Highlights:

- In June 1999, the carload freight (excluding intermodal traffic) loaded by railways in Canada totalled 19.8 million metric tonnes.
- The intermodal tonnage, represented by "container-on-flat-cars" (C.O.F.C.) and "trailer-on-flat-cars" (T.O.F.C.), was 2.0 million metric tonnes.
- The five top loaded commodities were: coal (3.4 million metric tonnes), Iron ores and concentrates (2.9 million metric tonnes), wheat (1.9 million metric tonnes), potash (1.1 million metric tonnes) and lumber (1.0 million metric tonnes).
- The cumulative freight loaded (excluding intermodal traffic) for the first six months of 1999 reached 116.0 million metric tonnes.
