Highlights:

- In December 1999, the freight loaded by railways in Canada (excluding intermodal traffic) totalled 19.9 million metric tonnes.
- The intermodal tonnage, represented by "container-on-flat-cars" (C.O.F.C.) and "trailer-on-flat-cars" (T.O.F.C.), was 1.9 million metric tonnes.
- The five main loaded commodities were: coal (3.1million metric tonnes), iron ores and concentrates (2.9 million metric tonnes), wheat (1.6 million metric tonnes), potash (1.0 million metric tonnes) and lumber (0.8 million metric tonnes).
- The cumulative freight loaded (excludind intermodal traffic) for the year of 1999 reached 236.7 million metric tonnes.


