample of individuals is representative of the civilian, non-institutionalized population 15 years of age or older in Canada's ten provinces. Specifically excluded from the survey's coverage are residents of the Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Nunavut, persons living on Indian Reserves, full-time members of the Canadian Armed Forces and inmates of institutions. These groups together represent an exclusion of approximately 3.0% of the population aged 15 or over.

LFS sample design

The LFS has undergone an extensive redesign culminating in the introduction of the new design at the end of 1994. The LFS sample is drawn from an area frame and is based on a stratified, multi-stage design that uses probability sampling. A detailed description of the LFS design can be obtained in *Methodology of the Canadian Labour Force Survey*, Statistics Canada Catalogue no. 71-526. The main advantage of a stratified sample design is that when sampling is applied separately to many diverse strata, each stratum having a relatively homogeneous population, the efficiency of the sample is higher than that obtained from simple random sampling without stratification.

LFS sample rotation

The LFS employs a panel design whereby the entire monthly sample of dwellings consists of six panels, or rotation groups, of approximately equal size. Each of these panels can be considered to be representative of the entire LFS population. All dwellings in a rotation group remain in the LFS sample for six consecutive months after which time they are replaced (rotated out of the sample) by a new panel of dwellings selected from the same or similar clusters.

This rotation pattern was adopted to minimize any problems of non-response or respondent burden that would occur if households were to remain in the sample for longer than six months. It also has the statistical advantage of providing a common sample base for short-term month-to-month comparisons of LFS characteristics. Because of the rotation group feature, it is possible to readily conduct supplementary surveys (e.g., the CTS) using the LFS design but employing less than the full sample size.

CTS as a supplement

Since 1998, the CTS uses 2 of the 6 rotation groups in the LFS sample for all provinces, except for Newfoundland and Labrador where the number of rotation groups in the sample is three. All households of a selected rotation group participate in the survey. For the CTS, the coverage of the LFS remains the same, that is, it includes all household members aged 15 years and over. One person per household is randomly selected to answer CTS survey questions. Text table 1 shows the CTS monthly sample sizes for each month for two rotation groups.

CTS data collection

Since 1996, the CTS uses computer-assisted interviewing (CAI), i.e., the questionnaire is designed for a laptop computer and the interviewer keys in reported information during the interview. Upon completion of the LFS interview, the interviewer asks to speak to the selected person for the CTS. If the selected person is not available, the interviewer arranges for a convenient time to phone back. Since proxy response is not usually allowed, the collection period is extended by three working days (five calendar days) to allow the interviewers time to contact the selected individuals.

Data processing and weighting

After collection, the data go through many processing steps. The data are edited in a series of iterations to detect errors in the data and to prepare the data files for subsequent weighting and expenditure imputation.

The edited files are then processed through the weighting system. Since the CTS used a sub-sample of the LFS sample, the derivation of weights for the survey records is clearly tied to the weighting procedure used for the LFS. In the LFS, the final weight attached to each record is the product of the following factors: the basic weight, the cluster sub-weight, the balancing factor for non-response and the province-age-sex ratio adjustment factor. Further adjustments are made to the LFS weights in order to derive a final weight for the individual records on the CTS microdata files.

Changes to the Canadian Travel Survey

Changes to the sampling methodology have been introduced in the last few years. From 1980 to the first quarter of 1992, the survey was conducted on a quarterly basis, that is, the respondents were contacted after the end of the three-month period and had to recall all trips ending in that period. Because it was hard to remember all the trips that ended during such a long period, starting with the second quarter of 1992, the same respondent was contacted for every month in that three-month period. However, this resulted in trips being under-reported for the second and third months of

the quarter. To improve the data quality, the methodology was changed again in 1994, with a new sample of respondents for every month. This method has been used since. Also in 1996, the sample was increased to two rotation groups in all provinces (except Newfoundland and Labrador where the sample was increased to three) compared to only one rotation group for most provinces in 1994 (some provinces purchased additional rotation groups for the summer months).

In 1997, the implementation of the “Project to Improve Provincial Economic Statistics” (PIPES), resulted in new requirements for the CTS, namely the collection of more reliable annual data on interprovincial trips. In order to comply with these new demands, the sample was increased to three rotation groups in all provinces. Members of one rotation group were asked about all trips, while respondents in the remaining two rotation groups were asked to report only their out-of-province trips.

In 1998, the sample was brought back to 1996 levels. However minor changes were made to the questionnaire: first, the activity “visit to friends and relatives” was split in two separate activities and second, the accommodation type “resort” was split in two separate accommodation types, “resort” and “hunting or fishing lodge”.

In 1999, there was no change to the survey.

In the summer of 2000, the CTS and LFS data collection method was changed. Rather than being done by interviewers working out of their homes (a de-centralized environment), the majority of the collection was going to be done in all regional offices (centralized environment).

