CUSTOMS NOTICE N-559

Bicycles and Bicycle Frames From Chinese Taipei and the People's Republic of China

1. This is to advise that a review of normal values and export prices has been initiated on March 8, 2004, pursuant to the *Special Import Measures Act*.

2. The review is part of the Canada Border Services Agency's (CBSA) enforcement of the Canadian International Trade Tribunal's (Tribunal) finding of December 11, 1992. On December 9, 2002, the Tribunal continued its order concerning bicycles, assembled or unassembled, with wheel diameters of 16 inches (40.64 cm) and greater, originating in or exported from Chinese Taipei and the People's Republic of China, with an amendment to exclude bicycles with an FOB Chinese Taipei or People's Republic of China selling price exceeding CAN\$225 and to exclude bicycles with foldable frames and stems. The Tribunal also continued its order concerning bicycle frames, originating in or exported from the aforementioned countries, with an amendment to exclude bicycle frames with an FOB Chinese Taipei or People's Republic of China selling price exceeding CAN\$50.

3. The subject goods are normally imported into Canada under one of the following ten-digit Harmonized System classification numbers:

4. It is anticipated that this review will be concluded on or before August 31, 2004.

5. Notice of the completion of this review will be published in a Customs Notice.

6. Importers are cautioned that the cost of production information on which the normal values of the 2003-2004 models were based will be verified during the current review. If any of the information provided by the exporters was found to be inaccurate, the normal values will be re-established and the entries reappraised in light of the new information. This may result in additional dumping duties being assessed against the importer.

7. Importers are advised that if an exporter fails to provide a complete and accurate submission by April 14, 2004, the finalized 2004 normal values will be based on the best information available. This may result in retroactive assessments of additional dumping duties against the importer as high as 64% of the export price for all imports of subject bicycles and frames purchased from that exporter since September 1, 2003. The exporters have been made aware of the need to provide complete and accurate information to the CBSA during this review.

8. Finally, importers are advised that they must respond to the questionnaire sent at the initiation of the review by the due date of March 29, 2004. If they fail to provide a complete and accurate submission, the finalized export prices for 2004 models will be based on the best information available. This may result in retroactive assessments of additional dumping duties by reducing the export prices by 21.2% for all imports of subject bicycles and frames purchased since September 1, 2003.

9. The information collected in the course of this review will also be used to establish the method for determining normal values and export prices for the 2004-2005 season.
