

Stocks of Frozen and Chilled Meats



Highlights

Total frozen and chilled red meat in cold storage at the opening of the first business day of November 2004 amounted to 78 946 metric tonnes, up 4% from 75 556 tonnes in October and down 20% from 99 221 tonnes in November 2003. Stocks of frozen poultry meat in cold storage on November 1st totalled 63 236 metric tonnes, up 4% from November 2003.



Methodology

This bulletin presents data on stocks of frozen and chilled meats at the wholesale level obtained from a monthly census of known cold storage establishments registered with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency. Included are such facilities as meat packers, wholesale butchers, abattoirs, and central warehouses of large retail grocery stores. Data not received in time for publication for the current month are estimated through imputation until such time as actual data are available. Therefore, current month data are preliminary and subject to revision.