In 2001, no changes were made to the CTS.

At the start of 2002, a more systematic interviewer monitoring system was implemented in the regional offices. This is an automated system that enables supervisors to see the interviewer’s screen remotely and hear the telephone conversation between the interviewer and the respondent. Increased monitoring of interviewers served to improve the collection of information from respondents and thereby enhance the quality of the data produced by the survey.

In 2003, no changes were made to the CTS.

Data comparability

In 1992 and 1994, changes to the methodology caused a break in data continuity, with the result that the data for these years cannot be compared with each other or with data from previous years. Because of the number of changes made to the survey since 1996, data from that year and subsequent years are not comparable with those of previous years.

Revised data for 1996 and 1998 to 2001, which were produced in the project “Historical Adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2001,” are comparable. The estimates included in the 2001 edition of this publication resulted from that revision of data for 1996 and 1998 to 2001. The 1997 data are not comparable with those revised data, since they were excluded from the 2001 historical adjustment project.

However, it is important to note that the 2002 and 2003 data cannot be compared with the data revised in the project “Historical Adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2001.” In particular, the 2002 and 2003 estimates cannot be compared with those appearing in the 2001 edition of this publication.

For this reason, data from 1998 to 2001 were revised again in the project "Historical Adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2003" in order to make them comparable with 2002 and 2003 data. All 1998 to 2001 estimates appearing in this publication result from this revision of the data and are comparable with the 2002 and 2003 estimates included in this publication.

Historical adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2003

At the start of 2002, a more systematic interviewer monitoring system was implemented in the regional offices. Previously, monitoring of interviewers' work was done by means of spot checks, but with the new system, each interviewer was now monitored for a fixed period at different times in the week.

However, since the beginning of the year, a sizeable increase was observed in the estimates for 2002 compared to those for 2001. While CTS estimates tend to be somewhat volatile, the variations were too large to be considered acceptable. Following a thorough analysis of the data, Statistics Canada concluded that the new monitoring system was largely responsible for the increases observed in 2002 and the 2002 estimates could not be compared with those of previous years. Accordingly, the project "Historical Adjustment for the Canadian Travel Survey – 2003" was implemented to revise once again the data from 1998 to 2001.

Changes were therefore made to the provincial models used in the 2001 historical adjustment project in order to reflect what the trip levels from 1998 to 2001 would have been if collection had been carried out under the new interviewer monitoring system. Also, changes were made to the 2001 models to improve the adjustments relating to the centralization of collection.

Using these modified models, the microdata files and estimates from 1998 to 2001 were re-adjusted to take into account not only the effects of the centralization of collection and respondent conditioning, but also the effect of the increased monitoring of interviewers.

Consequently, the 1998 to 2001 estimates that appear in this publication have been re-revised and are comparable with the 2002 and 2003 estimates also appearing in this publication.

Concepts and definitions

- **Quarter.** Quarter during which the trip ended.
- **Trip.** For the purposes of the CTS, a trip is defined as travel to a Canadian destination at least 80 km one-way from home for any reason except: travel to and from work or school (i.e., commuting); one-way travel involving a change of residence; travel of operating crew members of buses, airplanes, boats, etc.; travel in an ambulance to a hospital or clinic; trips that did not originate in Canada; trips longer than a year.¹ A trip may involve one person travelling alone or several persons from the same household travelling together. Persons from different households travelling together are defined as taking different trips.

1. The CTS collects information about trips beyond those defined by the destination and distance criteria above. Except for the types of travel that are excluded in the definition above, information is also collected about: i) travel to destinations outside Canada; ii) overnight travel to a destination less than 80 km one-way from home; and iii) same-day travel from Ontario to a destination between 40 and 80 km one-way from home.

