
Stocks of frozen and chilled meats

APRIL 2003

Highlights

Total frozen and chilled red meat in cold storage at the opening of the first business day of April amounted to 86 824 metric tonnes, virtually unchanged from 86 577 tonnes in March and up 5% from 82 453 tonnes in April 2002. The graph below depicts the monthly stocks of all frozen and chilled red meat from January 1990 to April 2003.



Methodology

This bulletin presents data on stocks of frozen and chilled meats at the wholesale level obtained from a monthly census of known cold storage establishments registered with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency. Included are such facilities as meat packers, wholesale butchers, abattoirs, and central warehouses of large retail grocery stores. Data not received in time for publication for the current month are estimated through imputation until such time as actual data are available. Therefore, current month data are preliminary and subject to revision.
