# **Highlights:**

- In November 1999, the freight loaded by railways in Canada (excluding intermodal traffic) totalled 21.4 million metric tonnes.
- The intermodal tonnage, represented by "container-on-flat-cars" (C.O.F.C.) and "trailer-on-flat-cars" (T.O.F.C.), was 2.1 million metric tonnes.
- The five main loaded commodities were: coal (3.5 million metric tonnes), iron ores and concentrates (3.2 million metric tonnes), wheat (1.7 million metric tonnes), potash (1.2 million metric tonnes) and lumber (1.0 million metric tonnes).
- The cumulative freight loaded (excluding intermodal traffic) for the first eleven months of 1999 reached 216.8 million metric tonnes.