- **Traveller.** Anyone who takes a trip. Anyone who does not take a trip is referred to as a non-traveller.
- **Person-trip.** Trip taken by one person. A person-trip starts when the traveller leaves his/her home to go on a trip. The total number of person-trips for a population is the count of the number of persons on each trip taken in the population.²
- **Same-day trip.** Trip which does not include a night away from home.
- **Overnight trip.** Trip that includes at least one night away from home.
- **Visit.** A same-day visit can only be made on the course of a same-day trip. In such cases, a visit is recorded at the destination of the trip. An overnight visit can only be done on an overnight trip. As such, the location visited is defined as the location where the respondent has spent at least one night.
- **Person-visit.** Same-day or overnight visit made by a person taking a trip. The total number of person-visits for a population is the count of the number of visits made by each person on each trip taken in the population.
- **Province-visit.** Each person visiting a province is registered as having made one person-visit in this province.
- **Census metropolitan area-visit.** Each person visiting a census metropolitan area is registered as having made one person-visit in this census metropolitan area.
- **Origin.** Starting point of a trip is the respondent's place of residence at the time the trip was taken.
- **Destination.** Place reported by the respondent as the destination of a trip. If a respondent visited more than one place during a trip, the destination is the place furthest from his/her home.
- **Distance.** One-way distance between the trip origin and its destination expressed in kilometres.
- **Duration.** A trip starts when the traveller leaves his/her usual residence. It ends when he/she comes back. The trip duration is measured by the number of nights a traveller spends away from his/her usual residence.
- **Person-night.** One night away from home by a person taking a trip e.g. a person who takes a trip involving three nights away from home has a count of three person-nights. The total number of person-nights for a population is the count of the number of nights spent away from home by each person on each trip taken in the population.
- **Visit-night.** One night away from home in Canada by a person taking a trip e.g. a person who takes a trip involving three nights away from home in Canada has a count of three visit-nights. The total number of visit-nights for a population is the count of the number of nights spent away from home in Canada, by each person on each trip taken in the population.

2. The CTS selects a sample of persons rather than a sample of trips. This means the CTS estimates the number of person-trips for a population by selecting a sample of persons and counting the number of trips taken by each person in the sample. Appropriate weights are assigned to the sampled persons and their person-trips to make the estimates of those persons and their person-trips representative of the population.

- **Intraprovincial travel.** Travel within a province by its residents, e.g., Ontario residents travelling in Ontario.
- **Interprovincial travel.** Travel by the resident of one province to and in another province, e.g., Ontario residents travelling elsewhere in Canada.
- **Non-resident travel.** Travel by residents from another province to a specific province, e.g., travel of Canadians (except Ontario residents) to Ontario.
- **Census metropolitan area (CMA).** Main labour market area of an urbanized core having 100,000 or more population. For more details, refer to the Standard Geographical Classification SGC 1991.
- **Census division (CD).** Areas established by provincial laws which are intermediate geographic areas between the municipality (census subdivision) and the province level. Census divisions represent counties, regional districts, regional municipalities and other types of provincially legislated areas. For more details, refer to the Standard Geographical Classification SGC 1991.
- **Tourism region.** From a tourism point of view, homogeneous regions defined by each province.
- **Purpose.** Main reason the respondent to the survey went on a trip, regardless of the reason anyone else from the household had for taking the same trip.
- **Mode of transportation.** Mode of transportation used to travel the greatest distance during a trip.
- **Accommodation.** Type of accommodation where nights were spent. The data on the type of accommodation is collected for each of the nights spent on the trip.
- **Activities.** Activities in which travellers took part during the trip rather than during their visit. For this reason, an activity cannot always be associated to a precise location. For example, a person may have visited Vancouver and Whistler, and reported downhill skiing as an activity. It is impossible to know if the traveller skied in Vancouver, in Whistler or in both places.
- **Expenditures.** Trip expenditures made by all household members who went on the trip. Expenditures may have been paid for by individuals, by government or by a private sector business. In the CTS, the expenditures are broken down in the following categories: vehicle rental, vehicle operation, local transportation, intercity transportation, food or beverages purchased at restaurants or bars, food or beverages purchased at stores during the trip, accommodation, recreation and entertainment, clothing and other expenditures. The following items are excluded:
 - food purchased before the trip for use while on the trip;
 - items purchased to be resold or used in business (including items used on farm);
 - vehicles such as cars, caravans, boats;
 - capital investments such as real estate, works of arts, rare articles and stocks;
 - cash given to friends or relatives during a holiday trip which does not represent payment of tourism goods or services, as well as donations made to institutions.

- **Reported expenditures.** Reported expenditures are the expenditures made by the respondent and other household members who went on the trip. Expenditures are reported in Canadian dollars and include all taxes and tips. As described above, these expenditures are reported in different categories. They do not represent where money was spent on a specific trip, but rather how much money was spent, and in which categories of expenditures. They are associated with a trip as a whole.
- **Reallocated expenditures.** Refers to the process by which the respondents' reported expenditures are redistributed to specific geographic regions where money was spent. The CTS uses an expenditure reallocation model by which money included in each expenditure category is redistributed to geographic regions according to specific rules. Generally, money is allocated at the destination location in the case of same-day trips and redistributed according to the number of nights spent in each geographic region in the case of overnight trips. However, this rule may vary according to the expenditure item. Once redistributed, the expenditures are referred to as reallocated expenditures.

