## The System of National Accounts

In Canada, the National Accounts have been developed since the close of the Second World War in a series of publications relating to their constituent parts. These have now reached a stage of evolution where they can be termed a "System of National Accounts". For purposes of identification, all publications (containing tables of statistics, descriptions of conceptual frameworks and descriptions of sources and methods) which make up this System carry the term "System of National Accounts" as a general title.

The System of National Accounts in Canada consists of several parts. The annual and quarterly Income and Expenditure Accounts (included with Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 13) were, historically speaking, the first set of statistics to be referred to with the title "National Accounts" (National Accounts, Income and Expenditure). The Balance of International Payments data (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 67) are also part of the System of National Accounts and they, in fact, pre-date the Income and Expenditure Accounts.

Greatly expanded structural detail on industries and on goods and services is portrayed in the Input-Output Tables of the System (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 15). The Catalogue Nos. carrying the prefix 15 also provide measures of the contribution of each industry to total Gross Domestic Product at factor cost as well as Productivity Measures.

Both the Input-Output tables and the estimates of Gross Domestic Product by Industry use the establishment as the primary unit of industrial production. Measures of financial transactions are provided by the Financial Flow Accounts (Catalogue Nos. with prefix 13). Types of lenders and financial instruments are the primary detail in these statistics and the legal entity is the main unit of classification of transactors. Balance sheets of outstanding assets and liabilities are published annually.

The System of National Accounts provides an overall conceptually integrated framework in which the various parts can be considered as interrelated sub-systems. At present, direct comparisons amongst those parts which use the establishment as the basic unit and those which use the legal entity can be carried out only at highly aggregated levels of data. However, Statistics Canada is continuing research on enterprise company establishment relationships; it may eventually be feasible to reclassify the data which are on one basis (say the establishment basis) to correspond to the units employed on another (the company or the enterprise basis).

In its broad outline, the Canadian System of National Accounts bears a close relationship to the international standard as described in *System of National Accounts, 1993*, a joint publication of the Commission of the European Communities, International Monetary Fund, Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development, United Nations and World Bank.

## Le système de comptabilité nationale

Au Canada, les comptes nationaux ont fait l'objet depuis la fin de la Seconde Guerre mondiale de toute une série de publications portant sur leurs éléments constitutifs propres. Ils ont connu une telle évolution qu'on peut maintenant les qualifier de "Système de comptabilité nationale". Aux fins d'identification, toutes les publications qui font partie du système (elles contiennent des tableaux statistiques, la description du cadre théorique et l'explication des sources et des méthodes) portent le titre général de "Système de comptabilité nationale".

Le système de comptabilité nationale du Canada se divise en plusieurs catégories de comptes. Les comptes annuels et trimestriels des revenus et des dépenses (paraissant dans les publications dont le numéro de catalogue commence par 13) ont constitué le premier ensemble de statistiques à être connu sous le titre de "Comptes nationaux" (Comptes nationaux, revenus et dépenses). Les données sur la balance canadienne des paiements internationaux (numéro de catalogue commençant par 67) font également partie du système de comptabilité nationale; elles ont même existé avant les comptes des revenus et dépenses.

Une nomenclature beaucoup plus détaillée d'industries et de biens et services figure dans les tableaux d'entrées-sorties du système (numéro de catalogue commençant par 15). Les publications dont le numéro de catalogue commence par 15 comprennent aussi les mesures de l'apport de chaque branche d'activité au total du produit intérieur brut au coût des facteurs ainsi que les mesures de productivité.

L'établissement est l'unité primaire de production industrielle tant dans les tableaux d'entrées-sorties que dans les estimations du produit intérieur brut par activité économique. Les comptes de flux financiers (publications dont le numéro de catalogue commence par 13) mesurent les opérations financières. Les catégories de prêteurs et d'instruments financiers forment les éléments de base de ces statistiques et l'entité juridique est le point de départ du classement des agents économiques. Les comptes du bilan des actifs et passifs en cours sont disponibles annuellement.

Le système de comptabilité nationale constitue un ensemble conceptuellement intégré dans lequel les diverses catégories de comptes peuvent être considérées comme des sous-systèmes étroitement liés entre eux. Au stade actuel de développement, on ne peut faire de comparaison directe entre les éléments basés sur l'établissement et ceux qui sont basés sur l'entité juridique que lorsque les données sont groupées dans des catégories très générales. Toutefois, Statistique Canada poursuit ses recherches sur les relations entre l'entreprise, la société et l'établissement. Il sera peut-être possible un jour de reclasser les données établies sur une certaine base (l'établissement par exemple) de manière à les faire correspondre aux données établies sur une autre base (société ou entreprise).

Dans ses grandes lignes, le système de comptabilité nationale du Canada suit de très près la norme internationale exposée dans la publication *System of National Accounts, 1993* produite conjointement par la Commission des Communautés Européennes, le Fonds Monétaire International, l'Organisation pour la Coopération et le Développement, les Nations-Unies et la Banque Mondiale.

## Notice to Users

As mentioned in the second quarter release (August 29th, 2003), the power outage in Ontario shortened the time spent on the production of the second quarter data and revisions to the first quarter. It was explained that upward adjustments were made to export values due to the large shifts in exchange rate. These adjustments totalled \$4 billion and \$10.8 billion (seasonally adjusted at annual rates) respectively for the first and second quarters of 2003.

Upon further analysis, it was found that these adjustments were overstated. For this current release, the adjustments have been revised downward to \$3.2 billion and \$4.4 billion respectively for the first and second quarters with a smaller but negative adjustment for the third quarter of \$0.8 billion.

Updated information has also been incorporated for trade prices, particularly export prices, from what had been previously published by Statistics Canada on November 13th in its release "Canadian International Merchandise Trade".

An hours worked adjustment has been made to real government spending to reflect hours lost during the Ontario power outage. This adjustment was estimated at \$560 million at annual rates, based on 1997 chained dollars.

This publication presents information about Canada's National Income and Expenditure Accounts (IEA). These accounts portray the evolution of the Canadian economy on a quarterly basis. They record the components of income and expenditure, saving and investment, and borrowing and lending of each of four broad sectors of the economy: (i) persons and unincorporated businesses, (ii) corporate and government business enterprises, (iii) government and (iv) non-residents. The sum of the final (non-transfer) income or the final (non-intermediate) expenditure of all domestic sectors equals gross domestic product at market prices, the market value of total production in Canada.

The sectoral structure of these accounts can best be explained through an example. Consider the corporate and government business enterprises sector. Corporations receive income in the form of profits, other investment income and capital assistance from government. They pay out part of that income as interest and dividends, direct taxes or other transfers such as charitable donations, and save the remainder. Corporations also invest in plant, equipment and inventories. To the extent their investment exceeds or falls short of their saving, they either borrow from or lend to other sectors in the form of financial transactions. The net borrowing or lending of a sector is also the difference between financial asset acquisition (bank deposits, purchase of bonds, purchase of equity and so on) and liability acquisition (bank borrowing, bond sales, equity financing and so on). The system as a whole, then, provides two equivalent measures of net lending by sector, which differ somewhat due to statistical errors. The sum of net lending by all sectors must be zero.

## Avis aux utilisateurs

Tel que mentionné lors du communiqué du deuxième trimestre 2003 (publié le 29 août 2003), la panne d'électricité en Ontario avait écourté le temps consacré à la production des données pour le deuxième trimestre et les révisions au premier trimestre. Cette note expliquait que la valeur des exportations avait été ajustée à la hausse due aux larges variations du taux de change. Ces corrections étaient de 4,0 milliards de dollars et 10,8 milliards de dollars (désaisonnalisés au taux annuel) pour les premier et deuxième trimestres de 2003 respectivement.

Suite à une analyse plus approfondie, on a constaté que ces corrections à la valeur des exportations avaient été surévaluées. Ainsi, pour ce communiqué, les corrections ont été révisées à la baisse, soit à 3,2 milliards de dollars et 4,4 milliards de dollars pour les premier et deuxième trimestres de 2003 respectivement. Une correction plus petite, mais négative cette fois, a été évaluée à 0,8 milliard de dollars pour le troisième trimestre.

De l'information plus récente a aussi été incorporée aux prix du commerce, particulièrement aux prix des exportations, comparativement à ce qui avait été précédemment publié le 13 novembre par Statistique Canada dans le communiqué "Commerce international de marchandises du Canada".

Un ajustement relatif aux heures travaillées a été apporté aux dépenses en termes réels des administrations au troisième trimestre pour représenter les heures perdues lors de la panne de courant survenue en Ontario. Cet ajustement a été estimé à 560 millions de dollars enchaînés (1997) à taux annuel.

La présente publication nous renseigne sur les Comptes nationaux des revenus et dépenses (CRD) au Canada. Ceux-ci permettent de constater l'évolution de l'économie au Canada sur une base trimestrielle. Ils font état des composantes des revenus et des dépenses, de l'épargne, de l'investissement, de l'emprunt et du prêt de chacun des quatre grands secteurs de l'économie: i) les particuliers et les entreprises individuelles; ii) les sociétés et entreprises publiques; iii) les administrations publiques; et iv) les non-résidents. La somme du revenu final (excluant les paiements de transfert) ou des dépenses finales (excluant les coûts intermédiaires) de chaque secteur domestique correspond au produit intérieur brut aux prix du marché, c'est-à-dire la valeur marchande de la production totale au Canada.

La structure sectorielle de ces comptes mérite d'être expliquée. Prenons par exemple le secteur des sociétés et entreprises publiques. Les sociétés touchent des revenus sous forme de bénéfices, d'autres revenus de placements et des subventions d'équipement des administrations publiques. Elles versent une partie de ces revenus en intérêts et en dividendes, en impôts directs et sous forme d'autres transferts, par exemple des dons de charité, et épargnent le reste. Les sociétés investissent en outre dans des installations, du matériel et des stocks. Selon que leur investissement est supérieur ou inférieur à leur épargne, elles empruntent de l'argent d'autres secteurs ou en prêtent à ces derniers sous forme de transactions financières. L'emprunt ou le prêt net d'un secteur peut être aussi la différence entre l'acquisition d'actifs (dépôts bancaires, achat d'obligations, achat d'actions, etc.) et d'instruments de passif (emprunts bancaires, vente d'obligations, financement par actions, etc.). Le système dans son ensemble fournit par la suite deux mesures équivalentes du prêt net par secteur qui diffèrent quelque peu en raison des erreurs statistiques. La somme du prêt net de tous les secteurs doit être égale à zéro.

Financial transactions are expanded in the Financial Flow Accounts (FFA). The FFA show the details of the financing of economic activity, as well as the economy-wide intermediation of funds, in considerable detail (covering 30 institutional sectors).

## Highlights

### Third quarter 2003

Economic growth edged up 0.3 % in the third quarter following a 0.2% decline in the second. Consumer expenditures made the largest contribution to growth but were partly offset by the rundown of non-farm inventories. Final domestic demand grew 1.4% as consumer spending and business investment provided support to the economy.

On an annualized basis, growth in the quarter was 1.1%. South of the border, the U.S. economy grew at an annualized rate of 8.2%, up from 3.3% in the second quarter.

## Faits saillants

### Troisième trimestre de 2003

L'économie a légèrement progressé de 0,3 % au troisième trimestre, après avoir connu une baisse de 0,2 % au deuxième trimestre. Ce sont les dépenses de consommation qui ont contribué le plus à la croissance, mais elles ont été contrebalancées en partie par la réduction des stocks non agricoles. La demande intérieure finale a augmenté de 1,4 %, les dépenses des consommateurs et les investissements des entreprises ayant contribué à soutenir l'économie.

Sur une base annualisée, la croissance a été de 1,1 % au cours du trimestre. Aux États Unis, l'économie a augmenté à un taux annualisé de 8,2 %, ce qui est supérieur au taux de 3,3 % enregistré au deuxième trimestre.

Personal expenditures advanced 1.2%, slightly more than the average over the past three quarters. Consumer spending has grown each quarter for more than seven years. Stronger labour income growth and lower interest rates provided the fundamentals for continued strength in consumer spending.

Purchases of new and used motor vehicles were the largest contributors to growth of personal expenditures, accounting for about one third of the increase. Truck purchases, including minivans and sport utility vehicles, were particularly strong, jumping over 15%. Manufacturers continued to offer generous sales incentives. Purchases of furniture, appliances and electronic goods continue to be stimulated by the strong housing market. Overall,

### Les dépenses de consommation s'intensifient

Les dépenses personnelles ont progressé de 1,2 %, ce qui est légèrement supérieur à la moyenne des trois derniers trimestres. Les dépenses de consommation ont augmenté chaque trimestre depuis plus de sept ans. La croissance plus marquée du revenu du travail et les taux d'intérêt plus faibles ont été les facteurs principaux de la vigueur soutenue des dépenses de consommation.

Ce sont les achats de véhicules automobiles neufs et d'occasion qui ont contribué le plus à la croissance des dépenses personnelles, ayant été à la base d'environ le tiers de la hausse. Les achats de camions, y compris les mini-fourgonnettes et les véhicules utilitaires à caractère sportif, ont été particulièrement élevés, avec un bond de plus de 15 %. Les fabricants ont continué d'offrir des incitatifs généreux aux acheteurs potentiels. Les achats de meubles, d'électroménagers et de

expenditure on durable goods increased 4.0%, representing almost one-half of the growth in consumer expenditures.

Spending on consumer services was largely responsible for the remainder of the growth in consumer spending. Restaurant and accommodation services rose 1.6%, following two quarters of decline impacted by SARS and other factors. Accommodation services were up 4.4%, but were still below the level reached at the beginning of 2003. Canadians' spending on foreign travel surged in the third quarter, recovering more than their losses incurred in the previous three quarters. Financial and legal services advanced 1.4%.

