

Introduction

This report presents an overview of the educational attainment, labour force activity and income of adults with and without disabilities.

The 2001 Participation and Activity Limitation Survey (PALS) was a national survey about persons with disabilities whose everyday activities are limited because of a physical or mental condition or health problem. The survey was funded by Human Resources Development Canada and conducted by Statistics Canada. It collected data on the type and severity of activity limitations, need for specialized equipment or aids, and barriers to employment, education, accommodation, transportation and leisure.

The population covered by the survey was persons residing in households in the ten provinces. Persons living in the Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunuvat, as well as persons living in institutions and on Indian reserves were excluded. Data was collected from September 2001 to January 2002. For more information on the methods, data quality and tables, please refer to the section at the end of this report.

Data Quality, Concepts and Methodology

Methods

The 2001 Participation and Activity Limitation Survey (PALS) was a post-censal survey which collected information about persons with disabilities whose everyday activities are limited because of a health-related condition or problem. The survey took place between September 2001 and January 2002. PALS was funded by Human Resources Development Canada (HRDC).

PALS is a post-censal survey because it used the 2001 Census as a sampling frame to identify its population. The 2001 Census questionnaire included two general questions on activity limitations and difficulty with everyday activities. The PALS respondents were selected through the use of the census information on age, geography and the responses to these two general questions.

After the 2001 Census, a sample of individuals who answered YES to the activity limitation questions on the census form was selected. The PALS sample was 43,000, consisting of approximately 35,000 adults and 8,000 children. The interviews were conducted by telephone with the interviewers completing a paper and pencil questionnaire. Two questionnaires were used, one for adults aged 15 and over and one for children under 15. The interviews for the children's questionnaire were conducted with the parent or guardian of the child. The overall response rate was 82.5%.

The population covered by the survey was persons residing in private and some collective households in the ten provinces. Persons living in the Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut, as well as persons living in institutions and on Indian reserves were excluded from the survey.

PALS followed the groundwork laid by the Health and Activity Limitation Survey (HALS), which was conducted by Statistics Canada about persons with disabilities in 1986 and 1991. However, the data from the HALS and PALS cannot be compared because of significant differences in the census questions on activity limitations used in 1991 and 2001, their sampling plans, the operational definition of their target population and the content of their questionnaires. For more information about the differences between HALS and PALS, please see the report, "A New Approach to Disability Data: Changes between the 1991 Health and Activity Limitation Survey (HALS) and the 2001 Participation and Activity Limitation Survey (PALS)", published in December 2002 (catalogue no. 89-578-XIE).

Data Limitations

Since the estimates were obtained from a sample as opposed to a census, the estimates will vary from one sample to another (sampling error). In order to provide estimates of sampling error for the statistics, the bootstrap method was used.

All other types of errors, such as coverage, response, processing and non-response, are non-sampling errors. Measures were taken to minimize such errors. These actions included a pilot test of all of the survey process, from the questionnaire to data processing, follow-up of refusals and the application of a detailed set of edit rules to identify and correct any inconsistent responses.

Notes to users

The education data in Table 1 and the income data in Table 5 come from the linked census data of the PALS respondents. As a post-censal survey, PALS selected its population from the answers to

two general activity limitation questions on the 2001 Census of Population. In order to reduce the number of questions asked by the survey, the information provided to the census by the survey respondents, including information on education and income, was linked to the PALS database during processing. In a very small number of cases, it was not possible to link the survey respondent to his/her census data. As a result, all census data for these respondents are missing. These cases are noted in the tables by the label "Not specified".

The education data in Table 2 and the income data in Table 6 come from the 2001 Census data.

The source for Tables 3 and 4 is the 2001 PALS. The "Not specified" category refers to PALS respondents for whom Section E (Employment Status) on the questionnaire was completely blank.

Definitions

Disability

The Participation and Activity Limitation Survey uses the World Health Organization's (WHO) framework of disability provided by the International Classification of Functioning (ICF). This framework defines disability as the relationship between body structures and functions, daily activities and social participation, while recognizing the role of environmental factors.

