

# **Stocks of Frozen and Chilled Meats**



## **Highlights**

Total frozen and chilled red meat in cold storage at the opening of the first business day of May 2005 amounted to 93 449 metric tonnes, up 1% from 92 556 tonnes in April and up 5% from 88 957 tonnes in May 2004. Stocks of frozen poultry meat in cold storage on May 1<sup>st</sup> totalled 54 867 metric tonnes, up 6% from a year ago. The graph below depicts the monthly stocks of all frozen and chilled red meat from January 1990 to May 2005.



# Methodology

This bulletin presents data on stocks of frozen and chilled meats at the wholesale level obtained from a monthly census of known cold storage establishments registered with the Canadian Food Inspection Agency. Included are such facilities as meat packers, wholesale butchers, abattoirs, and central warehouses of large retail grocery stores. Data not received in time for publication for the current month are estimated through imputation until such time as actual data are available. Therefore, current month data are preliminary and subject to revision.