### **Sustained boom in housing**

Investment in residential construction jumped 4.3% from the second quarter, the largest increase in six quarters, prolonging the housing boom which started in the late 1990's. Strength in the housing market has been supported by a number of factors, including low interest rates, continuing employment growth, higher disposable income and shortages in the rental housing markets.

The major contributor to the increase was surging real estate transfer costs (+12%), which include real estate commissions. Residential real estate commissions reached a new record for the second consecutive quarter, reflecting continued strength in the resale housing market. New housing construction increased 3.6% following two quarters of decline. Housing starts on an annualized basis exceeded 230 thousand units for the first time since the late 1980s housing boom. Spending on renovations increased 1.7%, slowing from the second quarter's growth (+3.8%).

produits électroniques ont continué d'être stimulés par la vigueur du secteur de l'habitation. Dans l'ensemble, les dépenses en biens durables ont connu une hausse de 4,0 %, soit presque la moitié de la croissance des dépenses de consommation.

Les dépenses au chapitre des services ont été responsables pour une large part du reste de la croissance des dépenses de consommation. Les services de restauration et d'hébergement ont connu une hausse de 1,6 %, après deux trimestres de baisses en raison du SRAS et d'autres facteurs. Les services d'hébergement ont progressé de 4,4 %, mais leur niveau demeure inférieur à celui atteint au début de 2003. Les dépenses des Canadiens au titre des voyages à l'étranger ont fait un bond au troisième trimestre, récupérant plus que le terrain qu'elles avaient perdu au cours des trois trimestres précédents. Les services financiers et juridiques ont progressé de 1,4 %.

### **Vigueur soutenue du secteur de l'habitation**

L'investissement en bâtiments résidentiels a fait un bond de 4,3 % par rapport au deuxième trimestre. Cela constitue la hausse la plus marquée en six trimestres et s'inscrit dans le prolongement de l'effervescence du secteur immobilier qui s'est amorcée à la fin des années 90. La vigueur du marché du logement a été alimentée par plusieurs facteurs, dont les faibles taux d'intérêt, la croissance soutenue de l'emploi, le revenu disponible plus élevé et la pénurie sur le marché du logement locatif.

La hausse remarquable des coûts de transfert de propriété (+12 %), qui comprennent les commissions sur les ventes de maisons, a été la principale source de cette augmentation. Les commissions dans le secteur immobilier résidentiel ont atteint un niveau record pour le deuxième trimestre consécutif, dans la foulée de la vigueur soutenue du marché de la revente de maisons. La construction de logements neufs a augmenté de 3,6 %, après deux trimestres de baisses. Les mises en chantier ont dépassé le seuil des 230 000 unités (sur une base annualisée) pour la première fois depuis le boom immobilier de la fin des années 80. Les dépenses au chapitre des rénovations ont progressé de 1,7 %, un ralentissement par rapport au deuxième trimestre (+3,8 %).

### **Business investment in plant and equipment strengthens**

Investment in plant and equipment grew 3.1%. This marked the third consecutive quarter of growth for business investment and its largest contribution to growth in 15 quarters. Government investment declined 0.7%.

Business investment in machinery and equipment increased 4.4%, accelerating from the second quarter (+0.6%). It was spurred on by strong growth in computers and other office equipment (+9.8%) and trucks (+15%). Business investment in non-residential structures was supported by increases for buildings (+1.6%) and engineering (+0.9%) which benefited from increased oil and gas drilling activity.

### **Non-farm inventories drawn down sharply**

Businesses reduced non-farm inventories more than \$3 billion in the third quarter, following five quarters where inventories were built up. With the draw-down of inventory, the economy-wide stock-to-sales ratio fell for the first time since the third quarter of 2002.

Manufacturers and retailers unloaded durable goods from their inventories, reflecting in part the clearance of motor vehicles to domestic demand. Lumber inventories were drawn down to supply housing demand in Canada and the U.S. Partially offsetting these declines were accumulation of non-durable inventories by wholesalers.

Agricultural inventories grew more than \$4 billion during the quarter, with increases for both the grain and livestock sectors. The return to a more normal production year for most crops in 2003 allowed farmers to rebuild their grain inventories on farms, after two years of reductions. Considering that about half the cattle sold in Canada are usually exported as either live animals or meat and that 90% of these exports go to the United States, the closure of the U.S. border has led to increases in the numbers of cattle on Canadian farms in both the second and

### **Raffermissement de l'investissement des entreprises en usines et en matériel**

L'investissement des entreprises en usines et en matériel a augmenté de 3,1 %. Il s'agit de la troisième hausse trimestrielle consécutive de l'investissement des entreprises, ainsi que de la contribution à la croissance la plus marquée au cours des 15 derniers trimestres. L'investissement des administrations publiques a baissé de 0,7 %.

L'investissement des entreprises en machines et en matériel a augmenté de 4,4 %, ce qui constitue une amélioration par rapport au deuxième trimestre (+0,6 %). L'investissement des entreprises a été alimenté par la vigueur du marché des ordinateurs et autre matériel de bureau (+9,8 %) ainsi que des camions (+15 %). L'investissement des entreprises en bâtiments non résidentiels a été soutenu par les hausses au titre des bâtiments (+1,6 %) et des ouvrages de génie (+0,9 %), en raison de l'intensification des activités de forage pétrolier et gazier.

### **Les stocks non agricoles connaissent une baisse marquée**

Les entreprises ont réduit leurs stocks non agricoles de plus de 3 milliards de dollars au troisième trimestre, après cinq trimestres d'accumulation. Cette baisse des stocks a entraîné une diminution du ratio des stocks aux ventes pour l'ensemble de l'économie a diminué pour la première fois depuis le troisième trimestre de 2002.

Les fabricants et les détaillants se sont départis de stocks de biens durables, en partie du fait de la liquidation des véhicules automobiles pour répondre à la demande intérieure. Les stocks de bois d'œuvre ont diminué, pour combler la demande sur les marchés de la construction au Canada et aux États Unis. L'accumulation de stocks de biens non durables par les grossistes a contrebalancé en partie ces diminutions.

Les stocks agricoles ont augmenté de plus de 4 milliards de dollars au cours du trimestre, des hausses ayant été enregistrées à la fois dans le secteur des céréales et dans celui du bétail. Le retour à une année de production plus normale dans le cas de la plupart des récoltes en 2003 a permis aux agriculteurs de reconstituer leurs stocks de céréales, après deux années de baisses. Compte tenu du fait qu'environ la moitié du bétail canadien vendu est habituellement exporté, qu'il s'agisse d'animaux vivants ou de viande, et que 90 % de ces exportations sont destinées aux

third quarters. As of mid-September, Canadian boneless beef from animals younger than 30 months has been allowed into the U.S. under a permit process. However, the border remains closed to live cattle and calves.

### Farm incomes plummeted

Despite a recovery in the grain sector, after two years of adverse weather conditions on the Prairies, farm income declined strongly in the third quarter due to a severe drop in livestock revenues. On May 20, after one cow tested positive for bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE), the United States and several other countries shut their borders to Canadian cattle. Despite partial re-opening of the U.S. market in mid-September, the reduced demand for Canadian beef resulted in dramatic declines in marketings and prices.

### Exports weaken further

Exports fell 0.2%, in part the result of a stronger Canadian dollar. This fourth consecutive quarterly decline, marks the longest string of export declines in over forty years.

Machinery and equipment exports (-2.7%) were the largest contributor to this decline. Declines in machinery and equipment exports were widespread with the aircraft industry being one of the hardest hit. Automotive product exports fell 2.3%. Offsetting some of these declines, wheat exports increased as a result of better crops this year. Crude oil exports recovered some of their losses from the previous quarter. Exports of travel services (+6.0%) were up strongly as the impact of the fear of SARS on tourists coming to Canada eased.

Imports fell 0.5% following an increase of 1.7% in the second quarter when the Canadian dollar strengthened significantly.

Automotive product imports dropped 7.1% as strong consumer demand was satisfied by drawing down inventory. Industrial goods and materials imports declined 1.6%. Machinery and equipment imports grew 2.0%.

États Unis, la fermeture de la frontière américaine a entraîné des hausses du cheptel canadien, tant au deuxième qu'au troisième trimestre. À la mi septembre, la vente de viande désossée de bœufs canadiens âgés de moins de 30 mois a été autorisée aux États Unis, par voie de permis spécial. Cependant, la frontière demeure fermée aux bovins et aux veaux vivants.

### Les revenus agricoles chutent

Malgré une reprise dans le secteur céréalier, après deux années de conditions climatiques défavorables dans les Prairies, les revenus agricoles ont connu une baisse marquée au troisième trimestre, en raison du recul important des revenus tirés du bétail. Le 20 mai, après la découverte d'un cas d'encéphalopathie fongiforme bovine (EFB), les États Unis et plusieurs autres pays ont fermé leurs frontières au bétail canadien. Malgré une réouverture partielle du marché américain à la mi septembre, la baisse de la demande de bœuf canadien a entraîné une réduction considérable des mises en marché et des prix.

### Autre recul des exportations

Les exportations ont diminué de 0,2 %, ce qui peut s'expliquer en partie par la vigueur du dollar canadien. Cette quatrième baisse trimestrielle consécutive marque l'enchaînement le plus long de baisses des exportations en plus de 40 ans.

Les exportations de machines et de matériel (-2,7 %) ont contribué le plus à ce recul. Les diminutions des exportations de machines et de matériel ont été généralisées, le secteur des aéronefs ayant été l'un des plus gravement touchés. Les exportations de produits de l'automobile ont baissé de 2,3 %. Les exportations de blé ont augmenté, en raison d'une amélioration des récoltes cette année, ce qui a contrebalancé en partie les diminutions. Les exportations de pétrole brut ont repris légèrement, après les reculs observés au trimestre précédent. Les exportations de services de voyage ont connu une hausse marquée (+6,0 %), les répercussions de la crainte du SRAS sur les touristes venant au Canada s'étant atténuées.

Les importations ont diminué de 0,5 %, après une hausse de 1,7 % au deuxième trimestre, le dollar canadien s'étant raffermi de façon significative.

Les importations de produits de l'automobile ont diminué de 7,1 %, la demande importante des consommateurs ayant été comblée par une réduction des stocks. Les importations de produits industriels et de matériaux ont diminué de 1,6 %. Celles de machines et de matériel ont augmenté de 2,0 %.



### **Blackout dampened government spending**

Net government spending on goods and services edged up 0.3%, decelerating from the previous quarter. The power blackout in Ontario in August shaved 0.3 of a percentage point from this expenditure, as government operations were scaled back during this period.

The combined government surplus (annualized national accounts basis expressed in nominal terms) rose to almost \$12 billion. Much of the increase resulted from higher personal and corporate income taxes, higher sales tax collections, and lower transfers to businesses.

### **Labour income strengthened**

Labour income increased 0.7% in the third quarter, accelerating from a 0.2% increase in the second quarter, but less than any quarterly increase in 2002. Wages and salaries increased 0.8% in the service producing industries, while the goods producing industries grew 0.2%. Employment increased by 17,000 jobs in the quarter matching the job growth in the second quarter. Provincially, Ontario had the largest portion of this increase. Disposable income grew by 0.8% in the quarter, about half of the increase in personal expenditure. As a result, the savings rate fell to 1.3%, lowest in over forty years.

### **Profits rebounded**

Profits (+4.9%) rebounded from a second quarter decline but remained below peak levels set in the first quarter. Retailers' profits were stronger as personal expenditures strengthened particularly for durables. Higher production and higher commodity prices boosted mining profits. Manufacturers, particularly auto related, recorded higher profits but the power blackout and the stronger Canadian currency limited their gains. Profits of the construction industry improved from a weaker second quarter.

### **La panne de courant généralisée freine les dépenses des administrations publiques**

Les dépenses nettes des administrations publiques au titre des biens et des services ont connu une hausse légère de 0,3 %, ce qui est inférieur au taux enregistré au trimestre précédent. La panne de courant du mois d'août en Ontario a entraîné une réduction des dépenses de 0,3 point de pourcentage, en raison du ralentissement des activités des administrations publiques au cours de cette période.

L'excédent pour l'ensemble des administrations publiques (sur la base de la comptabilité nationale, annualisé et aux prix courants) a augmenté pour se chiffrer à près de 12 milliards de dollars. Une part importante de la hausse a été le résultat des montants plus élevés perçus au titre des impôts des particuliers et des entreprises et au titre des taxes de vente, ainsi que de la diminution des transferts aux entreprises.

### **Raffermissement du revenu du travail**

Le revenu du travail a augmenté de 0,7 % au troisième trimestre, après une augmentation de 0,2 % au trimestre précédent. Cette hausse est toutefois inférieure à toutes les augmentations trimestrielles enregistrées en 2002. Les salaires et traitements ont progressé de 0,8 % dans le secteur producteur de services, et de 0,2 % dans le secteur producteur de biens. On a enregistré une augmentation de 17 000 emplois au cours du trimestre, semblable à celle notée au deuxième trimestre. Au niveau provincial, c'est l'Ontario qui a profité de la part la plus importante de cette hausse. Le revenu disponible a augmenté de 0,8 % au cours du trimestre, soit environ la moitié du taux d'augmentation des dépenses personnelles. Par conséquent, le taux d'épargne est passé à 1,3 %, le taux le plus bas en plus de 40 ans.

### **Reprise des bénéfices**

Les bénéfices (+4,9 %) ont connu une reprise par rapport à la baisse enregistrée au deuxième trimestre, mais ils sont demeurés inférieurs aux sommets atteints au premier trimestre. Les bénéfices des détaillants ont été plus marqués, en raison de l'accroissement des dépenses personnelles, plus particulièrement au titre des biens durables. Les bénéfices du secteur minier ont bondi suite aux augmentations dans la production et des prix. Les fabricants, et plus particulièrement ceux du secteur de l'automobile, ont enregistré des bénéfices plus élevés, mais la panne de courant et la hausse de la devise canadienne ont limité leurs gains. Les bénéfices du secteur de la construction se sont améliorés par rapport aux résultats plus mitigés du deuxième trimestre.

