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Highlights, October 2003

Total freight carried by Canadian railways in October 2003 reached 27 million tonnes. This represents a 7.7% increase over the previous month and a 5.3% increase over the same month from the previous year.

The 64 commodity groupings published in the MRC are carried in 2 ways: (1) intermodally (trailers and or containers that can be transferred to ships and/or trucks) and (2) non-intermodally (e.g. box cars).

Loadings for intermodal traffic, that is "containers on flat cars" and "trailers on flat cars," totalled 2.4 million tonnes, up 19% from October 2002 and 12.7% from September 2003. Cumulative tonnage for January to October reached 21.9 million tonnes, compared with 20.5 million tonnes for the same period of 2002.

These top five groups of commodities accounted for 44.6% of the October tonnage and for 37.9% of the car loadings.

Total non-intermodal carloadings were at their highest levels since May 2002. October's wheat and cereal grain loadings were up again this month, showing an increase of over a half million tonnes over the same month last year. Although still down from the same month last year, coal was up 12.2% over last month, continuing its rise from a low in August of 1.9 million tonnes. Traffic received from the U.S. rose to its highest point since 1999 with over 57 thousand carloadings, which could be a reflection of the economic recovery observed in the United States. With the approach of winter, carloads of gaseous hydrocarbons, including LPG's, have risen 34.8% from September.

Non-intermodal traffic on Canadian railroads totalled 276 thousand carloads and 21.7 million tonnes. This represents a 4.4% increase in tonnage from October 2002 and a 6.5% increase from September of this year.

The cumulative total for the first ten months of 2003 (excluding intermodal loadings) climbed to 192.8 million tonnes, compared with 200.0 million tonnes in 2002.

Traffic received from the United States destined for Canada or passing through Canada back into the United States reached 2.8 million tonnes, up 13.7% from September. From January to October, U.S. loadings reached 25.3 million tonnes, compared with 22.2 million tonnes in the same period of 2002.

Methodology and concepts

The *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication presents essential data for timely analysis of the Rail Transport Industry and its contribution to the Canadian economy. Approximately 40 rail carriers report each month on their total intermodal and non-intermodal¹ traffic of the previous month. For non-intermodal traffic, the carriers report the number of cars and tonnes by commodity of revenue-generating freight that they have loaded in Canada. For intermodal freight, the carriers report the number of units and tonnes for containers-on-flat-cars (C.O.F.C.) and trailers-on-flat-cars (T.O.F.C.), with no commodity detail. The carriers also report the total tonnage of revenue freight received from United States connections.

The total quantity of freight carried in Canada is the sum of the non-intermodal and intermodal freight loaded and the traffic received from U.S. connections. Additional information provided includes the number of units and tonnes of C.O.F.C. and T.O.F.C received from U.S. connections and the total tonnes of cargo that the carriers received from other Canadian connections. This freight that is exchanged among Canadian based carriers is counted only once in the total quantity of freight moved as it is counted only when loaded. For intermodal freight, twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) are derived from the dimensions of the freight-laden containers. Empty containers are not included in these statistics.

The data are collected via questionnaires and electronic reports that are filed with Statistics Canada eight working days after the reference month. These questionnaires are captured and edited and the data are then aggregated to produce tables for all of Canada and the Eastern and Western divisions of Canada². Tables show the data for the reference month and the year-to-date. These year-to-date figures include revisions of data from previous months.

Users of *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* current and historical data should be aware of a break in the continuity of these data. Starting with the January 1999 reference period, the commodities presented in the *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication were modified to conform to the Standard Classification of Transported Goods (SCTG) and the number of carriers surveyed more than doubled from the eighteen carriers surveyed prior to 1999.

The additional carriers were primarily shortline carriers whose data were previously included with the data of mainline carriers. The change in commodity classes has had negligible impact on the reporting of bulk commodities (e.g., wheat, potash and coal) which represent the majority of the total number of cars and tonnes. However, the reporting of manufactured and miscellaneous goods has changed significantly.
