# **Highlights**

#### November 2004

Canadian railways carried their heaviest monthly freight load of 2004 in November, thanks to booming demand for Canadian coal in Asia and a rebound in wheat shipments.

Railways transported 24.9 million metric tonnes of freight, up 3.2% from October, surpassing the previous high for 2004 in April by almost half a million tonnes.

Non-intermodal loadings totalled 22.6 million tonnes, up 3.7% from October. The non-intermodal volume for November was also the highest volume this year. About 287,600 carloads were required to carry the non-intermodal freight in November.

Shipments of coal reached 3.1 million tonnes in November, nearly 275,000 tonnes over October's level, making it the highest monthly level since June 2002. Strong demand from Asian countries, particularly China, is pushing the price of coal to unprecedented levels, resulting in renewed coal mining activities and increases in rail loadings. Nickel and copper ore, also appear to be profiting from this Pacific-rim economic boom.

Wheat loadings hit 1.8 million tonnes in November, a strong comeback from the total of less than one million tonnes mark in September 2004. Shipments of gaseous hydrocarbons were also on the rise to accommodate the demand caused by the colder weather.

The intermodal portion, that is, containers and trailers hauled on flat cars, fell 1.4% to 2.4 million tonnes, mostly the result of a decline in containerized goods compared with those carried in trailers on flat cars.

Freight arriving from the United States, either destined for or passing through Canada, totalled 2.5 million tonnes, up 8.9% from October.

All categories went up when compared to November 2003, non-intermodal tonnage was up 8.9%, intermodal traffic was up 3.4% while traffic received from the United States showed and 5.6% rise. Coal, potash, wheat and lumber loadings showed the most increase from November 2003.

On a year-to-date basis, the cumulative total for non-intermodal loadings for the first 11 months of 2004 grew 6.5% compared to the same period last year. Tonnage shipped between January and November 2004 amounted to 227.8 million tonnes, compared with 213.8 million tonnes in the same period in 2003.

Intermodal loadings totalled 24.5 million tonnes, up 1.5 %, while traffic received from the United States hit 24.3 million tonnes, up 1.7% over the same period.

## Methodology and concepts

The *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication presents essential data for timely analysis of the Rail Transport Industry and its contribution to the Canadian economy. Approximately 40 rail carriers report each month on their total intermodal and non-intermodal<sup>1</sup> traffic of the previous month. For non-intermodal traffic, the carriers report the number of cars and tonnes by commodity of revenue-generating freight that they have loaded in Canada. For intermodal freight, the carriers report the number of units and tonnes for containers-on-flat-cars (C.O.F.C.) and trailers-on-flat-cars (T.O.F.C.), with no commodity detail. The carriers also report the total tonnage of revenue freight received from United States connections.

The total quantity of freight carried in Canada is the sum of the non-intermodal and intermodal freight loaded and the traffic received from U.S. connections. Additional information provided includes the number of units and tonnes of C.O.F.C. and T.O.F.C received from U.S. connections and the total tonnes of cargo that the carriers received from other Canadian connections. This freight that is exchanged among Canadian based carriers is counted only once in the total quantity of freight moved as it is counted only when loaded. For intermodal freight, twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) are derived from the dimensions of the freight-laden containers. Empty containers are not included in these statistics.

The data are collected via questionnaires and electronic reports that are filed with Statistics Canada eight working days after the reference month. These questionnaires are captured and edited and the data are then aggregated to produce tables for all of Canada and the Eastern and Western divisions of Canada<sup>2</sup>. Tables show the data for the reference month and the year-to-date. These year-to-date figures include revisions of data from previous months.

Users of *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* current and historical data should be aware of a break in the continuity of these data. Starting with the January 1999 reference period, the commodities presented in the *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication were modified to conform to the Standard Classification of Transported Goods (SCTG) and the number of carriers surveyed more than doubled from the eighteen carriers surveyed prior to 1999.

The additional carriers were primarily shortline carriers whose data were previously included with the data of mainline carriers. The change in commodity classes has had negligible impact on the reporting of bulk commodities (e.g., wheat, potash and coal) which represent the majority of the total number of cars and tonnes. However, the reporting of manufactured and miscellaneous goods has changed significantly.