**Prices bounced back**

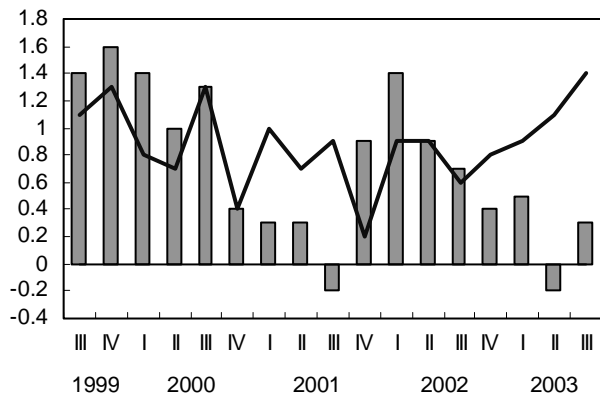
Prices, as measured by the chain price index for GDP increased 0.8% in the third quarter, following a 0.5% decline in the second. Energy prices and lumber prices increased during the quarter. The stronger Canadian dollar contributed to a 1.4% decline in import prices, following a 5.8% decline in the second quarter when the appreciation of the dollar was greater.

**Les prix rebondissent**

Les prix, tels que mesurés par l'indice de prix en chaîne du PIB, ont augmenté de 0,8 % au troisième trimestre, après avoir connu une baisse de 0,5 % au deuxième. 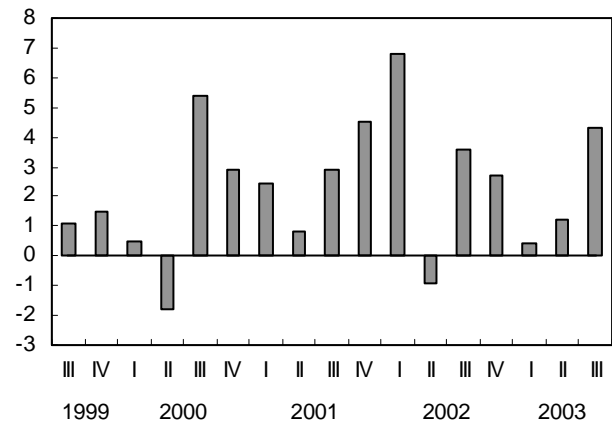

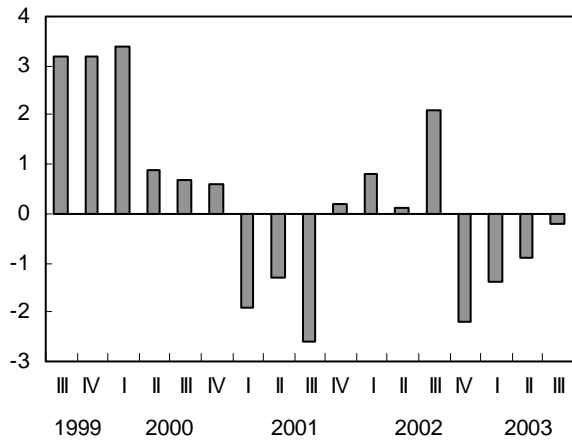

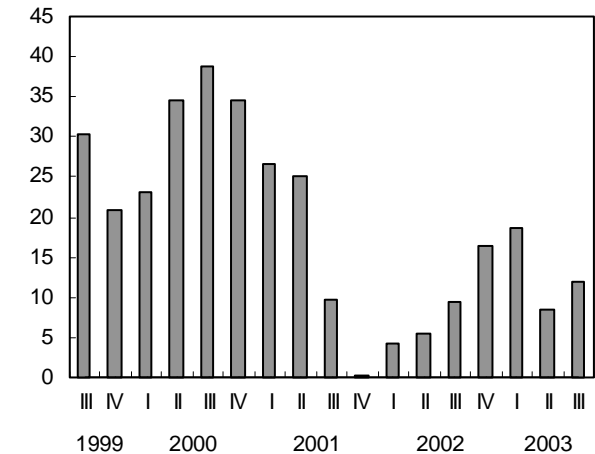

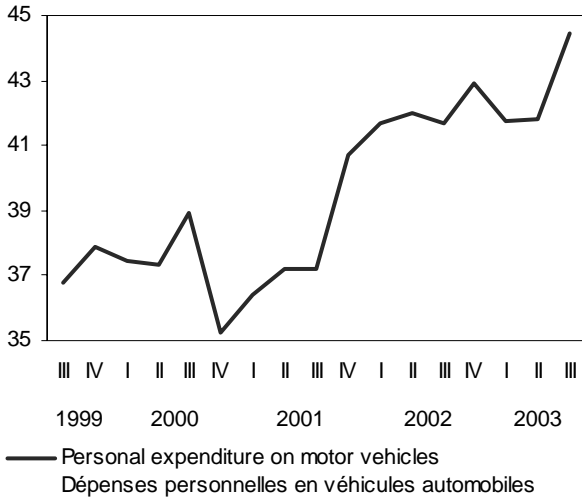

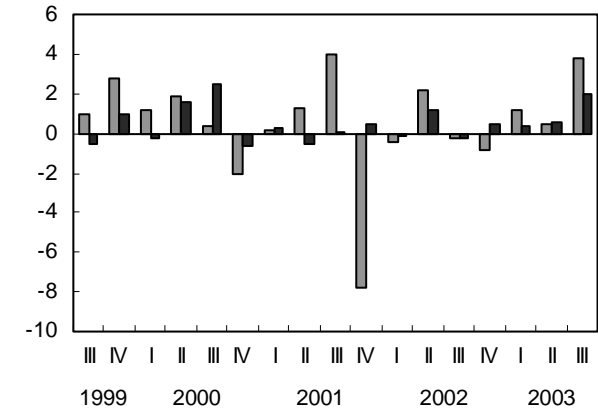

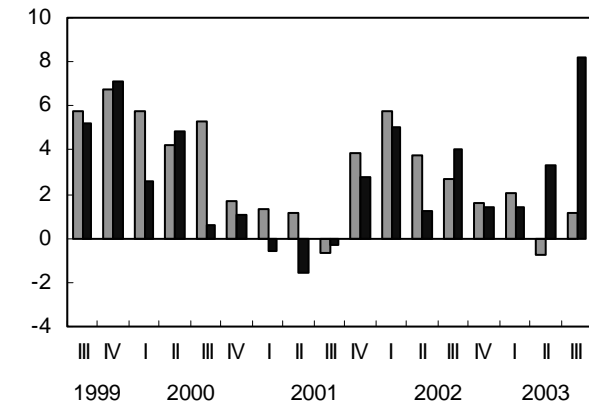

## Glossary

**Accrued net income of farm operators from farm production.** Net income received by farm operators from farm production plus the undistributed portion of earnings arising out of the operations of the Canadian Wheat Board and the adjustment made to shift agricultural subsidies from a cash to an accrual basis.

**Associations of individuals.** Non-profit institutions serving households, such as churches, labour unions and charitable organizations, plus credit unions, trustee pension plans, life insurance companies, fraternal societies and mutual non-life insurance companies. They are treated as businesses with respect to their capital outlays and their intermediation activities, but as persons with respect to their current expenses.

**Base period.** Reference period from which prices are taken to calculate an index.

**Basic prices.** A basic price valuation includes the costs of **production factors** (labour and capital) and indirect taxes and subsidies on production factors. Income measures are estimated at basic prices or **market prices**.

**Bonds.** Marketable and non-marketable securities issued in Canadian or foreign currency with an original term to maturity in excess of one year. Includes:

**Canada bonds.** Direct bonds of the federal government (of which, Canada Savings Bonds) and guaranteed federal enterprise bonds.

**Provincial bonds.** Direct bonds of provincial governments (of which, provincial savings bonds) and guaranteed provincial enterprise bonds.

**Municipal bonds.** Direct bonds of municipalities and guaranteed municipal enterprise bonds.

**Other bonds.** Bonds issued by Canadian corporations, hospitals and non-profit institutions, as well as non-guaranteed bonds of government business enterprises. Also included are asset-backed securities.

**Business gross fixed capital formation.** This expression covers all expenditures on buildings, engineering construction and machinery and equipment by the **business sector**, both corporations and unincorporated businesses. Business gross fixed capital formation is divided into three major categories in production accounts: **residential structures, non-residential structures and machinery and equipment**.

**Business investment in inventories.** Business sector inventories consist of two categories: (a) **non-farm inventories** and (b) **farm inventories and grain in commercial channels**. These two categories are presented in detailed tables in the Economic and Financial Accounts. Business sector inventories are themselves subdivided into those of the persons and unincorporated businesses sector and those of the corporations and government business enterprises sector. These two estimates are shown in the respective sector accounts under the inventories heading.

**Business sector.** All transactors producing goods and services for sale at a price intended to cover costs of production, namely corporations, government business enterprises, unincorporated businesses and independent professional practitioners. Also includes owners occupying their own dwelling, treated as businesses renting to themselves, and associations of individuals, treated as businesses with respect to their capital outlays and their intermediation activities.

**Canada and Quebec Pension Plans.** The part of the government sector which consists of the operations of the Canada and Quebec Pension Plans, established in 1966.

**Canadian residents.** Institutional units, such as persons, corporations and non-profit institutions, which have a centre of economic interest (a dwelling, a business location) in the economic territory of Canada.

**Capital and financial account.** This account shows, for each major sector, a) the saving and acquisition of non-financial capital and the difference between them, called net lending; and b) transactions in financial assets, transactions in liabilities and the difference between them, called net financial investment. In theory, the two balancing items, net lending and net financial investment, are equal; in practice, imperfections in the statistics lead to a difference between the two, shown as a statistical discrepancy.

**Capital consumption allowances.** Allowances for the using up of capital in the productive process. They are calculated for business and government fixed assets as well as housing. They also include miscellaneous valuation adjustments bringing business accounting records into conformity with national accounts definitions, such as the addition of claims paid by insurance companies to compensate for fire and other losses.

**Capital transfers.** Transfers in cash or in kind, out of the wealth of the donor (**inheritances and migrants' funds**, transfer of ownership of an asset or cancellation of a

liability), or transfers which the recipient is expected to use towards the acquisition of an asset. Capital transfers have no effect on the saving of the donor or recipient.

**Chain Fisher price index.** See **implicit price indexes**.

**Chain Fisher volume index.** A measure of change in volume from period to period. It is calculated as the geometric mean of a **chain Paasche volume index** and a **chain Laspeyres volume index**. In other words, it is the mean of two distinct measures of change in volume: one calculated as if prices were constant in the first of two consecutive periods (Laspeyres volume) and the other calculated as if prices were constant in the second of the two consecutive periods (Paasche volume).

**Chain index.** An index which is rebased on a period to period basis, accumulated multiplicatively from a **base period** value. For example, the **chain Fisher volume index** calculates the Fisher volume index in each pair of consecutive quarters, treating the earlier quarter as the base period.

**Chain Laspeyres volume indexes.** A measure of the change in volume from period to period. It is calculated as if prices were constant in the first of two consecutive periods. The indexes of each of the periods are linked together in a chain to form an index. Chain Laspeyres volume indexes are one of the components of the **chain Fisher volume indexes** that are the official measure of the economic and financial accounts.

**Chain Paasche volume indexes.** A measure of the change in volume from period to period. It is calculated as if prices were constant in the second of two consecutive periods. The indexes of each of the periods are linked together in a chain to form an index. The chain Paasche volume indexes are one of the components of the **chain Fisher volume indexes** that are the official measure of the economic and financial accounts.

**Changing the base period.** Changing the base period of a series involves redefining the **base period** on which the weightings are established.

**Claims.** Financial instrument comprising:

**Corporate claims.** Loans, advances and issues of debt between associated corporations; on the asset side, also includes investment in shares between associated corporations.

**Government claims.** Claims between governments, between related government business enterprises or between a parent government and its enterprises, in the form of shares, debt securities, loans and advances.

**Consumer credit.** Credit extended to persons for purchasing consumer goods and services.

**Consumer goods.** New goods acquired by households for their own consumption. Comprises three categories:

**Durable goods,** which can be used repeatedly or continuously for more than one year, such as motor vehicles and major appliances;

**Semi-durable goods,** which can be used on multiple occasions and have an expected lifetime of one year or somewhat more, such as clothing, footwear and linens;

**Non-durable goods,** which can be used only once, such as food, gasoline, alcoholic beverages and tobacco; in practice, the latter also include a few goods of little value used more than once, such as household supplies.

**Consumer services.** Services consumed by households, such as rent (including the rent imputed on owner-occupied housing), transportation, education, medical care, child care, food and accommodation services as well as travel expenditures of Canadians abroad, less travel expenditures of foreigners in Canada. Also includes the current (operating) expenses of associations of individuals and unincorporated businesses.

**Contributions to percent changes.** These estimates show the contribution of a sub-aggregate to the percent change in an aggregate. For example, if personal consumer spending increases 2% and the contribution to the percent change by motor vehicle purchases is 1%, then motor vehicle purchases would be said to have accounted for half of the increase in personal consumer spending.

**Contributions to social insurance plans.** Employer and employee contributions to employment insurance, the Canada and Quebec Pension Plans and workers' compensation.

**Corporate and government business enterprise sector.** All business transactors whose legal form of organization is the corporation, plus government business enterprises. This sector is divided into non-financial and financial enterprises. The latter are comprised of several sub-sectors (Bank of Canada, chartered banks, credit unions, life insurance companies, trustee pension funds, mutual funds, etc.). The

intermediation activities of credit unions, life insurance companies and trustee pension funds shown as assets of these sub-sectors are balanced by claim liabilities which, in turn, are assets of the persons and unincorporated business sector.

**Corporation profits before taxes.** The net earnings from economic activity of privately-held corporations, measured after deduction of capital consumption allowances.

