Highlights

August 2004

In August, railways carried a total of 21.9 million metric tonnes of freight, up 1.3% from July.

Non-intermodal freight totalled 19.6 million tonnes, compared to 19.3 million tonnes last month. Just over 251,000 carloads were required to carry the freight.

Colza seed loadings dropped 72% from July to an all time low of 83,000 metric tonnes. Other cereal grains also show lower volumes of loadings than those normally seen in August because of cool and wet weather in the prairies that have slowed the development of most crops.

On the up side, manufacturing activities, such as the automobile sector, resuming from summer slowdowns show back to normal volumes in August.

Iron ore loadings remain lower than usual as the work conflict in that sector is yet unresolved.

These top five commodity groupings accounted for 41.2% of the August tonnage and 34.8% of the total carloadings.

The intermodal portion, that is, containers and trailers hauled on flat cars, showed a drop of 3.5% from July. Intermodal loadings totalled a little more than 2.2 million tonnes in August, and accounted for 9.3% of the total tonnage loaded.

Freight arriving from the United States, either destined for or passing through Canada, totalled 2.1 million tonnes, about the same as July.

Compared to August last year, non-intermodal tonnage showed a 5.5% increase even though iron ore loadings were down 1.6 million tonnes because of the ongoing strike in Labrador and northern Quebec. Coal, wheat and lumber increased 1.3 million tonnes from August of last year. Intermodal traffic increased 5.0% and traffic received from the United States rose 10.2% perhaps a reflection of a strong Canadian dollar.

On a year-to-date basis, the cumulative total for non-intermodal loadings for the first eight months of 2004 grew 8.7% compared to the same period last year. Tonnage grew from 151 million tonnes in 2003 to reach 164.1 million tonnes in 2004 mainly the result of stronger loadings of wheat, cereal grains and potash which accounted for a 6.5 millions tonne increase. Iron ore loadings reduced by an ongoing strike fell 3.3 million tonnes from last year.

Intermodal loadings totalled 17.8 million tonnes, up 3.3%, while traffic received from the United States was up 3.8% over the same period, for a total of 17.7 million tonnes.

Methodology and concepts

The *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication presents essential data for timely analysis of the Rail Transport Industry and its contribution to the Canadian economy. Approximately 40 rail carriers report each month on their total intermodal and non-intermodal¹ traffic of the previous month. For non-intermodal traffic, the carriers report the number of cars and tonnes by commodity of revenue-generating freight that they have loaded in Canada. For intermodal freight, the carriers report the number of units and tonnes for containers-on-flat-cars (C.O.F.C.) and trailers-on-flat-cars (T.O.F.C.), with no commodity detail. The carriers also report the total tonnage of revenue freight received from United States connections.

The total quantity of freight carried in Canada is the sum of the non-intermodal and intermodal freight loaded and the traffic received from U.S. connections. Additional information provided includes the number of units and tonnes of C.O.F.C. and T.O.F.C received from U.S. connections and the total tonnes of cargo that the carriers received from other Canadian connections. This freight that is exchanged among Canadian based carriers is counted only once in the total quantity of freight moved as it is counted only when loaded. For intermodal freight, twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) are derived from the dimensions of the freight-laden containers. Empty containers are not included in these statistics.

The data are collected via questionnaires and electronic reports that are filed with Statistics Canada eight working days after the reference month. These questionnaires are captured and edited and the data are then aggregated to produce tables for all of Canada and the Eastern and Western divisions of Canada². Tables show the data for the reference month and the year-to-date. These year-to-date figures include revisions of data from previous months.

Users of *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* current and historical data should be aware of a break in the continuity of these data. Starting with the January 1999 reference period, the commodities presented in the *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication were modified to conform to the Standard Classification of Transported Goods (SCTG) and the number of carriers surveyed more than doubled from the eighteen carriers surveyed prior to 1999.

The additional carriers were primarily shortline carriers whose data were previously included with the data of mainline carriers. The change in commodity classes has had negligible impact on the reporting of bulk commodities (e.g., wheat, potash and coal) which represent the majority of the total number of cars and tonnes. However, the reporting of manufactured and miscellaneous goods has changed significantly.