Since 1996 data providing more detailed information were collected and have allowed the redistribution of the reported expenditures at the sub-provincial level. By using the information available at the locational level, namely the number of nights spent at a location, types of accommodation used and the number of nights spent by type of accommodation, it is possible to refine the expenditure reallocation model for the following categories of expenditures: accommodation, food or beverages purchased at restaurants or bars and food or beverages purchased in stores during the trip. The level of geography for which the expenditures are redistributed in the CTS are the following: province, tourism region, census metropolitan area (CMA) and census division (CD).

- **Point of origin reallocation expenditures.** This category of expenditures refers to expenditures that have been allocated to the point of origin of the traveller. Those expenditures are assumed to have taken place at the location of origin of the trip and not at the locations visited. Expenditure categories that are allocated to the location of origin of the trip are the following:

In the case of a same-day trip

- vehicle rental,
- vehicle operation,
- intercity transportation.

In the case of an overnight trip

- vehicle rental, in cases where an automobile was stated as the primary mode of transportation,
- intercity transportation.

When looking at person-visits and total reallocated expenditures, one has to be careful. Point of origin expenditures made by travellers leaving a location are included in total expenditures allocated to that location. When calculating expenditures (average or total) made by visitors coming to that location, it is important to exclude point of origin expenditures that have been made by residents leaving the location to visit other destinations as they were not made by non-resident visitors who visited the location.

- **Point of origin reallocation expenditures, provincial level.** This category of expenditures refers to expenditures that have been allocated to the province of origin of the traveller. These expenditures include the amount spent in a province by the residents of that province before going on a trip outside that province.

- **Province of origin reallocation expenditures, census metropolitan area level.** This category of expenditures refers to expenditures that have been allocated to the CMA of origin of the traveller. These expenditures include the amount spent in a CMA by the residents of that CMA before going on a trip outside that CMA.
- **Vehicle rental expenditures.** Includes all operation, rental or user fees encountered for the use of any vehicle such as an automobile, truck, motorcycle, bicycle, boat, motor home, snowmobile, etc. (including insurance).
- **Vehicle operation expenditures.** It includes expenditures related to the operation of a private or rental vehicle, namely gasoline, repairs and parking costs while on the trip.
- **Local transportation expenditures.** Local transportation means within a city or metropolitan area, that is, intracity transportation. It includes the cost of taxis, city bus fares, subway fares and bus tours in the place of visit and/or destination while on the trip.
- **Intercity transportation expenditures.** Includes expenses between cities or metropolitan areas to get to or from the destination. These transportation expenditures include ticket fares for intercity aircrafts, boats, hovercrafts, trains, buses as well as intercity ferries.
- **Food or beverages purchased at restaurants or bars.** Includes the total amount spent on meals and drinks purchased from restaurants, bars, cafeterias, fast food take-out counters, and minibars located in some hotel/motel rooms, regardless where they were consumed.
- **Food or beverages purchased at stores during the trip.** Includes the total amount spent at local stores while on the trip, regardless of where they were consumed. For example, groceries purchased to bring home or to eat during the trip are included in this category.
- **Accommodation expenditures.** Total expenditures for nights spent in hotels, motels, resorts, cabins, private or commercial cottages, campgrounds, etc. This primarily includes rental fees. However, in the case of trips to private cottages or the home of friends or relatives, it could also include any money given to owners for the use of their accommodation.
- **Recreation and entertainment expenditures.** Includes the cost of admission to theatres, sports events, art galleries, nightclubs, etc. It also includes gambling expenses and sporting activity costs such as daily ski lift passes, green fees, rental of sports equipment, entrance fees to a cultural or leisure activity, but excludes recreation and entertainment purchased for the season (e.g., season ski passes).
- **Clothing expenditures.** Includes any clothing purchases whether they are gifts or for personal use. Also, includes shoes, belts, jewellery, handbags and other accessories.
- **Other expenditures.** Includes items such as souvenirs, household items, registration fees for courses or conferences, customs duties, postcards and stamps, insurance fees, medication, books, craft supplies, film and developing, costs for child care, telephone charges, etc. Also, includes rental of accommodation (e.g., seminar rooms) in same-day trips.
- **Age.** Age group of the respondent. This variable comes from the LFS.

- **Sex.** Sex of the respondent. This variable comes from the LFS.
- **Marital status.** Marital status of the respondent. This variable comes from the LFS.
- **Education attainment.** Educational attainment of the respondent. This variable comes from the LFS.
- **Occupation.** Type of work the respondent was doing during the LFS reference week, as determined by the type of work reported and the description of the respondent's most important duties. This variable comes from the LFS. It is based on the 1980 Standard Occupational Classification. The occupations are grouped in the following five categories: managerial and other professional; clerical, sales and service; primary occupation; manufacturing, construction and transportation; never worked/other.
- **Household income.** Total household income, before taxes and deductions, including income from wages, salaries, tips, commissions, pensions, interest, rents, etc. for all household members, for the year preceding the reference year.