**Currency and deposits.** Financial instruments comprising:

**Currency and bank deposits.** Deposits denominated in Canadian dollars at chartered banks in Canada and at the Bank of Canada, plus Canadian currency and coin in circulation.

**Other deposits.** All deposits at other Canadian deposit-taking institutions, including shares in credit unions.

**Foreign currency and deposits.** Holdings of foreign currency and foreign currency denominated deposits at chartered banks in Canada, foreign branches and subsidiaries of Canadian chartered banks, foreign banks and other foreign deposit-taking institutions.

**Current prices.** A valuation at current prices is expressed at the prices prevailing during the period being referred to.

**Current transactions with non-residents.** Exports of goods and services less imports of goods and services, plus net investment income from non-residents and net current transfers from non-residents.

**Current transfers.** Transfers out of the income of the donor, reducing his saving and adding to that of the recipient.

**Current transfers from corporations to persons.** Charitable donations and other contributions.

**Current transfers from government to business.** Subsidies to the business sector.

**Current transfers from government to non-residents.** Pensions paid to non-residents, contributions to international organizations and economic and technical assistance as well as food aid provided by the Canadian International Development Assistance Agency and other governmental agencies.

**Current transfers from government to persons.** Payments such as the Child Tax Benefit/Credit, Employment Insurance benefits, old age security benefits, welfare payments, scholarships and research grants, workers' compensation benefits, grants to aboriginal peoples and

their organizations, public service pensions, pensions paid under the Canada and Quebec Pension Plans, and veterans' allowances.

**Current transfers from non-residents to government.** Withholding taxes paid by non-residents to the Government of Canada.

**Current transfers from non-residents to persons.** Pensions paid by foreign governments to Canadian residents plus remittances by non-residents to Canadian residents.

**Current transfers from persons and unincorporated businesses to government.** Income taxes, contributions to social insurance plans and other current transfers.

**Current transfers from persons to corporations.** The transfer portion of interest on the consumer debt.

**Current transfers from persons to non-residents.** Remittances by Canadian residents (particularly religious and charitable organizations) to non-residents and withholding taxes paid abroad.

**Deflation.** Process of eliminating price change from a specific time series.

**Disposable income.** See **personal disposable income**.

**Dividends.** Income payable and receivable in respect of corporate equities (cash dividends) and further equity participation in corporate enterprises (stock dividends).

**Economic territory.** The economic territory of a country encompasses the geographic territory, plus the air space, territorial waters and continental shelf, as well as its territorial enclaves abroad (embassies, consulates, military bases, etc.).

**Existing assets.** See **net acquisition of existing assets**.

**Exports and imports of goods and services.** Current receipts and payments arising out of transactions in moveable goods and services between residents and non-residents. Services include travel, freight and shipping, business services, government transactions, financial intermediation and other services.

**Factor cost.** A valuation reflecting the cost of production factors (labour and capital). It corresponds to the value remaining after the deduction from **market prices** of all applicable taxes and subsidies.

**Farm inventories.** Farm output stored on farms; includes grains, tobacco, potatoes and livestock.

**Final domestic demand.** The sum of personal expenditure on consumer goods and services, net government current expenditure on goods and services, government gross fixed capital formation and business gross fixed capital formation.

**Fisher index.** Geometric mean of the **Laspeyres index** and the **Paasche index**.

**Fisher volume index.** Geometric mean of the **Laspeyres volume index** and the **Paasche volume index**.

**Fixed capital.** See **gross fixed capital formation**.

**Fixed-weighted price indexes.** Also known as "Laspeyres" indexes, these are price indexes where a fixed pattern of expenditure from some base period is used to aggregate the detailed price indexes in each period.

**Foreign investments.** All marketable financial instruments (bonds, short-term paper and shares) which are liabilities of the non-resident sector (foreign governments and corporations) and assets of domestic sectors.

**Government business enterprise profits before taxes.** Net earnings from the economic activity of **government business enterprises**, measures after deduction of **capital consumption allowances**.

**Government business enterprises.** Government enterprises and agencies which operate on a profit or cost recovery basis and whose motivation is similar to that of private enterprises. Their total profits (net of losses) are recorded in GDP, while only the profits remitted to government are recorded in the government income and outlay account, under government investment income. The difference between these two measures, retained earnings, forms part of business sector saving.

**Government current expenditure on goods and services.** All current outlays for goods and services by the government sector, including wages and salaries of government employees. It also includes expenditure on weapons for defence and an imputation for the depreciation of government fixed assets. It is recorded before deduction of revenues from sales of goods and services in the government income and outlay account, and after deduction of these revenues in GDP (net government current expenditure on goods and services).

**Government gross fixed capital formation.** This expression covers all expenditures on buildings, engineering construction and machinery and equipment. Government gross fixed capital formation includes spending on non-military defence buildings and equipment (airports,

docks, roads, hospitals, transport aircraft, etc.). Abbreviated as **fixed capital** in the government capital and financial account.

**Government investment in inventories.** Government inventories include only uranium stocks, up to 1981, and those held by federal government commodity agencies, such as the Canadian Dairy Commission. Abbreviated as **inventories** in the government sector account.

**Government investment income.** In GDP, includes interest income of public service pension plans, other interest and dividend income of governments and royalties. In the government income and outlay account, it also includes the profits of government business enterprises remitted to government. See **government business enterprises**.

**Government sales of goods and services.** Revenues from the sale of goods and services, such as water charges, landing fees and charges for government documents.

**Government sector.** All departments, agencies, and funds (budgetary and non-budgetary) of the federal, provincial and local levels of government, as well as crown corporations which receive more than 50% of their revenues in grants from their parent governments. Also included are school boards, universities, non-profit colleges, hospitals, non-profit residential care facilities, as well as the Canada and Quebec Pension Plans.

**Grain in commercial channels.** Grain in the hands of the Canadian Wheat Board or private grain dealers.

**Gross domestic product.** The total unduplicated value of the goods and services produced in the economic territory of a country or region during a given period. GDP can be measured three ways: as total incomes earned in current production (income approach), as total final sales of current production (expenditure approach), or as total net values added in current production (value added approach). It can be valued either at base price or at market prices. In the Economic and Financial Accounts, Gross Domestic Product is measured by the income and expenditure approach.

**Gross fixed capital formation.** This expression covers all expenditures on buildings, engineering construction and machinery and equipment. Gross capital formation in machinery and equipment includes imports of used machinery and equipment since the latter constitute additions to domestic capital stock. Gross fixed capital formation in buildings includes transfer costs on the sale of existing fixed assets (e.g. real estate commissions). Abbreviated as **fixed capital** in the capital and financial account. Synonym of **investment in fixed capital**.

**Gross fixed capital formation, corporations and government business enterprises sector.** This expression covers all expenditures on buildings, engineering construction and machinery and equipment in the **corporations and government business enterprises sector**. It includes a large portion of the gross fixed capital formation in non-residential structures and machinery and equipment of the business sector. Abbreviated as **fixed capital** in the corporations and government business enterprises sector account.

**Gross fixed capital formation, persons and unincorporated businesses sector.** This expression covers all expenditures on buildings, engineering construction and machinery and equipment in the **persons and unincorporated businesses sector**. It includes mainly the gross fixed capital formation in residential structures but also includes a small portion of non-residential structures and machinery and equipment. Abbreviated as **fixed capital** in the persons and unincorporated businesses sector account.

**Gross national product.** A measure of income equal to the **Gross domestic product at market prices**, plus **investment income received from non-residents**, less **investment income paid to non-residents**.

**Gross saving.** Net saving plus capital consumption allowances.

**Holding gains and losses.** Additions to or subtractions from income which result from selling an asset for more or less than its purchase price. As holding gains and losses are not related to current production, they are excluded from GDP through the **inventory valuation adjustment**.

**Households.** A group of persons who share the same living accommodation, pool some, or all of their income and wealth and consume certain goods and services collectively. They may engage in any other kind of economic activity.

**Implicit price indexes.** These price indexes are a by-product of the **deflation** procedure, obtained by dividing an expenditure series expressed at current prices by the corresponding series expressed at constant prices. For all volume aggregates published in the Economic and Financial Accounts, the implicit price indexes are the chain Fisher price indexes.

**Imports of goods and services.** See **exports and imports of goods and services**.

**Income and outlay account.** This account shows, for each major sector, all sources of current income (production, receipts of property income and other transfers) and all

current outlays (expenditure on goods and services, payments of property income and other transfers), as well as **saving**, equal to a sector's income less its outlay.

**Inheritances and migrants' funds.** Capital brought to Canada by immigrants at the time of arrival or transferred outside Canada by emigrants at time of departure, or intended to be transferred at a later date, plus bequests to Canadian residents from non-residents or vice-versa.

**Interest and miscellaneous investment income.** Investment income of persons, except dividends, plus government investment income, less net investment income of persons and governments received from non-residents, less the transfer portion of interest on the consumer debt, less the interest on the public debt.

**Interest, dividends and miscellaneous investment income of persons.** Includes income of persons and unincorporated businesses as owners of financial or tangible non-produced assets in return for putting the assets at the disposal of another institutional unit. Interest includes interest on Canadian bonds, mortgage interest paid to persons and interest on deposits. Miscellaneous investment income includes accrued interest in pension plans, life insurance funds and interest on investments made by other "associations of individuals".

**Interest on the consumer debt.** Interest paid by persons on account of liabilities incurred to finance personal expenditure on consumer goods and services. Consists of two parts: the administrative expenses, representing the cost of rendering services to borrowers, and the remaining "transfer portion".

**Interest on the public debt.** Interest payments on liabilities of the government sector.

**Inventories.** See **investment in inventories**.

**Inventory valuation adjustment.** The difference between the change in inventory book values and the value of physical change in inventories, which is a measure of the net holding gain or loss realized by business as a result of price changes. Holding gains and losses on inventories are present in corporation profits and other income aggregates, and must be removed in order to measure the value of current production.

**Investment in fixed capital.** Synonym of **gross fixed capital formation**.

**Investment in inventories.** Change in the physical volume of business and government inventories, valued at the average market prices of the period.

**Investment in inventories, corporations and government business enterprises.** Consists of most of the investment in inventories of the business sector except for a portion of non-farm inventories held by unincorporated farm businesses. Abbreviated as **inventories** in the corporations and government business enterprises sector account.

**Investment in inventories, persons and unincorporated businesses sector.** Consists mainly of farm inventories held by unincorporated farm businesses. Abbreviated as **inventories** in the persons and unincorporated businesses sector account.

**Investment income of persons.** Interest on deposits, bonds, mortgages, etc., and royalties paid by corporations, governments and non-residents to persons, plus investment income accumulating on their behalf in trustee pension plans and life insurance funds, or on behalf of other associations of individuals. Excludes dividends.

**Investment income paid to non-residents.** Investment income payments on Canadian liabilities to non-residents, inclusive of any applicable withholding taxes. Includes interest, dividends and other payments such as net expenses of Canadian banks from foreign currency transactions and net revenues of foreign insurance companies from insurance operations in Canada.

**Investment income received from non-residents.** Investment income earned by Canadian residents on their assets abroad, inclusive of any applicable withholding taxes. Includes interest, dividends and other receipts such as net earnings of Canadian banks from foreign currency transactions and net revenues of Canadian insurance companies from insurance operations abroad.

**Labour income.** The sum of wages and salaries plus supplementary labour income.

**Laspeyres index.** Index calculated by using prices or volumes from a predetermined **base year** as weights.

**Life insurance and pensions.** Liability of life insurance companies and trustee pension plans to policyholders or beneficiaries and federal government liability with respect to annuities sold under the Annuities Act, as well as government employer-sponsored pension plans. Asset of policy holders or beneficiaries.

**Loans.** Financial instrument comprising **bank loans** and **other loans**. Negotiated loans made by chartered banks and other financial institutions.

**Machinery and equipment.** Capital expenditures on durable, tangible goods with an expected service life of one year or more, such as furniture, motor vehicles, office machines and equipment not permanently installed (permanently built-in equipment belongs to non-residential construction). Includes installation and delivery costs.

**Market prices.** A valuation expressed in terms of the prices actually paid by the purchaser, that is, after all applicable taxes and subsidies. See **factor cost**.

**Military pay and allowances.** The part of labour income consisting of payments to members of the Armed Forces serving in Canada or abroad. Includes military pay, allowances and the employer's social contributions. Excludes veterans' allowances, treated as transfer payments.

**Mortgages.** Negotiated loans and agreements of sale secured by real property, mostly residential buildings. Includes first, second and third mortgages. Mortgages are characterized by blended repayments, usually monthly, of principal and interest.

**Net acquisition of existing assets.** A sector's purchases less sales of used fixed assets and land. Business purchases less sales of natural resources, resource rights and intangible assets are also included. Does not apply to the non-resident sector which, by definition, acquires only financial investments. Abbreviated as **existing assets** in the capital and financial account.

**Net capital transfers.** Capital transfers from other sectors less capital transfers to other sectors.

**Net domestic product at basic prices.** The sum of all incomes arising from production, or ownership of assets used in production, within the economic territory of a country or region. This income includes **labour income, profits before taxes, interest and miscellaneous investment income, accrued net income of farm operators from farm production, net income of non-farm unincorporated business including rent, and the inventory valuation adjustment. Taxes and subsidies on factors of production** are also included since the size of these components is directly linked to the production decisions of producers. Differs from GDP at basic prices in that it excludes capital consumption allowances.

**Net financial investment.** The net lending (or borrowing) of a sector can be measured either through incomes and expenditures or through financial transactions. Under the financial transactions approach, net lending is called net financial investment. It is equal to a sector's transactions in financial assets less its transactions in liabilities. See **net lending and capital and financial account**.

**Net income of non-farm unincorporated business, including rent.** Earnings of unincorporated proprietors, except farm operators, from their own business. Includes the net income of unincorporated businesses and self-employed individuals, as well as the net rental income of persons.