For the purpose of PALS, persons with disabilities are those who reported difficulties with daily living activities, or who indicated that a physical, mental condition or health problem reduced the kind or amount of activities they could do.

The respondents' answers to the disability questions represent their perception of the situation and are therefore subjective.

Census Concepts and Definitions

The following census concepts and definitions are presented in summary form only. For the full definitions and additional remarks related to them, users should refer to the 2001 Census Dictionary (Catalogue No. 92-378-XIE).

Average income of individuals

Average income of individuals refers to the weighted mean total income of individuals 15 years and over who reported income for 2000. Average income is calculated from unrounded data by dividing the aggregate income of a specified group of individuals by the number of individuals **with income** in that group.

Employed

Refers to persons, who, during the week prior to the 2001 PALS enumeration:

- (a) did any work at all for pay or in self-employment or without pay in a family farm, business or professional practice;
- (b) were absent from their job or business, with or without pay, for the **entire week** because of a vacation, an illness, a labour dispute at their place of work, or any other reasons.

Highest level of educational attainment

The census asks individuals aged 15 and older to report their level of education. This information can be used to classify the population into five levels of educational attainment:

- Less than high school (no certificates, diplomas or degrees);
- High school graduation certificate;
- Trades certificate:
- College certificate or diploma: a certificate from a community college, CEGEP, school of nursing, theological college or private college;
- University: a certificate below the bachelor level, bachelor's degree, certificate above the bachelor level, master's degree, earned doctorate or a professional degree in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or optometry.

The last three categories are at times merged to form a broad group of "post-secondary graduates" or persons with "qualifications above the secondary level". Trades certificates are included even though completion of secondary school may not have been a prerequisite. However, the trades category includes registered apprenticeships obtained after a combination of classroom and on-the-job training that may have taken five years to complete.

Household

Refers to a person or a group of persons (other than foreign residents), who occupy the same dwelling and do not have a usual place of residence elsewhere in Canada. It may consist of a family group (census family) with or without other non-family persons, of two or more families sharing a dwelling, of a group of unrelated persons, or of one person living alone. For census purposes, every person is a member of one and only one household.

Labour Force Activity

Refers to the labour market activity of the population aged 15 to 64 in the week prior to the 2001 PALS enumeration. Respondents were classified as either **employed**, or **unemployed**, or as **not in the labour force**. The **labour force** includes the **employed** and the **unemployed**.

Median income of individuals

The median income of a specified group of income recipients is that amount which divides their income size into two distribution halves, i.e. the incomes of the first half of individuals are below the median, while those of the second half are above the median. Median income is calculated from the unrounded number of individuals **with income** in that group.

Not in the Labour Force

Refers to persons who, in the week prior to the 2001 PALS enumeration, were neither employed nor unemployed. It includes students, home-makers, retired workers, seasonal workers in an "off" season who were not looking for work, and persons who could not work because of a long-term illness or disability.

Total income

Total of income from all sources, including employment income, income from government programs, pension income, investment income and any other money income.

Refers to the total money income received from the following sources during the calendar year 2000 by persons 15 years of age and over:

- wages and salaries (total);
- net farm income
- net non-farm income from unincorporated business and/or professional practice;
- Canada Child Tax Benefits:
- Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement;
- benefits from Canada or Quebec Pension Plan;
- benefits from Employment Insurance;
- other income from government sources;
- dividends, interest on bonds, deposits and savings certificates, and other investment income:
- retirement pensions, superannuation and annuities, including those from RRSP's and RRIF's:
- other money income.

Unemployed

Refers to persons, who, in the week prior to the 2001 PALS enumeration, were without paid work or without pay in self-employment work and were available for work and either:

- (a) had actively looked for paid work in the past four weeks; or
- (b) were on temporary lay-off and expected to return to their job; or
- (c) had definite arrangements to start a new job in four weeks or less.
