# **Highlights**

#### 2005 annual and December 2005

Canadian railways carried their heaviest freight load so far this decade in 2005, thanks to the pressing demand for primary goods from China and other Asian nations.

Railways reported total loadings of more than 287.2 million tonnes of goods in 2005, up 3.7% or 10.4 million tonnes over 2004.

Canada's entire transportation industry has worked hard in 2005. New infrastructures as well as collaborative agreements to optimise movements of cargo on an already busy transportation network, appears to have been beneficial.

The results of these collective efforts became more obvious in the second part of the year, when loadings surpassed those of the first half thanks to the strongest fourth quarter since 1999.

The non-intermodal portion of loadings totalled 259.4 million tonnes, up from 250.2 million tonnes in 2004. Iron ore loadings alone increased by 4.4 million metric tonnes, while loadings of lumber were up by 2.9 million metric tonnes. Coal loadings increased by 1.7 million tonnes.

Intermodal loadings, which consist of containers and trailers on flat cars, rose 4.5% to 27.8 million metric tonnes. Containerized cargo consists mostly of finished manufactured goods ready for retail purchase, most of which come from Asian countries and the United States.

Traffic received from the United States either destined for Canada or passing through Canada back into the United States totalled 27.3 million tonnes last year, up from 26.6 million tonnes in 2004.

On a monthly basis, total loadings in December fell 5.5% from November to 23.4 million metric tonnes.

The non-intermodal portion reached 21.2 million metric tonnes in December and required 267,000 cars. This represented a 5.1% drop from November but a 0.7% increase from December 2004.

The intermodal portion fell 9.7% to 2.2 million tonnes. Traffic received from the United States destined for Canada or passing through Canada back into the United States totalled 2.3 million metric tonnes in December, down 6.7%.

**Note:** Data on railway carloadings have undergone some revisions, as numerous carriers have provided updates and corrections. Revisions affect the entire Railway Carloadings CANSIM series.

# Methodology and concepts

The *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication presents essential data for timely analysis of the Rail Transport Industry and its contribution to the Canadian economy. Approximately 40 rail carriers report each month on their total intermodal and non-intermodal traffic of the previous month. For non-intermodal traffic, the carriers report the number of cars and tonnes by commodity of revenue-generating freight that they have loaded in Canada. For intermodal freight, the carriers report the number of units and tonnes for containers-on-flat-cars (C.O.F.C.) and trailers-on-flat-cars (T.O.F.C.), with no commodity detail. The carriers also report the total tonnage of revenue freight received from United States connections.

The total quantity of freight carried in Canada is the sum of the non-intermodal and intermodal freight loaded and the traffic received from U.S. connections. Additional information provided includes the number of units and tonnes of C.O.F.C. and T.O.F.C received from U.S. connections and the total tonnes of cargo that the carriers received from other Canadian connections. This freight that is exchanged among Canadian based carriers is counted only once in the total quantity of freight moved as it is counted only when loaded. For intermodal freight, twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs) are derived from the dimensions of the freight-laden containers. Empty containers are not included in these statistics.

The data are collected via questionnaires and electronic reports that are filed with Statistics Canada eight working days after the reference month. These questionnaires are captured and edited and the data are then aggregated to produce tables for all of Canada and the Eastern and Western divisions of Canada<sup>2</sup>. Tables show the data for the reference month and the year-to-date. These year-to-date figures include revisions of data from previous months.

Users of *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* current and historical data should be aware of a break in the continuity of these data. Starting with the January 1999 reference period, the commodities presented in the *Railway Carloadings (Monthly)* publication were modified to conform to the Standard Classification of Transported Goods (SCTG) and the number of carriers surveyed more than doubled from the eighteen carriers surveyed prior to 1999.

The additional carriers were primarily shortline carriers whose data were previously included with the data of mainline carriers. The change in commodity classes has had negligible impact on the reporting of bulk commodities (e.g., wheat, potash and coal) which represent the majority of the total number of cars and tonnes. However, the reporting of manufactured and miscellaneous goods has changed significantly.