**Net income of unincorporated business.** The sum of **net accrued income received by farm operators from farm production** and **net income of non-farm unincorporated business, including rent**.

**Net income received by farm operators from farm production.** Gross proceeds from the sale of farm products, plus subsidies on a cash basis, plus the imputed value of farm output consumed by farming households, plus investment in farm inventories, less farm operating expenses and depreciation on farm buildings and equipment. Excludes other types of income, such as net rent or interest receipts, and profits of incorporated farms. See **accrued net income of farm operators from farm production**.

**Net investment income from non-residents.** Investment income received from, less investment income paid to, non-residents.

**Net lending.** The net lending (or borrowing) of a sector can be measured either through incomes and expenditures or through financial transactions. Under the income and expenditure approach, net lending is the difference between internally generated funds and outlays on non-financial capital. A sector's net lending equals its saving, plus its capital consumption allowances and net capital transfers from non-residents, less its investment in fixed capital and inventories. Net lending (or borrowing) is also referred to as sector surplus (or deficit). See **net financial investment** and **capital and financial account**.

**Net national income at basic prices. Net domestic product at basic prices** plus **net investment income of non-residents**.

**Net reinvested earnings on direct investment.** Reinvested earnings (REI) are profits earned on, less dividends received from, direct foreign investment. From 1961, equity income from direct foreign investment is recorded on an accrual rather than cash basis in the Balance of International Payments. Net REI are defined as REI on foreign direct investment in Canada less REI on Canadian direct investment abroad. Net REI gives rise to an additional reconciliation item between the Canadian Balance of International Payments Accounts and the National Economic and Financial Accounts, in which this change has not been incorporated.

**Net rental income.** Earnings of persons, after expenses, arising from the ownership of residential property, whether rented or owner-occupied, and from the rental of non-residential property.

**Net saving.** The current income of a sector, less its current expenditure. Includes current transfers but excludes capital consumption allowances and capital transfers. Synonym of **saving**.

**Non-farm inventories.** Inventories of raw materials, goods-in-process and finished products.

**Non-financial capital acquisition.** Includes the gross fixed capital formation of a sector (fixed capital), plus its investment in inventories (inventories) and its net acquisition of existing assets (existing assets). Does not apply to the non-resident sector which, by definition, can only engage in financial investment.

**Non-resident sector.** All transactors who do not have a centre of economic interest (a dwelling, a business location) in the economic territory of Canada. By definition, non-residents can only engage in financial investment. Any transactor making non-financial investment is deemed to be a resident.

**Non-residential structures.** Construction of industrial, commercial and institutional buildings, such as plants, warehouses, shopping centres, office buildings, schools and hospitals, plus construction of highways, bridges, railway tracks, canals, waterworks, sewage systems, dams, hydro or thermal generating plants, telephone lines, oil and gas facilities, etc. Includes new construction, conversions resulting in a structural change, major renovations, permanently built-in equipment and site preparation.

**Non-residential structures and equipment.** The sum of business investment in non-residential structures and in machinery and equipment.

**Official reserves.** The sum of a) official holdings of gold and foreign exchange (U.S. dollars and deposits in other convertible currencies), b) loans to or from the International Monetary Fund on general account, and c) special drawing rights.

**Other current transfers from persons to government.** Transfers not classified as direct taxes. Includes hospital and medical care premiums, various licences and permits, (hunting and fishing licenses, marriage licenses, etc.) fines and penalties, the personal portion of motor vehicle licenses and permits, as well as donations to entities within the government sector.

**Other financial assets / Other liabilities.** Various items not included under other financial instruments, such as accrued interest, interest receivable or payable and prepaid expenses.

**Outside Canada.** Embassies and other Canadian government offices abroad which are part of the territory of Canada.

**Paasche index.** Index calculated by using prices or volumes from the current period as weights.

**Personal disposable income.** Personal income less current transfers to government.

**Personal expenditure on consumer goods and services.** Household spending on new consumer goods and on consumer services, plus any mark-up on used goods. Operating expenses of associations of individuals serving households are also included, under consumer services.

**Personal income.** The sum of all incomes received by persons residing in Canada, whether factor earnings from current production or current transfers from other sectors, plus the investment income that associations of individuals accumulate on their own behalf or on behalf of persons.

**Personal saving.** Personal disposable income less personal expenditure on consumer goods and services, less current transfers from persons to corporations and to non-residents.

**Personal sector.** All persons, households and associations of individuals serving households.

**Persons and unincorporated business sector.** Transactors of the personal sector plus those of the unincorporated business sector. In the capital and financial account, transactions of these two sectors are consolidated. In addition, in this account, although credit unions, life insurance companies and trustee pension plans appear as sub-sectors of the corporate and government business enterprise sector, their transactions in financial assets are balanced by liabilities which, in turn, are recorded as assets of the persons and unincorporated business sector.

**Price index.** Measure of the change in prices in index form. There are several methods of measuring indexes. See **Laspeyres index**, **Paasche index**, **Fisher index**, **chain index** and **implicit price indexes**.

**Production factors.** Transactors which, when combined, result in economic production. In general, there are two production factors: labour and capital.

**Real.** In the national accounts, real means the estimation of the aggregate in **volume**, possibly in the form of a **volume index** or an estimate in **real dollars**.

**Real dollars.** A dollar estimate of the **volume** of economic activity obtained by applying the growth in a volume index to the value of a specific series for a given **reference period**.

**Rebase, to.** See **changing the base period**.

**Reference period.** The period when the value of a series in constant dollars is equal to the value of the same series in current dollars. The current reference year is 1997 (current dollars are equal to constant dollars in 1997).

**Residential structures.** Construction of dwellings (includes single, semi-detached, row housing and apartments), garages, cottages and mobile homes. Includes new construction, conversions resulting in a structural change and major renovations (together referred to as "alterations and improvements"), permanently built-in equipment, site preparation and transfer costs such as real estate commissions.

**Saving.** See **net saving**.

**Saving rate.** The ratio between **net saving** of the persons and unincorporated businesses sector and **personal disposal income**, expressed in percentage.

**Sector accounts.** The quarterly national accounts include the full sector accounts. They record the income, outlay, saving, non-financial and financial investment, borrowing and net lending for the four main sectors: (a) persons and unincorporated businesses; (b) corporations and government business enterprises; (c) government; and (d) non-residents. See **income and outlay account** and **capital and financial account**.

**Semi-durable goods.** See **consumer goods**.

**Shares.** Financial instrument consisting of common and preferred shares (including term preferred shares and mutual fund shares), plus contributed surplus. Stock issued by a government business enterprise to a parent government is classified to government claims.

**Short-term paper.** Marketable financial instrument comprising:

**Government of Canada short-term paper.** Treasury bills, which are notes of original term to maturity of less than one year, issued at a discount and sold at auction every week; also includes Canada bills issued in foreign currency.



**Other short-term paper.** Notes of original term to maturity of one year or less, issued at a discount by a variety of financial and non-financial institutions; includes provincial and municipal Treasury bills as well as asset-backed securities.

**Statistical discrepancy.** Double-entry bookkeeping is fundamental in national accounting and several aggregates, such as GDP and net lending, can be calculated in two or more ways. In principle, all the measures of an aggregate are equal. In practice, differences invariably arise between them due to imperfections in basic statistics and estimation techniques. This difference is called a statistical discrepancy and serves as the balancing item between two theoretically equal aggregates. It can be recorded as is, like the discrepancy between the two estimates of net lending or it can be divided in two, one half being subtracted from the higher estimate and the other, added to the lower one, like the discrepancy between income-based and expenditure-based GDP.

**Subsidies.** Transfers from government to the business sector toward current costs of production. These transfers represent additions to the income of producers from current production. Subsidies can be linked to production factors or products.

**Subsidies on products.** These subsidies are paid by unit of good or service. They can take the form of a specific monetary amount paid by unit quantity of good or service or can be calculated ad valorem as a specific percentage of their unit price. Examples of product subsidies are those paid for agricultural products, transportation services and energy.

**Subsidies on factors of production.** Production subsidies are subsidies received by a unit that are unrelated to the quantity or the value of goods produced or sold. They are primarily subsidies on wages and labour, pollution reduction subsidies and interest subsidies. Investment assistance is not included.

**Supplementary labour income.** Employers' social contributions, either compulsory or voluntary. Includes retirement allowances and contributions to employment insurance, the Canada and Quebec Pension Plans, other pension plans, workers' compensation, medicare, dental plans, short- and long-term disability insurance, etc.

**Surplus or deficit on current account in the "Canadian Balance of International Payments".** The surplus or deficit of Canada on **current transactions with non-residents** plus **net reinvested earnings on direct investment**.

**Taxes less subsidies on factors of production.** Difference between **taxes on factors of production** and **subsidies on factors of production**. These taxes and subsidies are payable (received) regardless of the quantity or value of the goods and services produced or sold.

**Taxes less subsidies on products.** Difference between **taxes on products** and **subsidies on products**. These taxes and subsidies are payable (received) based on the quantity or value of the goods and services produced or sold.

**Taxes on factors of production.** These are mandatory payments without consideration, in cash or in kind, collected by government. They apply to production and the import of goods and services, employment of labour and ownership or use of land, structures and other assets used for production purposes. They are payable regardless of the quantity or value of the goods and services produced or sold.

**Taxes on products.** These are mandatory payments without consideration, collected by government on the sale of goods and services. These taxes include sales taxes, fuel taxes, import duties and taxes, excise taxes on tobacco and alcohol.

**Trade accounts receivable/payable.** Short-term credit advanced or received in the ordinary course of business by suppliers or buyers of business goods and services.

**Transactors.** Economic agents who engage in transactions involving the purchase and sale of goods and services and the payment and receipt of factor incomes and transfers.

**Transfers.** Cash, good, service, or asset other than cash transferred by one transactor to another without counterpart, that is, without the donor receiving anything in return. See **current transfers** and **capital transfers**. Synonym of **transfer payments**.

**Transfer payments.** See **Transfers**.

**Unincorporated business sector.** All business transactors whose legal form of organization is not the corporation. Includes independent business operators, self-employed farmers, fishermen and professionals and unincorporated landlords (including those renting to themselves).

**Volume.** Volume consists of the changes in quantities and qualities.

**Volume index.** A measure of growth with the effects of price removed, presented in index form. There are several methods of measuring indexes. See **Laspeyres index**,

**Paasche index, Fisher index, chain index.** The Economic and Financial Accounts use the **chain Fisher volume index** to calculate the real GDP.

**Wages and salaries.** Total remuneration, in cash or in kind, paid to employees in return for work done. It is recorded on a gross basis, before any deduction for income taxes, pensions, unemployment insurance and other social insurance schemes. Also includes other forms of compensation, namely commissions, tips, bonuses, directors' fees and allowances such as those for holidays and sick leave, as well as military pay and allowances. Excludes employers' social contributions, which are treated as supplementary labour income.

**Withholding taxes.** Taxes withheld by the Government of Canada on selected income and service payments to non-residents, or withheld by foreign governments on selected income and service payments to Canadian residents.

## Glossaire

**Acquisition de capital non financier.** Comprend la formation brute de capital fixe d'un secteur (capital fixe), plus son investissement en stocks (stocks) et son acquisition nette d'actifs existants (actifs existants). Ne s'applique pas au secteur des non-résidents qui, par définition, réalise seulement des investissements financiers.

**Acquisition nette d'actifs existants.** Acquisitions moins cessions, par un secteur, d'actifs tangibles usagés et de terrains. Pour les entreprises, englobe aussi les acquisitions moins cessions de ressources naturelles, droits miniers et actifs intangibles. Ne s'applique pas au secteur des non-résidents qui, par définition, réalise seulement des investissements financiers. Abrégé comme **actifs existants** dans le compte de capital et financier.

**Actifs existants.** Voir **acquisition nette d'actifs existants**.

**Actions.** Instrument financier englobant les actions ordinaires et privilégiées (y compris actions privilégiées à échéance déterminée et actions des fonds mutuels) ainsi que le surplus d'apport. Les actions émises par une entreprise publique à l'administration mère sont classées sous **créances, administrations**.

**Agents.** Agents économiques qui effectuent des opérations visant l'achat et la vente de biens et services et qui versent ou reçoivent des revenus de facteurs et des transferts.

**Ajustement de la valeur des stocks.** Écart entre la variation des valeurs comptables des stocks et la valeur de la variation matérielle des stocks, qui mesure le gain (ou perte) de détention net réalisé par l'entreprise à la suite de variations de prix. Les gains ou pertes de détention sur stocks se retrouvent dans les bénéfices des sociétés et dans d'autres agrégats du revenu et doivent être enlevés en vue de mesurer la valeur de la production courante.

**Argent et dépôts.** Instruments financiers incluant :

**Argent et dépôts bancaires.** Dépôts en dollars canadiens dans les banques à charte au Canada et à la Banque du Canada, billets canadiens et monnaie en circulation.

**Autres dépôts.** Tous les dépôts dans les autres institutions de dépôt, y inclus parts dans les caisses d'épargne et de crédit.

**Devises et dépôts étrangers.** Avoirs et dépôts en devises étrangères dans les banques à charte au Canada, leurs succursales et filiales à l'étranger, les

banques étrangères et les autres institutions de dépôt étrangères.

**Associations de particuliers.** Institutions sans but lucratif au service des ménages, telles églises, syndicats et organismes de charité, ainsi que caisses d'épargne et de crédit, régimes de pensions en fiducie, sociétés d'assurance-vie, sociétés de secours mutuel et compagnies mutuelles d'assurance générale. Elles sont traitées en entreprises quant à leurs dépenses de capital et leurs activités d'intermédiation, et en particuliers quant à leurs dépenses courantes.

**Assurance-vie et rentes.** Engagement des sociétés d'assurance-vie et des régimes de pensions en fiducie envers les assurés ou les bénéficiaires et de l'administration fédérale à l'égard des rentes vendues en vertu de la Loi des rentes sur l'état, de même que les régimes de retraites gouvernementaux parrainés par l'employeur. Actif des assurés ou des bénéficiaires.

**Autres éléments d'actif / de passif.** Divers postes non inclus dans les autres instruments financiers, tels intérêts courus, intérêt à payer ou à recevoir et charges payées d'avance.

**Autres transferts courants des particuliers aux administrations.** Transferts non classés comme impôts directs. Comprend les primes d'assurance-hospitalisation et santé, divers licences et permis (permis de chasse et pêche, licences de mariage, etc.), les amendes et pénalités, la part des particuliers des licences et permis pour véhicules automobiles ainsi que les dons aux hôpitaux.

**Bâtiments résidentiels.** Construction de logements (subdivisés en logements individuels, logements semi-détachés, maisons en rangée et appartements), garages, chalets et maisons mobiles. Englobe la construction neuve, les rénovations majeures et les conversions entraînant un changement de structure (dites "améliorations et modifications"), le matériel incorporé de façon permanente, la préparation du site et les coûts de transfert comme les commissions immobilières.

**Bénéfices des entreprises publiques avant impôts.** Gains nets résultant de l'activité économique des **entreprises publiques**, mesurés après déduction des **provisions pour consommation de capital**.

**Bénéfices des sociétés avant impôts.** Gains nets résultant de l'activité économique des sociétés privées, mesurés après déduction des provisions pour consommation de capital.

**Bénéfices net réinvestis d'investissement direct.** Les bénéfices réinvestis sont des bénéfices réalisés sur, moins dividendes reçus de, l'investissement étranger direct. À compter de 1961, le revenu sur l'avoir au titre d'investissement étranger direct est inscrit sur une base d'exercice plutôt que de caisse dans la Balance des paiements internationaux. Les bénéfices net réinvestis sont définis comme étant les bénéfices de l'investissement direct étrangers au Canada moins les bénéfices de l'investissement direct Canadien à l'étranger. Il en résulte un poste de rapprochement additionnel entre cette dernière et les comptes économiques et financiers nationaux dans lesquels ce changement n'a pas été introduit.

**Biens de consommation.** Biens neufs acquis par les ménages pour consommation propre. Comprend trois catégories :

**Biens durables,** utilisables de façon répétée ou continue durant plus d'un an, tels véhicules et gros appareils ménagers;

**Biens semi-durables,** utilisables en de multiples occasions et d'une durée utile anticipée d'un an ou un peu plus, tels vêtements, chaussures et linge de maison;

**Biens non durables,** utilisables une seule fois, tels aliments, essence, boissons alcoolisées et tabac; en pratique, ces derniers comprennent aussi quelques biens de peu de valeur utilisables plus d'une fois, comme des fournitures ménagères.

**Capital fixe.** Voir formation brute de capital fixe.

**Céréales en circuit commercial.** Céréales détenues par la Commission canadienne du blé ou des négociants privés.

**Changer la période de base.** Changer la période de base d'une série consiste à redéfinir la **période de base** à partir de laquelle sont établies les pondérations.

**Compte des revenus et dépenses.** Ce compte montre, pour chaque grand secteur, toutes les sources de revenu courant (production, revenus de propriété reçus et autres transferts) et toutes les dépenses courantes (dépenses en biens et services, revenus de propriété versés et autres transferts), ainsi que l'**épargne**, égale au revenu d'un secteur moins sa dépense.

**Compte du capital et financier.** Ce compte montre, pour chaque grand secteur, a) l'épargne et l'acquisition de capital non financier, et l'écart entre les deux, appelé le prêt net; et b) les transactions sur actifs financiers, les transactions sur passif et l'écart entre les deux, appelé l'investissement

financier net. En théorie, les deux postes d'équilibre, prêt net et investissement financier net, sont égaux; en pratique, les imperfections dans les statistiques engendrent un écart entre les deux, montré comme une divergence statistique.

**Comptes à recevoir / à payer.** Crédit à court terme accordé ou reçu dans le cours ordinaire des affaires par des fournisseurs ou acheteurs de biens et services commerciaux.

**Comptes sectoriels.** Les comptes nationaux trimestriels comprennent des comptes sectoriels complets. Ceux-ci comptabilisent le revenu, les dépenses, l'épargne, l'investissement non financier et financier, l'emprunt et le prêt net, pour les quatre grands secteurs: a) particuliers et entreprises individuelles; b) sociétés et entreprises publiques; c) administrations; et d) non-résidents. Voir **compte des revenus et dépenses** et **compte du capital et financier**.

**Contributions à la variation en pourcentage.** Ces estimations affichent la contribution d'un sous-agrégat à la variation en pourcentage d'un agrégat. Par exemple, si les dépenses personnelles de consommation se sont accrues de 2% et que la contribution à la variation en pourcentage des achats de véhicules est de 1% on dira que ces derniers ont contribué pour la moitié de l'augmentation des dépenses personnelles de consommation.

**Cotisations aux régimes d'assurance sociale.** Cotisations des employeurs et salariés à l'assurance-emploi, aux régimes de pensions de la fonction publique, aux Régimes de pensions du Canada et de rentes du Québec et aux caisses de santé et sécurité au travail.

**Coût des facteurs.** Une évaluation traduisant le coût des facteurs de production (travail et capital). Elle correspond à la valeur restante, une fois enlevés des **prix du marché** tous les impôts et subventions applicables.

**Créances.** Instrument financier incluant :

**Créances, entreprises.** Prêts, avances et titres de dette entre sociétés liées; du côté de l'actif, englobe aussi placements sous forme d'actions entre sociétés liées.

**Créances, administrations.** Créances entre administrations, entre entreprises publiques liées ou entre une administration et ses entreprises sous forme d'actions, titres de dette, prêts et avances.

**Crédit à la consommation.** Crédit accordé aux particuliers pour l'achat de biens et services de consommation.

**Déflation.** Processus qui consiste à éliminer la variation des prix d'une série chronologique nominale.

**Demande intérieure finale.** Somme des dépenses personnelles en biens et services de consommation, des dépenses courantes nettes des administrations en biens et services, de la formation brute de capital fixe des administrations ainsi que celle des entreprises.

**Dépenses courantes des administrations en biens et services.** Toutes les dépenses courantes en biens et services du secteur des administrations publiques, y compris salaires et traitements des employés de l'État. Englobe aussi l'armement et une imputation pour la dépréciation du capital fixe des administrations. Elles sont comptabilisées avant déduction des recettes tirées de la vente de biens et services dans le compte des revenus et dépenses des administrations et après déduction de ces recettes dans le PIB (dépenses courantes nettes des administrations en biens et services).

**Dépenses personnelles en biens et services de consommation.** Dépenses des ménages en biens de consommation neufs et en services de consommation, et marges sur biens usagés. Les dépenses nettes de fonctionnement des associations de particuliers au service des ménages sont aussi incluses, sous "services de consommation".

**Divergence statistique.** La comptabilité en partie double est à la base de la comptabilité nationale et plusieurs agrégats, comme le PIB et le prêt net, peuvent être calculés de deux façons ou plus. En théorie, toutes les mesures d'un agrégat sont égales. En pratique, des écarts surviennent inévitablement entre elles en raison d'imperfections dans les statistiques. Cet écart est appelé divergence statistique et sert de poste d'équilibre entre deux estimations théoriquement égales. Il peut être comptabilisé tel quel, comme la divergence entre les deux estimations du prêt net, ou il peut être divisé en deux, une moitié étant soustraite de l'estimation la plus élevée, et l'autre ajoutée à la plus basse, comme la divergence entre l'estimation du PIB en termes de revenus et celle en termes de dépenses.

**Dividendes.** Revenu payable ou recevable à l'égard de titres de propriété (dividendes en espèces) et participation accrue à la propriété de sociétés (dividendes sous forme d'actions).

**Dollars réel.** C'est une estimation en dollar du volume de l'activité économique. Elle est obtenue en appliquant la croissance d'un indice de volume à la valeur d'une série nominale pour une période de référence donnée.

**Effets à court terme.** Instrument financier négociable incluant:

**Effets à court terme du Gouvernement du Canada.** Bons du Trésor, soit des billets à ordre du porteur d'une échéance originale de moins d'un an, émis à escompte et vendus aux enchères chaque semaine; comprend aussi les "Bons du Canada" émis en devises étrangères.

**Autres effets à court terme.** Billets d'une échéance originale d'un an ou moins, émis à escompte par diverses institutions financières et non financières. Comprend les bons du Trésor provinciaux et municipaux, ainsi que les titres garantis par un actif.

**Entreprises publiques.** Entreprises et agences publiques à but lucratif ou visant à recouvrer leurs coûts et dont la motivation est semblable à celle des entreprises privées. Leurs bénéfices totaux (pertes déduites) sont comptabilisés dans le PIB, alors que leurs bénéfices versés le sont dans le compte des revenus et dépenses des administrations, sous revenus de placements. L'écart entre ces deux mesures, les bénéfices non répartis, fait partie de l'épargne du secteur des entreprises.

**Épargne.** Voir **épargne nette**.

**Épargne brute.** Définition de l'épargne qui englobe les provisions pour consommation de capital.

**Épargne nette.** Le revenu courant d'un secteur moins ses dépenses courantes. Comprend les transferts courants mais exclut les provisions pour consommation de capital et transferts de capitaux. Synonyme de **d'épargne**.

**Épargne personnelle.** Revenu personnel disponible moins dépenses personnelles en biens et services de consommation, moins transferts courants des particuliers aux sociétés et aux non-résidents.

**Excédent ou déficit du compte courant selon la balance canadienne des paiements internationaux.** Excédent ou déficit du Canada au titre des **opérations courantes avec les non-résidents**, plus **bénéfices net réinvestis d'investissement direct**.

**Exportations et importations de biens et services.** Recettes et paiements courants au titre de transactions portant sur des biens meubles et des services entre résidents et non-résidents. Les services comprennent les voyages, les frais de transport, les services commerciaux, les opérations gouvernementales, l'intermédiation financière et d'autres services.

**Extérieur du Canada.** Ambassades et autres bureaux du gouvernement du Canada à l'étranger, qui font partie du territoire du Canada.

**Facteurs de production.** Agents productifs qui, lorsque combinés, engendrent une production économique. Il existe, en gros, deux facteurs de production: le travail et le capital.

**Formation brute de capital fixe.** On regroupe sous ce nom toutes les dépenses en immeubles, travaux de génie et machines et matériel. La formation brute de capital en machine et matériel comprend les importations de machines et matériels neufs et usagés. Ces dernières étant incluses parce qu'elles viennent accroître le stock de capital productif au pays. La formation brute de capital fixe en immeubles inclut les coûts de transfert sur la vente d'actifs existants (commissions immobilières par exemple). Abrégé en **capital fixe** dans le compte capital et financier. Synonyme d'**investissement en capital fixe**.

**Formation brute de capital fixe des administrations publiques.** On regroupe sous ce nom toutes les dépenses en immeubles, travaux de génie et machines et matériel. La formation brute de capital fixe des administrations comprend les bâtiments et l'équipement de la défense à des fins non militaires (aéroports, quais, routes, hôpitaux, avions de transport, etc.). Abrégé en **capital fixe** dans le compte capital et financier des administrations publiques.

**Formation brute de capital fixe des entreprises.** On regroupe sous ce nom toutes les dépenses en immeubles, travaux de génie et machines et matériel du **secteur des entreprises**, constituées en sociétés ou non. La formation brute de capital fixe des entreprises est divisée en trois grandes catégories dans les comptes de production soit: les **bâtiments résidentiels**, les **ouvrages non résidentiels** et les **machines et matériels**.

**Formation brute de capital fixe, secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles.** On regroupe sous ce nom toutes les dépenses en immeubles, travaux de génie et machines et matériel du **secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles**. Ce poste comprend principalement la formation brute de capital fixe en bâtiments résidentiels mais comprend aussi une petite portion d'ouvrages non résidentiels et de machines et matériels. Abrégé en **capital fixe** dans le compte sectoriel des particuliers et entreprises individuelles.

**Formation brute de capital fixe, secteur des sociétés et entreprises publiques.** On regroupe sous ce nom toutes les dépenses en immeubles, travaux de génie et machines et matériel du **secteur des sociétés et entreprises publiques**. Ce poste comprend une grande proportion de la formation brute de capital fixe en ouvrages non résidentiels

et de machines et matériels du secteur des entreprises. Abrégé en **capital fixe** dans le compte sectoriel des sociétés et entreprises publiques.

**Gains et pertes de détention.** Additions au, ou déductions du, revenu résultant de la vente d'un actif à un prix supérieur ou inférieur à son prix d'acquisition. Comme les gains et pertes de détention ne sont pas reliés à la production courante, ils sont exclus du PIB au moyen de l'**ajustement de la valeur des stocks**.

**Hypothèques.** Prêts négociés et accords de vente garantis par des biens immobiliers, surtout des immeubles résidentiels. Comprend les première, deuxième et troisième hypothèques. Les hypothèques sont caractérisées par le remboursement, en général mensuel, d'un mélange de capital et d'intérêts.

**Importations de biens et services.** Voir **exportations et importations de biens et services**.

**Impôts moins subventions, sur facteurs de production.** Différence entre les **impôts sur facteurs de production** et les **subventions sur facteurs de production**. Ces impôts et subventions sont dûs (reçus) ne sont pas liés à la quantité ou à la valeur des biens et services produits ou vendus.

**Impôts moins subventions, sur produits.** Différence entre les **impôts sur produits** et les **subventions sur produits**. Ces impôts et subventions sont dûs (reçus) sont liés à la quantité ou à la valeur des biens et services produits ou vendus.

**Impôts sur facteurs de production.** Il s'agit de versements obligatoires sans contrepartie, en espèces ou en nature, prélevés par les administrations publiques. Ils frappent la production et l'importation de biens et services, l'emploi de main-d'oeuvre et la propriété ou l'utilisation de terrains, bâtiments et autres actifs utilisés à des fins de production. Ils sont dus indépendamment de la quantité ou de la valeur des biens et services produits ou vendus.

**Impôts sur produits.** Il s'agit de versements obligatoires et sans contrepartie, prélevés par l'administration publique sur la vente de biens et services. Parmi ses impôts se retrouvent les taxes de vente, les taxes sur les carburants, les droits et taxes à l'importation, les taxes d'accises sur le tabac et les produits de l'alcool.

**Indice chaîne.** Indice dont on change la période de base d'une période à l'autre et dont les estimations des variations sont cumulées multiplicativement à partir de la valeur obtenue pour la **période de référence**. Par exemple, dans le cas de l'**indice de volume en chaîne de Fisher**, on calcule l'indice de volume pour chaque paire de trimestres

consécutifs, en prenant le trimestre le moins récent comme période de base.

**Indice de Fisher.** Moyenne géométrique de l'**indice de Laspeyres** et de l'**indice de Paasche**.

**Indice de Laspeyres.** Indice calculé en utilisant comme poids les prix ou les volumes calculés pour une **période de base** prédéterminée.

**Indice de Paasche.** Indice calculé en utilisant comme poids les prix ou volumes calculés pour la période courante.

**Indice de prix.** Mesure de la variation des prix sous forme d'un indice. Il existe plusieurs méthodes de calcul des indices. Voir **Indice de Laspeyres**, **Indice de Paasche**, **Indice de Fisher**, **Indice chaîne** et **indices implicites de prix**.

**Indices de prix à pondération fixe.** Également appelés indices "Laspeyres", indices de prix dans lesquels un panier fixe de dépenses pour une période de référence donnée sert à agréger les indices de prix détaillés à chaque période.

**Indice de prix en chaîne Fisher.** Voir **indices implicites de prix**.

**Indice de volume.** Mesure de la croissance de laquelle est exclu l'effet de la variation des prix, présenté sous forme d'un indice. Il existe plusieurs méthodes de calcul des indices. Voir **indice de Laspeyres**, **indice de Paasche**, **indice de Fisher**, **indice chaîne**. Les Comptes économiques et financiers utilisent la méthode de l'**indice de volume en chaîne Fisher** pour calculer le PIB réel.

**Indice de volume Fisher.** Moyenne géométrique de l'**indice de volume Laspeyres** et l'**indice de volume Paasche**.

**Indices de volume en chaîne Fisher.** Une mesure de la variation en volume d'une période à l'autre. Elle est calculée comme la moyenne géométrique d'un **indice de volume en chaîne Paasche** et d'un **indice de volume en chaîne Laspeyres**. En d'autres termes, c'est la moyenne de deux mesures distinctes en volume: une calculée comme si les prix étaient constants dans la première des deux périodes adjacentes (volume de Laspeyres) et l'autre, comme si les prix étaient constants dans la seconde des deux périodes adjacentes (volume de Paasche).

**Indices de volume en chaîne Laspeyres.** Une mesure de la variation en volume d'une période à l'autre. Celle-ci est calculée comme si les prix étaient constants dans la première des deux périodes adjacentes. Les indices de chacune des périodes sont raccordés ensemble en une

chaîne pour former un indice. Les indices de volume en chaîne Laspeyres sont une des composantes des **indices de volume en chaîne Fisher** qui constituent la mesure officielle des Comptes économiques et financiers.

**Indices de volume en chaîne Paasche.** Une mesure de la variation en volume d'une période à l'autre. Celle-ci est calculée comme si les prix étaient constants dans la seconde des deux périodes adjacentes. Les indices de chacune des périodes sont raccordés ensemble en une chaîne pour former un indice. Les indices de volume en chaîne Paasche sont une des composantes des **indices de volume en chaîne Fisher** qui constituent la mesure officielle des Comptes économiques et financiers.

**Indices implicites de prix.** Ces indices sont un sous-produit de la procédure de **déflation** et sont obtenus en divisant une série des dépenses exprimées en prix courants par la série correspondante exprimée en prix constants. Dans le cas de tous les agrégats en volume publiés dans les Comptes économiques et financiers, les indices implicites de prix sont des indices de prix en chaîne Fisher.

**Intérêts et revenus divers de placements.** Revenus de placements des particuliers, sauf dividendes, plus revenus de placements des administrations, moins revenus nets de placements reçus des non-résidents par les particuliers et les administrations, moins la partie "transfert" des intérêts sur la dette de consommation, moins le service de la dette publique.

**Intérêts, dividendes, et revenus divers de placements des particuliers.** Sont incluses dans ce poste, les revenus que reçoivent les particuliers et entreprises individuelles en tant que propriétaires d'actifs financiers ou corporels non-produits en échange de sa mise à la disposition d'une autre unité institutionnelle. Les intérêts comprennent les intérêts sur obligations canadiennes, les intérêts hypothécaires allant aux particuliers et les intérêts sur dépôts. Les revenus divers de placements incluent les intérêts accumulés dans les régimes privés de pension, les caisses d'assurance-vie et les intérêts sur les placements effectués par d'autres "association de particuliers".

**Intérêts sur la dette de consommation.** Intérêts versés par les particuliers sur des engagements encourus pour financer des dépenses personnelles en biens et services de consommation; comprend deux parties: les frais d'administration, correspondant au coût des services rendus aux emprunteurs, et la partie résiduelle, dite "transfert".

**Intérêts sur la dette publique.** Intérêts sur les engagements du secteur des administrations publiques.

**Investissement des administrations publiques en stocks.** Les stocks des administrations englobent seulement des stock d'uranium, jusqu'en 1981, et ceux détenus par des agences fédérales comme la Commission canadienne du lait. Abrégé en **stocks** dans le compte sectoriel des administrations publiques.

**Investissement des entreprises en stocks.** Les stocks du secteur des entreprises renferment deux catégories: a) **stocks non agricoles** et b) **stocks agricoles et céréales en circuit commercial**. Ces deux catégories font l'objet de tableaux détaillées dans les Comptes économiques et financiers. Les stocks du secteur des entreprises sont eux-mêmes divisés entre ceux du secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles et du secteur des sociétés et entreprises publiques ces deux estimations sont montrées dans les comptes sectoriels respectifs sous le titre de stocks.

**Investissement des entreprises en stocks agricoles.** Voir **stocks agricoles**.

**Investissement des entreprises en stocks non agricoles.** Voir **stocks non agricoles**.

**Investissement en capital fixe.** Synonyme de **formation brute de capital fixe**.

**Investissement en stocks.** Variation du volume matériel des stocks détenus par les entreprises et les administrations, évaluée aux prix moyens du marché au cours de la période.

**Investissement en stocks, secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles.** Cet item est principalement composé de stocks agricoles détenus par les entreprises agricoles non-constituées en sociétés. Abrégé en **stocks** dans le compte sectoriel des particuliers et entreprises individuelles.

**Investissement en stocks, secteur des sociétés et entreprises publiques.** Cet item comprend la majeure partie de l'investissement en stocks du secteur des entreprises à l'exception d'une partie des stocks non agricoles détenues par des entreprises individuelles non constituées en sociétés. Abrégé en **stocks** dans le compte sectoriel des sociétés et entreprises publiques.

**Investissement financier net.** Le prêt (ou emprunt) net d'un secteur peut être mesuré soit par les revenus et dépenses, soit par les transactions financières. Dans l'approche des transactions financières, le prêt net est appelé investissement financier net. Pour un secteur, il est égal à ses transactions sur actifs financiers moins ses

transactions sur passif. Voir **prêt net** et **compte du capital et financier**.

**Investissements étrangers.** Tous les instruments financiers négociables (actions, obligations et effets à court terme) inscrits au passif du secteur des non-résidents (sociétés, gouvernements étrangers) et à l'actif de secteurs intérieurs.

**Machines et matériel.** Dépenses d'immobilisations en biens matériels durables d'une durée utile anticipée d'un an ou plus, tels meubles, véhicules, machines de bureau, logiciels et équipement non installé en permanence (celui incorporé de façon permanente fait partie des ouvrages non résidentiels). Englobe le coût de livraison et d'installation.

**Ménages.** Un groupe de personnes qui partagent un logement, mettent ensemble toutes, ou partie, de leurs revenus et richesse et consomment certains biens et services collectivement. Ils peuvent aussi exercer n'importe quelle autre activité économique.

**Obligations.** Titres, négociables ou non, émis en devises canadiennes ou étrangères ayant une échéance originale de plus d'un an. Comprend:

**Obligations fédérales.** Obligations directes du gouvernement fédéral (dont, obligations d'épargne du Canada) et obligations garanties des entreprises fédérales.

**Obligations provinciales.** Obligations directes (dont, obligations d'épargne) des administrations provinciales et obligations garanties des entreprises provinciales.

**Obligations municipales.** Obligations des administrations municipales et obligations garanties des entreprises municipales.

**Autres obligations.** Obligations négociables émises par les sociétés canadiennes, les hôpitaux et les organismes sans but lucratif, et obligations non garanties des entreprises publiques, ainsi que les titres garantis par un actif.

**Opérations courantes avec les non-résidents.** Exportations de biens et services moins importations de biens et services, plus revenus de placements nets reçus des non-résidents, plus transferts courants nets reçus des non-résidents.

**Ouvrages non résidentiels.** Érection de bâtiments industriels, commerciaux et institutionnels, tels usines, entrepôts, centres commerciaux, édifices à bureaux, écoles et hôpitaux, et construction de routes, ponts, voies ferrées,



canaux, réseaux d'adduction d'eau, égouts, barrages, centrales électriques ou thermiques, lignes téléphoniques, installations pétrolières et gazières, etc. Englobe construction neuve, conversions entraînant un changement de structure, rénovations majeures, matériel incorporé de façon permanente et préparation du site.

**Ouvrages non résidentiels et équipement.** Somme de l'investissement des entreprises en ouvrages non résidentiels et en machines et matériel.

**Paiement de transferts.** Voir **transfert**.

**Particuliers.** Voir **secteur des particuliers**.

**Période de base.** Période de référence des prix utilisées pour calculer un indice.

**Période de référence.** La période ou la valeur d'une série en dollars constants est égale à sa valeur en dollars courants. L'année de référence courante est 1997 (les dollars courants sont égaux aux dollars réels pour l'année 1997).

**Prêt net.** Le prêt (ou emprunt) net d'un secteur peut être mesuré soit par les revenus et dépenses, soit par les transactions financières. Selon l'approche des revenus et dépenses, le prêt net est l'écart entre les fonds d'origine interne et l'investissement en capital non financier. Le prêt net d'un secteur égale son épargne, plus ses provisions pour consommation de capital et les transferts nets de capitaux des non-résidents, moins son investissement en capital fixe et en stocks. Prêt (ou emprunt) net d'un secteur est aussi appelé **surplus** (ou **déficit**). Voir **investissement financier net** et **compte du capital et financier**.

**Prêts / Emprunts.** Instrument financier comprenant **prêts/emprunts bancaires** et **autres prêts/emprunts**. Prêts négociés, offerts surtout par les banques à charte et autres institutions financières.

**Prix courants.** Une évaluation en prix courants est exprimée aux prix ayant cours dans la période à laquelle il est fait référence.

**Prix de base.** Une évaluation aux prix de base comprend le coût des **facteurs de production** (travail et capital) ainsi que les impôts indirects et subventions sur facteurs de productions. Les mesures de revenu sont estimés aux prix de base ou au **prix du marché**.

**Prix du marché.** Une évaluation exprimée en termes des prix effectivement payés par l'acheteur, c'est-à-dire après prise en compte de tous les impôts et subventions applicables. Voir **coût des facteurs**.

**Produit intérieur brut.** Valeur sans double compte des biens et services produits dans le territoire économique d'un pays ou d'une région au cours d'une période donnée. Le PIB peut être calculé de trois façons, soit comme la somme des revenus gagnés dans la production courante (approche des revenus), la somme des ventes finales de la production courante (approche des dépenses) ou la somme des valeurs ajoutées nettes dans la production courante (approche de la valeur ajoutée). Il peut être évalué au prix de base ou aux prix du marché. Dans les Comptes économiques et financiers, le produit intérieur brut est calculé par l'approche des revenus et des dépenses.

**Produit intérieur net au prix de base.** Somme de tous les revenus engendrés par la production, ou la propriété d'actifs servant à la production, dans le territoire économique d'un pays ou d'une région. Ces revenus comprennent **rémunération des salariés, bénéfices avant impôts, intérêts et revenus divers de placements, revenu comptable net des exploitants agricoles au titre de la production agricole, revenu net des entreprises individuelles y compris les loyers et ajustement de la valeur des stocks**. Les **impôts et les subventions sur les facteurs de production** sont aussi inclus puisque la taille de ces derniers est directement liée aux décisions de production des producteurs. Diffère du PIB au prix de base en ce qu'il exclut les provisions pour consommation de capital.

**Produit national brut.** Une mesure de revenu égale au **Produit intérieur brut**, plus les **revenus de placements reçus des non-résidents**, moins les **revenus de placements versés aux non-résidents**.

**Provisions pour consommation de capital.** Provisions pour tenir compte de l'usure du capital dans le processus productif. Elles sont calculées à l'égard des actifs fixes des entreprises et administrations ainsi que des logements. Englobe aussi divers ajustements de valeur visant à rendre les dossiers comptables des entreprises conformes aux définitions de la comptabilité nationale, telle l'addition des prestations versées par les compagnies d'assurance pour compenser les pertes dues aux incendies.

**Rebaser.** Voir **changer la période de base**.

**Réel.** Dans la comptabilité nationale, réel signifie l'estimation en **volume** de l'agrégat. Cet estimé peut-être sous forme d'un **indice de volume** ou une estimation en **dollars réels**.

**Régime de pensions du Canada et régime de rentes du Québec.** La partie du secteur des administrations qui concerne les opérations du Régime de pensions du Canada et du Régime de rentes du Québec, créés en 1966.

**Rémunération des salariés.** Somme des salaires et traitements et du revenu supplémentaire du travail. Appelé aussi "revenu du travail".

**Réserves officielles.** Somme de a) avoirs officiels en or et devises étrangères (dollars américains et dépôts en autres devises étrangères convertibles), b) prêts au, et emprunts du, compte général du Fonds monétaire international, et c) droits de tirage spéciaux.

**Résidents canadiens.** Unités institutionnelles, tels particuliers, sociétés et institutions sans but lucratif, qui ont un centre d'intérêt économique (logement ou place d'affaire) dans le territoire économique du Canada.

**Retenues fiscales.** Impôts retenus par le gouvernement du Canada sur certains paiements de revenus ou de services faits à des non-résidents, ou retenus par les gouvernements étrangers sur certains paiements de revenus ou services faits à des résidents canadiens.

**Revenu comptable net des exploitants agricoles au titre de la production agricole.** Revenu net reçu par les exploitants agricoles au titre de la production agricole, plus la part non répartie des bénéfices sur les opérations de la Commission canadienne du blé et l'ajustement apporté pour exprimer les subventions agricoles sur une base d'exercice plutôt que comptable.

**Revenu disponible.** Voir **revenu personnel disponible**.

**Revenu national net au prix de base. Produit intérieur net au prix de base,** plus les **revenus nets de placements des non-résidents**.

**Revenu net de loyers.** Gains des particuliers, après déduction des dépenses, tirés de la propriété résidentielle, qu'elle soit louée ou occupée par le propriétaire, et de la location de propriété non résidentielle.

**Revenu net des entreprises individuelles.** Somme du **revenu comptable net des exploitants agricoles au titre de la production agricole** et du **revenu net des entreprises individuelles non agricoles, loyers compris**.

**Revenu net des entreprises individuelles non agricoles, loyers compris.** Gains des propriétaires individuels, sauf les exploitants agricoles, au titre de leur propre entreprise. Englobe le revenu net des entreprises individuelles et des travailleurs à leur propre compte ainsi que le revenu net de loyers des particuliers.

**Revenu net reçu par les exploitants agricoles au titre de la production agricole.** Recettes brutes de la vente de produits agricoles, plus subventions sur une base de caisse,

plus valeur imputée de la production agricole consommée par les ménages sur les fermes, plus investissement en stocks agricoles, moins dépenses d'exploitation agricoles et dépréciation sur les bâtiments et le matériel agricoles. Exclut les autres revenus, tels loyers nets ou revenus d'intérêt et les bénéfices des exploitations constituées en sociétés. Voir **revenu comptable net des exploitants agricoles au titre de la production agricole**.

**Revenu personnel.** Somme de tous les revenus reçus par les particuliers et entreprises individuelles résidant au Canada, qu'il s'agisse de gains de facteurs au titre de la production courante ou de transferts courants d'autres secteurs, plus revenus de placements que les associations de particuliers accumulent pour leur propre compte ou celui des particuliers.

**Revenu personnel disponible. Revenu personnel moins transferts courants des particuliers aux administrations.**

**Revenu supplémentaire du travail.** Cotisations sociales des employeurs, obligatoires ou facultatives. Comprend les allocations de retraite et les cotisations à l'assurance-emploi, au Régime de pensions du Canada, au Régime de rentes du Québec, aux autres régimes de pensions, aux caisses de santé et sécurité au travail, à l'assurance-santé, aux régimes de soins dentaires, à l'assurance-invalidité à court ou à long terme, etc.

**Revenus de placements des administrations publiques.** Dans le PIB, englobe les revenus d'intérêts des régimes de pension de la fonction publique, d'autres revenus d'intérêts et de dividendes des administrations et les redevances. Dans le compte des revenus et dépenses des administrations, comprend aussi les bénéfices versés par les entreprises publiques aux administrations. Voir **entreprises publiques**.

**Revenus de placements des particuliers.** Intérêts (sur dépôts, obligations, hypothèques, etc.) et redevances versés par les sociétés, les administrations et les non-résidents aux particuliers, plus revenus de placements s'accumulant à leur profit dans les régimes de pensions en fiducie et les caisses d'assurance-vie, ou au profit d'autres associations de particuliers. Exclut les dividendes.

**Revenus de placements reçus des non-résidents.** Revenus de placements gagnés par les résidents canadiens sur leurs actifs à l'étranger, incluant toutes les retenues fiscales applicables. Englobe intérêts, dividendes et autres revenus tels gains nets des banques canadiennes sur des transactions en devises étrangères et des compagnies d'assurance canadiennes de leur activité à l'étranger.

**Revenus de placements versés aux non-résidents.**

Revenus de placements sur des engagements canadiens envers des non-résidents, incluant toutes les retenues fiscales applicables. Englobe intérêts, dividendes et autres paiements comme les dépenses nettes des banques canadiennes sur des transactions en devises étrangères et les revenus nets des compagnies d'assurance étrangères de leur activité au Canada.

**Revenus nets de placements des non-résidents.**

Revenus de placements reçus des, moins revenus de placements versés aux, non-résidents.

**Salaires et traitements.** Rémunération totale, en espèces ou en nature, versée à des salariés pour un travail exécuté. Elle est inscrite sur une base brute, avant toute déduction pour les impôts sur le revenu, les pensions, l'assurance-chômage et les autres régimes d'assurance sociale. Englobe aussi d'autres types de rémunération, soit commissions, pourboires, primes de rendement, honoraires des directeurs et allocations pour vacances et congés de maladie, ainsi que **solde et indemnités militaires**. Exclut les cotisations sociales des employeurs, qui sont traitées comme revenu supplémentaire du travail.

**Secteur des administrations publiques.** Tous les ministères, agences et fonds généraux (budgétaires et non budgétaires) des administrations fédérale, provinciales et locales, y compris les sociétés de la couronne qui tirent plus de 50% de leurs revenus de transferts de l'administration mère. Englobe aussi les conseils scolaires, les universités, les collèges à but non lucratif, les hôpitaux, et les centres d'hébergement à but non lucratif, ainsi que le Régime de pensions du Canada et le Régime de rentes du Québec.

**Secteur des entreprises.** Tous les agents produisant des biens et services vendus à un prix censé couvrir le coût de production, soit sociétés, entreprises publiques, entreprises individuelles et professionnels à leur propre compte. Englobe aussi les propriétaires occupant leur logement, traités en entreprises louant à elles-mêmes, et les associations de particuliers, traitées en entreprises quant à leurs dépenses de capital et leurs activités d'intermédiation.

**Secteur des entreprises individuelles.** Tous les agents du secteur des entreprises qui ne sont pas légalement constitués en sociétés. Englobe les propriétaires d'entreprises indépendants, les fermiers, pêcheurs et professionnels à leur propre compte et les propriétaires de logements non constitués en sociétés (y compris propriétaires-occupants).

**Secteur des non-résidents.** Tous les agents qui n'ont pas de centre d'intérêt économique (logement ou place d'affaire) dans le territoire économique du Canada. Par définition, les non-résidents font seulement de l'investissement financier.

Tout agent faisant un investissement non financier est considéré comme résident.

**Secteur des particuliers.** Tous les particuliers, ménages et associations de particuliers au service des ménages.

**Secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles.**

Agents du **secteur des particuliers**, plus ceux du **secteur des entreprises individuelles**. Dans le compte du capital et financier, les transactions de ces deux secteurs sont consolidées. En outre, dans ce compte, bien que les caisses d'épargne et de crédit, les sociétés d'assurance-vie et les régimes de pensions en fiducie figurent comme sous-secteurs de celui des sociétés et entreprises publiques, leurs transactions en actifs financiers sont équilibrées par des créances à leur tour inscrites à l'actif du secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles.

**Secteur des sociétés et des entreprises publiques.**

Tous les agents du secteur des entreprises légalement constitués en sociétés, plus les entreprises publiques. Ce secteur est divisé en entreprises non financières et financières, lesquelles sont subdivisées en plusieurs sous-secteurs (Banque du Canada, banques à charte, caisses d'épargne, sociétés d'assurance-vie, régimes de pensions en fiducie, fonds mutuels, etc.). Les activités d'intermédiation des caisses d'épargne et de crédit, sociétés d'assurance-vie et régimes de pensions en fiducie figurant à l'actif de ces sous-secteurs sont équilibrées par des créances à leur passif, inscrites à leur tour à l'actif du secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles.

**Services de consommation.** Services consommés par les ménages, tels loyer (y compris le loyer imputé aux propriétaires-occupants), transports, éducation, soins médicaux, garde des enfants, hébergement et restauration ainsi que dépenses de voyage des Canadiens à l'étranger, moins dépenses de voyage des étrangers au Canada. Englobe aussi les dépenses de fonctionnement des associations de particuliers et des entreprises individuelles non-incorporées.

**Solde et indemnités militaires.** Partie de la rémunération des salariés qui consiste en paiements aux membres des Forces armées en service au Canada et à l'étranger. Englobe la solde, les indemnités militaires et les cotisations sociales de l'employeur. Exclut les allocations aux anciens combattants, traitées en paiements de transfert.

**Stocks.** Voir **investissement en stocks**.

**Stocks agricoles.** Production agricole détenue sur les fermes; englobe céréales, tabac, pommes de terre et bétail.

**Stocks non agricoles.** Stocks de matières premières, de produits en cours et de produits finis.

**Subventions.** Transferts des administrations au secteur des entreprises, visant les coûts de production courants. Ces transferts viennent s'ajouter au revenu des producteurs au titre de la production courante. Les subventions peuvent être liés aux facteurs de production ou encore aux produits.

**Subventions sur facteurs de production.** Les subventions sur la production sont les subventions perçues par une unité qui ne sont pas liées à la quantité, ni à la valeur des biens produits ou vendus. Il s'agit notamment de subventions sur les salaires et la main-d'oeuvre, de subventions destinées à réduire la pollution et de bonifications d'intérêts. Les aides à l'investissement sont exclues.

**Subventions sur les produits.** Ces subventions sont versées par unité de bien ou de service. Elles peuvent consister en un montant monétaire déterminé, à verser par unité de quantité du bien ou du service, ou être calculées ad valorem sous la forme d'un pourcentage déterminé de leur prix unitaire. Les subventions versées pour les produits agricoles, les services de transport et l'énergie sont des exemples de subventions sur les produits.

**Successions et capitaux des migrants.** Capitaux apportés au Canada par les immigrants à l'arrivée ou transférés hors du pays par les émigrants lors du départ, ou sommes censées être transférées à une date ultérieure, plus héritages versés à des résidents canadiens par des non-résidents ou vice versa.

**Taux d'épargne.** Il s'agit du rapport entre l'épargne nette du secteur des particuliers et entreprises individuelles et le revenu personnel disponible, exprimé en pourcentage.

**Territoire économique.** Le territoire économique d'un pays englobe le territoire géographique, plus l'espace aérien, les eaux territoriales et le plateau continental, ainsi que les enclaves territoriales de ce pays à l'étranger (ambassades, consulats, bases militaires, etc.).

**Transferts.** Argent, bien, service ou actif autre que de l'argent transféré d'un agent à un autre sans contrepartie, c'est-à-dire sans que le donateur reçoive quelque chose en retour. Voir **transferts courants** et **transferts de capitaux**. Synonyme de **paiements de transferts**.

**Transferts courants.** Transferts provenant du revenu du donateur, diminuant son épargne et accroissant celle du bénéficiaire.

**Transferts courants des administrations aux entreprises.** Subventions au secteur des entreprises.

**Transferts courants des administrations aux non-résidents.** Pensions versées aux non-résidents et contributions officielles (aide alimentaire ainsi qu'assistance économique et technique fournies aux pays en voie de développement par l'Agence canadienne de développement international, les autres agences gouvernementales et les organisations non gouvernementales).

**Transferts courants des administrations aux particuliers.** Paiements tels prestations fiscales et crédits d'impôt pour enfants, prestations d'assurance-emploi, pensions de vieillesse, prestations de bien-être social, bourses et subventions de recherche, prestations d'indemnisation des accidents de travail, subventions aux autochtones et à leurs organisations, pensions de la fonction publique et pensions versées en vertu du Régime de pensions du Canada et du Régime de rentes du Québec, allocations aux anciens combattants.

**Transferts courants des non-résidents aux administrations.** Retenues fiscales versées au gouvernement du Canada par les non-résidents.

**Transferts courants des non-résidents aux particuliers.** Pensions payées par des gouvernements étrangers à des résidents canadiens plus versements par des non-résidents à des résidents canadiens.

**Transferts courants des particuliers aux non-résidents.** Versements par des résidents canadiens (notamment par des organisations religieuses ou charitables) à des non-résidents et retenues fiscales versées à l'étranger.

**Transferts courants des particuliers aux sociétés.** La partie "transfert" des intérêts sur la dette de consommation.

**Transferts courants des particuliers et entreprises individuelles aux administrations.** Impôts sur le revenu, cotisations aux régimes d'assurance sociale et autres transferts courants.

**Transferts courants des sociétés aux particuliers.** Dons de charité et autres contributions.

**Transferts de capitaux.** Transferts en argent ou en nature, provenant de la richesse du donateur (**successions et capitaux des migrants**, transfert de la propriété d'un actif ou annulation d'une dette) ou transferts que le bénéficiaire est censé utiliser pour acquérir un actif. Les transferts de capitaux sont sans effet sur l'épargne du donateur ou du bénéficiaire.

**Transferts nets de capitaux.** Transferts de capitaux provenant d'autres secteurs moins transferts de capitaux aux autres secteurs.

**Ventes de biens et services par les administrations.**

Revenus tirés de la vente de biens et services, tels frais d'aqueduc, droits d'atterrissage et frais exigés pour les documents gouvernementaux.

**Volume.** Le volume comprend les changements de quantités et de qualités.
